



## DAILY INFORMATION BULLETIN

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DEVELOPMENTS PLANS FOR CHAI WAN UNVEILED  
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MAJOR DEVELOPMENT PLANS ARE ON STREAM FOR CHAI WAN OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS IN HOUSING, EDUCATION AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, ASSISTANT DISTRICT OFFICER FOR EASTERN, DR SIMON VICKERS, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPEN DAY OF THE MARDEN FOUNDATION CARITAS PREVOCATIONAL SCHOOL, DR VICKERS SAID CHAI WAN WAS THE FASTEST DEVELOPING AREA OF HONG KONG, AND WITH THE OPENING OF THE ISLAND EASTERN CORRIDOR AND THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY ISLAND LINE, TRANSPORT LINKS BETWEEN CHAI WAN AND OTHER AREAS HAVE IMPROVED CONSIDERABLY.

IN LINE WITH THIS, HE SAID, HOUSING WAS DEVELOPING RAPIDLY IN QUANTITY AS WELL AS QUALITY. IN THE CHAI WAN SOUTH AREAS, THERE WAS THE WAN TSUI ESTATE PHASE 3 HOUSING PROJECT FOR 7 000 PEOPLE, THE INTAKE OF WHICH WOULD BEGIN NEXT YEAR; AND ANOTHER LARGE-SCALE PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE SITUATED NEAR YUE WAN ESTATE WOULD BE BUILT TO HOUSE 9 500 PEOPLE BY 1988.

IN ADDITION, TWO PRIVATE HOUSING PROJECTS AT GREENWOOD TERRACE AND NEPTUNE TERRACE WOULD ACCOMMODATE ABOUT 15 000 RESIDENTS, WHILE THERE WERE ALSO PLANS FOR PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS AT THE TWO MTR STATION PODIUMS IN CHAI WAN.

TURNING TO EDUCATION, DR VICKERS SAID A TECHNICAL INSTITUTE WOULD BE BUILT SOUTH OF HENG FA TSUEN AND RECRUITMENT WOULD START IN 1987 FOR CRAFT COURSES FOR FORM THREE GRADUATES AND TECHNICAL COURSES FOR FORM FIVE GRADUATES.

THE MODERN TECHNICAL INSTITUTE COULD ACCOMMODATE NEARLY 10 000 FULL-TIME, PART-TIME EVENING AND PART-TIME DAY RELEASE STUDENTS.

ON RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, HE SAID THAT IN ADDITION TO THE SWIMMING POOL COMPLEX IN THE AREA, AN INDOOR GAMES HALL WOULD BE BUILT ABOVE THE YUE WAN MARKET AND CARPARK BUILDING TO PROVIDE MUCH NEEDED RECREATION FACILITIES IN THE DISTRICT.

IF APPROVED BY THE URBAN COUNCIL, THIS \$20 MILLION PROJECT WOULD START NEXT YEAR AND BE COMPLETED IN 1988, DR VICKERS SAID.

AS FOR LITTLE SAI WAN, CONSTRUCTION OF A PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE HAD ALREADY STARTED AND MAJOR RECLAMATION WORKS WOULD BE CARRIED OUT TO PROVIDE LAND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVATE COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS AND A WATERFRONT PARK.

DR VICKERS SAID IT WAS ANTICIPATED THAT THE PROJECTED POPULATION FOR LITTLE SAI WAN, WHEN FULLY DEVELOPED BY THE END OF 1990'S, WOULD BE ABOUT 35 000.

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EIGHT MAJOR PROJECTS EARMARKED FOR TUEN MUN  
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THE GOVERNMENT WILL SPEND \$183 MILLION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF EIGHT PUBLIC WORK PROJECTS IN TUEN MUN IN THE NEXT TWO YEARS.

TUEN MUN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR STEPHEN SELBY, SAID THE PUBLIC WORKS SUB-COMMITTEE RECENTLY AGREED TO THE EIGHT PROJECTS FOR 1986-87 AT ITS ANNUAL REVIEW MEETING.

THE PROJECTS, WHICH WOULD START AT DIFFERENT STAGES IN THE NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR, INCLUDE A PRIMARY SCHOOL AND A COMMUNITY CENTRE AT LEUNG KING-TIN KING ESTATE, A LAUNDRY AT THE TUEN MUN HOSPITAL; A SCHOOL CHILDREN'S DENTAL CLINIC; A LIBRARY, POST OFFICE BUILDING AND GARDEN INCORPORATED INTO THE CIVIC AND CULTURAL COMPLEX; PHASE II OF TUEN MUN TOWN PARK, DISTRICT OPEN SPACE; AND PHASE II OF THE BUTTERFLY BEACH RECREATIONAL AREA.

MR SELBY NOTED THAT THESE PROJECTS HAD BEEN DRAWN UP ON THE BASIS OF PROVIDING ESSENTIAL FACILITIES FOR BALANCED DEVELOPMENT IN THE DISTRICT.

AMONG THEM, THE CONSTRUCTION OF A DISTRICT LIBRARY AND A POST OFFICE WERE THE MOST IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE TOWN CENTRE BECAUSE SUCH FACILITIES WERE BADLY NEEDED.

A CENTRAL GARDEN WOULD LINK THE BUILDING BLOCKS WITHIN THE CIVIC AND CULTURAL COMPLEX TO FORM A CENTRALISED FOCAL POINT WITHIN THE TOWN CENTRE.

A SCHOOL CHILDREN'S DENTAL CLINIC, WHICH WOULD PROVIDE BASIC DENTAL CARE SERVICES TO PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILDREN, WOULD BE BUILT IN SEPTEMBER 1986 AND SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION IN AUGUST 1988.

THE CLINIC WOULD SERVE ABOUT 60 000 CHILDREN IN TUEN MUN WHO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE SCHOOL DENTAL CARE SERVICE PROGRAMME FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILDREN.

IN ORDER TO MAKE BETTER USE OF THE SITE, AN ADDITIONAL TWO FLOORS OF GOVERNMENT OFFICE ACCOMMODATION WITH AN AREA OF SOME 1 850 SQUARE METRES, WOULD BE PROVIDED FOR FUTURE GOVERNMENT OFFICES AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES.

FOLLOWING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TUEN MUN TOWN PARK, A DISTRICT OPEN SPACE WOULD BE BUILT NORTH OF SIU SHAN COURT.

THE DISTRICT OPEN SPACE WOULD INCLUDE A FULL-SIZE ARTIFICIAL TURF SOCCER PITCH AND SPECIALLY DESIGNED CYCLING FACILITIES. CONSTRUCTION WOULD START IN DECEMBER 1986 AND IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED BY MID-1988.

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EFFORTS CONTINUE TO TRACK DOWN ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS  
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THE DRAGNET ON ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS HIDING IN HONG KONG WAS FURTHER TIGHTENED UP THIS WEEK AS THE GOVERNMENT STEPPED UP OPERATIONS TO FERRET THEM OUT.

THE BLITZ BY THE POLICE, LABOUR AND IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENTS RESULTED IN THE ARREST OF 41 SUSPECTED UNDERGROUND CITIZENS.

ALL OF THEM HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT FOR FURTHER ENQUIRIES AND THOSE CONFIRMED TO BE ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS WILL BE REPATRIATED.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN AGAIN STRESSED TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THERE WOULD BE NO AMNESTY FOR ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS.

+THIS WEEK'S OPERATION SHOULD AGAIN MAKE IT CLEAR THAT THERE WILL BE NO CHANGE IN OUR IMMIGRATION POLICY,+ HE SAID. +WHENEVER AND WHEREVER ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS ARE FOUND, THEY WILL BE SENT BACK.+

THE SPOKESMAN NOTED THAT APART FROM CONTINUOUS CHECKS THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY, THERE WAS NO LET-UP IN ANTI-ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION EFFORTS AT THE BORDER.

+THE SECURITY FORCES AND THE POLICE WILL CONTINUE TO MAINTAIN A HIGH STATE OF VIGILANCE AT THE LAND AND SEA BORDER,+ HE SAID.

DURING THIS WEEK'S SPECIAL OPERATION, POLICE INCREASED THEIR IDENTIFICATION SPOT CHECKS IN PUBLIC PLACES AND CARRIED OUT CHECKS AT SUSPECT LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY.

THEY ARRESTED 37 SUSPECTED ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS. ANOTHER 66 PEOPLE WERE SUMMONSED FOR FAILING TO PRODUCE PROPER PROOF OF IDENTITY, AND A FURTHER FIVE WARNED IN RESPECT OF THIS OFFENCE, WHICH CARRIES A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$1 000.

ON THE LABOUR FRONT, INSPECTORS OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT VISITED 6 636 ESTABLISHMENTS TO CHECKS ON ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS WHO MIGHT BE WORKING THERE, AND TO ENSURE EMPLOYERS FULFIL THEIR LEGAL OBLIGATION OF KEEPING PROPER RECORDS OF THEIR EMPLOYEES.

A TOTAL OF 11 068 EMPLOYEES WERE CHECKED AND FOUR PERSONS IN FOUR ESTABLISHMENTS WERE FOUND WITHOUT PROPER PROOF OF IDENTITY. THEY HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION.

ANOTHER 27 ESTABLISHMENTS WERE FOUND TO BE KEEPING EITHER NO RECORD OR IMPROPER RECORDS OF EMPLOYEES.

THE SPOKESMAN REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT THEY COULD BE FINED UP TO \$50 000 AND JAILED FOR UP TO A YEAR IF THEY WERE FOUND TO BE EMPLOYING ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS.

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CALL TO PARTICIPATE IN CIVIC AFFAIRS  
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THE GOVERNMENT'S ROLE IN PROMOTING CIVIC EDUCATION IS TO GENERATE INTEREST AMONG PEOPLE FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN CIVIC AFFAIRS, DEPUTY REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR T.H. CHAU, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE BISHOP HALL JUBILEE SCHOOL SPEECH DAY, MR CHAU SAID THE GOVERNMENT HAD BEEN MAKING AN EFFORT TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT CIVIC RIGHTS AND POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT, SO THAT PEOPLE COULD GROW WITH A MORE OPEN GOVERNMENT AND PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC MATTERS.

SINCE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT BOARDS, MORE CHANNELS HAD BEEN PROVIDED FOR THE PUBLIC TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS ON POLICIES, MR CHAU SAID.

+BY VOICING THEIR OPINIONS, THE PUBLIC WOULD LEARN AND PROMOTE THE SPIRIT OF CIVIC EDUCATION,+ HE SAID.

MR CHAU URGED YOUNG PEOPLE TO ATTEND OPEN MEETINGS OF DISTRICT BOARDS, URBAN COUNCIL AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO SEE HOW REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT OPERATES.

+PUBLICITY CAMPAIGNS SUCH AS FIGHT CRIME, CLEAN HONG KONG, ANTI-NARCOTICS, AND ANTI-SMOKING ARE ANOTHER FORM OF CIVIC EDUCATION WHICH HAS THE SUPPORT OF THE COMMUNITY,+ HE SAID.

MR CHAU SAID CIVIC EDUCATION ALSO ENHANCED MORAL STANDARD.

+THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES AND ESTABLISHMENT OF HUMAN RELATIONS, WE WOULD BE ABLE TO BUILD UP OUR MORAL STANDARDS AND VALUES,+ HE SAID.
