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PUBLIC PRECAUTION URGED AGAINST SUMMER DISEASES

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WITH THE ARRIVAL OF SUMMER, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE URGED BY THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS AGAINST CHOLERA AND OTHER GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASE.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT IN 1986 THERE WERE 30 CHOLERA CASES AND 223 FOOD POISONING CASES, WHICH AFFECTED MORE THAN 1 000 PEOPLE.

DURING THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF 1987, 34 FOOD POISONING CASES AFFECTING 121 PEOPLE WERE REPORTED.

THE SPOKESMAN CAUTIONED THAT ALTHOUGH NO CHOLERA CASE HAS BEEN REPORTED SO FAR THIS YEAR, THE PUBLIC SHOULD NOT RELAX THEIR PRECAUTIONS AGAINST THE DISEASE.

+THE MOST RELIABLE AND EFFECTIVE METHOD TO PREVENT CHOLERA AND OTHER COMMUNICABLE DISEASES SUCH AS TYPHOID AND DYSENTERY IS TO OBSERVE PERSONAL, ENVIRONMENTAL AND FOOD HYGIENE,+ HE STRESSED.

DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS, PEOPLE TEND TO BE LESS CAREFUL IN THE CHOICE OF FOOD AND DRINKS. SINCE MOST GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASES ARE TRANSMITTED THROUGH CONTAMINATED FOOD AND DRINK, PEOPLE SHOULD BE SPECIALLY CAREFUL IN THEIR EATING HABITS.

THE SPOKESMAN ADVISED THAT ALL FOOD SHOULD BE THOROUGHLY COOKED AND SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNCOVERED IF NOT TAKEN IMMEDIATELY.

+THE CHOLERA BEING ENCOUNTERED TODAY IS CHOLERA EL TOR WHICH IS ENDEMIC IN THIS PART OF THE WORLD AND ISOLATED CASES ARE EXPECTED TO OCCUR NOW AND THEN, BUT EPIDEMICS ARE UNLIKELY.

+CHOLERA VACCINATION IS OF NO PRACTICAL VALUE AS A PUBLIC HEALTH PREVENTIVE MEASURE. THE STRICT ADHERENCE TO THE SIMPLE RULES OF PERSONAL HYGIENE SUCH AS WASHING OF HANDS AFTER TOILET AND BEFORE FOOD PREPARATION AND THE HYGIENIC HANDLING OF FOOD AND DRINKS ARE THE EFFECTIVE WAYS AGAINST CHOLERA AND OTHER DIARRHOEA DISEASES,+ HE SAID.

PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO OVERSEAS COUNTRIES WHERE CHOLERA IS ENDEMIC ARE ALSO ADVISED TO TAKE SPECIAL CARE IN THE SELECTION OF FOOD AND DRINK.

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YOUTHS URGED TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT
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A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, MRS ROSANNA TAM, TODAY (SUNDAY) URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC, AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN PARTICULAR, TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS DURING THE REVIEW OF THE REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT SYSTEM LATER THIS YEAR.

SHE WAS SPEAKING AT THE PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF THE +HONG KONG BEST OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SCHEME AWARD 1986-87+ HOSTED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AT THE HENRY G. LEONG YAUMATEI COMMUNITY CENTRE, YAU MA TEI.

MRS TAM NOTED THAT YOUNG PEOPLE COULD PARTICIPATE IN SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT AT DIFFERENT LEVELS.

+THE LOWEST LEVEL IS TO BE A LAW-ABIDING CITIZEN AND NEXT TO THAT IS TO SUPPORT STATUTORY GOVERNMENT ACTIONS.

+MOVING YET TO A HIGHER LEVEL IS TO PAY ATTENTION AND TO MONITOR THE WORK OF THE GOVERNMENT AND THE RELATED AUTHORITIES AND TO GIVE OPINIONS WHEN NECESSARY.

+THE HIGHEST LEVEL IS TO INITIATE DEVELOPMENTS TO IMPROVE THE SOCIETY,+ SHE SAID.

+WHAT WE ARE ADVOCATING TODAY IS ACTIVE, AND NOT PASSIVE, PARTICIPATION,+ SHE ADDED.

MRS TAM CALLED ON YOUNG PEOPLE TO PAY ATTENTION TO THE FORTHCOMING REVIEW OF THE REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT SYSTEM AND TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS FREELY.

HOWEVER, SHE STRESSED THAT BEFORE DOING SO, YOUNG PEOPLE SHOULD FIRST ACQUIRE KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THE EXISTING POLITICAL SYSTEM, THE JOINT DECLARATION, THE POLITICAL SYSTEMS AND STRUCTURES OF OTHER WESTERN COUNTRIES AND THE BASIC PRINCIPLES IN ASSESSING POLITICAL SYSTEMS.

IN HER WELCOMING REMARKS, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ELIZABETH WONG, SAID THAT PROJECTS AIMED AT SERVING THE HOMELESS WOULD BE GIVEN PRIORITY WHEN APPLYING FOR SUBSIDIES UNDER THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SCHEME.

SHE NOTED THAT 1987 HAD BEEN DESIGNATED AS THE +INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF SHELTER FOR THE HOMELESS.+

+WE HAVE THEREFORE DECIDED TO ECHO THIS INTERNATIONAL THEME AND MAKE THIS OUR TARGET FOR THE 1987-88 OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SCHEME,+ SHE SAID.

SHE ADDED THAT IN THE BROADER SENSE, THE +HOMELESS+ INCLUDED STREET SLEEPERS, SOLO-PARENT FAMILIES AND THOSE WHO LACK PROPER HOUSING AND REQUIRE ADEQUATE CARE.

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ON YOUTH SOCIAL WORK IN GENERAL, MRS WONG SAID THAT FOR YEARS THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT HAD BEEN ACTIVELY PROMOTING SERVICES TO ASSIST YOUNG PEOPLE TO BECOME USEFUL MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY BY FOSTERING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR PERSONALITY, CHARACTER, SENSE OF CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY AND ABILITY TO USE THEIR LEISURE TIME BENEFICIALLY.

+AT THE SAME TIME, THE DEPARTMENT HAS SET UP YOUTH AND COMMUNITY OFFICES IN VARIOUS DISTRICTS TO CO-ORDINATE, DEVELOP AND PROMOTE YOUTH WORK, COMMUNITY SERVICES AND OTHER ACTIVITIES AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL.

+THERE ARE ALSO GROUP WORK UNITS IN COMMUNITY CENTRES TO PROVIDE SUPPORTIVE GROUP AND SELF-PROGRAMMING GROUP ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE,+ SHE SAID.

VOLUNTERY AGENCIES, MRS WONG ADDED, WERE ALSO INVOLVED IN THE PROVISION OF SERVICES SUCH AS FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION, SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK AND OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORK.

+THROUGH THE SPIRIT OF MUTUAL CO-OPERATION, WE STRIVE TO PROVIDE VARIOUS ESSENTIAL SERVICES TO YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ARE THE 'PILLARS OF SOCIETY' OF OUR TOMORROW,+ SHE SAID.

UNDER THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SCHEME WHICH WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1974, YOUTH GROUPS ARE GIVEN SUBSIDIES BY THE DEPARTMENT TO ENABLE THEM TO DEVISE AND IMPLEMENT INNOVATIVE COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS THROUGH THE POOLING OF THEIR KNOWLEDGE, DEDICATION AND ENTHUSIASM AND THEREBY ENHANCING THEIR SOCIAL AWARENESS AND THE SPIRIT OF CO-OPERATION.

THE BEST AWARD WAS INTRODUCED IN 1985-86 TO MARK THE INTERNATIONAL YEAR FOR YOUTH.

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SPIRIT HIGH IN KEEPING VILLAGES CLEAN

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THE SPIRIT OF INVOLVEMENT AND CO-OPERATION IN LAST MONTH'S SAI KUNG DISTRICT CLEAN VILLAGE COMPETITION WAS HIGHLY EVIDENT WITH GOOD ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT OFFICE SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

THE PERFORMANCE OF PARTICIPATING VILLAGES HAD HELPED TO STRENGTHEN RESIDENTS' AWARENESS OF THE IMPORTANCE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SANITATION, AND AMPLIFIED THE VALUE OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN SUCH A WORTHY CAUSE AS KEEPING THE VILLAGES CLEAN, HE SAID.

/JOINTLY ORGANISED

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JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT BOARD ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE AND THE REGIONAL COUNCIL, THE CLEAN VILLAGE COMPETITION WAS HELD IN SUPPORT OF THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN CAMPAIGN.

A TEAM OF ADJUDICATORS WAS FORMED COMPRISING MEMBERS OF THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT BOARD ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE, LOCAL LEADERS, VILLAGE REPRESENTATIVES AND OFFICIALS OF THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT OFFICE AND REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

DURING AN EIGHT-DAY INSPECTION OF THE VILLAGES, THE ADJUDICATORS HAD ASSESSED THE CONDITIONS OF THE MAIN ROADS, FOOTPATHS, SIDE LANES, PUBLIC OPEN SPACES, PUBLIC TOILETS, NULLAHS, STREAMS, SEA SHORE, OPEN CHANNELS AND REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS.

WHILE INSPECTING THE VILLAGES, THEY HAD ALSO EXPRESSED THEIR VIEWS TO VILLAGERS ON THE IMPORTANCE OF KEEPING A CLEAN AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT AND WAYS TO IMPROVE CLEANSING SERVICES AND FACILITIES.

FOURTEEN VILLAGES TOOK PART IN THE COMPETITION AND THE THREE WINNING VILLAGES ARE TAI HANG HAU VILLAGE, LUNG MEI VILLAGE AND KWUN MUN FISHERMEN VILLAGE.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES AND SOUVENIRS TO THE THREE WINNING VILLAGES AND OTHER PARTICIPATING VILLAGES WILL BE HELD ON WEDNESDAY (MAY 6).

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SOUTHERN DISTRICT ENVIRONMENT BEING IMPROVED

THE OUTLOOK AND FACILITIES OF A NUMBER OF SQUATTER VILLAGES IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT HAVE IMPROVED AFTER CONSTRUCTION AND ACCESS IMPROVEMENT WORKS CARRIED OUT UNDER THE DISTRICT BOARD'S ENVIRONMENT IMPROVEMENT SCHEMES.

ABOUT \$32 400 WAS SPENT ON VARIOUS CONSTRUCTION WORKS WHICH WERE RECENTLY COMPLETED IN THREE VILLAGES IN WONG CHUK HANG, STANLEY AND SHEK O UNDER THE COMPREHENSIVE SQUATTER IMPROVEMENT SCHEME, WHILE ANOTHER \$122 815 WAS SPENT ON MINOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS ELSEWHERE.

/PROJECTS CARRIED

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PROJECTS CARRIED OUT IN THE VILLAGES INCLUDED THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SITTING-OUT AREA IN MARY NEW VILLAGE, REFURBISHING A LATRINE IN KAU WAI AND REPAIRING AND RESURFACING FOOTSTEPS, ACCESSES AND A FOOTPATH AND PROVIDING A DRAIN COVER IN SHEK O VILLAGE.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT WORKS WERE ENDORSED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD'S ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE FOLLOWING SURVEYS CONDUCTED BY THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE LAST YEAR.

UNDER THE COMPREHENSIVE SQUATTER IMPROVEMENT SCHEME, IN-DEPTH STUDIES WERE CARRIED OUT TO LOOK INTO BASIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES PROVIDED IN THE VILLAGES AND MEASURES REQUIRED TO MEET DEMANDS WERE RECOMMENDED.

AREAS COVERED BY THE SURVEYS INCLUDED POWER AND WATER SUPPLY, SEWAGE DISPOSAL, REFUSE COLLECTION SERVICES, STREET LIGHTING, POSTAL SERVICES, DRAINAGES, ACCESSES, LAW AND ORDER, AND RECREATIONAL AND AMENITY FACILITIES.

MOST OF THE OTHER RECENTLY COMPLETED MINOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS WERE ALSO IN SQUATTER AREAS. THEY INCLUDED INSTALLATING GUARDRAILS, CONSTRUCTING FOOTSTEPS AND RESURFACING ACCESSES IN TELEGRAPH BAY, TAI HAU WAN (BISNEY ROAD) AND KELLETT BAY VILLAGES, REPAIRING A SECTION OF A STREAM COURSE IN BIG WAVE BAY VILLAGE AND CONSTRUCTING A RAINSHELTER AT THE GREEN MINIBUS STAND ON SANDY BAY ROAD.

WITH AN ALLOCATION OF \$657 000 FROM THE DISTRICT BOARD THIS YEAR, THE ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE WILL KEEP UP ITS EFFORTS IN IMPLEMENTING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT MEASURES.

IN FACT, IT HAS RECENTLY ENDORSED A RECOMMENDATION TO CONDUCT SURVEYS IN PAK DAI NAI SQUATTER AREA (EAST AND WEST), AND SHUI CHOI TIN AND TAI TAM TUK VILLAGES TO IDENTIFY AREAS FOR REMEDIAL WORKS.

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FIRST-HAND LOOK AT WORKING WORLD

THE YOUTH EMPLOYMENT ADVISORY SERVICE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT IS ORGANISING A MONTH-LONG WORK ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR STUDENTS TO SEE FOR THEMSELVES THE REAL WORLD OF WORK.

MORE THAN 1 000 STUDENTS FROM 40 SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN SHAM SHUI PO, KOWLOON CITY AND THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT WILL TAKE PART IN THE PROGRAMME WHICH STARTS ON THURSDAY (MAY 7).

/THE PROGRAMME

THE PROGRAMME INCLUDES VISITS TO VARIOUS ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS INCLUDING TRAINING CENTRES OF DISCIPLINARY FORCES, TELEVISION STATIONS, BANKS, HOTELS, PUBLIC UTILITIES COMPANIES AND TOY FACTORIES.

THE VISITS WILL BE CONDUCTED BY SPECIALLY ASSIGNED PERSONNEL OF EACH ESTABLISHMENT AND AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS WILL ALSO BE USED WHERE NECESSARY.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE PROGRAMME HAD BEEN WELL RECEIVED BY STUDENTS IN THE PAST THREE YEARS.

+IT ENABLES STUDENTS TO ACQUIRE FIRST-HAND INFORMATION ON VARIOUS SPECIALISED FIELD OF WORK AND TO SEE FOR THEMSELVES THE ACTUAL WORKING ENVIRONMENT,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THROUGH SUCH CAREERS-ORIENTED ACTIVITIES, THE STUDENTS WOULD BE ABLE TO DEVELOP A MORE REALISTIC UNDERSTANDING OF THE IMPORTANCE OF FINDING JOBS BEST SUITED TO THEIR POTENTIAL.

+AND IN THE LONG TERM, OUR SOCIETY WILL BENEFIT FROM BEING ABLE TO OPTIMISE ITS USE OF HUMAN RESOURCES,+ HE ADDED.

MEMBERS WILL COMMENT AND EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS ON THE BILL WHICH DEALS WITH MATTERS CONCERNING FILM CENSORSHIP AND CLASSIFICATION.

AT THE MEETING, AN ASSISTANT SECRETARY FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AND INFORMATION BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT WILL BRIEF MEMBERS AND ANSWER THEIR QUESTIONS.

THE POLICY STATEMENT ON LONG TERM HOUSING STRATEGY WILL ALSO BE DISCUSSED.

MEMBERS WILL ALSO BE CONSULTED ON THE NAMING OF A TUNNEL OF ROUTE 5-A TRUNK ROAD LINKING SHA TIN AND TSUEN WAN. THE ROAD PROJECT IS SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED IN LATE 1989.

OTHER ITEMS ON THE AGENDA INCLUDE A QUESTION ON WHETHER THE PUBLIC ORDER ORDINANCE WILL HAVE ANY EFFECT ON THE DELIVERY OF SPEECHES BY DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS.

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REPORTS ON THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD WILL ALSO BE TABLED.

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**EMERGENCY GENERATORS CONTRACT AWARDED

THE ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED A \$1.6 MILLION CONTRACT FOR SUPPLYING AND INSTALLING SIX EMERGENCY GENERATORS.

THEY WILL BE INSTALLED AT THE TAI PO AND TSING YI DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS AND DIVISIONAL POLICE STATIONS, SIU LEK YUEN DIVISIONAL POLICE STATION, WONG TAI SIN POLICE STATION, ABERDEEN POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL, AND THE TAI LAM CENTRE FOR WOMEN.

ALSO INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT IS THE SUPPLY AND INSTALLATION OF GARAGE EQUIPMENT AND ASSOCIATED ACCESSORIES FOR THE TAI PO AND TSING YI DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS AND DIVISIONAL POLICE STATIONS AND THE SIU LEK YUEN DIVISIONAL POLICE STATION.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO TAKE ABOUT 15 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

THEY WILL GIVE THEIR VIEWS ON THE CHANGES TO THE EXISTING STRATEGY AND IN PARTICULAR, THE INTRODUCTION OF A HOME PURCHASE LOAN SCHEME TO ASSIST THE LOW AND MIDDLE-INCOME FAMILIES TO PURCHASE NEW PRIVATE FLATS.

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**ANOTHER SERVICE RESERVOIR FOR PENG CHAU

AN ADDITIONAL SERVICE RESERVOIR WITH A CAPACITY OF 3 000 CUBIC METRES IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON PENG CHAU TO IMPROVE THE ISLAND'S WATER SUPPLY.

THE WORK ALSO INCLUDES LAYING 550 METRES OF FRESH WATER MAIN BETWEEN THE NEW SERVICE RESERVOIR AND THE EXISTING PUMPING STATION NEAR TAI WO.

AT PRESENT, A SERVICE RESERVOIR WITH A CAPACITY OF 2 080 CUBIC METRES SERVES RESIDENTS.

THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE 14-MONTH PROJECT WHICH IS EXPECTED TO START IN JULY.

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TSUEN WAN ROAD CLOSED FOR FLYOVER CONSTRUCTION
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TEMPORARY TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN TSUEN WAN ROAD NEAR THE ROUNDABOUT AT TEXACO ROAD FROM WEDNESDAY (MAY 6) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FLYOVER.

THE SLIP ROAD LEADING FROM THE ROUNDABOUT TO THE KOWLOON-BOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF TSUEN WAN ROAD WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC BETWEEN 1.15 AM AND 5.30 AM DAILY ON MAY 6 AND 7.

DURING THE CLOSURE, MOTORISTS HEADING FOR KOWLOON WILL BE DIVERTED TO TEXACO ROAD, MA TAU PA ROAD, YEUNG UK ROAD, TEXACO ROAD AND KWAI FUK ROAD.
