BOARDS PAY \$6M INJURIES COMPENSATION
* * * * *

THE CRIMINAL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES COMPENSATION (CLEIC) BOARDS PAID OUT \$6.02 MILLION IN COMPENSATION TO VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDENTS IN 1986-87, COMPARED WITH \$4.82 MILLION IN THE PRECEDING YEAR, ACCORDING TO THE BOARDS' LATEST ANNUAL REPORT.

THESE PAYMENTS WERE AWARDED TO 1,136 CRIMINAL INJURIES CASES AND FOUR LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES CASES.

THEY ALSO BROUGHT THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF GRANTS AWARDED SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE CLEIC SCHEME IN 1973 TO \$32.87 MILLION.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARDS, MR ROBERT C. TANG, NOTED THAT A TOTAL OF 1,117 APPLICATIONS FOR COMPENSATION WERE RECEIVED IN THE YEAR UNDER REVIEW, REPRESENTING 14.7 PER CENT OF THE 7,600 REPORTED CASES OF CRIMINAL INJURIES DURING THE PERIOD.

VICTIMS OF ASSAULT AND WOUNDING AS WELL AS ROBBERY, THEFT AND BURGLARY MADE UP THE MAJORITY - ABOUT 92 PER CENT - OF THE APPLICANTS.

THERE WAS A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN APPLICATIONS ARISING FROM CASES OF ARSON WITH 25 APPLICATIONS, AS COMPARED WITH SIX IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR; AND CASES OF RAPE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT TOTALLED 18 AS AGAINST NINE.

ON THE OTHER HAND, APPLICATIONS RELATED TO ASSAULT AND WOUNDING DECREASED FROM 874 TO 700. APPLICATIONS RELATED TO CASES OF HOMICIDE, MURDER AND MANSLAUGHTER WENT DOWN FROM 46 TO 34.

OF THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED DURING THE YEAR, 706 WERE REFERRED BY THE POLICE, 394 SUBMITTED BY THE VICTIMS THEMSELVES OR THEIR FAMILIES, AND THE REST REFERRED BY OTHER ORGANISATIONS.

DURING THE PERIOD UNDER REVIEW, THE HIGHEST SINGLE PAYMENT OF \$300,000 WAS AWARDED TO AN APPELLANT OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES COMPENSATION CASE. THE LOWEST AWARD WAS \$126.

IN GRANTING THE COMPENSATION, THE BOARDS TOOK INTO CONSIDERATION THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE VICTIM'S INJURY, HIS SUFFERING, RESIDUAL DISABILITY, LOSS OF EARNINGS, CONDUCT AND WAY OF LIFE, MR TANG SAID.

HE ADDED THAT IN ORDER TO IMPROVE THE WORKING OF THE CLEIC SCHEME, THE BOARDS HAD PROPOSED TO EXTEND THE MAXIMUM PAYMENT PERIOD OF INJURY GRANT AND INTERIM ADJUSTMENT GRANT TO VICTIMS OF SERIOUS INJURIES FROM THREE MONTHS TO SIX MONTHS.

ANOTHER PROPOSAL WAS TO GIVE THE BOARDS DISCRETIONARY POWER TO INCREASE THE AWARDS TO RAPE VICTIMS, AND TO VICTIMS WHO HAD DEMONSTRATED EXEMPLARY EFFORTS IN ASSISTING THE POLICE IN THE IDENTIFICATION AND ARREST OF CRIMINALS, IN SPITE OF PERSONAL EMBARRASSMENT, INCONVENIENCE OR FEAR.

THE PROPOSALS WERE BEING CONSIDERED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

VA'S COMMENDED FOR PROVIDING SERVICES FOR ELDERLY

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ELIZABETH WONG, TODAY (SATURDAY) COMMENDED VOLUNTARY AGENCIES FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS IN PROVIDING SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY.

SHE WAS SPEAKING AT A CEREMONY TO COMMEMORATE THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE WONG FUNG TING HOSTEL FOR THE ELDERLY OF THE EASTERN DISTRICT WOMEN'S WELFARE CLUB IN SHEUNG SHUI.

MRS WONG POINTED OUT THAT MOST OF THE SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY SUCH AS OLD PEOPLE'S HOMES, HOSTELS FOR THE ELDERLY AND MANY COMMUNITY CARE SERVICES FOR SENIOR RESIDENTS WERE PROVIDED BY VOLUNTARY AGENCIES WITH GOVERNMENT SUBVENTIONS.

SHE NOTED THAT A WORKING GROUP SET UP IN 1972 TO STUDY SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY HAD, IN ITS REPORT PUBLISHED THE FOLLOWING YEAR, STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF CARE IN THE COMMUNITY AND BY THE COMMUNITY.

"THUS, A WIDE RANGE OF COMMUNITY SERVICES SUCH AS SOCIAL CENTRES, HOME HELP, COMMUNITY NURSING AND DAY CARE SERVICE ARE PROVIDED TO ENCOURAGE FAMILIES TO LOOK AFTER THEIR ELDERLY MEMBERS AND TO ENABLE OLD PEOPLE TO CONTINUE LIVING INDEPENDENTLY IN THE COMMUNITY," MRS WONG SAID.

"HOWEVER, THE NEED FOR RESIDENTIAL SERVICES IS ALSO FULLY RECOGNISED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AS CHANGES IN FAMILY CIRCUMSTANCES OR HEALTH CONDITIONS OFTEN GIVE RISE TO SUCH NEED BY SOME ELDERLY.

"WE ARE THEREFORE STRENGTHENING THESE SERVICES, AND THE PROVISION OF CARE AND ATTENTION PLACES WILL BE IMPROVED TO EIGHT PLACES PER 1,000 PEOPLE AGED OVER-60 FROM THE PREVIOUS FIVE PLACES SO AS TO SPEED UP THE PROVISION OF ADEQUATE CARE FOR THE ELDERLY," SHE ADDED.

MRS WONG COMMENDED THE EASTERN DISTRICT WOMEN'S WELFARE CLUB FOR PROVIDING SERVICES FOR WOMEN, CHILDREN AND THE ELDERLY.

FURTHER MEASURES TO PROMOTE CIVIC EDUCATION
* * * * *

THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION WILL CONTINUE TO GIVE SUPPORT TO LOCAL BODIES IN ORGANISING CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECTS, COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN, DR DANIEL TSE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OUTSTANDING CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECT AWARDS PRESENTATION CEREMONY.

DR TSE SAID MEASURES TO PROMOTE CIVIC EDUCATION WOULD INCLUDE CONTINUING TO HOLD THE AWARD SCHEME, HOLDING A SEMINAR AND CONDUCTING ANOTHER OPINION SURVEY ON HOW TO IMPROVE PROMOTION WORK FOR CIVIC EDUCATION.

OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS, THE COMMITTEE HAD SPENT \$750,000 IN SUBSIDISING 52 PROJECTS ORGANISED BY COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS TO DRIVE HOME THE CIVIC EDUCATION MESSAGE. THESE PROJECTS INCLUDED EXHIBITIONS, DRAMAS, VIDEO PRODUCTIONS, TRAINING SESSIONS, TALKS AND COMPETITIONS.

"THE OUTSTANDING CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECT AWARD SCHEME IS ORGANISED BY THE COMMITTEE TO ENCOURAGE LOCAL ORGANISATIONS TO PLAN AND PROVIDE BETTER CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECTS," HE STRESSED.

DR TSE ADDED THAT ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS FOR SUBSIDIES UNDER THIS YEAR'S COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION SCHEME TO ORGANISE CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECTS STARTED ON APRIL 15.

THE TOTAL AMOUNT ALLOCATED TO THE SCHEME HAS BEEN INCREASED TO \$600,000. THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT TO BE GRANTED TO EACH SELECTED PROJECT IS \$50,000.

APART FROM MATERIAL SUPPORT, DR TSE SAID THE COMMITTEE BELIEVED THAT MORE OPPORTUNITIES SHOULD BE PROVIDED FOR ORGANISATIONS TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON CIVIC EDUCATION AND TO ACQUIRE OTHER RESOURCES. TO THIS END, THE COMMITTEE PLANNED TO HOLD A SEMINAR AT THE END OF THE YEAR, FOLLOWING THE SUCCESS OF A SIMILAR FUNCTION HELD IN APRIL.

THE COMMITTEE ALSO PLANNED TO CONDUCT A SECOND OPINION SURVEY WITH A VIEW TO IMPROVING PROMOTION WORK FOR CIVIC EDUCATION. FINDINGS OF THE SURVEY WERE EXPECTED TO BE ANNOUNCED IN DECEMBER, DR TSE SAID.

REFERRING TO THE AWARD-WINNING PROJECTS ON DISPLAY AT THE CEREMONY, DR TSE SAID REPORTS ON THE PROJECTS, TOGETHER WITH OTHER REFERENCE MATERIALS, WOULD BE AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AT THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION HEADQUARTERS IN CANTON ROAD, TSIM SHA TSUI.

A MEMBER OF THE ADJUDICATION COMMITTEE FOR THE AWARD SCHEME, MR MAK HOI-WAH, SAID THE COMMITTEE SELECTED THE SEVEN OUTSTANDING PROJECTS AFTER HAVING CAREFULLY STUDIED THE REPORT ON EACH PROJECT AND DISCUSSED WITH THE ORGANISERS ON THE CONTENTS AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THEIR ENTRIES.

THE WINNING ENTRIES WERE SELECTED FOR THEIR CONTENTS, PRESENTATION, TARGET GROUPS, PUBLICITY AND EDUCATION VALUE, EFFICIENCY OF PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION AND COST-EFFECTIVENESS.

THE JOINT CONFERENCE ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION RECEIVED THE FIRST PRIZE OF \$8,000, WHILE THE SECOND AND THIRD PRIZES OF \$6,000 AND \$4,000 WENT TO THE CARITAS GROUP AND COMMUNITY WORK SERVICE KOWLOON AND THE SALVATION ARMY TAI WO HAU CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRE RESPECTIVELY.

FOUR OTHER ORGANISATIONS WERE AWARDED OUTSTANDING PRIZES OF \$2,000 EACH.

THE CHAMPION PROJECT CONSISTS OF A ROVING EXHIBITION, PRODUCTION OF A SLIDE SHOW AND A VIDEO PROGRAMME FOR LOAN TO VOLUNTARY AGENCIES AND SCHOOLS, AS WELL AS LEAFLETS FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE PUBLIC, ORGANISATIONS AND SCHOOLS.

THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD HAS BEEN ALLOCATED A TOTAL OF \$75,000 BY THE BOARD TO ORGANISE AND SPONSOR SOCIAL SERVICES PROJECTS IN THIS FINANCIAL YEAR.

"OF THE AMOUNT ALLOCATED, \$20,000 HAS BEEN EARMARKED AS GRANTS FOR LOCAL ORGANISATIONS TO CARRY OUT SOCIAL SERVICES PROJECTS IN THE DISTRICT," A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DISTRICT BOARD SAID.

SCHOOL PUPILS WHO HAVE A FLAIR FOR DRAWING AND PAINTING ARE INVITED TO TAKE PART IN THE FIFTH KANAGAWA BIENNIAL WORLD CHILDREN'S ART EXHIBITION - AND WIN A CHANCE TO VISIT JAPAN EARLY NEXT YEAR.

AIMED AT PROMOTING, THROUGH ART, MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING OF DIFFERENT LIVES AND CULTURES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, THE EXHIBITION WILL BE HELD IN MARCH NEXT YEAR. IT IS SPONSORED BY JAPAN'S KANAGAWA PREFECTURE.

PUPILS AGED BETWEEN FOUR AND 15 AS AT SEPTEMBER 30 THIS YEAR ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE.
