SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES FOR ALL 85 367

+ALL 85 367 PUPILS PARTICIPATING IN THE SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES ALLOCATION SYSTEM HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED FORM 1 OR MIDDLE 1 PLACES IN GOVERNMENT, AIDED OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS,+ AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

+ALL PLACES ALLOCATED ARE THREE-YEAR PLACES FOR WHICH NO TUITION FEES WILL BE CHARGED,+ HE ADDED.

RESULTS OF ALLOCATION WILL BE RELEASED TO ALL PARTICIPATING PRIMARY SCHOOLS TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

WHEN INQUIRING ABOUT THEIR RESULTS OF ALLOCATION, PUPILS SHOULD FOLLOW THE ARRANGEMENTS SET DOWN BY THEIR PRIMARY SCHOOLS. THEY SHOULD ALSO TAKE ALONG WITH THEM THEIR PRIMARY 6 IDENTIFICATION FORMS SO THAT THEIR INDIVIDUAL ALLOCATION SLIPS MAY BE ATTACHED TO THE FORMS.

+ALL PUPILS SHOULD REPORT DURING THE FIRST REGISTRATION PERIOD TO THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO WHICH THEY HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DATES AND TIMES SPECIFIED,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+THIS INFORMATION HAS BEEN SUPPLIED TO ALL PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS,+ HE ADDED.

+PUPILS WHO FAIL TO REPORT TO THEIR SECONDARY SCHOOLS ALLOCATED DURING THE FIRST REGISTRATION PERIOD WHICH FALLS ON JULY 22 AND 23, 1981 ARE DEEMED TO HAVE CHOSEN NOT TO TAKE UP THE PLACES ALLOCATED,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THEREFORE THOSE PUPILS OR THEIR PARENTS WHO HAVE GENUINE DIFFICULTY IN REPORTING TO THEIR ALLOCATED SECONDARY SCHOOLS DURING THE FIRST REGISTRATION PERIOD ARE URGED TO CONTACT THE SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES ALLOCATION SECTION BEFORE JULY 23 SO THAT OTHER ARRANGEMENTS MAY BE MADE.

+THE SECOND REGISTRATION PERIOD (JULY 30 AND 31) IS MAINLY FOR PUPILS WHO HAVE TO SEEK TRANSFER DUE TO HAVING MOVED HOUSE RECENTLY,+ THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED.

+THEY OR THEIR PARENTS SHOULD CONTACT THE DISTRICT COUNCIL SECRETARY OF THE NET TO WHICH THEY HAVE RECENTLY MOVED HOUSE.+

+THE SECRETARY, UPON BEING SATISFIED WITH THE GENUINE NATURE OF THE CASE, MAY THEN GRANT APPROVAL FOR TRANSFER AND ASSIST THEM IN SECURING PLACES IN THE NETS CONCERNED,+ HE ADDED.

ALTERNATIVELY, THE PUPILS OR THEIR PARENTS MAY CONTACT A SECONDARY SCHOOL OF THEIR CHOICE IN THE NET THEY HAVE MOVED TO, AND THE PRINCIPAL OF THE SCHOOL SHOULD THEN SEEK APPROVAL FROM THE DISTRICT COUNCIL SECRETARY OF HIS NET ON BEHALF OF THE PUPILS BEFORE ADMITTING THE PUPILS.

+IN THE CASE OF A TYPHOON AFFECTING HONG KONG DURING THE REGISTRATION PERIODS, HEADS OF SCHOOLS AND PARENTS ARE ADVISED TO WATCH OUT FOR ANNOUNCEMENTS IN THE MEDIA FOR ANY NECESSARY SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

FULL WATER SUPPLY TO CONTINUE FOR THE TIME BEING  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE DIRECTOR OF WATER SUPPLIES, MR WILLIAM TUCKER, ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE PRESENT FULL SUPPLY WOULD BE MAINTAINED AT LEAST UNTIL THE MIDDLE OF NEXT MONTH WHEN A FURTHER REVIEW OF THE OVERALL WATER SITUATION WOULD BE MADE.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT CAME AFTER A MEETING THIS MORNING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

MR TUCKER REITERATED HOWEVER THAT THE PRESENT WATER STORAGE POSITION WAS STILL +UNHEALTHY+.

AT 9 AM TODAY, THE RESERVOIR STORAGE WAS 219.432 MILLION CUBIC METRES OR 38 PER CENT OF THE CAPACITY, COMPARED WITH 342.278 MILLION CUBIC METRES OR 59.2 PER CENT AT THE SAME TIME LAST YEAR.

HE SAID THAT THE DECISION ON WHETHER THERE WOULD BE WATER RESTRICTIONS WOULD DEPEND ON THE AMOUNT OF RAINFALL IN THE NEXT MONTH AND THE STORAGE POSITION IN THE MIDDLE OF AUGUST.

MR TUCKER AGAIN APPEALED TO THE PUBLIC TO CONTINUE TO EXERCISE MAXIMUM ECONOMY IN THE USE OF WATER.

THE TALENT QUEST, TO BE HELD IN OCTOBER THIS YEAR, IS JOINTLY PRESENTED BY THE MUSIC OFFICE AND RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, AND SPONSORED BY AIWA CO LTD.

ANNOUNCING THIS AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY (TUESDAY), THE MUSIC ADMINISTRATOR, MRS ELIZABETH WONG SAID THE AIM OF THIS CONTEST IS TO PROMOTE INTEREST IN MUSIC COMPOSITION, ARRANGEMENT AND PERFORMANCE AMONG YOUNG LOCAL AMATEUR MUSICIANS.

ALSO ATTENDING THE PRESS CONFERENCE WERE THE CONTROLLER (RADIO) OF RTHK, MISS CHEUNG MAN-YEE- THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF AIWA CO LTD, MR KENNETH FUNG- THE ASSISTANT MUSIC ADMINISTRATOR, MR M.C. LUKE- AND ASSISTANT MUSIC ADMINISTRATOR, MR THOMAS WANG.

PARTICIPANTS CAN ENTER ONE OF THE THREE CATEGORIES, NAMELY, CHINESE, WESTERN AND FOLK MUSIC.

+THE WINNER FROM EACH CATEGORY WILL BE AWARDED A \$5 000 AIWA 30TH ANNIVERSARY SCHOLARSHIP AND WINNERS OF THE BEST COMPOSITION AND BEST PERFORMANCE AWARDS WILL EACH RECEIVE AN AIWA CARRY-COMP HI-FI SET,+ SAID MR KENNETH FUNG.

APPLICATIONS ARE OPEN TO ALL AMATEUR MUSIC-MAKERS UNDER THE AGE OF 30. THE DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION IS SEPTEMBER 15. SHORT-LISTED CANDIDATES WILL ATTEND A PRELIMINARY CONTEST ON OCTOBER 11, AND THE FINALS WILL BE HELD AT THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY HALL ON OCTOBER 17.

WELL-KNOWN MUSICIANS, CELEBRITIES AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WILL BE INVITED AS ADJUDICATORS AND THERE WILL ALSO BE GUEST PERFORMANCES. THE ENTIRE PROGRAMME WILL BE BROADCAST LIVE ON RTHK.

TICKETS AT \$5 EACH WILL BE ON SALE AT THE AC HALL AND MUSIC OFFICE MUSIC CENTRES TOWARDS THE END OF SEPTEMBER.

## SUBSIDISED FORM IV PLACES INCREASED

\* \* \* \*

THE PROVISION RATE OF SUBSIDISED FORM IV PLACES HAS INCREASED FROM 20 PER CENT IN 1971 TO SOME 60 PER CENT IN 1981, AND WILL FURTHER INCREASE TO 75 PER CENT BY THE MID-1980'S, MR Y.T. LI, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION (PLANNING AND BUILDING) SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE COMBINED GRADUATION CEREMONY OF THE SAM YUK SCHOOLS, HE SAID THIS WAS +A TRACK RECORD NOT MANY OF OUR NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES HAVE MATCHED.+ SEEN IN THIS HISTORICAL CONTEXT, MR LI SAID, HE COULD NOT SEE HOW THE JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT (JSEA) SYSTEM COULD BE REFERRED TO AS A +FORM III ELIMINATION EXAMINATION+ BY SOME CRITICS.

RECALLING THE DRAFTING OF THE 1978 EDUCATION WHITE PAPER, MR LI SAID THAT A DECISION WAS THEN TAKEN THAT SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION SHOULD NOT BE CONFINED TO ACADEMIC EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS BUT SHOULD BE DIVERSIFIED TO INCLUDE MORE VOCATIONAL-BIASED COURSES IN OTHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS SUCH AS TECHNICAL INSTITUTES.

+GIVEN THEREFORE THAT THE SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION SYSTEM IN HONG KONG WOULD BE A DIVERSIFIED ONE, AND THAT WE DO NOT YET HAVE ENOUGH PLACES IN OUR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS TO MAKE SELF-SELECTION BY STUDENTS POSSIBLE, SOME PROCEDURES ARE NEEDED FOR SELECTING THOSE STUDENTS WHO ARE MOST SUITED FOR THE COURSES RUN BY THE INSTITUTIONS CONCERNED. IT WAS IN THIS CONTEXT THAT THE JSEA SYSTEM WAS INTRODUCED,+ HE SAID.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE PLANNED EXPANSION OF POST-FORM III EDUCATION. IN PARTICULAR, IT WILL STUDY CAREFULLY THE DEMAND FOR THE VARIOUS TYPES OF POST-FORM III EDUCATION TO SEE WHETHER THE MIX OF EDUCATIONAL PLACES PROPOSED IN THE 1978 WHITE PAPER NEEDS TO BE ADJUSTED.

RESULTS OF THE FIRST JSEA WILL BE ANNOUNCED ON JULY 28 AND FORM III STUDENTS WILL SOON KNOW WHETHER THEY WILL BE ALLOCATED SUBSIDISED FORM IV PLACES.

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT ALTERNATIVE EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR THOSE STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT ALLOCATED SUCH PLACES. THESE WILL INCLUDE THE TECHNICAL INSTITUTES, THE POLICE CADET SCHOOL, GOVERNMENT EVENING SECONDARY SCHOOLS AS WELL AS PRIVATE INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS WHICH ALSO OFFER POST-FORM III PLACES.

+THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT ALSO LOOKS TO SCHOOL PRINCIPALS AND CAREER, COUNSELLING AND FORM TEACHERS FOR PROVIDING ALL STUDENTS WITH THE NECESSARY ADVICE ABOUT FURTHER STUDIES AND EMPLOYMENT,+ MR LI SAID.

TUEN MUN HOLDS SEMINAR ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

TUEN MUN DISTRICT OFFICE HELD A SEMINAR ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION THIS (TUESDAY) EVENING, CHAIRED BY THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BILLY LAM.

BESIDES MR LAM, THE SPEAKERS WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE HEUNG YEE KUK, MR LAU WONG-FAT, WHO IS ALSO A MEMBER OF TUEN MUN DISTRICT BOARD, MR CHEUNG KAM-HUNG, MR NG CHEUK-TAI AND MR CHOW MAN-PING, ALL OF WHOM ARE BOARD MEMBERS.

MR LAM SAID THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM WAS AIMED AT IMPROVEMENTS AT THE LOCAL LEVEL AND AT STIMULATING PARTICIPATION IN HELPING TO RUN THE DISTRICT.

HE SAID THIS WAS PARTICULARLY RELEVANT IN A NEW TOWN LIKE TUEN MUN WHERE TRADITIONAL RURAL ELEMENTS HAD BEEN SERIOUSLY AFFECTED BY DEVELOPMENTS.

HE URGED LOCAL RESIDENTS AND NEW COMERS TO TUEN MUN TO TAKE PART AND TO STAND FOR ELECTION.

MR LAU WONG-FAT SAID GOVERNMENT WAS NOW WILLING TO DELEGATE ADMINISTRATION AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL TO LOCAL PEOPLE.

THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE SHOULD MAKE GOOD USE OF THIS OPPORTUNITY TO REFLECT THEIR NEEDS TO THE GOVERNMENT- THEY SHOULD SUPPORT THE SCHEME TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE AND ALLOW THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM TO BE CARRIED OUT MORE EFFECTIVELY.

ON THE ROLE OF LOCAL RESIDENTS IN THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM, MR CHEUNG KAM-HUNG SAID THE PEOPLE MUST THEMSELVES SEEK TO IMPROVE THEIR WELFARE AND LIVELIHOOD.

PEOPLE MUST UNDERSTAND THEIR ROLE IN THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM.

THEY MUST NOT GIVE UP THE RIGHT TO VOTE, OR TO STAND FOR ELECTION.

SPEAKING ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT, MR NG CHEUK-TAI SAID PEOPLE'S OPINIONS WERE MOST IMPORTANT IF THE SYSTEM WAS TO SUCCEED.

ON THE PROMOTION OF CULTURE, RECREATION AND SPORT IN THE DISTRICT, MR CHOW MAN-PING SAID THIS WAS IMPORTANT IN BOOSTING A SENSE OF BELONGING AND SHOULD NOT BE NEGLECTED IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM.

**TWO MORE WATER STANDPIPES FOR WONG TAI SIN VILLAGES**

TWO ADDITIONAL PUBLIC STANDPIPES ARE BEING INSTALLED AT THE HONG LOK AND SEI HEI NEW VILLAGES, WONG TAI SIN WITH A VIEW TO IMPROVING THE WATER SUPPLY SITUATION THERE.

THERE IS AT PRESENT ONLY ONE PUBLIC STANDPIPE SERVING A POPULATION OF 2 000 IN THE TWO VILLAGES. THE ADDITIONAL STANDPIPES WILL REDUCE THE RATIO OF POPULATION TO STANDPIPE TO 660, RESULTING IN A MARKED IMPROVEMENT IN THE PRESENT WATER SUPPLY SITUATION, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE WONG TAI SIN CITY DISTRICT OFFICE SAID TODAY.

THE PROJECT IS BEING CARRIED OUT AT THE REQUEST OF THE VILLAGERS, WITH THE JOINT EFFORTS OF CITY DISTRICT OFFICE (WONG TAI SIN), WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT AND OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, HE SAID.
