SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME STARTS TODAY

* * * * *

THE 1980 SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME - THE 12TH IN THE SERIES - WAS OFFICIALLY LAUNCHED TODAY (SATURDAY) BY MR ERIC CUMINE, STEWARD OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB, AT THE SHA TIN RACE COURSE.

IN HIS OPENING SPEECH, MR CUMINE SAID THERE WILL BE SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE IN THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME, INCLUDING THE PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED AND CHILDREN LIVING IN THE REMOTE PARTS OF THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE PROGRAMME, HE SAID, IS AIMED AT GIVING YOUNG PEOPLE AN OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE PART IN HEALTHY RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS TO HELP THEM GAIN SELF-CONFIDENCE AND A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY.

+MANY OF THE EVENTS WILL ALSO PERMIT THEM TO USE THEIR INITIATIVE AND TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY IN DIFFERENT WAYS,+ HE ADDED.

THIS YEAR'S SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME CONTAINS MORE THAN 8 000 SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES TO BE HELD IN VARIOUS PARTS OF HONG KONG IN THE NEXT THREE MONTHS.

THE ORGANISERS HAVE ARRANGED MORE OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES THIS SUMMER TO CATER TO INCREASING DEMAND.

ANOTHER SPEAKER, MR NORMAN OEI, CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE FOR YOUTH RECREATION, CALLED ON PARENTS TO ENCOURAGE THEIR CHILDREN TO TAKE PART IN THE ACTIVITIES.

MR OEI ALSO THANKED THE JOCKEY CLUB FOR ITS GENEROUS DONATION OF \$2.5 MILLION FOR THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME.

AFTER SOUVENIR PENNANTS WERE PRESENTED, GUESTS WERE ENTERTAINED BY SCHOOL CHILDREN PERFORMING A NUMBER OF COLOURFUL FOLK DANCES. THEY WERE ALSO INVITED TO SING ALONG WITH THE YOUNGSTERS FROM THE MUSIC OFFICE WHICH IS TAKING PART FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE PROGRAMME THIS YEAR.

THE GUESTS LATER WATCHED SOME OF THE ACTIVITIES PLANNED FOR THIS YEAR. THE DEMONSTRATIONS, PERFORMED BY EIGHT YOUTH GROUPS, INCLUDED THE MAKING OF RIBBON FLOWERS, BOOK MARKERS AND HANDICRAFT.

REGISTER BEFORE SELLING PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS

* * * * *

THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT TODAY REITERATED THAT ALL IMPORTED AND LOCALLY MANUFACTURED PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS MUST BE REGISTERED BEFORE THEY CAN BE ALLOWED FOR SALE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT TODAY (SATURDAY) WARNED IMPORTERS AND MANUFACTURERS OF PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS THAT SELLING NON-REGISTERED MEDICINES IS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE PHARMACY AND POISONS REGULATIONS WHICH CAME INTO FORCE TWO YEARS AGO.

THE REVISED REGULATIONS ARE AIMED AT SAFEGUARDING THE PUBLIC AGAINST SUB-STANDARD MEDICINES WHICH USUALLY ORIGINATE FROM UNKNOWN SOURCES.

THE PRODUCTS, BEFORE BEING ACCEPTED FOR REGISTRATION, ARE ASSESSED BY THE DEPARTMENT'S PHARMACEUTICALS REGISTRATION SECTION ON THEIR SAFETY, QUALITY AND EFFICACY.

THE PHARMACEUTICALS REGISTRATION SECTION HAS SO FAR RECEIVED 16 000 APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF MEDICINES AND ABOUT 13 000 CERTIFICATES OF REGISTRATION HAVE BEEN ISSUED SINCE JULY 1978.

ONE OF THE REGULATIONS REQUIRES PERMIT NUMBERS OF THE CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION TO BE CLEARLY SHOWN ON THE CONTAINERS OF THE PRODUCTS INTENDED FOR SALE ON THE MARKET.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO SAID THAT STAFF OF THE FORENSIC PHARMACY SECTION ARE STEPPING UP EFFORTS TO CARRY OUT RANDOM CHECKS OF THE PRODUCTS.

+THIS IS TO ENSURE THAT THE QUALITY, EFFICACY AND SAFETY OF ALL REGISTERED MEDICINES ARE UP TO THE CONFORMED STANDARD AT ALL TIMES,+ HE ADDED.

ACTING SNT OPENS NEW EXTENSION TO YOUTH CAMP

AN EXTENSION TO A CHINESE YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION YOUTH CAMP AT WONG YEE CHAU, SAI KUNG, WAS OPENED TODAY (SATURDAY) BY THE ACTING SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR AUGUSTINE CHUI KAM.

THE EXTENSION INCREASES THE CAPACITY OF THE CAMP TO 160 BEDS IN 10 COTTAGES.

ITS CONSTRUCTION IS BEING FINANCED FROM YMCA FUNDS AND DONATIONS AMOUNTING TO \$420 000 FROM THE ROTARY CLUBS OF HONG KONG, KOWLOON, KOWLOON EAST, KOWLOON NORTH AND VICTORIA. IT WILL BE KNOWN AS 'ROTARY VILLAGE'.

CONSTRUCTION WORK TOOK ABOUT A YEAR TO COMPLETE.

THE FIRST PHASE OF THE CAMP WAS COMPLETED IN 1972 AND INCLUDED AN ASSEMBLY HALL, A KITCHEN, TOILET FACILITIES, FOOTPATHS AND TWO SMALL HUTS.

LATER, WHEN ADDITIONAL FUNDS BECAME AVAILABLE FROM GOVERNMENT AND OTHER SOURCES, FACILITIES WERE IMPROVED TO INCLUDE A PIER, A WELL-WATER SYSTEM, ELECTRICITY, OPEN GROUND AND A TENTING AREA.

ALSO PURCHASED WERE CANOES, SAMPANS AND SURFBOARDS.

THE CAMP HAS BEEN PROVIDING FACILITIES FOR 14 000 YOUNG PEOPLE EACH YEAR BUT CAN NOW CATER FOR 20 000.

THE NEW EXTENSION MEANS THAT THE MAIN HALL, WHICH HAS BEEN USED TO PROVIDE ACCOMMODATION, CAN NOW BE USED FOR OTHER ACTIVITIES.

THERE ARE PLANS FOR FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THE CAMPSITE TO INCLUDE A BARBECUE AREA, RECREATION ROOM, HANDICRAFT ROOM AND CANTEEN.

MR CHUI SAID THE CAMP WAS FIRST BUILT IN RESPONSE TO THE TREMENDOUS NEED FOR CAMPS AND HOSTELS, +WHERE YOUNG AND OLD, FAMILIES AND FRIENDS, CAN GET AWAY FROM THE NOISE AND TENSION OF LIFE IN AN INDUSTRIAL SOCIETY TO THE PEACE AND QUIET OF THE COUNTRYSIDE.+

UNTIL RECENTLY IN HONG KONG, MR CHUI SAID, FEW CAMPS OF THIS KIND EXISTED. THERE WERE NOW MORE THAN 40 HOLIDAY CAMPS, HOSTELS AND YOUTH CENTRES, WHERE PEOPLE COULD STAY THE NIGHT.

+THE GOVERNMENT WILL CONTINUE TO GIVE ITS ASSISTANCE TO VOLUNTARY AGENCIES= AND, PARTICULARLY, STAFF OF THE RECREATION AND SPORTS SERVICE ARE ALWAYS AVAILABLE TO ADVISE ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROGRAMMES OF ACTIVITIES AND MANAGEMENT IN GENERAL.+

MR CHUI CONGRATULATED THE PRESIDENT OF THE CHINESE YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION, DR PHILIP KWOK, AND HIS COMMITTEE ON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT AND HE ALSO THANKED THE PRESIDENTS OF THE FIVE ROTARY CLUBS FOR THEIR +GENEROUS DONATION.+

HE SAID THAT THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF EVERYONE INVOLVED, THEY HAD SUCCEEDED IN CREATING +HERE ON THIS BEAUTIFUL ISLAND+ A PLACE SO ATTRACTIVE AND RESTFUL THAT IT WOULD MAKE PEOPLE FEEL THEY DID NOT WANT TO LEAVE.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS LICENSING CENTRE OPENS ON MONDAY

A TELECOMMUNICATIONS LICENSING CENTRE WILL OPEN ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, CONNAUGHT PLACE AT 9 AM ON MONDAY (JUNE 23).

THE HOURS OF BUSINESS WILL BE (EXCLUDING SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS):

MONDAY TO FRIDAY	9 AM - 5 PM
SATURDAY	9 AM - NOON

THE NEW TELECOMMUNICATIONS LICENSING CENTRE IS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND IN HONG KONG, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE POST OFFICE SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WILL BE ABLE TO CONDUCT A WIDE RANGE OF BUSINESS RELATING TO LICENCES ISSUED BY THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS AUTHORITY.

+EXAMPLES OF THESE LICENCES ARE MODEL CONTROL LICENCES, TELEPRINTER, RADIO PAGING AND RADIO DEALERS LICENCES,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+STAFF AT THE CENTRE WILL DEAL WITH LICENCE APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS AND WILL BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT ON THE SPOT INSPECTIONS OF CERTAIN TYPES OF EQUIPMENT PRESENTED FOR LICENSING. THE CENTRE WILL ALSO ENDORSE IMPORT/EXPORT LICENCES FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT,+ HE ADDED.

SURVEY TO COLLECT DATA ON ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION

SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE INVITED TO JOIN A MICRO-CLIMATE SURVEY TO BE HELD THIS SEPTEMBER TO PROVIDE A SOURCE OF PRIMARY DATA ON ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION IN HONG KONG.

THE SURVEY IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, THE HONG KONG CONSERVANCY ASSOCIATION, THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG AND THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC.

AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED SCHOOLS TO TAKE PART IN THIS SURVEY WHICH WILL HELP STUDENTS GAIN VALUABLE EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE IN GEOGRAPHY AND ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION.

STUDENTS INVOLVED WILL BE RECORDING THE WET AND DRY-BULB TEMPERATURES WITHIN THEIR SCHOOL PREMISES WITH THE USE OF A SIMPLE HYGROMETER DURING SCHOOL HOURS ON A SELECTED DAY IN SEPTEMBER, HE SAID.

A REPORT ON THE INVESTIGATION WILL BE PREPARED AFTER THE COLLECTED DATA IS COLLATED AND ANALYSED.

IN ORDER TO FAMILIARISE TEACHERS WITH VARIOUS ASPECTS OF THE SURVEY, A SEMINAR WILL BE HELD FROM 9 AM TO 12.30 PM AT THE GRANTHAM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION IN KOWLOON ON JULY 14.

THREE EXPERTS ON ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION WILL BE GIVING TALKS AT THE SEMINAR.

MR F. MAK, HEAD OF THE CENTRE OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES, HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC, WILL BE GIVING A BRIEF REVIEW OF THERMAL POLLUTION IN HONG KONG AND ALSO A LECTURE IN +CALIBRATION AND USE OF HYGROMETERS+.

MR S.L. WAN, CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG CONSERVANCY ASSOCIATION WILL TALK ON +MICRO-CLIMATE SURVEY AND CONSERVATION IN HONG KONG+ WHILE DR W.J. KYLE, A LECTURER IN THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG'S DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY AND GEOLOGY WILL SPEAK ON +MICRO-CLIMATOLOGY AND MICRO-CLIMATE SURVEY IN HONG KONG.+

FRESH WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES IN TAI O ON LANTAU ISLAND WILL BE FURTHER IMPROVED NEXT YEAR.

THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT HAS INVITED TENDERS FOR THE LAYING OF ABOUT 1.7 KILOMETRES OF WATER MAINS BETWEEN YI O AND TAI O.

ON COMPLETION, THE CAPACITY OF TREATED FRESH WATER SUPPLY TO TAI O WILL BE INCREASED FROM 910 CUBIC METRES TO 1 460 CUBIC METRES A DAY.
