ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN AIMED AT ELDERLY

* * * *

THE SPECIAL TARGET FOR THE 1986-87 ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN IS THOSE AGED 60 AND ABOVE, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR (TRAFFIC), ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, MR JOHN CLEMENCE, SAID AT THE OPENING OF THE ROAD SAFETY DAY HELD AT THE KWUN TONG RECREATION GROUND TODAY (SUNDAY).

NOTING THAT ACCIDENTS INVOLVING OLD PEOPLE HAD INCREASED LAST YEAR, MR CLEMENCE SAID: +IT HAS BEEN SUGGESTED THAT MANY OF OUR SENIOR CITIZENS HAVE NOT HAD THE BENEFIT OF ANY FORM OF ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION WHEN THEY WERE YOUNG AND THAT MANY GREW UP IN A RURAL ENVIRONMENT WHICH DID NOT ENVISAGE THE TRAFFIC DENSITY AND BUSTLE OF PRESENT DAY HONG KONG.+

+BUT EVEN IF THESE TWO REASONS ARE CORRECT, THERE IS ALSO THE QUESTION OF A NEW FIRST GENERATION OF MOTORISTS WHO DO NOT APPRECIATE THE SPECIFIC DIFFICULTIES THAT CERTAIN SENIOR CITIZENS FACE WHEN ATTEMPTING TO CROSS THE ROADS,+ HE ADDED.

MR CLEMENCE SAID THAT ALL THESE FACTORS HAD BEEN TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT IN PLANNING THIS YEAR'S PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN.

OTHER TARGETS OF THIS YEAR'S ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN ARE CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 14, YOUNG AND INEXPERIENCED DRIVERS AND CYCLISTS.

MR CLEMENCE SAID THAT THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN UNDER 14 INVOLVED IN TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS REMAINED DISPROPORTIONATELY HIGH.

+EDUCATIONAL INSTRUCTION KITS DESIGNED FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS HAVE BEEN PRODUCED AND DISTRIBUTED, KITS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED THIS YEAR AND A KIT FOR KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN IS BEING DESIGNED,+ HE SAID.

ANOTHER AIM OF THE CAMPAIGN IS TO MAKE YOUNG AND INEXPERIENCED MOTORISTS, WHO USUALLY FAIL TO ANTICIPATE THE DANGERS AHEAD, STAY ALERT WHILE DRIVING ON THE ROADS.

THE OTHER MAJOR TARGET GROUP FOR THIS YEAR WOULD BE CYCLISTS, INCLUDING THOSE USING CYCLES PROFESSIONALLY.

+PROFESSIONAL CYCLISTS ARE THOSE WHO WE SEE DAILY DELIVERING MEAT, VEGETABLES AND GOODS WHO CONSISTENTLY IGNORE TRAFFIC LIGHTS AND ROAD DIRECTION SIGNS,+ MR CLEMENCE SAID.

APART FROM DISTRICT AND TERRITORY-WIDE FUNCTIONS, THE FULL RANGE OF AVAILABLE MEDIA INCLUDING POSTER DISPLAY, BUS ADVERTISING, LEAFLETS, RADIO AND TELEVISION API'S (ANNOUNCEMENT OF PUBLIC INTEREST), WILL BE UTILISED TO RUN THIS YEAR'S ROAD SAFETY PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN.

/TODAY'S

TODAY'S OPENING CEREMONY WAS FOLLOWED BY A SPECIALLY PRODUCED VARIETY SHOW TARGETTED AT OLD PEOPLE AND AT YOUNGSTERS. THE PROGRAMME COMPRISED DRAMAS, SINGING PERFORMANCES BY POPULAR SINGERS AND GAMES AND QUIZZES FOR THE AUDIENCE.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING, LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEMBER, DR HENRIETTA IP, SAID THAT THE VARIETY SHOW WAS ORGANISED TO AROUSE THE PUBLIC'S ATTENTION, ESPECIALLY THE ELDERLY, TOWARDS ROAD SAFETY MEASURES.

SHE URGED THE PUBLIC TO OBEY THE ROAD SAFETY RULES TO AVOID TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.

OTHER OFFICIATING GUESTS AT TODAY'S FUNCTION WERE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (PUBLICITY) OF INFORMATION SERVICES, MR PETER MOSS, AND HEAD OF CHINESE PROGRAMME SERVICE, RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, MR RAYMOND NG.

THE DAY'S PROGRAMME ALSO INCLUDED DISPLAYS OF THE ROAD SAFETY BUS, A KMB BUS, EXHIBITIONS OF ROAD SAFETY PUBLICITY MATERIALS, A ROAD SAFETY COMPUTER GAMES COUNTER AND A GAMES STALL FOR CHILDREN.

THE ROAD SAFETY DAY ALSO FORMED PART OF THE +INFORMATION '86+ RADIO SERIES, WHICH IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE INFORMATION SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, TO PROMOTE VARIOUS GOVERNMENT CAMPAIGN MESSAGES.

JOB-SEEKERS ADVISED ON FEES, COMMISSIONS
* * * * *

JOB-SEEKERS ARE ADVISED THAT FEES AND COMMISSIONS CHARGEABLE BY AN EMPLOYMENT AGENCY ARE GOVERNED BY THE LAW.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID THAT UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT AGENCY REGULATIONS, THE FEE TO BE PAID BY A JOB-SEEKER FOR FIRST REGISTRATION AND SUBSEQUENT RENEWAL AFTER THREE MONTHS IS LIMITED TO A MAXIMUM OF \$3, AND THE COMMISSION FOR A SUCCESSFUL JOB PLACEMENT TO 10 PER CENT OF THE FIRST MONTH'S SALARY RECEIVED.

THE REGULATIONS ALSO LIMIT THE FEE THAT CAN BE CHARGED BY AN AGENCY TO AN EMPLOYER TO A MAXIMUM OF \$10 PER EACH TYPE OF VACANCY REGISTERED ON FIRST REGISTRATION AND \$5 FOR RENEWAL OF SUCH REGISTRATION.

/HOWEVER,

HOWEVER, THE COMMISSION TO BE PAID BY AN EMPLOYER ON SUCCESSFULLY OBTAINING FOR HIM AN EMPLOYEE BY AN AGENCY IS A MATTER OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN BOTH PARTIES.

+CHARGING MORE THAN THE PRESCRIBED FEES AND COMMISSIONS IS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE AND THE EMPLOYMENT AGENCY REGULATIONS AND THE LICENSEE OF THE EMPLOYMENT AGENCY CONCERNED IS LIABLE ON CONVICTION TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$10 000,+ HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO REMINDED OPERATORS OF EMPLOYMENT AGENCIES TO DISPLAY FEE SCHEDULES AND THEIR LICENCES IN THE PLACE OF BUSINESS. THEY SHOULD ALSO SUBMIT QUARTERLY RETURNS TO THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT WITHIN THE PRESCRIBED TIME AND MAINTAIN THE PRESCRIBED REGISTERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ORDINANCE AND THE REGULATIONS.

BUS SHELTERS FOR SOUTHERN DISTRICT
* * * * *

A RESIDENT WHO WROTE TO THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD REQUESTING THAT A PASSENGER SHELTER BE BUILT AT THE BUS STOP ON AP LEI CHAU BRIDGE ROAD NEAR ITS JUNCTION WITH LEE CHI ROAD HAD HIS WISHES MET LAST MONTH.

USING THE +MY SUGGESTIONS TO THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD+ POSTGRAMME SCHEME, THE AP LEI CHAU RESIDENT POINTED OUT THAT A SHELTER SHOULD BE PROVIDED AT THE BUS STOP TO PROTECT PASSENGERS FROM RAIN AND THE SCORCHING HEAT OF SUMMER.

THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE HAD IN FACT MADE A SIMILAR PROPOSAL TO CHINA MOTOR BUS IN 1984 AND THE LOCATION WAS SUBSEQUENTLY INCLUDED IN THE COMPANY'S 1985-86 BUS SHELTER CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME. CONSTRUCTION WORK FOR THE SHELTER WAS COMPLETED LAST MONTH.

MEANWHILE, THE DISTRICT BOARD'S TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT COMMITTEE, AT A RECENT MEETING, STUDIED 12 NEW LOCATIONS SUGGESTED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS FOR INCLUSION IN NEXT YEAR'S PROGRAMME AND HAD PROPOSED THE PRIORITY OF CONSTRUCTION TO THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT AND THE BUS COMPANY.

BUS STOPS ARE LOCATED ALONG ABERDEEN THROUGH ROAD, WAH FU ROAD, POKFULAM ROAD AND IN VARIOUS PARTS OF STANLEY AND SHEK O.

A SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID THE POSTGRAMME SCHEME WAS INTRODUCED IN 1983 FOR RESIDENTS, PARTICULARLY THOSE LIVING IN REMOTE PARTS OF THE DISTRICT SUCH AS THE BAYS AREA, STANLEY AND SHEK O, TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS TO THE BOARD IN A MORE CONVENIENT WAY.

DURING THE PERIOD BETWEEN JANUARY 1984 AND NOVEMBER 1985, THE BOARD HAD RECEIVED 292 POSTGRAMMES FROM RESIDENTS GIVING SUGGESTIONS OR LODGING COMPLAINTS ON TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT AND LAW AND ORDER MATTERS.

+THE POSTAGE-FREE POSTGRAMMES, PUBLISHED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD, ARE OBTAINABLE AT 72 DISTRIBUTION POINTS THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

+THESE INCLUDE THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND ITS SUB-OFFICES, POST OFFICES, GOVERNMENT OFFICES, COMMUNITY HALLS, MAJOR BANKS, PETROL STATIONS AND VARIOUS KAIFONG AND RESIDENTS ASSOCIATIONS,+ THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

CHEAPER TRAVELLING FARE FOR THE ELDERLY * * * * *

ELDERLY RESIDENTS IN KOWLOON CITY WILL SOON BE ABLE TO ENJOY CHEAPER FARE WHEN TRAVELLING ON FOUR MAXICAB AND MINIBUS ROUTES IN THE DISTRICT.

UNDER THE +MAXICAB AND MINIBUS FARE DISCOUNT FOR THE ELDERLY+ SCHEME, PEOPLE AGED 60 OR ABOVE CAN ENJOY HALF OR REDUCED FARE ON MAXICAB ROUTE 6 RUNNING BETWEEN WHAMPOA ESTATE AND HANKOW ROAD IN TSIM SHA TSUI= ROUTE 13 BETWEEN HUNG HOM FERRY PIER AND BROADCAST DRIVE= AND TWO MINIBUS ROUTES BETWEEN LOK MAN ESTATE AND ROYAL THEATRE IN MONG KOK AND BETWEEN RUBY THEATRE IN TO KWA WAN AND OI MAN ESTATE.

THE NEW SCHEME IS AN EXPANSION OF THE +REDUCED MEDICAL FEE+ SCHEME WHICH CHARGES ELDERLY PEOPLE A REDUCED FEE WHEN SEEKING TREATMENT FROM PRIVATE DOCTORS IN THE SCHEME.

THE SCHEME WILL BE RUN ON A TRIAL BASIS FOR SIX MONTHS, STARTING FROM JULY 1 TO THE END OF THIS YEAR. IT WILL THEN BE EVALUATED ON ITS EFFECTIVENESS AND POPULARITY BEFORE DECIDING WHETHER IT SHOULD BE EXPANDED.

THERE ARE ABOUT 47 000 ELDERLY RESIDENTS IN KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT ELIGIBLE TO JOIN THE SCHEME.

THOSE WHO JOIN WILL BE ISSUED WITH A PRIVILEGE CARD WHICH CAN BE USED TO TRAVEL ON THE FOUR MAXICAB AND MINIBUS ROUTES.

MAXICABS AND MINIBUSES PARTICIPATING IN THE SCHEME WILL BE IDENTIFIED WITH SPECIAL LABELS.

THE SCHEME IS JOINTLY RUN BY THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD AND THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT COUNCIL FOR THE WELFARE AND RECREATION OF THE ELDERLY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE SAID IT WAS HOPED THAT THE SCHEME WOULD HELP RAISE PUBLIC AWARENESS ON THE RESPECT AND CARE FOR THE ELDERLY.

ANTI-SMOKING BOOKMARK DESIGN COMPETITION

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL BE ORGANISING AN ANTI-SMOKING BOOKMARK DESIGN COMPETITION FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS IN SUPPORT OF THE 1986-87 ANTI-SMOKING PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

THE DESIGN SHOULD ILLUSTRATE THE FOLLOWING THEMES: (1) SMOKING IS HAZARDOUS TO HEALTH, (2) ADOLESCENTS SHOULD NOT START SMOKING, AND (3) IRRITATIVE EFFECTS OF PASSIVE SMOKING.

THE COMPETITION IS OPEN TO ALL SECONDARY PUPILS AND THERE WILL BE TWO DIVISIONS - THE JUNIOR SECONDARY DIVISION FOR FORM OR MIDDLE 1-3 PUPILS AND THE SENIOR SECONDARY DIVISION FOR FORM OR MIDDLE 4-6 STUDENTS.
