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NO AMNESTY FOR ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS, SAYS THE GOVERNOR

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HONG KONG KEPT IN VERY CLOSE TOUCH WITH THE GUANGDONG AUTHORITIES ON THE QUESTION OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS, THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

NOTING THAT THERE WAS AN INCREASE IN ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS RECENTLY, SIR DAVID STRESSED THAT THERE WAS NO QUESTION EVER OF AN AMNESTY.

"THOSE WHO ARE FOUND HERE TO BE ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS WILL BE SENT BACK TO CHINA. THAT MESSAGE MUST GET ACROSS VERY LOUDLY AND CLEARLY TO GUANGDONG," HE SAID.

THE GOVERNOR WAS SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AT THE AIRPORT ON HIS RETURN FROM LONDON.

"WE HAVE VERY STRICT CONTROL AT THE MOMENT. WE WATCH VERY CAREFULLY THE BORDER AND THAT WILL BE MAINTAINED AT A HIGH LEVEL. THOSE WHO ARE FOUND AS ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS HERE, WHETHER THEY ARE FOUND COMING INTO HONG KONG OR WHETHER THEY ARE FOUND HAVING WORKED HERE, WILL BE SENT BACK TO CHINA," SIR DAVID POINTED OUT.

HE SAID THAT THOSE WHO TRIED TO MAKE UNSCRUPULOUS USE OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS BY EMPLOYING THEM MUST ALSO BE DEALT WITH UNDER THE LAW.

"WE HAVE LAWS TO DEAL WITH THAT AND WE MUST TRY TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE APPLIED EFFECTIVELY," HE ADDED.

ASKED IF HE WAS AWARE OF ANY CHANGE OF AMERICAN STANCE ON THE QUESTION OF VIETNAMESE BOAT PEOPLE, SIR DAVID SAID THAT THERE HAD BEEN SOME CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF PEOPLE WHO HAD REALLY BEEN FOLLOWING THE PROBLEM IN DETAIL.

"THEY REALISE THAT IN ORDER TO DEAL WITH THIS SITUATION YOU HAVE GOT TO HAVE ARRANGEMENTS FOR RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES PEOPLE WHO ARE FOUND NOT TO BE GENUINE REFUGEES. AND I HAVE FOUND AN INCREASING WILLINGNESS TO UNDERSTAND THAT AMONGST MEMBERS OF CONGRESS AND THE WELL INFORMED PRESS IN THE UNITED STATES," HE SAID.

ON THE STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING TO BE HELD IN GENEVA LATER THIS MONTH, SIR DAVID SAID IT WAS VERY HARD TO SAY AT THE MOMENT WHAT THE OUTCOME WOULD BE.

HE SAID THAT THERE WAS NEAR UNANIMOUS AGREEMENT AT THE EARLIER MEETING IN JANUARY THIS YEAR AND HE HOPED THAT THE WORLD COMMUNITY WOULD PUSH THIS ONE FORWARD.

ON HIS VISIT TO BRITAIN, THE GOVERNOR SAID THAT HE HAD FOUND AN ENORMOUS AMOUNT OF INTEREST IN HONG KONG AND HE WELCOMED THE OPPORTUNITY HE HAD HAD TO TALK TO PEOPLE ABOUT THE ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES THERE WERE HERE FOR INVESTORS.

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ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS POSSIBLE WITH RESOLUTE ACTION

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WITH RESOLUTE ACTION, IT IS POSSIBLE TO BRING ABOUT WORTHWHILE AND SOMETIMES DRAMATIC IMPROVEMENTS IN THE ENVIRONMENT, THE DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, DR STUART REED, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE CITED AS AN EXAMPLE THE VERY RECENT SUBSTANTIAL REDUCTIONS OF AIR POLLUTION LEVELS IN INDUSTRIAL AREAS WHICH HAD RESULTED FROM THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE FUEL RESTRICTION REGULATIONS.

THE NEW REGULATIONS CAME INTO FORCE ON JULY 1, REQUIRING THAT ALL INDUSTRIAL BOILERS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT BURNING HEAVY, DIRTY HIGH SULPHUR FUEL OIL SHOULD CHANGE TO LIGHT, LOW SULPHUR DIESEL FUEL OIL.

"IN THE LAST COUPLE OF DAYS, WE HAVE SEEN A DRAMATIC AND SUBSTANTIAL DROP IN AIR POLLUTION LEVELS IN INDUSTRIAL/RESIDENTIAL AREAS," DR REED SAID.

"NOT ONLY SULPHUR DIOXIDE, BUT ALSO OXIDES OF NITROGEN AND SMOKE HAVE DECREASED AND THE AIR OVER TSUEN WAN AND KWUN TONG IS DISTINCTLY CLEANER," HE SAID.

DR REED WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A FIVE-DAY JOINT SCHOOL EXHIBITION ON ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ORGANISED BY THE SCHOOL CONSERVANCY CLUBS' LIAISON BOARD, FRIENDS OF THE EARTH AND JARDINE'S AMBASSADORS.

"IT IS, OF COURSE, ESSENTIAL THAT WE CONTINUE, THROUGH MEANS SUCH AS THIS EXHIBITION, TO WAKE UP OUR COMMUNITY FROM ITS ENVIRONMENTAL SLEEP WALKING IN WHICH WE ARE TRAMPLING ALL OVER OUR OWN PRECIOUS ENVIRONMENT AND MAKE INDIVIDUALS REALISE THE DAMAGE THAT THEY ARE DOING.

"BUT THERE IS ALWAYS A DANGER THAT IN FOCUSING ON THE PROBLEMS, WE LOSE SIGHT OF THE FACT THAT WE CAN ACTUALLY ACHIEVE IMPROVEMENTS, GIVEN THE WILL TO FIGHT FOR THEM.

"WE MANAGED TO AVERT THE CLOSURE OF THE BATHING BEACHES ON THE SOUTH OF HONG KONG ISLAND LAST SUMMER, THOUGH ONLY JUST WITH SOME FIRST AID MEASURES.

"THE STREAM IN FO TAN AND THE LAM TSUEN RIVER NOW RUN MUCH MORE CLEARLY AND FREELY AND THERE IS NO LONGER A STINK OF ROTTING PIG WASTES IF YOU STROLL IN THE EVENING ALONG STANLEY MAIN STREET," HE SAID.

"EVEN THE BLACK RIVER IN SAI KUNG MUST BE BEGINNING TO FORGET ITS NAME NOW THAT IT IS RECOVERING FROM DECADES OF DYE-WORKS POLLUTION AND THE STONES ALONG THE RIVER BED, WASHED CLEAN BY THE RECENT STORMS, ONCE MORE REFLECT THE NATURAL SUNLIGHT RATHER THAN THE LATEST FASHION SHADE OF BLUE JEANS BLUE," HE ADDED.

/DR REED .....

DR REED SAID THERE WERE OF COURSE MORE THAN ENOUGH ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS REMAINING IN HONG KONG AND POTENTIAL PROBLEMS IN THE MAKING.

"AND GROUPS SUCH AS THE ORGANISERS OF THIS EXHIBITION MUST CONTINUE TO FOCUS THE COMMUNITY'S ATTENTION ON THE THREAT THAT POLLUTION POSES TO OUR HEALTH AND WELL BEING.

"BUT LET US NOT LOSE SIGHT OF THE FACT THAT IF WE FIGHT HARD ENOUGH WE CAN BRING ABOUT REAL IMPROVEMENTS IN OUR ENVIRONMENT, THAT WILL MAKE HONG KONG A HEALTHIER AND MORE AGREEABLE PLACE IN WHICH TO LIVE," HE CONCLUDED.

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#### PUBLIC URGED TO PARTICIPATE ACTIVELY IN ELECTIONS

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THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR PETER TSAO, TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN THE 1991 ELECTIONS.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CIVIC EDUCATION EXHIBITION AT THE CITY HALL EXHIBITION HALL.

"NEXT YEAR'S THREE-TIER COUNCIL ELECTIONS, IN PARTICULAR THE INTRODUCTION OF DIRECT ELECTION TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, WILL BE A MILESTONE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF HONG KONG'S POLITICAL SYSTEM," HE SAID.

HE URGED THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN THE ELECTIONS THROUGH VARIOUS WAYS AND MEANS, EITHER TO STAND AS CANDIDATES, TO HELP OUT IN ELECTIONEERING ACTIVITIES OR TO CAST VOTES.

"WE SHOULD POOL OUR EFFORTS TO MAKE NEXT YEAR'S ELECTIONS A SUCCESS AND TO ELECT THE TALENTED TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY," HE SAID.

ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION, MR TSAO SAID THE MAIN OBJECTIVE WAS TO ENABLE PEOPLE TO UNDERSTAND THAT EACH INDIVIDUAL WAS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE SOCIETY SO THAT THEY COULD ACQUIRE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE SOCIETY AND BECOME MORE CONCERNED WITH ITS DEVELOPMENT.

"MORE IMPORTANTLY, IT IS HOPED THAT PEOPLE CAN BE ENCOURAGED TO TAKE PART WIDELY IN POLITICAL AND SOCIAL AFFAIRS IN BUILDING OUR FUTURE," HE SAID.

HE SAID HE WAS CONFIDENT THAT WITH DETERMINATION AND A PRAGMATIC ATTITUDE, WE COULD BE SUCCESSFUL IN BUILDING A BRIGHT FUTURE.

AT THE SAME CEREMONY, MR TSAO ALSO PRESENTED PRIZES TO THE WINNERS OF THE OUTSTANDING CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECT AWARDS.

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YOUNG PEOPLE URGED TO HELP IN REHABILITATION WORK  
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YOUNG PEOPLE ARE ENCOURAGED TO HELP IN THE WORK OF INTEGRATING THE DISABLED PEOPLE INTO THE COMMUNITY.

THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ROSE GOODSTADT, MADE THIS APPEAL WHEN OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING OF THE S.K.H. HOLY TRINITY CHURCH SOCIAL SERVICE CENTRE IN KOWLOON CITY.

SHE SAID EVERY PERSON, INCLUDING THE DISABLED, SHOULD HAVE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE PART IN COMMUNITY LIFE.

NOTING THAT THE 200 CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRES IN THE TERRITORY BOASTED A MEMBERSHIP OF MORE THAN 100,000, MRS GOODSTADT HOPED THESE YOUNGSTERS COULD KEEP AN OPEN MIND BY TAKING PART IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES TOGETHER WITH THE DISABLED.

SHE POINTED OUT THAT THERE WAS QUITE A NUMBER OF MILD-GRADED DISABLED PEOPLE, AGED BETWEEN SIX AND 21, AND THAT THEY TOO NEEDED GROUP ACTIVITIES AND OTHER PEOPLE'S RESPECT.

"CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRES CAN HELP IN INTEGRATING THE DISABLED INTO THE COMMUNITY AS THEIR ACTIVITIES AND FACILITIES ARE ACCESSIBLE TO THESE PEOPLE," SHE SAID.

SHE CALLED ON MEMBERS OF THESE CENTRES TO PLAY A MORE ACTIVE ROLE IN ENCOURAGING THOSE AT SPECIAL SCHOOLS, TRAINING CENTRES OR SHELTERED WORKSHOPS TO TAKE PART IN THEIR ACTIVITIES.

ON THE OPENING OF THE HOLY TRINITY CHURCH SOCIAL SERVICE CENTRE, MRS GOODSTADT COMMENDED THE CHURCH FOR ITS CONTINUOUS EFFORT IN MEETING THE NEEDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE DISTRICT.

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DIRECTOR OF AFD PRAISES LOCAL FARMERS

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THE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, DR LAWRENCE LEE, TODAY (SATURDAY) COMMENDED FARMERS FOR THE IMPORTANT ROLE THEY PLAYED AND THEIR READINESS IN ADOPTING NEW TECHNIQUES.

SPEAKING AT THE DINNER RECEPTION TO CELEBRATE THE 68TH INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATIVE DAY, DR LEE PRAISED THE FEDERATION OF VEGETABLES MARKETING CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT TO THE MARKET MANAGEMENT IN INTRODUCING THE PESTICIDE-RESIDUE MONITORING SCHEME.

HE ACKNOWLEDGED THEIR KEEN PARTICIPATION IN PROJECTS TO PROMOTE NEW CULTIVATION TECHNIQUES SUCH AS THE MASS SEEDLING PRODUCTION METHOD AND CULTIVATION OF EXOTIC VEGETABLES, AS WELL AS THEIR EFFORT IN UNDERTAKING AND CO-ORDINATING PROJECTS TO IMPROVE AGRICULTURAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN THEIR OWN AREA.

"I AM PLEASED TO NOTE THAT ALL THESE PROJECTS WERE HIGHLY APPRECIATED BY THE FARMERS CONCERNED," HE SAID.

DR LEE SAID UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF THE FEDERATION AND THE VEGETABLES MARKETING ORGANISATION, 17 FARMERS HAD RECENTLY COMPLETED A STUDY VISIT TO EUROPEAN COUNTRIES TO GAIN FIRST-HAND KNOWLEDGE OF VEGETABLE CULTIVATION AND MARKETING AND TO EXCHANGE EXPERIENCE AND INFORMATION WITH THEIR OVERSEAS COUNTERPARTS.

REFERRING TO THE 24 PIG RAISING AND AGRICULTURAL CREDIT CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES, DR LEE SAID THEY PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN PROMOTING LOCAL PIG PRODUCTION BY HELPING THEIR MEMBERS TO UPGRADE BREEDING STOCK AND TO OBTAIN THE LATEST TECHNICAL INFORMATION ON MODERN PIG PRODUCTION.

DR LEE ALSO POINTED OUT THE IMPORTANT ROLE THE FARMERS CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES CONTINUED TO PLAY IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF AGRICULTURAL CREDIT.

"DURING 1989-90, 36 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL \$11.6 MILLION ISSUED AS LOANS TO FARMERS FROM THE VARIOUS LOAN FUNDS ADMINISTRATED BY THE DEPARTMENT WAS CHANNELLED THROUGH THESE SOCIETIES," HE SAID.

TURNING TO THE FISH FARMERS, DR LEE SAID IN THE PAST YEAR FISHERMEN ENJOYED FAVOURABLE WEATHER AND BENEFITTED FROM SATISFACTORY PRICES FOR THEIR CATCHES.

"LANDINGS MADE BY FISHERMEN IN 1989 AT THE FISH MARKETS OF THE FISH MARKETING ORGANISATION (FMO) AMOUNTED TO 74,392 TONNES AND VALUED AT \$618 MILLION.

"ALTHOUGH THE AMOUNT OF LANDINGS HAS RECORDED A SLIGHT DECREASE OF ABOUT TWO PER CENT, THE VALUE HAS SHOWN A MODERATE INCREASE OF FIVE PER CENT OVER THE AMOUNTS IN 1988," HE SAID.

/DR LEE .....

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DR LEE SAID FISHERMEN'S CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES HAD DONE VERY WELL IN THE PAST YEAR. A TOTAL SURPLUS OF SOME \$362,000 WAS REGISTERED IN 1989 FOR ALL THE 66 FISHERIES CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES AND THE CUMULATIVE REVOLVING LOAN FUND CAPITAL BUILT UP FROM MEMBERS' SAVINGS STOOD AT \$6.5 MILLION.

MEMBERS OBTAINED LOANS AMOUNTING TO SOME \$11.58 MILLION FROM THEIR OWN LOAN FUNDS AND FROM THE LOAN FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR PRODUCTIVE PURPOSES SUCH AS BUILDING OF NEW FISHING VESSELS AND THE PURCHASE OF FISHING EQUIPMENT.

DR LEE SAID IN OCTOBER LAST YEAR, 12 MEMBERS OF FISHERMEN'S CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES PARTICIPATED IN AN 11-DAY FISHERIES STUDY TOUR TO HOLLAND, WEST GERMANY AND DENMARK ORGANISED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

"THIS STUDY TOUR PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PARTICIPANTS TO EXAMINE THE MODERN FISHING TECHNOLOGY USED IN THESE COUNTRIES AND TO GAUGE THEIR SUITABILITY FOR ADOPTION IN THE HONG KONG FISHING INDUSTRY.

"I HOPE THE TOUR WOULD GIVE ADDED INSPIRATION TO OUR FISHERMEN TO IMPROVE THEIR FISHING TECHNIQUES TO THE BENEFIT OF THE INDUSTRY AS A WHOLE," HE SAID.

DR LEE ADDED THAT AT THE END OF MARCH THIS YEAR, THERE WERE 388 CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES REGISTERED WITH THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT WITH A TOTAL MEMBERSHIP OF 23,053.

DR LEE AND MRS LEE LATER PRESENTED AWARD CERTIFICATES TO CO-OPERATIVE WORKERS IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO THE MOVEMENT OVER THE PAST YEARS.

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FRENCH STUDENTS LEARN MORE ABOUT HK  
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FOR 10 FRENCH STUDENTS ON A STUDY TRIP IN THE TERRITORY, THEIR MEETING TODAY (SATURDAY) WITH THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR DAVID LAN, HAS BEEN "MOST INTERESTING, ENLIGHTENING AND USEFUL".

MR LAN IS NO STRANGER TO THE STUDENTS - ALL FROM THE INSTITUT D'ETUDE POLITIQUE.

BACK IN FEBRUARY THIS YEAR, HE GAVE A TALK ON "HONG KONG IN THE 1990'S" AT THEIR UNIVERSITY IN PARIS.

THE TALK GENERATED SO MUCH INTEREST ABOUT HONG KONG THAT SOME STUDENTS DECIDED TO MAKE A STUDY TRIP TO THE TERRITORY.

/THIS MORNING .....

THIS MORNING 10 STUDENTS CALLED ON MR LAN AND LEARNED MORE FROM HIM ABOUT THE TERRITORY'S SUCCESS STORY AND ITS PLANS FOR THE FUTURE.

THE GROUP'S LEADER, MISS HELENE WAJNBUM, COMMENTED AFTER THE MEETING: "THE BRIEFING GIVEN BY MR LAN THIS MORNING IS MOST ENLIGHTENING AND USEFUL. WE ARE VERY IMPRESSED WITH HONG KONG'S SUCCESS AS A THRIVING INTERNATIONAL CITY, AND THE HARD WORK OF ITS PEOPLE".

AT THE MEETING, MR LAN GAVE A DETAILED BRIEFING ON WHAT MAKES HONG KONG TICK, AND ON THE TERRITORY'S AMBITIOUS INFRASTRUCTURAL PLANS FOR THE FUTURE.

TO BEGIN WITH, HE HIGHLIGHTED THE CHARACTERISTICS OF HONG KONG PEOPLE ----- HARDWORKING, ADAPTABLE AND RESOURCEFUL. "THESE CHARACTERISTICS HAVE MADE HONG KONG WHAT IT IS TODAY," HE SAID.

HONG KONG HAS A "DYNAMIC AND COHESIVE" COMMUNITY ALWAYS TAKING A POSITIVE OUTLOOK, MR LAN STRESSED.

"WE ARE ALSO A CARING COMMUNITY, BREAKING MANY RECORDS IN RAISING FUNDS FOR EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND THE LESS PRIVILEGED. NOTABLE EXAMPLES ARE THE GOOD WORK BY THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS, PO LEUNG KUK, LOK SIN TONG, AND SO ON.

"AT THE GRASSROOT LEVEL, OUR DISTRICT BOARDS ARE MAKING A VALUABLE CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS BUILDING A COHESIVE AND HARMONIOUS COMMUNITY, APART FROM PERFORMING OTHER USEFUL FUNCTIONS.

"THE DISTRICT FESTIVALS ORGANISED BY THE BOARDS HAVE BEEN WELL RECEIVED BY THE HONG KONG COMMUNITY AS A MAJOR COMMUNITY-BUILDING EFFORT," HE SAID.

ON HONG KONG'S CURRENT PROBLEMS, MR LAN STRESSED THAT "WE ARE NEVER DAUNTED BY THEM AND ARE TAKING ALL POSSIBLE MEASURES TO TACKLE THEM.

"WE HAVE A BRAIN DRAIN, MANY VIETNAMESE BOAT PEOPLE AND A LABOUR SHORTAGE. NEVERTHELESS, WE ARE CONFIDENT OF TIDING THEM OVER AS WE DID IN THE PAST. WE ARE ALSO CONFIDENT OF BOUNCING BACK AND EMERGING EVEN STRONGER THAN BEFORE," HE SAID.

ELABORATING ON THE MEASURES, MR LAN POINTED OUT THAT THE TERRITORY, IN PARTICULAR, SAW THE NEED TO GROOM YOUNG PEOPLE FOR THE FUTURE.

"WE HAVE THEREFORE PLANNED TO INCREASE SUBSTANTIALLY THE NUMBER OF FIRST-YEAR PLACES IN TERTIARY EDUCATION FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS. WELL-EDUCATED AND WELL-TRAINED YOUNG PEOPLE ARE OUR IMPORTANT ASSET AND RESOURCE," HE ADDED.

MR LAN POINTED OUT THAT OTHER PLANS FOR THE FUTURE INCLUDED A NEW AIRPORT AND IMPROVED PORT FACILITIES, ALL OF WHICH UNDERLINED THE GOVERNMENT'S FIRM COMMITMENTS TO THE TERRITORY UP TO AND BEYOND 1997.
