IMPROVED IRRIGATION FACILITIES FOR N.T. FARMERS

*** **

THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT IS PUSHING AHEAD WITH ITS EFFORTS TO MODERNISE IRRIGATION FACILITIES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY THAT THE MOST IMPORTANT FACTOR AFFECTING THE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME WAS CO-OPERATION AMONG THE FARMERS THEMSELVES, BECAUSE THE SMALL SIZE OF INDIVIDUAL FARMS AND THEIR CLOSE PROXIMITY NECESSITATES MUTUAL AID AND CONSIDERATION.

A SUM OF \$600,000 HAS BEEN ALLOCATED THIS YEAR FOR FIVE IRRIGATION DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN SHAP LONG, SHAN HA, HOK TAU, HA HANG AND SHAN LIU.

IRRIGATION SYSTEMS ALREADY EXIST IN THESE AREAS WHERE FARMERS HAVE BUILT ROUGH RUBBLE WEIRS TO DIVERT WATER VIA EARTH CHANNELS ONTO THE FIELDS. IN SHAP LONG AND HOK TAU USE IS ALSO BEING MADE OF STORAGE RESERVOIRS PROVIDED BY THE WATERWORKS OFFICE FOR IRRIGATION USE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE DEPARTMENT IS IMPROVING THESE TRADITIONAL SYSTEMS IN TWO WAYS. FIRST, IT IS REPLACING THE RUBBLE WEIRS WITH MODERN IMPERVIOUS CONCRETE DIVERSION WEIRS AND THEN IT EITHER REPLACES THE EARTH CHANNELS WITH CONCRETE ONES, OR WHERE THE LAND IS TOO RUGGED, INSTALLS PIPELINES.

IN THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1973/74 FOUR IRRIGATION DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS, COSTING SOME \$500,000 WERE CARRIED OUT IN VARIOUS PARTS OF YUEN LONG, TAI PO, SAI KUNG AND LANTAU IN AN ATTEMPT TO IMPROVE EXISTING FACILITIES AND TO OPEN UP UNUSED LAND.

THE SPOKESMAN CITED AN EXAMPLE IN TAI MONG CHE, TAI PO, WHERE ABOUT EIGHT ACRES OF ABANDONED LAND WERE TURNED INTO ARABLE VEGETABLE PLOTS, AND SAID THIS WAS +MOST ENCOURAGING.+

MANY FARMERS ARE TURNING FROM TRADITIONAL RICE FARMING TO MARKET GARDENING WHICH AT PRESENT IS MORE PROFITABLE, HE NOTED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ALSO CONCENTRATING ON INTRODUCING THE SPRINKLER IRRIGATION SYSTEM TO THE FARMERS.

LAST YEAR A DEMONSTRATION SCHEME FINANCED BY THE DEPARTMENT WAS SET UP IN HOK TAU, TAI PO. +WE HOPE TO SHOW THE FARMERS WHAT THE SPRINKLER SYSTEM IS ALL ABOUT, AND WHEN THEY SEE THAT THE FARMER WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE SCHEME IS MAKING A CLEAR PROFIT, THEY ARE LIKELY TO ADOPT THE SYSTEM.+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

/THERE ARE

THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF SPRINKLERS -- THE ROTARY SPRINKLER AND THE FIXED HEAD SPRINKLER. THE ROTARY SPRINKLER SENDS OUT ONE JET OF WATER WHILE ITS HEAD ROTATES 360 DEGREES TO COVER THE ENTIRE SURROUNDING AREA, WHEREAS THE FIXED HEAD SPRINKLER GIVES OFF A SHOWER IN ALL DIRECTIONS IN A CIRCLE TO WATER THE AREA WITHIN ITS RADIUS.

+ON MANY FARMS THE WORKERS ARE STILL USING THE OLD METHOD OF BUCKETS AND MANUAL LABOUR TO WATER THE CROPS. THIS IS TIME CONSUMING AND THEREFORE UNECONOMICAL, ESPECIALLY WITH THE RECENT SHARP INCREASE IN LABOUR COSTS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

TO OPERATE THE SPRINKLER SYSTEM THERE ARE TWO WAYS TO BUILD UP THE WATER PRESSURE, AND HE AGAIN STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF CO-OPERATION AMONG THE FARMERS IN THIS RESPECT.

IN THE FIRST METHOD THE FARMERS CAN INSTALL INDIVIDUAL PUMPS. WITH THE SIZE OF THE FARMS PLUS THE IRREGULAR-SHAPED PLOTS, IT IS NOT PRACTICAL FOR A FARMER TO INSTALL A PUMP BY HIMSELF. +CHANCES ARE HE WILL ONLY USE IT FOR HALF-AN-HOUR OR ONE HOUR EACH DAY,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID, +AND IT WOULD MAKE MORE SENSE IF SEVERAL NEIGHBOURING FARMERS WERE TO SHARE A PUMP, THUS REDUCING THE COST.+

+BUT THE MAJORITY OF HONG KONG FARMERS ARE TOO INDEPENDENT TO ACCEPT THIS CONCEPT, AND I THINK IT WILL TAKE SOME TIME BEFORE THEY ARE RECONCILED TO THE IDEA.+

SECONDLY, WHERE THE RESERVOIRS ARE SITUATED HIGH ON A HILL, THERE WILL BE SUFFICIENT PRESSURE AVAILABLE TO OPERATE THE SPRINKLER SYSTEMS FROM WATER PIPED TO THE FIELDS.

THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT +HERE AGAIN CO-OPERATION AND CONSIDERATION ARE NECESSARY BECAUSE THE PRESSURE CANNOT BE MAINTAINED IF EVERYONE TURNED ON THEIR SYSTEM AT THE SAME TIME.+

AN EXTENSIVE IRRIGATION SYSTEM IS BEING BUILT ON THE SAI KUNG PENINSULA AT A COST OF SOME \$7 MILLION IN CONNECTION WITH THE HIGH ISLAND WATER SCHEME. THE INITIAL PLANNING BEGAN AS EARLY AS 1969, AND THE WHOLE PROJECT IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN 1975.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT ONCE AN IRRIGATION SYSTEM WAS BUILT IT MUST BE MAINTAINED. HE NOTED THAT MAINTENANCE COSTS HAD GONE UP IN THE LAST FEW YEARS DUE TO THE RECENT WIDESPREAD DEVELOPMENT OF IRRIGATION SYSTEMS IN CONJUNCTION WITH VARIOUS MAJOR WATER PROJECTS SUCH AS THE PLOVER COVE RESERVOIR. APART FROM THE DAILY WEAR AND TEAR, A LOT OF DAMAGE COULD BE DONE BY TYPHOONS AND FLOODS FOLLOWING RAINSTORMS, HE ADDED.

A TOTAL OF \$250,000 HAS BEEN ALLOCATED FOR MAINTENANCE PROGRAMMES IN THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR, COMPARED WITH ONLY \$90,000 TWO YEARS AGO.

FIVE KILLED IN WORK ACCIDENTS LAST MONTH

FIVE WORKERS WERE KILLED AND 497 INJURED LAST MONTH IN ACCIDENTS ON CONSTRUCTION SITES, ACCORDING TO FIGURES RELEASED TODAY BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

TWO OF THE FATALITIES AND 85 OF THE INJURIES WERE CAUSED BY FALLS, BRINGING THE TOTAL FOR THIS TYPE OF ACCIDENT IN THE FIRST EIGHT MONTHS OF THE YEAR TO 17 KILLED AND 524 INJURED.

THIS COMPARES WITH SIX FATALITIES AND 351 INJURED IN THE SAME EIGHT-MONTH PERIOD LAST YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING OFFICER, MR. NICK CARTER, SAID TODAY.

+THESE FIGURES POINT OUT THAT THE INDUSTRY NOT ONLY HAS A CONTINUING PROBLEM BUT A WORSENING ONE, AND IT WILL CONTINUE TO BE A RUNNING SORE UNTIL POSITIVE PRECAUTIONS ARE IMPLEMENTED,+ HE SAID.

+TWO COMMON CAUSES OF FALLS ARE LACK OF SAFE WORKING PLATFORMS - WHICH RESULT IN WORKERS HAVING TO PERFORM LIKE ACROBATS IN A CIRCUS - AND LACK OF SAFE MEANS OF ACCESS. OFTEN WORKERS USE MAKESHIFT LADDERS - OR WORSE, NO LADDERS ARE PROVIDED AT ALL.

+ANOTHER FACTOR IS THE FAILURE TO PROVIDE WALKWAYS OR FENCING AROUND EXCAVATION AND OPENINGS IN FLOORS.

+HOWEVER, THE BIGGEST CONTRIBUTORY CAUSE IS THE BAD HOUSE-KEEPING SO EVIDENT ON MOST BUILDING SITES, WHERE PILES OF RUBBISH AND DISCARDED MATERIALS ARE STREWN ABOUT THE PLACE.

+HIGH STANDARDS OF HOUSEKEEPING WILL PAY DIVIDENDS BOTH IN THE REDUCTION OF ACCIDENTS AND THE TIME SAVED IN LOOKING FOR THE RIGHT MATERIALS,+ MR. CARTER EMPHASISED.

NOTE TO EDITORS:

NEW PARKING METERS FOR YAU MA TEI

ALL PARKING METERS IN THE YAU MA TEI AREA, KOWLOON, WILL BE REPLACED BY THE NEW-RATE TYPES AS FROM THURSDAY (SEPTEMBER 19), THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY.

THE CHANGEOVER, INVOLVING ABOUT 950 OLD METERS, WILL BE SPREAD OVER SIX WORKING DAYS AND WILL START OUTSIDE THE CANTON ROAD GOVERNMENT OFFICES.

A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE PROGRAMME WAS PART OF A SERIES TO GRADUALLY REPLACE ALL PARKING METERS IN HONG KONG AND KOWLOON WITH THE NEW METERS. METERS HAVE ALREADY BEEN SO CONVERTED IN CENTRAL, WANCHAI AND TSIM SHA TSUI AREAS.

LEGISLATION AUTHORIZING THE NEW RATES FOR PARKING METERS WAS PASSED IN JUNE 1972.

THE SPOKESMAN ADVISED MOTORISTS TO READ CAREFULLY THE REGULATION PRINTED ON THE METAL PLATE ATTACHED TO THE NEW PARKING METER TO ENSURE THAT THE CORRECT COINS WERE INSERTED.

+CARS ALREADY PARKED AT THE OLD RATE METERS WHICH ARE SUBSEQUENTLY CHANGED TO NEW RATE ONES WHILE THE CARS ARE STILL PARKED WILL BE GIVEN THE FULL TIME ALLOWED BY THE NEW RATES,+ HE SAID.

ARRANGEMENTS HAVE ALSO BEEN MADE, HE ADDED, TO CANCEL ANY PARKING TICKET ISSUED TO A MOTORIST WHO MAY HAVE PARKED HIS CAR AT A 10-HOUR OR FOUR-HOUR METER WHEN IT WAS REPLACED BY A TWO-HOUR NEW METER.

THE NEW METERS ACCEPT ONLY 50-CENT OR ONE DOLLAR COINS. UNDER THE NEW RATE SYSTEM, THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF TWO-HOUR METERS - ONE WHICH ACCEPTS 50-CENT COINS FOR 30 MINUTES, WHILE THE OTHER TAKES 50-CENT COINS FOR ONE HOUR. THERE ARE ALSO NEW HALF-HOUR METERS FOR WHICH THE CHARGE IS A FLAT \$1.

GOVERNOR TO VISIT BIG TEXTILE WORKS

NOTE TO EDITORS:

THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, WILL BE VISITING A BIG TEXTILE FACTORY AT TSUEN WAN TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY) TO SEE MANUFACTURING OPERATIONS IN PROGRESS.

HE WILL MAKE A SHOP-FLOOR TOUR OF CHINA DYEING WORKS LTD, WHICH HAS BEEN A PIONEER OF THE TEXTILE PRINTING INDUSTRY IN HONG KONG. MORE THAN 600 WORKERS ARE EMPLOYED AT THE FACTORY WHICH PRODUCES FINISHED FABRICS FOR USE IN THE LOCAL GARMENT-MAKING INDUSTRY.

SIR MURRAY WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE DIRECTOR OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY, MR. DAVID JORDAN, AND THE PRINCIPAL TRADE OFFICER, INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. K.H. YEUNG.

THEY WILL BE RECEIVED AT THE FACTORY BY THE CHAIRMAN AND MANAGING DIRECTOR, MR. CHA CHI MING, AND OTHER OFFICIALS OF THE COMPANY.

YOU ARE INVITED TO SEND A REPORTER AND PHOTOGRAPHER TO COVER THE GOVERNOR'S VISIT TO THE CHINA DYEING WORKS LTD AT 3 P.M. TOMORROW. PRESS REPRESENTATIVES ARE REQUESTED TO MEET G.I.S. STAFF AT 2.45 P.M. AT THE MAIN ENTRANCE TO THE FACTORY, WHICH IS SITUATED OFF THE CASTLE PEAK ROAD, 9 MILESTONE, TSUEN WAN, NEAR THE N.T. POLICE TRAFFIC HEADQUARTERS.

THE COMPANY HAS APPOINTED MR. JOHN NG TO ACT AS ITS PRESS LIAISON OFFICER.

WATER SITUATION REPORT

THE TOTAL WATER STORAGE IN ALL RESERVOIRS AS AT 9 A.M. TODAY (TUESDAY) STOOD AT 36,798 MILLION GALLONS, REPRESENTING 54.7 PER CENT OF THE FULL CAPACITY OF 67,300 MILLION GALLONS. AT THIS TIME LAST YEAR THERE WERE 66,018 MILLION GALLONS IN STORE.

THIS MORNING'S STORAGE AT PLOVER COVE WAS 28,123 MILLION GALLONS, COMPARED WITH 50,298 MILLION GALLONS ON THE SAME DAY LAST YEAR. PLOVER COVE'S PRESENT STORAGE REPRESENTS 55.7 PER CENT OF ITS FULL CAPACITY OF 50,500 MILLION GALLONS.

1.0 M.M. (0.04 IN) OF RAINFALL WAS RECORDED AT THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY DURING THE PAST 24 HOURS ENDING AT 9 A.M. TODAY. TOTAL RAINFALL RECORDED SO FAR THIS YEAR IS 1,357.7 M.M. (53.45 IN).

THE MEAN AVERAGE RAINFALL SINCE JANUARY 1 STANDS AT 1,871.3 M.M. (73.67 IN), REPRESENTING A SHORTFALL OF 27.4 PER CENT.

CHEUNG SHA WAN LICENSED AREA TO BE IMPROVED

* * * * *

THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT IS TO CARRY OUT A NUMBER OF IMPROVEMENTS TO AREA "C" OF CHEUNG SHA WAN LICENSED AREA TO PROVIDE BETTER LIVING CONDITIONS FOR THE RESIDENTS.

THE IMPROVEMENTS WERE LISTED IN THE REPLY TO THE RESIDENTS' LATEST PETITION WHICH WAS HANDED TO THEM THIS (TUESDAY) AFTERNOON.

MR. IAN LIGHTBODY, SECRETARY FOR HOUSING, SAID IN THE REPLY THAT THE IMPROVEMENTS WOULD INCLUDE THE CONCRETING OF THE TWO MAIN ROADS THROUGH THE LICENSED AREA AND THE SURFACING OF AN OPEN SPACE NEARBY FOR CHILDREN TO PLAY.

HE ADDED THAT ANY DEFECTS IN THE STORMWATER DRAINS INSTALLED BY THE GOVERNMENT WILL BE REPAIRED AND AN ADDITIONAL FIRE EXIT WILL BE PROVIDED.

REFERRING TO THE RESIDENTS' REQUEST FOR EARLY REHOUSING, MR. LIGHTBODY SAID IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE FOR THE DEPARTMENT TO OFFER THEM IMMEDIATE REHOUSING SINCE THIS WOULD BE MOST UNFAIR TO THE 8,000-ODD PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN LIVING IN KOWLOON LICENSED AREAS FOR A MUCH LONGER PERIOD THAN THE GROUP.

HOWEVER, IT IS POSSIBLE FOR THE DEPARTMENT TO OFFER THEM PUBLIC HOUSING IN KWAI CHUNG BY THE END OF 1975 PROVIDED THAT THERE WILL BE NO UNFORESEEN DELAY TO THE HOUSING PROGRAMME.

MR. LIGHTBODY SAID: + THE ESTATE BLOCKS TO WHICH YOU WILL MOVE ARE NOW BEING BUILT IN KWAI CHUNG, BUT IF SOME UNFORESEEN EVENT OCCURS TO DELAY COMPLETION THEN THE ALLOCATION DATE WILL SIMILARLY BE DELAYED. +

HE EXPLAINED THAT ANY PROMISE MADE BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO ALLOCATE HOUSING TO ANY PARTY BY A CERTAIN DATE IS ALWAYS SUBJECT TO SUCH A RESERVATION.
