RESIDENTS URGED TO HELP FIGHT CRIME
* * * * *

WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ROGER GARCIA, TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED LOCAL RESIDENTS TO SUPPORT AND JOIN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME WHICH COULD HELP THEM TO PREVENT AND FIGHT CRIME.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE DISTRICT'S FIGHT CRIME CAMPAIGN, MR GARCIA SAID THE EMPHASIS OF THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WAS ON THE PREVENTION OF BURGLARIES AND ROBBERIES IN RESIDENTIAL AND HIGH-RISK PREMISES, AND ON THE IMPORTANCE OF THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME.

+ IN THE COMING MONTHS, THE POLICE AND WAN CHAI DFCC MEMBERS WILL HELP PROMOTE THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME IN RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS THAT ARE BEING AFFECTED BY CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES,+ HE SAID.

+ I HOPE RESIDENTS WILL FORM NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH TEAMS TO KEEP VIGILANCE NOT JUST ON THEIR OWN HOMES BUT ALSO THOSE OF THEIR NEIGHBOURS.+

A VARIETY SHOW IN SOUTHERN PLAYGROUND TODAY MARKED THE BEGINNING OF A SERIES OF PUBLICITY PROGRAMMES ON THE DISTRICT'S FIGHT CRIME ACTIVITIES, MR GARCIA SAID.

A POSTER DESIGN COMPETITION WITH THE CRIME PREVENTION THEME AND NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH HAS BEEN ORGANISED, AND THERE WILL BE AN ESSAY COMPETITION ON HOW TO PREVENT CRIME FOR SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS LIVING OR STUDYING IN THE DISTRICT.

DETAILS OF THESE COMPETITIONS COULD BE OBTAINED AT THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICE, MR GARCIA SAID.

PERFORMING IN TODAY'S VARIETY SHOW WERE THE AUXILIARY POLICE PIPE BAND, POLICE DOGS TEAMS AND POPULAR SINGERS. THERE WAS ALSO A DRAMA PRESENTED BY THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT ARTS, CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS ASSOCIATION THEATRE.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY WERE POLICE DISTRICT COMMANDER (WAN CHAI), MR LAU TO-YEE, AND MEMBERS OF THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE.

CENTRES HELP CHILDREN FORM CHARACTER

CHILDREN'S CENTRES HELP CHILDREN TO DEVELOP THEIR CREATIVITY AND INDEPENDENT THINKING THROUGH GROUP ACTIVITIES, AND ALSO PROVIDE THEM WITH RECREATIONAL PROGRAMMES, MR STEPHEN LAW, ACTING DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE HONG KONG PLAYGROUND ASSOCIATION'S CHILDREN CENTRE AT SHEK WAI KOK ESTATE IN TSUEN WAN, HE SAID THAT THE SUCCESS OF YOUTH CENTRES DEPENDED ON THE ACTIVE PARTICIPATION AND CO-OPERATION OF THE CHILDREN AND THEIR PARENTS.

MR LAW SAID: +THE SHEK WAI KOK CHILDREN'S CENTRE IS SET UP ACCORDING TO EXISTING WELFARE POLICY THAT A CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CENTRE SHOULD BE PROVIDED FOR EVERY 20 000 POPULATION.+

APART FROM THIS CENTRE, SERVICES PROVIDED IN THE ESTATE INCLUDE YOUTH CENTRE, SOCIAL CENTRE FOR THE ELDERLY, HOSTEL FOR THE ELDERLY AND SHELTERED WORKSHOP.

THERE WERE 35 ORGANISATIONS CATERING FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTHS, AND OVER 170 SUBVENTED CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CENTRES, WITH MORE THAN 900 SOCIAL WORKERS AND SOME 150 000 MEMBERS, HE SAID.

ADDITIONALLY, TWO USD MOBILE FLUSHING TOILETS WILL BE STATIONED AT TAIKOO SHING, WHILE SIGNS WILL BE PUT UP AT THE FINISHING POINT IN SHAU KEI WAN SHOWING THE WAY TO THE NEAREST PUBLIC CONVENIENCES.

THIS WILL BRING TO 34 THE NUMBER OF COUNTRIES IN THE INTELPOST NETWORK SERVED FROM HONG KONG, A POST OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID.

INTELPOST ITEMS POSTED AT THE GENERAL POST OFFICE BEFORE 2 PM TO THE GUANGZHOU AUTUMN TRADE FAIR, WHICH OPENS THAT DAY, WILL BE DELIVERED TO THE ADDRESSEE THE SAME AFTERNOON.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TODAY URGED TEACHERS OF THE SUBJECT TO BE VERY CAREFUL ABOUT THE USE OF CHEMICALS IN FOOD AND TEXTILES SCIENCE, AS WELL AS OF APPLIANCES.

+TEACHERS SHOULD BE ABLE TO GIVE EXPERT SUPERVISION IN ORDER TO GUARD AGAINST ANY POSSIBLE DANGER IN THE PRACTICAL AREAS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.
