BAN ON SMOKING BEING EXTENDED  
\* \* \*

THE GOVERNMENT CAMPAIGN TO DISCOURAGE CIGARETTE SMOKING WILL REACH ANOTHER STAGE ON FEBRUARY 15 WHEN THE BAN WILL BE EXTENDED TO MORE PUBLIC AREAS AND THE HEALTH WARNING WILL HAVE TO BE CARRIED IN MOST TYPES OF CIGARETTE ADVERTISEMENTS.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY THAT FROM THAT DAY, SMOKING WILL BE PROHIBITED IN PUBLIC LIFTS, SINGLE DECKER ROAD PUBLIC TRANSPORT EXCEPT TAXIS AND HIRED CARS, AND THE LOWER DECKS OF DOUBLE DECKER BUSES AND TRAMS.

NO SMOKING AREAS WILL ALSO HAVE TO BE DESIGNATED IN NOT LESS THAN 50 PER CENT OF EACH CLASS OF SEATING ACCOMMODATION IN FERRIES, TRAINS, CINEMAS, CONCERT HALLS AND THEATRES.

+MANAGEMENTS WHO FAIL TO SET ASIDE SUCH AREAS OR FAIL TO DISPLAY APPROPRIATE +NO SMOKING+ SIGNS MAY BE FINED \$5 000. ANY PERSON WHO SMOKES OR CARRIES A LIGHTED CIGARETTE, CIGAR OR PIPE IN A NO SMOKING AREA MAY RECEIVE A \$1 000 FINE AND A FURTHER FINE OF \$3 000 IF HE FAILS TO PROVIDE CORRECT PERSONAL PARTICULARS TO THE MANAGEMENT ON DEMAND,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE SAID THAT SINCE NOVEMBER 15 LAST YEAR, IT HAS BEEN MANDATORY FOR ADVERTISEMENTS IN LOCAL NEWSPAPERS AND OTHER PRINTED MATTERS PUBLISHED OR DISTRIBUTED IN HONG KONG TO CARRY THE GOVERNMENT HEALTH WARNING AND THE TAR GROUP DESIGNATION OF THE CIGARETTES ADVERTISED.

FROM FEBRUARY 15, MOST OTHER TYPES OF CIGARETTE ADVERTISEMENTS, EXCEPT NEON SIGNS, WILL BE REQUIRED TO CARRY THE HEALTH WARNING. ANYONE RESPONSIBLE FOR A CIGARETTE ADVERTISEMENT WHICH DOES NOT CARRY THIS WARNING MAY BE FINED \$5 000 IN ADDITION TO \$500 FOR EACH DAY THE OFFENCE CONTINUES.

THE LANGUAGE, TYPEFACE, SIZE, SHAPE, COLOUR AND LOCATION OF THE HEALTH WARNING IN CIGARETTE ADVERTISEMENTS, AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR NO SMOKING SIGNS HAVE BEEN SPELT OUT IN DETAIL IN THE SMOKING (PUBLIC HEALTH) (NOTICES) ORDER 1982 PUBLISHED IN THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE ON AUGUST 13, 1982.

DETAILS OF THE OTHER STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS AND COMMENCEMENTS DATES WERE ALSO PUBLISHED ON THE SAME DAY, WHILE THE PRINCIPAL ORDINANCE WAS GAZETTED ON JULY 30, 1982.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT FROM MAY 15 THIS YEAR, THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE GOVERNMENT HEALTH WARNING TO BE INCLUDED IN CIGARETTE ADVERTISEMENTS WOULD BE EXTENDED TO NEON SIGNS.

FROM AUGUST 15, IT WILL BE MANDATORY FOR ALL CIGARETTE PACKETS AND RETAIL CONTAINERS ON SALE IN HONG KONG TO CARRY THE HEALTH WARNING AND TAR GROUP RATING. THOSE WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THESE REQUIREMENTS MAY BE FINED \$5 000.

TRAFFIC CHANGES

\* \* \* \*

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS, SOME OF THEM TEMPORARY, WILL BE INTRODUCED IN VARIOUS PARTS OF KOWLOON AND HONG KONG TOMORROW (FEBRUARY 8).

AT WANG TAU HOM ESTATE, WHERE A NEW EXTENSION OF FU KEUNG STREET BETWEEN FU MEI STREET AND WANG TAU HOM CENTRAL ROAD OPENS TO TWO-WAY TRAFFIC, WANG TAU HOM CENTRAL ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY EASTBOUND FROM 10 AM.

AT THE SAME TIME, A SECTION OF FU KEUNG STREET BETWEEN WANG TAU HOM CENTRAL ROAD AND WANG TAU HOM SOUTH ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY NORTHBOUND, WHILE WANG TAU HOM SOUTH ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY WESTBOUND.

IN TSZ WAN SHAN, THE SECTION OF WAN WAH STREET BETWEEN SHEUNG FUNG STREET AND YUK WAH STREET WILL REMAIN CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FOR WATER MAINS REPAIRS.

DURING THE CLOSURE, WAN WAH STREET BETWEEN SHEUNG FUNG STREET AND WAI WAH STREET WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY NORTHBOUND.

BUS ROUTES 3A, 3B, AND 15A FROM TSZ WAN SHAN WILL USE TSZ WAN SHAN ROAD, YUK WAH STREET AND WAN WAH STREET.

WHILE MAXICAB NO. 19 FROM TSZ WAN SHAN WILL USE TSZ WAN SHAN ROAD, PO KONG VILLAGE ROAD AND HAMMER HILL ROAD, ROUTE 20 FROM TSZ WAN SHAN WILL USE TSZ WAN SHAN ROAD, YUK WAH STREET, WAN WAH STREET AND SHUNG WAH STREET.

THE ROUTES OF THESE BUSES AND MAXICABS HEADING FOR TSZ WAN SHAN WILL REMAIN UNCHANGED.

TO AVOID CONGESTION, MOTORISTS HEADING FOR OR DEPARTING FROM TSZ WAN SHAN ARE ADVISED TO USE TSZ WAN SHAN ROAD AND PO KONG VILLAGE ROAD.

THE ARRANGEMENTS WILL LAST FOR ABOUT A WEEK, WITHIN WHICH THE REPAIRS ARE EXPECTED TO COMPLETE.

IN MONG KOK, THE SECTION OF FIFE STREET BETWEEN TUNG CHOI STREET AND FA YUEN STREET WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FROM 10 AM FOR THE LAYING OF WATER MAINS.

THE CLOSURE WILL LAST FOR ABOUT A MONTH, DURING WHICH EASTBOUND TRAFFIC ON FIFE STREET HEADING FOR FA YUEN STREET WILL BE DIVERTED VIA TUNG CHOI STREET, ARGYLE STREET, SAI YEE STREET, MONGKOK ROAD AND FA YUEN STREET, WHILE SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC ON TUNG CHOI STREET HEADING FOR FIFE STREET WILL HAVE TO USE ARGYLE STREET, SAI YEE STREET, MONGKOK ROAD, FA YUEN STREET AND FIFE STREET.

IN WONG CHUK HANG, SHUM WAN PIER DRIVE WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC BETWEEN 9 AM AND 4 PM FOR ROAD WORKS.

APPROPRIATE TRAFFIC SIGNS WILL BE ERECTED TO GUIDE MOTORISTS.

HOLIDAY POSTAL HOURS

THERE WILL BE ONE MAIL DELIVERY ON SATURDAY AND MONDAY (FEBRUARY 12 AND 14) DURING THE LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS, THE POSTMASTER GENERAL ANNOUNCED TODAY.

ON MONDAY MORNING (FEBRUARY 14) 35 POST OFFICES WILL BE OPEN FROM 9 AM TO 12 NOON. THEY INCLUDE THE GENERAL POST OFFICE ON HONG KONG ISLAND, KOWLOON CENTRAL AND TSIM SHA TSUI IN KOWLOON, AND TSUEN WAN AND TAI PO POST OFFICES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

ALL OTHER POST OFFICES WILL BE CLOSED FOR THE HOLIDAYS FROM FEBRUARY 12 TO 15.

HELP SOUGHT IN EASING AIRPORT HOLIDAY RUSH  
\* \* \* \*

PEOPLE LEAVING BY PLANE FOR THE LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS HAVE BEEN ASKED TO HELP EASE THE EXPECTED CONGESTION AT THE AIRPORT.

IN SEEKING PUBLIC COOPERATION, AN AIRPORT MANAGEMENT SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT SOME 20 000 PEOPLE ARE EXPECTED TO BE LEAVING THE AIRPORT EACH DAY FROM TOMORROW, AND SOME 23 000 ON LUNAR NEW YEAR'S DAY. THE BUILD UP OF RETURNING PASSENGERS IS EXPECTED ON THE THIRD AND FOURTH DAY OF THE LUNAR NEW YEAR, HE ADDED.

HE ADVISED PEOPLE TO TRAVEL TO THE AIRPORT BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT INSTEAD OF BY PRIVATE CARS AND URGED THEM TO TRY TO KEEP THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE SEEING THEM OFF TO A MINIMUM.

PEOPLE SHOULD ALSO ARRIVE EARLY FOR CHECK-IN, HE SAID.

A SPECIAL CHECK-IN AREA FOR GUANGZHOU-BOUND PASSENGERS WILL BE SET UP AT THE WESTERN-END OF THE DEPARTURE HALL TO PROCESS THE LARGE NUMBERS OF PASSENGERS EXPECTED.

PEOPLE ARE ASKED TO DISEMBARK FROM VEHICLES AT THE FAR END OF THE DEPARTURE LEVEL ROADWAY NEAREST TO THE SPECIAL CHECK-IN AREA.

+THIS PROCEDURE WILL HELP REDUCE UNNECESSARY CROSS FLOW OF PEOPLE AND BAGGAGE MOVEMENT IN THE DEPARTURE HALL,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+THE EFFICIENCY OF AIRPORT OPERATION WILL DEPEND GREATLY ON THE DEGREE OF CO-OPERATION FROM THE PUBLIC,+ HE SAID.

SPORTS FESTIVAL TO FOSTER DISTRICT IDENTITY

THE FIRST SHAM SHUI PO SPORTS FESTIVAL, FEATURING MORE THAN 20 INDOOR AND OUTDOOR ATHLETIC EVENTS, WATER SPORTS, BALL GAMES AND COMPETITIONS, TELEMATCHES AND ENTERTAINMENT SHOWS, WILL BEGIN ON FEBRUARY 20 (SUNDAY).

ANNOUNCING DETAILS OF THE PROGRAMME AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY, MR CHOW KWEN-LIM, CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, SAID THAT THE FESTIVAL IS AIMED AT FOSTERING A DISTRICT IDENTITY AND PROMOTING COMMUNITY BUILDING.

APART FROM THE CONVENTIONAL SPORTS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE, THERE WILL BE FUNCTIONS SPECIALLY ORGANISED FOR THE ELDERLY AND CHILDREN, INCLUDING A WALK FOR THE ELDERLY, AND FUN SPORTS FOR JUNIORS AND BEGINNERS.

MR CHOW SAID ABOUT \$280 000 WOULD BE SPENT ON THE TWO-WEEK FESTIVAL. MORE THAN HALF WOULD BE CONTRIBUTED BY THE LOCAL DISTRICT BOARD AND THE BALANCE BY THE DISTRICT'S FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE AND PRIVATE DONATIONS.

AN OPENING CEREMONY WILL BE HELD AT 9 AM ON FEBRUARY 20 AT THE MONG KOK STADIUM, FOLLOWED BY A FOUR-HOUR PROGRAMME WITH A VARIETY OF RACES AND PERFORMANCES FEATURING A MASS PARADE, A FOLK DANCE DISPLAY, A LONG DISTANCE RUN, A GYMNASTIC PARADE AND A RELAY RACE.

HIGHLIGHTING THE DAY WILL BE A TELEMATCH IN WHICH LOCAL RESIDENTS, DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS, TVB ARTISTS AND THE SEIKO FOOTBALL TEAM WILL PARTICIPATE.

ADMISSION TO ALL EVENTS IS FREE. DETAILS OF THE PROGRAMME ARE NOW AVAILABLE AT THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT OFFICE AND ITS SUB-OFFICES AND THE SHAM SHUI PO RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE.

CO-ORDINATED BY THE DISTRICT OFFICE, THE SPORTS FESTIVAL IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT BOARD, URBAN COUNCIL, RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT, SHAM SHUI PO SPORTS ASSOCIATION AND LOCAL ORGANISATIONS.

SCHOOLS URGED TO SUPPORT FIGHT YOUTH CRIME DRIVE  
\* \* \* \*

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR MICHAEL LEUNG, TODAY (MONDAY) CALLED ON SCHOOL AUTHORITIES TO CONTINUE THEIR STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE FIGHT YOUTH CRIME CAMPAIGN.

HE SAID ALTHOUGH THE NUMBER OF JUVENILES PROSECUTED FOR CRIME HAD DROPPED BY 23 PER CENT IN 1982 OVER THE 1981 FIGURES, THERE WERE STILL TOO MANY YOUNG PEOPLE INVOLVED IN SERIOUS CRIMES.

+THE GOVERNMENT AND THE COMMUNITY ARE CHARGED WITH THE URGENT TASK OF RECTIFYING THIS UNSATISFACTORY SITUATION,+ SAID MR LEUNG, WHO IS ALSO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON UNRULY AND DELINQUENT BEHAVIOUR IN SCHOOLS.

MR LEUNG WAS SPEAKING AT THE PRIZE PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF THE FIGHT YOUTH CRIME ESSAY COMPETITION ORGANISED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S COMMUNITY YOUTH CLUB SECTION AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE.

THE AIM OF THE COMPETITION IS TO PUT ACROSS THE MESSAGE THAT CRIME DOES NOT PAY AND TO MAKE STUDENTS AWARE OF THE GRAVE CONSEQUENCES OF BECOMING INVOLVED IN CRIME.

MORE THAN 300 SCHOOLS ENTERED THE COMPETITION AND SUBMITTED A TOTAL OF 1 266 ESSAYS.

THE WINNER FOR THE PRIMARY DIVISION WAS WONG TOU OF CHIU SHEUNG SCHOOL, WHILE THE FIRST PRIZES FOR THE JUNIOR AND SENIOR SECONDARY DIVISIONS WENT TO YUEN SIU-MAY OF MING KEI COLLEGE AND WONG SING-KWAN OF ST STEPHEN'S COLLEGE RESPECTIVELY. PRIZES WERE ALSO PRESENTED TO 36 OTHER STUDENTS.

STORAGE IN HONG KONG'S RESERVOIRS AT 9 AM TODAY (MONDAY) STOOD AT 71.1 PER CENT OF CAPACITY OR 410.605 MILLION CUBIC METRES.

THIS TIME LAST YEAR THE RESERVOIRS CONTAINED 249.151 MILLION CUBIC METRES OF WATER, REPRESENTING 43.1 PER CENT OF CAPACITY.
