STATUTORY BENEFITS OF IMPORTED WORKERS PROTECTED

* * * * *

IMPORTED WORKERS ARE ENTITLED TO EXACTLY THE SAME RIGHTS AND PROTECTION AS LOCAL WORKERS UNDER THE LABOUR LAWS.

ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR MR MAK SAI-YIU TODAY (SUNDAY) REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT THEY MUST GIVE IMPORTED WORKERS THEIR STATUTORY BENEFITS AND THE FULL AMOUNT OF WAGES.

HE NOTED THAT THREE EMPLOYERS HAD RECENTLY BEEN FINED BY THE COURTS FOR INFRINGING THE RIGHTS OF IMPORTED WORKERS.

MR MAK CITED A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH THE PROPRIETOR OF HIP HING MACHINE AND METAL FACTORY IN TSUEN WAN WAS FINED \$1,500 FOR ILLEGALLY DEDUCTING \$380 FROM THE WAGES OF AN IMPORTED WORKER.

"ACCORDING TO THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE, AN EMPLOYER IS NOT ALLOWED TO DEDUCT THE WAGES OF HIS EMPLOYEES EXCEPT UNDER SPECIFIC CONDITIONS AND UP TO CERTAIN LIMITS STIPULATED IN THE LAW, SUCH AS FOR THE PROVISION OF FOOD AND ACCOMMODATION AND RECOVERY OF LOANS MADE BY THE EMPLOYER," HE EXPLAINED.

"ANY DEDUCTION FROM AN IMPORTED WORKER'S WAGES OTHER THAN IS PERMITTED BY THE ORDINANCE IS UNLAWFUL," HE ADDED.

MR MAK NOTED THAT AN AMENDMENT TO THE ORDINANCE HAD BEEN INTRODUCED TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SEEKING TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM PENALTY FOR THE OFFENCE TO A FINE OF \$100,000 PLUS ONE YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT.

IN ANOTHER CASE, THE PROPRIETOR OF YUEN LEE COMPANY IN TUEN MUN WAS FINED \$500 FOR FAILING TO GRANT A STATUTORY HOLIDAY TO AN IMPORTED WORKER, CONTRARY TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE.

EMPLOYERS WHO BREACHED THE REQUIREMENT ARE LIABLE TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$10,000.

MR MAK ALSO REMINDED EMPLOYERS TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES FOR THEIR IMPORTED WORKERS AS REQUIRED UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION ORDINANCE.

HE NOTED THAT THE FUNG CHEONG LOONG INDUSTRIAL COMPANY LIMITED IN KWAI CHUNG HAD BEEN FINED \$1,500 RECENTLY BY A TSUEN WAN MAGISTRATE FOR FAILING TO INSURE FOR ITS EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING THREE IMPORTED WORKERS.

"ALL EMPLOYERS ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES TO COVER THEIR FULL LIABILITIES TO COMPENSATE WORKERS INJURED AT WORK UNDER THE ORDINANCE AND UNDER COMMON LAW," HE SAID.

"OFFENDERS ARE LIABLE, ON SUMMARY CONVICTION, TO A FINE OF \$20,000 AND TO IMPRISONMENT FOR ONE YEAR," HE NOTED.

MR MAK STRESSED THAT THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT WILL STEP UP ENFORCEMENT ACTION AGAINST EXPLOITATION OF IMPORTED WORKERS AND WILL PROSECUTE OFFENDING EMPLOYERS WHEN THERE IS EVIDENCE.

ONE MORE MONTH TO GIVE VIEWS ON CHINESE MEDICINE

* * * * *

THE WORKING PARTY ON CHINESE MEDICINE TODAY (SUNDAY) URGED THE PUBLIC AND PRACTITIONERS OF CHINESE MEDICINE TO SEND IN THEIR VIEWS ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN ITS INTERIM REPORT, PUBLISHED IN MID-JANUARY THIS YEAR.

THE SECRETARY OF THE WORKING PARTY, MR PETER KWOK, SAID: "IT IS NOW EXACTLY ONE MONTH FROM THE END OF THE CONSULTATION PERIOD ON APRIL 16. THE WORKING PARTY WILL BE EXAMINING ALL VIEWS CAREFULLY BEFORE REFINING FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SUBMISSION TO GOVERNMENT."

IN THE PAST TWO MONTHS, THE WORKING PARTY RECEIVED MORE THAN 70 WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS. OF THESE, 15 WERE FROM PROFESSIONAL ORGANISATIONS AND THE REST FROM INDIVIDUALS. THE WORKING PARTY HAS ALSO MONITORED COMMENTS THROUGH THE MEDIA.

"WE ARE GRATEFUL FOR THESE VIEWS BUT WE WOULD APPRECIATE MORE VIEWS SO AS TO REFLECT MORE FULLY THE WISHES OF OUR COMMUNITY," MR KWOK SAID.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS INCLUDE THE REGISTRATION OF TRADITIONAL CHINESE MEDICINE PRACTITIONERS SO AS TO ASSURE PATIENTS OF PROPER STANDARDS AND TO ACCORD PRACTITIONERS DUE STATUS. THE WORKING PARTY HAS ALSO ADVOCATED THE PROMULGATION OF A LIST OF POTENT AND TOXIC HERBS TO ENHANCE PUBLIC AWARENESS IN THEIR PROPER USE.

"THESE RECOMMENDATIONS AIM TO RECOGNISE THE ROLE OF TRADITIONAL CHINESE MEDICINE IN HEALTH CARE AND HEALTH MAINTENANCE AND TO DEVELOP TRADITIONAL CHINESE MEDICINE IN HONG KONG ON THE STRENGTHS OF ITS HERITAGE," MR KWOK ADDED.

COPIES OF THE INTERIM REPORT IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE ARE AVAILABLE AT ALL DISTRICT OFFICE PUBLIC ENQUIRY COUNTERS. TO DATE, 10,500 COPIES OF THE REPORT HAVE BEEN DISTRIBUTED.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN TREE PLANTING URGED

* * * * *

PROMOTING COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN TREE PLANTING HELPS PEOPLE LEARN AND UNDERSTAND THE COUNTRYSIDE ENVIRONMENT AND REMINDS PEOPLE OF THEIR OBLIGATION TO KEEP IT CLEAN, GREEN AND HEALTHY.

THIS WAS STATED TODAY (SUNDAY) BY OMELCO MEMBER MR ANDREW WONG AT THE LAUNCHING CEREMONY OF THE 1992 COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING SCHEME AT HOI HA AU, SAI KUNG WEST COUNTRY PARK.

/MR WONG

MR WONG SAID: "IT IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO HELP CONSERVE OUR COUNTRYSIDE."

HE SAID THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT (AFD) PRODUCED SOME 800,000 TREE SEEDLINGS EACH YEAR FOR PLANTING IN COUNTRY PARKS AND FOR USE IN GOVERNMENT LANDSCAPING PROJECTS.

"IT WOULD BE REALLY SAD IF SOME OF THESE TREES TURN OUT TO BE DAMAGED BY HILL FIRES OR VANDALISM," HE SAID.

MR WONG SAID TREES WERE VERY IMPORTANT TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

"THEY HELP TO BEAUTIFY OUR COUNTRYSIDE, STABILISE SOIL IN WATER CATCHMENT AREAS AND PROVIDE SHELTERS AND FOOD FOR A WIDE VARIETY OF WILDLIFE.

"TO SHOW MY SUPPORT FOR TREES AND TREE PLANTING," HE SAID, "I AND MY FAMILY ARE ACCUSTOMED TO PLANTING TREES IN COUNTRY PARKS WHEN THE COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING SCHEME STARTS EACH SPRING."

HE WAS PLEASED THAT THE SCHEME HAD NOW BECOME A VERY POPULAR ANNUAL EVENT AND HAD RECEIVED INCREASING SUPPORT FROM ALL SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY.

HE ALSO URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO PLANT THEIR TREES IN COUNTRY PARKS IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS.

"SHOW YOUR SUPPORT FOR COUNTRYSIDE CONSERVATION BY PLANTING YOUR TREES AND TAKING EVERY PRECAUTION TO PROTECT THE COUNTRYSIDE FROM HILL FIRE," HE URGED.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT TODAY'S CEREMONY WERE THE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, DR LAWRENCE LEE; THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNTRY PARKS BOARD, MR CARLOS CHEUNG, AND THE GOVERNOR OF THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT 3450, MR ANDRES GUILLEN.

EARLIER IN HIS WELCOME SPEECH, DR LEE SAID IT HAD BEEN THE DEPARTMENT'S LONG-STANDING PRACTICE TO ENCOURAGE ALL SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY, ESPECIALLY STUDENTS AND THE YOUNGER GENERATION, TO BE INVOLVED IN PLANTING TREES IN THE COUNTRY PARKS AND IN CARING FOR THEM.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING SCHEME DATED BACK TO 1957. SINCE THEN MORE AND MORE PEOPLE HAD RECOGNISED THE IMPORTANCE OF TREE PLANTING AND COUNTRYSIDE CONSERVATION.

"LAST YEAR, ABOUT 20,000 PEOPLE JOINED THE SCHEME AND PLANTED A TOTAL OF 26,000 TREES," HE SAID.

DR LEE ALSO COMMENDED THE ROTARIANS FOR THEIR KEEN SUPPORT FOR TREE PLANTING AND NATURE CONSERVATION.

/HE SAID

HE SAID SEVEN PLANTING SITES IN SELECTED COUNTRY PARKS WOULD BE OPEN BETWEEN MARCH 22 AND END OF APRIL FOR THE PUBLIC TO PLANT TREES, ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

DR LEE SAID: "COUNTRY PARKS STAFF WILL BE ON DUTY AT THE SELECTED SITES DURING THE PERIOD TO PROVIDE TREE SEEDLINGS, TOOLS AND TECHNICAL ADVICES."

ARRANGEMENTS CAN ALSO BE MADE FOR STUDENTS AND COMMUNITY GROUPS TO TAKE PART IN THE PLANTING PROGRAMME ON WEEKDAYS OR SATURDAYS DURING THE PERIOD.

TAX-FRAUD BUSTERS AT WORK

* * * * *

RAYMOND NG AND HIS SIX COLLEAGUES HARDLY LOOK LIKE LAW ENFORCERS. THEY DO NOT WEAR UNIFORM WHILE ON DUTY NOR DO THEY HAVE LEGAL POWER TO MAKE ARRESTS.

HOWEVER, THEY CAN BRING TO JUSTICE PEOPLE WHO STEAL WILFULLY WITH INTENT FROM THE PUBLIC PURSE.

SO FAR THIS YEAR, THEIR EFFORTS HAVE LED TO THE CONVICTIONS OF THREE MERCHANTS WHO EVADED PROFITS TAX TOTALLING \$1.8 MILLION BY UNDERSTATING PROFITS OF OVER \$10 MILLION.

SENIOR ASSESSOR RAYMOND NG, WHO HEADS THE SEVEN-MEMBER CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION SECTION OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, SAID THEIR MAIN TASK WAS TO CRACK DOWN ON SERIOUS TAX EVASION ACTIVITIES.

SINCE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SECTION IN APRIL 1987, THEY HAVE SUCCESSFULLY PROSECUTED NINE MERCHANTS FOR EVADING PROFITS TAX AND HAVE RECOVERED A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$12.1 MILLION FOR THE GOVERNMENT.

EXPLAINING THE TACTICS USED BY TAX EVADERS, HE SAID: "THEY MAY INFLATE CHARGES OR COSTS OF PURCHASES IN THE TAX RETURNS, UNDERSTATE SALES REVENUE, OMIT COMMISSION INCOME, OR MAKE FALSE INVOICES."

HE SAID THE INVESTIGATION TARGETS WERE MOSTLY UNLIMITED COMPANIES WHICH DID NOT NEED TO HAVE THEIR ACCOUNTS AUDITED, THUS POSSIBLY OPENING THE WAY TO MANIPULATION OF RECORDS.

"WHERE THERE ARE INDICATIONS OF SERIOUS FRAUDS, WE SHALL INITIATE INVESTIGATION ACTION. USUALLY WE HAVE TO APPLY FOR A SEARCH WARRANT TO SEIZE BOOKS OF ACCOUNT AND RECORDS FROM THE SUSPECT'S BUSINESS PREMISES.

"WE HAVE TO INTERVIEW THE SUSPECT AND VARIOUS WITNESSES, CROSS CHECK LARGE QUANTITIES OF DOCUMENTS AND RECORDS OF DIFFERENT PARTIES TO A BUSINESS DEAL.

"A HUGE VOLUME OF EVIDENCE HAVE TO BE GATHERED BEFORE WE CAN TAKE THE SUSPECT TO COURT," HE ADDED.

DESCRIBING THE PROCESS AS LENGTHY AND TIME-CONSUMING, MR NG SAID AN AVERAGE CASE MIGHT TAKE ONE-AND-A-HALF TO TWO YEARS BEFORE THE WORK COULD BEAR FRUITS.

DURING THE COURSE OF INVESTIGATION, ASSISTANCE OF OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS SUCH AS THE POLICE, LEGAL DEPARTMENT, INDEPENDENT COMMISSION AGAINST CORRUPTION AND IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT, IS ENLISTED.

CITING A RECENT CASE IN WHICH A SHOES AND HANDBAGS BUYING AGENT WAS FOUND GUILTY OF SUBMITTING FRAUDULENT PROFITS TAX RETURNS, MR NG SAID EXPERTS FROM THE GOVERNMENT LABORATORY HAD BEEN CALLED TO CONDUCT FORENSIC TEST TO VERIFY THE SIGNATURE OF THE DEFENDANT.

THE MERCHANT WAS SENTENCED TO 18 MONTHS' IMPRISONMENT SUSPENDED FOR TWO YEARS, AND FINED A SUM OF \$10,000 ON EACH CHARGE PLUS A PENAL TAX OF \$3.4 MILLION IN THE DISTRICT COURT.

THE INVESTIGATION SECTION HAS A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH VARIOUS LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, INCLUDING THE INTERPOL.

IN 1990, EXTRADITION ACTIONS WERE INITIATED AGAINST A CHEMICALS WHOLESALER WHO FLED TO CANADA WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE TO THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT DURING THE INVESTIGATION PERIOD.

HE WAS FINALLY ARRESTED AFTER HE HAD SLIPPED INTO HONG KONG. HE WAS LATER JAILED FOR 12 MONTHS AND FINED \$3.35 MILLION IN THE DISTRICT COURT.

NOTING THAT PUBLIC SUPPORT PLAYED AN IMPERATIVE PART IN THE FIGHT AGAINST TAX EVASION, MR NG SAID 80 PER CENT OF THE CASES HANDLED WERE PROMPTED BY TIP-OFFS FROM INFORMERS WHO MAY BE THE SUSPECT'S EMPLOYEES, COMPETITORS, FRIENDS AND RELATIVES.

HE URGED THE PUBLIC TO COME FORWARD TO REPORT CASES OF POSSIBLE TAX EVASION BY WRITING TO THE COMMISSIONER OF INLAND REVENUE AT GPO BOX 132 OR SIMPLY CALLING 594 4011.

"INFORMERS CAN BE ASSURED OF PEACE OF MIND BECAUSE INVESTIGATORS ARE OBLIGED BY LAW TO KEEP ALL INFORMATION STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL," HE SAID.

LOOKING AHEAD, MR NG HOPED THEIR WORK COULD CREATE A DETERRENT EFFECT ON POTENTIAL TAX EVADERS.

TAX EVASION IS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE. ON CONVICTION, THE MAXIMUM CUSTODIAL SENTENCE IS THREE YEARS' IMPRISONMENT AND A FINE OF \$20,000 ON EACH CHARGE, PLUS A FURTHER FINE OF TREBLE THE AMOUNT OF TAX UNDERCHARGED.

"WE HOPE TO INSTIL A MORE RESPONSIBLE ATTITUDE TO TAX MATTERS AMONG THE COMMUNITY. AFTER ALL, TAX EVASION IMPOSES SUBSTANTIAL COSTS TO A TAXPAYER," HE SAID.

58 NEW BUILDING PLANS APPROVED IN JANUARY

THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE OF THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT APPROVED 58 NEW BUILDING PLANS IN JANUARY.

OF THESE, 22 WERE FOR HONG KONG, 20 FOR KOWLOON AND 16 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE APPROVED PLANS INCLUDED 29 FOR APARTMENT, APARTMENT/COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS, 10 FOR COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS AND SIX FOR WORKSHOP PURPOSE.

DURING THE MONTH, THE OFFICE GAVE CONSENT FOR WORK TO START ON 44 PROJECTS, INVOLVING 54,435.4 SQUARE METRES OF USABLE DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA AND 107,683.8 SQUARE METRES OF USABLE NON-DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA.

THE TOTAL DECLARED COST OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS ABOUT \$1,455 MILLION.

USABLE FLOOR AREAS FOR DOMESTIC AND NON-DOMESTIC USES PROVIDED IN BUILDINGS WHICH WERE CERTIFIED FOR OCCUPATION WERE ABOUT 21,015.3 SQUARE METRES AND ABOUT 186,257 SQUARE METRES RESPECTIVELY.

ALSO DURING JANUARY, THE OFFICE ISSUED 45 OCCUPATION PERMITS; 17 FOR HONG KONG ISLAND, 16 FOR KOWLOON, AND 12 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

IN ADDITION, 26 DEMOLITION CONSENTS AFFECTING 51 BUILDINGS WERE ISSUED.

THE CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION RECEIVED 560 COMPLAINTS ON ILLEGAL BUILDING WORKS, CARRIED OUT 1,033 INSPECTIONS AND ISSUED 361 REMOVAL ORDERS.

THE DANGEROUS BUILDINGS SECTION INSPECTED 737 BUILDINGS AND NO EMERGENCY CLOSURES WERE REQUIRED.

SEAFOOD FESTIVAL IN SAI KUNG

THE SAI KUNG SEAFOOD FESTIVAL WAS AIMED AT PROMOTING TOURISM IN THE AREA SO AS TO BOOST THE TERRITORY'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR NEW TERRITORIES, MR ALBERT LAM, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE FESTIVAL, MR LAM NOTED THAT SAI KUNG WAS THE FASTEST GROWING DISTRICT IN HONG KONG AND A SEAFOOD CENTRE AS WELL.

"THE SEAFOOD HERE IS INEXPENSIVE, WITH A CONTINUOUS FRESH SUPPLY FROM THE EIGHT MARICULTURE ZONES IN THE DISTRICT.

"THIS 'SEAFOOD PARADISE' ATTRACTS NOT ONLY LOCAL BUT FOREIGN VISITORS AS WELL," MR LAM SAID.

ANOTHER "MAGNET" OF THE DISTRICT IS THE SERENE COUNTRYSIDE SETTING WITH A LARGE COUNTRY PARK, 28 BEACHES, THREE LARGE-SCALE HOLIDAY RESORT CENTRES, A WATER ACTIVITY CENTRE, SEVEN DECLARED MONUMENT LOCATIONS, AND MANY OTHER TOURIST SPOTS.
