ABLE CANDIDATES FROM LEGCO POLLS - SIR EDWARD
* * * *

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING HE WAS SURE THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS WOULD PRODUCE SOME ABLE CANDIDATES AND HE LOOKED FORWARD TO WORKING WITH THEM WHEN THE COUNCIL ASSEMBLED AGAIN IN THE AUTUMN.

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AT THE AIRPORT ON HIS RETURN FROM LONDON, SIR EDWARD SAID THE ELECTIONS WERE ATTRACTING A GREAT DEAL OF INTEREST NOT ONLY IN HONG KONG BUT ALSO IN LONDON AND ELSEWHERE.

+I COME BACK NOW AT THIS TIME IN ORDER TO BE SURE TO BE HERE FOR THE LAST STAGE OF THE ELECTORAL PROCESS WHICH WILL BE A VERY IMPORTANT ONE,+ HE SAID.

SIR EDWARD SAID HE HAD A GOOD HOLIDAY AND HAD BEEN KEPT IN TOUCH WITH WHAT HAD BEEN GOING ON HERE BY REPORTS FROM THE CHIEF SECRETARY AND FROM PRESS SUMMARIES.

+I WAS VERY GLAD TO SEE THAT THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP AND THE LAND COMMISSION HAD MADE A GOOD START.+

WHILE IN LONDON, SIR EDWARD SAID HE HAD TWO OR THREE OPPORTUNITIES TO TALK TO MINISTERS AND SENIOR OFFICIALS ABOUT VARIOUS HONG KONG PROBLEMS AND TO REPORT TO THEM WHAT HAD BEEN HAPPENING HERE. HE ALSO HAD TALKS WITH STAFF OF THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT OFFICE IN LONDON ABOUT THEIR WORK.

SIR EDWARD WAS MET ON ARRIVAL BY THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, SIR S.Y. CHUNG, AND SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, SIR ROGER LOBO.

WONG TAI SIN RESIDENTS WILL BE CONSULTED ON THE HOUSING SUBSIDY TO TENANTS OF PUBLIC HOUSING GREEN PAPER THROUGH QUESTIONNAIRES SENT OUT BY THE DISTRICT BOARD AND CONSULTATION MEETINGS ORGANISED IN THE DISTRICT.

STARTING FROM MONDAY (AUGUST 19), THE AD HOC WORKING GROUP SET UP UNDER THE DISTRICT BOARD WILL DISTRIBUTE WITH THE HELP OF 200 VOLUNTARY WORKERS 100 000 SETS OF QUESTIONNAIRES TO RESIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT.

+WE HOPE TO COLLECT A WIDE SPECTRUM OF PUBLIC OPINION ON THE GREEN PAPER SO THAT A MORE REPRESENTATIVE VIEW COULD BE SUBMITTED THROUGH THE DISTRICT BOARD.

+WE EXPECT TO PRESENT THE REPORT OF THE FINDINGS IN THE COMING DISTRICT BOARD MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 3,+ HE SAID.

IN ADDITION TO THE QUESTIONNAIRES, THE WONG TAI SIN DISTRICT OFFICE HAS ORGANISED SIX CONSULTATION SESSIONS AT THE AREA COMMITTEES AND MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES LEVEL TO ALLOW DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS TO LISTEN TO OPINIONS OF THE RESIDENTS.

U.S. ANNOUNCES LIST OF WAIVER REQUESTS

THE U.S. GENERALISED SYSTEM OF PREFERENCES (GSP) SUB-COMMITTEE ANNOUNCED IN THE AUGUST 7 FEDERAL REGISTER THE LIST OF WAIVER REQUESTS WHICH HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED FOR CONSIDERATIONS IN THE GENERAL REVIEW OF THE U.S. GSP SCHEME.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY (SATURDAY), A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRADE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT IN RESPONSE TO INVITATION, HONG KONG SUBMITTED TO THE U.S. AUTHORITIES IN MAY, AMONG OTHER THINGS, A LIST OF PRODUCTS REQUESTING FOR WAIVER FROM THE 50 PER CENT COMPETITIVE NEED LIMITS OF THE U.S. GSP.

+AMONG THE WAIVER REQUESTS ACCEPTED FOR THE REVIEW, 41 PRODUCTS ARE OF HONG KONG'S CONCERN,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE FEDERAL REGISTER ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT AS PART OF THE GENERAL REVIEW, A PUBLIC HEARING WOULD BE HELD IN OCTOBER 21-25 TO CONSIDER THE WAIVER, THE SPECIFIC BENEFICIARY PRODUCTS AND THEIR COMPETITIVENESS AND THE DETERMINATIONS REGARDING LIKE OR DIRECTLY COMPETITIVE ARTICLES.

+BEFORE EXERCISING HIS WAIVER AUTHORITY, THE U.S. PRESIDENT IS REQUIRED TO TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE ANTICIPATED IMPACT OF SUCH ACTION ON U.S. PRODUCERS OF LIKE OR DIRECTLY COMPETITIVE PRODUCTS, THE GENERAL LEVEL OF DEVELOPMENT OF THE BENEFICIARY COUNTRY, ITS COMPETITIVENESS IN RESPECT TO THE PRODUCT AND THE TRADE PRACTICES OF THE COUNTRY,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+WHETHER THE 41 PRODUCTS OF HONG KONG WILL BE GRANTED WAIVER DEPENDS ON THE OUTCOME OF THE GENERAL REVIEW, WHICH WILL BE ANNOUNCED BY JANUARY 4, 1987 AND TAKE EFFECT ON JULY 1, 1987.+

ADOLESCENT HEALTH EXHIBITION OPENS

ADEQUATE COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE TO ADOLESCENTS ON THE CHALLENGES THEY FACED WERE VITAL, UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCILS, MR ALLEN LEE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE ADOLESCENT HEALTH EXHIBITION ORGAINSED BY THE CENTRAL HEALTH EDUCATION UNIT OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT, MR LEE SAID THAT YOUNG PEOPLE WERE FULL OF ENERGY AND AT THE PEAK OF PHYSICAL FITNESS, AND WERE ALSO CURIOUS, INNOVATIVE, ADVENTUROUS AND FEARLESS OF HARDSHIP.

HE SAID THAT SUCH QUALITIES COULD BE AN IMMENSE BUILDING FORCE IN SOCIETY IF CHANNELLED TOWARDS HEALTH AND WELL-BEING.

SHARING HIS VIEW, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES (MEDICAL SERVICES), DR RUDY KHOO, SAID THAT HEALTH EDUCATION WAS IMPORTANT BECAUSE ADOLESCENCE WAS A PERIOD OF IMMENSE PHYSICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL CHANGES DURING WHICH BEHAVIORAL PATTERNS WERE FORMED.

DR KHOO REMINDED YOUTHS THAT ALTHOUGH THEY HAD A GREAT POTENTIAL FOR HEALTH AS ILLUSTRATED IN THE EXHIBITION DISPLAYS, THEY HAD TO LEARN ABOUT MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE AND DECISION.

THE EXHIBITION, WHICH LASTS FOR SEVEN DAYS AT THE CITY HALL EXHIBITION HALL, FEATURES VARIOUS SUBJECTS INCLUDING MENTAL HEALTH, EXERCISE, DRUG SMOKING AND SEX EDUCATION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE.

THE GOVERNMENT IS PLANNING TO CONSTRUCT A SERIES OF ROADS IN NORTHEAST TSING YI TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO THE PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENT PROPOSED FOR THE AREA.

WORK WILL ALSO INVOLVE THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ASSOCIATED DRAINAGE SYSTEM AND THE REMOVAL OR RELOCATION OF SOME EXISTING PUBLIC UTILITY FACILITIES.

A NOTICE CONCERNING THE PROPOSED WORKS WAS PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

THE POST OFFICE WILL BE INTRODUCING FROM SEPTEMBER 2 BRITISH POSTAL ORDERS IN DENOMINATIONS OF SIX TO NINE POUNDS STERLING.

THE COLOUR AND DESIGN OF THE FOUR NEW ORDERS ARE THE SAME AS THOSE OF THE EXISTING TWO TO FIVE POUND ORDERS, A POST OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

CIVIL ENGINEERING WORKS INVITED

TENDERS ARE BEING INVITED FOR A NUMBER OF CIVIL ENGINEERING WORKS IN TUEN MUN NEW TOWN.

THE WORKS WILL INVOLVE THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO DUAL CARRIAGEWAY ROADS, TWO SINGLE CARRIAGEWAY ROADS, AND FOUR FOOTBRIDGES NEAR LEUNG TIN HOUSING ESTATE NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION. THEY WILL PROVIDE VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO THE ESTATE AND OTHER RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN THE AREA.

THERE WILL ALSO BE STREET FACILITIES, AND TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN AIDS.

IN ADDITION, THE SITE FORMATION WORK FOR A SCHOOL CHILDREN'S CLINIC TO THE NORTH-WEST OF TUEN MUN SAN HUI WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE PROJECT.

THE WORK, TO BE CARRIED OUT FOR THE TUEN MUN NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, IS EXPECTED TO START AT THE END OF THE YEAR AND WILL TAKE ABOUT 20 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.
