SIR DAVID PRAISES CULTURAL PROGRESS

THE PAST 20 YEARS HAVE SEEN AN EXPLOSION OF INTEREST IN THE ARTS, RELEASING THE CREATIVITY, VISION AND IMAGINATION OF HONG KONG'S YOUNG PEOPLE, THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE 1987 HONG KONG ARTS FESTIVAL, SIR DAVID SAID THIS DEVELOPMENT WOULD TAKE HONG KONG FORWARD TO NEW REALMS OF ACHIEVEMENT AND TO A NEW ROLE IN THE REGION AS A MEETING PLACE FOR THE CULTURES OF EAST AND WEST.

+THE SPIRIT OF ENTERPRISE WHICH INVIGORATES INDUSTRY AND COMMERCE IN HONG KONG HAS ALSO, IN RECENT YEARS, INSPIRED THE DEVELOPMENT OF OUR PERFORMING ARTS,+ HE SAID.

SIR DAVID SAID HE WAS DELIGHTED TO SEE THE GROWING INTEREST AND SUPPORT FROM THE COMMUNITY, NOT ONLY IN THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO ATTENDED PERFORMANCES, BUT IN THE SUPPORT GIVEN BY THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY THROUGH SPONSORSHIP OF PROGRAMMES.

HE PAID TRIBUTE TO THE ORGANISERS, IN PARTICULAR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ARTS FESTIVAL SOCIETY, SIR RUN RUN SHAW, FOR STAGING THE FOUR-WEEK FESTIVAL, AND TO SPONSORS FOR THEIR SUPPORT.

BUSY YEAR ALL ROUND FOR FIREMEN

* * * * *

MORE FIRES HAVE BEEN RECORDED LAST YEAR COMPARED WITH 1985, ACCORDING TO STATISTICS OF THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

A TOTAL OF 18 808 FIRE CALLS WERE RESPONDED TO COMPARED WITH 14 722 IN 1985. THE NUMBER OF INJURIES AND FATALITIES CAUSED BY FIRE ALSO ROSE IN 1986 WITH 667 PEOPLE INJURED AND 45 DEATHS.

+AMONG THESE CALLS, 7 593 WERE FALSE ALARM CASES MOSTLY CAUSED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE ALARM SYSTEMS, AS COMPARED WITH 4 877 SIMILAR CALLS IN 1985,+ A FIRE SERVICES SPOKESMAN SAID.

AS IN THE PREVIOUS YEARS, THE LARGEST SINGLE CATEGORY OF CAUSES OF FIRE WAS CARELESS HANDLING OR DISPOSAL OF CIGARETTES AND MATCHES WHICH ACCOUNTED FOR 4 431 CALLS.

ELECTRICAL FAULT WAS THE SECOND HIGHEST CAUSE WITH 1 749 CASES, WHILE OVERCOOKING WAS THE THIRD HIGHEST WITH 1 615 CASES.

+HOTEL FIRES WENT UP FROM FIVE CASES IN 1985 TO 13 IN 1986,+
THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE NUMBER OF FIRES IN SQUATTERS ALSO SHOWED A SLIGHT INCREASE
DURING THE PERIOD FROM 368 IN 1985 TO 425 LAST YEAR AND IN
FACTORIES FROM 466 IN 1985 TO 534 LAST YEAR.

SPECIAL SERVICES RESPONDED TO BY THE FIRE SERVICES INCLUDING
LANDSLIDES, HOUSE COLLAPSES, DROWNING, TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS AND
GAS LEAKAGE AND SO ON WENT UP FROM 9 594 CASES IN 1985 TO 10 895
IN 1986.

+AMONG THE SPECIAL SERVICES, 'PEOPLE TRAPPED IN MOUNTAINS'
CASES ROSE TO 37 FROM 18 IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR. GAS LEAKAGE CASES
INCREASED FROM 289 IN 1985 TO 442 IN 1986,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE AMBULANCE COMMAND ALSO RESPONDED TO A RECORD 365 574 CALLS
WITH EMERGENCY ACCOUNTING FOR 250 323 CALLS, REPRESENTING AN
AVERAGE OF 1 001 CALLS A DAY. IN 1985, THERE WERE 333 905 CALLS
OF WHICH 233 178 WERE EMERGENCY.

THE NUMBER OF PATIENTS CARRIED BY AMBULANCES BOTH FOR
EMERGENCY AND NON-EMERGENCY ACHIEVED ANOTHER RECORD OF 468 554,
COMPARED WITH 441 174 PATIENTS IN 1985.

\$35.5 MILLION PAID TO TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS

THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT PAID OUT \$35.5 MILLION IN 1986
TO HELP TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDANTS.

THE PAYMENTS WERE MADE UNDER THE TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS
ASSISTANCE (TAVA) SCHEME ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT, AND
REPRESENTED A 2.6 PER CENT INCREASE OVER PAYMENTS MADE IN 1985.

DURING THE YEAR, 5 505 APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE WERE
RECEIVED AS AGAINST 5 660 THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

ABOUT 92 PER CENT OF THE APPLICATIONS, OR 5 076 CASES, WERE
SUCCESSFUL.

THE ACCIDENT WHICH RESULTED IN THE LARGEST NUMBER OF INJURED
PERSONS OCCURRED ON NOVEMBER 5 AT SHEK PAI TAU ROAD NEAR THE JUNCTION
OF MING KAM ROAD, KWAI CHUNG. OF THE 70 VICTIMS INVOLVED, 32 WERE
PAID ASSISTANCE TOTTALLING \$102 303.

DURING THE YEAR, THE HIGHEST SINGLE PAYMENTS OF \$47 950 WERE PAID IN THREE CASES INVOLVING THE LOSS OF THE SOLE WAGE-EARNERS.

THE TAVA SCHEME PROVIDES QUICK FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDANTS WITHOUT TAKING REGARD OF THE MEANS OF THE FAMILY OR THE ELEMENT OF FAULT IN CAUSING THE ACCIDENT.

ANY PERSON INJURED IN A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT IS ELIGIBLE FOR ASSISTANCE IF THE CASE HAD BEEN REPORTED TO THE POLICE, AND THE VICTIM HAS OBTAINED THREE DAYS' SICK LEAVE FROM A REGISTERED DOCTOR OR BY HOSPITALISATION OR BY CERTIFICATION. APPLICATIONS MUST BE MADE TO THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF THE ACCIDENT.

RECIPIENTS OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE AND SPECIAL NEEDS ALLOWANCE HOLDING CASH ORDER BOOKS MAY RECEIVE EARLIER PAYMENT IF THEIR PAYMENT DATES FALL ON JANUARY 29, 30, 31 AND 31 AND FEBRUARY 1.

A SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THEY MAY CASH THEIR COUPONS ON JANUARY 23, 26, 27 AND 28 RESPECTIVELY OR AFTER AT THE DESIGNATED POST OFFICES, NEW TERRITORIES DISTRICT OFFICES AND TREASURY SUB-OFFICES.

THE SHOW WILL BE BROADCAST ON RTHK RADIO 1 BETWEEN 5 PM AND 6 PM ON JANUARY 25.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE URGED RESIDENTS TO BE ON GUARD AGAINST BURGLARS.

+NOW IS THE TIME TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS AGAINST CRIME,+ HE ADDED.

CRIME PREVENTION MEASURES HIGHLIGHTED IN THE SHOW INCLUDED LOCKING UP DOORS AND WINDOWS PROPERLY AT NIGHT OR BEFORE LEAVING HOME, CHECKING THE CONDITIONS OF LOCKS AND WINDOW GRILLES OR BARS, AND CAREFULLY CHECKING THE IDENTITY OF STRANGERS WHO MAY CALL AT FLATS.

+ANYONE REQUIRING FURTHER ADVICE OF CRIME PREVENTION MAY CONTACT THE POLICE CRIME PREVENTION BUREAU AT 3-7212486 OR THE CRIME PREVENTION OFFICER AT THE LOCAL DISTRICT POLICE STATION,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

PEOPLE CLEANING THEIR HOMES IN PREPARATION FOR THE LUNAR NEW YEAR CAN TAKE THEIR JUNK AND REFUSE TO THE NEAREST JUNK OR REFUSE COLLECTION POINT.

FROM JANUARY 22 TO 28, 95 TEMPORARY AND 133 PERMANENT COLLECTION POINTS WILL BE OPENED TO THE PUBLIC IN THE URBAN AREAS, AN URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

EASTERN RESIDENTS PRAISED FOR HELPING FIGHT CRIME
* * * * *

EASTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BOWEN LEUNG, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT JOINT PUBLIC AND POLICE EFFORTS WERE AN EFFECTIVE WEAPON IN THE FIGHT AGAINST CRIME.

SPEAKING AT THE EASTERN DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME CAMPAIGN'S GOOD CITIZENS AWARD PRESENTATION CEREMONY, MR LEUNG SAID 12 RESIDENTS WERE SELECTED FOR THEIR BRAVERY IN HELPING THE POLICE TO ARREST CRIMINALS.

HE ALSO PRAISED MEMBERS OF THE EASTERN DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE AND RESIDENTS WHO HAD ACHIEVED GREAT SUCCESS IN HELPING THE POLICE IN THE WAR AGAINST CRIME.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE CEREMONY, THE EASTERN POLICE DISTRICT COMMANDER, MR G.W. ROPER, SAID THE DISTRICT HAD SOME SUCCESSFUL ACHIEVEMENTS IN FIGHTING CRIME AS REFLECTED IN A 10.1 PER CENT DECREASE IN THE CRIME RATE IN 1986 AS COMPARED WITH 1985.

BUT HE POINTED OUT THAT THERE WAS A CONTINUING HIGH PATTERN OF BURGLARIES IN THE LAST FIVE MONTHS OF 1986, AND APPEALED TO HOSEHOLDERS TO TAKE SENSIBLE PRECAUTIONS IN THEIR HOMES AND TO JOIN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME.

MR ROPER SAID THAT CONTINUING INVOLVEMENT IN CRIME SUCH AS ROBBERY, BURGLARY, BLACKMAIL AND INTIMIDATION BY YOUNG PEOPLE WERE SERIOUS OFFENCES EVEN THOUGH THE MONEY INVOLVED WAS OFTEN SMALL.

TYPHOON WAYNE GOES INTO THE RECORD BOOK
* * * * *

TYPHOON WAYNE, WHICH AFFECTED HONG KONG BETWEEN AUGUST 19 AND SEPTEMBER 5 LAST YEAR, SET A RECORD AS THE FIRST TROPICAL CYCLONE EVER TO REQUIRE THE HOISTING OF WARNING SIGNALS ON THREE SEPARATE OCCASIONS.

ANOTHER FEATURE OF 1986 WAS A RECORD LOW TEMPERATURE OF 4.8 DEGREES CELSIUS FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH.

HOWEVER, IN ITS SUMMARY OF THE YEAR'S WEATHER, THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY REPORTS THAT, ON THE WHOLE, 1986 WAS NORMAL. THE YEAR'S MEAN TEMPERATURE RECORDED WAS THE SAME AS THE NORMAL VALUE OF 22.8 DEGREES CELSIUS WHILE RAINFALL, TOTALLING 2 338.3 MILLIMETRES, WAS ONLY FIVE PER CENT ABOVE NORMAL.

TWO UNUSUAL OCCURRENCES WERE A WATERSPOUT NEAR TAP MUN AND A TORNADO IN ABERDEEN IN AUGUST.

THE GALE OR STORM SIGNAL WAS HOISTED TWICE IN 1986, DURING THE APPROACH OF TYPHOON PEGGY IN JULY AND OF TYPHOON WAYNE IN AUGUST. BOTH TYPHOONS CAUSED SOME DAMAGE TO HONG KONG.

/JANUARY WAS

SUNDAY, JANUARY 18, 1987

- 12 -

JANUARY WAS GENERALLY FINE AND SUNNY WITH NO MEASURABLE RAINFALL. IT WAS THE SECOND DRIEST JANUARY SINCE RECORDS BEGAN IN 1884.

FEBRUARY WAS COLDER AND WETTER THAN USUAL. THE MONTH'S MEAN TEMPERATURE OF 14.7 DEGREES WAS 1.2 DEGREES BELOW NORMAL WHILE THE TOTAL RAINFALL OF 68.8 MM WAS 64 PER CENT ABOVE THE NORMAL AMOUNT FOR THE MONTH.

THE WINTER MONSOON WAS ACTIVE IN MARCH. A RECORD LOW TEMPERATURE OF 4.8 DEGREES FOR THE MONTH WAS SET ON MARCH 1. HOAR FROST WAS REPORTED AT TAI MO SHAN AND TATE'S CAIRN ON THE FIRST TWO DAYS OF THE MONTH AND TEMPERATURES THERE DROPPED TO -4.0 DEGREES AND -0.5 DEGREE RESPECTIVELY ON MARCH 2.

THE MONTH WAS ALSO CHARACTERISED BY THE FREQUENT OCCURRENCE OF FOG. COASTAL FOG WAS EXPERIENCED ON 15 DAYS, EQUALLING THE RECORD SET IN MARCH 1980.

UNDER THE CONTINUED INFLUENCE OF A MOIST SOUTHEASTERLY AIRSTREAM, SEA FOG OCCURRED ON THE MORNINGS OF APRIL 10 AND 11, DISRUPTING FERRY SERVICES. TWO FERRIES WERE INVOLVED IN A MINOR COLLISION DURING FOG.

THUNDERY SHOWERS ON APRIL 21 AND 22 CAUSED LANDSLIPS IN SEVERAL DISTRICTS. TOTAL RAINFALL RECORDED ON THESE TWO DAYS AMOUNTED TO 106.3 MM, ACCOUNTING FOR MORE THAN 90 PER CENT OF THE MONTH'S TOTAL.

ALTHOUGH THE TOTAL RAINFALL FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THE YEAR WAS BELOW NORMAL, THE RAINFALL IN MAY WAS MORE THAN SUFFICIENT TO MAKE UP THE DEFICIT. THE TOTAL RAINFALL RECORDED FOR THE FIRST FIVE MONTHS WAS 615.0 MM, WHICH WAS 10 PER CENT ABOVE THE NORMAL AMOUNT.

A CONTINUOUS HEAVY DOWNPOUR AND SQUALLY THUNDERSTORMS AFFECTED HONG KONG ON MAY 11 AS AN ACTIVE LOW PRESSURE AREA APPROACHED. OVER 200 MM OF RAINFALL WERE RECORDED IN TAI LAM CHUNG, TAI MO SHAN AND TAI PO. THE HEAVY DOWNPOUR CONTINUED ON MAY 12 AND 48 CASES OF FLOODING AND SEVEN LANDSLIPS WERE REPORTED.

JUNE WAS NORMAL FOR TEMPERATURE, CLOUDINESS AND PRECIPITATION. A TOTAL OF 415.9 MM OF RAINFALL WAS RECORDED, COMPARED WITH THE MONTH'S NORMAL OF 431.8 MM. HOWEVER, IT WAS UNEVENLY DISTRIBUTED AND RAINFALL ON TWO DAYS - JUNE 6 AND 25 - ACCOUNTED FOR 58 PER CENT OF THE MONTH'S TOTAL.

RAINY WEATHER CONTINUED AFTER THE DOWNPOUR OF JUNE 6, LEADING TO MINOR FLOODING AND A LANDSLIP.

/JULY WAS

SUNDAY, JANUARY 18, 1987

JULY WAS WETTER THAN USUAL, WITH THE TOTAL RAINFALL OF 547.3 MM BEING 73 PER CENT ABOVE NORMAL.

TYPHOON PEGGY, THE FIRST TYPHOON OF THE YEAR, BROUGHT ABOUT 85 PER CENT OF THE MONTH'S RAINFALL ON JULY 3 AND 4.

HEAVY SHOWERS AND SQUALLY THUNDERSTORMS OCCURRED ON JULY 3 WHEN A MOISTURE-LADEN SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTED THE TERRITORY. THERE WERE 39 CASES OF MINOR FLOODING AND FIVE LANDSLIPS IN VARIOUS PARTS OF HONG KONG.

TYPHOON PEGGY CROSSED LUZON ON JULY 9 AND HEADED TOWARDS THE SOUTH CHINA COAST. WITH LIGHT WINDS OFF THE LAND AHEAD OF PEGGY, THE TEMPERATURE IN HONG KONG ROSE TO 34.8 DEGREES IN THE AFTERNOON OF JULY 10, MAKING IT THE FOURTH HOTTEST JULY DAY ON RECORD.

ON JULY 11, THE WEATHER DETERIORATED RAPIDLY UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF PEGGY WHICH MADE LANDFALL NEAR SHANWEI IN THE AFTERNOON. STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS ACCOMPANIED BY WIDESPREAD AND FREQUENT SQUALLY SHOWERS BATTERED THE TERRITORY UNTIL THE MORNING OF JULY 12.

AUGUST WAS HOTTER THAN USUAL WITH A MEAN TEMPERATURE OF 29 DEGREES WHICH WAS THE THIRD HIGHEST FOR AUGUST ON RECORD.

THUNDERSTORMS WERE FREQUENT DURING THE MONTH. FROM AUGUST 9 TO 11, HONG KONG WAS AFFECTED BY SQUALLY HEAVY SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS AS A TROPICAL DEPRESSION OVER THE SOUTH CHINA SEA MOVED TOWARDS HAINAN. OVER 300 MM OF RAINFALL WERE RECORDED AT TAI PO, SHA TAU KOK AND SAI KUNG.

SEVERE TROPICAL STORM WAYNE FIRST APPROACHED HONG KONG FROM THE SOUTH, RESULTING IN FRESH TO STRONG EASTERLY WINDS LOCALLY ON AUGUST 20. WINDS REACHED GALE FORCE OFFSHORE BRIEFLY OVERNIGHT AS WAYNE ACCELERATED EAST-NORTHEASTWARDS AWAY FROM HONG KONG.

ON AUGUST 21, AFTER A VERY HOT AND SUNNY DAY, SQUALLY THUNDERSTORMS DEVELOPED OVERLAND AND MOVED SOUTHEASTWARDS TO AFFECT HONG KONG IN THE EVENING.

AFTER CROSSING TAIWAN, WAYNE WEAKENED TO A TROPICAL STORM AND MOVED SOUTHWESTWARDS BACK INTO THE SOUTH CHINA SEA. AS IT HEADED WESTWARDS TOWARDS DONGSHA, LOCAL SIGNALS WERE HOISTED A SECOND TIME ON AUGUST 25 BUT LOWERED THE NEXT DAY AS WAYNE MOVED SOUTHWESTWARDS AWAY FROM HONG KONG.

WAYNE THEN TURNED NORTHEASTWARDS TO AFFECT THE BASHI CHANNEL AND PHILIPPINES. IT LATER STRENGTHENED TO A TYPHOON, HEADING WESTWARDS AGAIN TO AFFECT HONG KONG A THIRD TIME ON SEPTEMBER 4 AND 5.

/SEPTEMBER WAS

SUNDAY, JANUARY 18, 1987

- 14 -

SEPTEMBER WAS NORMAL APART FROM BEING SLIGHTLY DRIER THAN USUAL. HOWEVER, HEAVY AND THUNDERY SHOWERS AFFECTED HONG KONG ON SEPTEMBER 16, AND 72.0 MM OF RAINFALL WERE RECORDED BETWEEN 2 PM AND 8 PM, RESULTING IN 11 CASES OF FLOODING.

OCTOBER WAS DRIER THAN USUAL WITH 61.3 MM OF RAINFALL, REPRESENTING ONLY 51 PER CENT OF THE NORMAL AMOUNT.

ON OCTOBER 18, TYPHOON ELLEN APPROACHED FROM THE SOUTHEAST AND PASSED ABOUT 150 KM TO THE SOUTH-SOUTHWEST OF HONG KONG, CAUSING ONLY MINOR DAMAGE TO THE TERRITORY.

AN INTENSE SURGE OF THE WINTER MONSOON ARRIVED ON OCTOBER 28, BRINGING NOTICEABLY COOLER WEATHER TO HONG KONG TOWARDS THE END OF THE MONTH.

NOVEMBER WAS WETTER THAN NORMAL, WITH 112.6 MM OF RAINFALL. ALTHOUGH THE AMOUNT WAS MORE THAN THREE TIMES THE MONTH'S NORMAL VALUE, THE ACCUMULATED RAINFALL SINCE JANUARY 1 WAS ONLY FOUR PER CENT ABOVE NORMAL.

SEVERE TROPICAL STORM IDA, WHICH AFFECTED THE NORTHERN PART OF THE SOUTH CHINA SEA AROUND THE MIDDLE OF THE MONTH, ACCOUNTED FOR MOST OF THE NOVEMBER RAINFALL.

DECEMBER WAS CHARACTERISED BY A SIGNIFICANT COLD SNAP FROM DECEMBER 18 TO 20 FOLLOWED BY AN UNSEASONABLE WARM PERIOD LEADING UP TO CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR.
