CONCERTED EFFORTS NEEDED TO COMBAT PORNOGRAPHY
* * * * *

THE CONCERTED EFFORTS OF THE GOVERNMENT, COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS AND THE PUBLIC ARE ESSENTIAL TO ENSURE A BETTER ENVIRONMENT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO GROW PHYSICALLY AND MENTALLY HEALTHY, THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR CHOW CHUN-FAI, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING OF THE DISTRICT'S HEALTHY LIFE CAMPAIGN, MR CHOW STRESSED THAT MORE EFFECTIVE POLICIES AND MEASURES WERE URGENTLY REQUIRED TO CURB THE PUBLICATION AND SALE OF PORNOGRAPHIC MAGAZINES.

MR CHOW CALLED FOR COMMUNITY LEADERS OF ALL DISTRICTS TO POOL THEIR RESOURCES TOGETHER TO HELP WORK OUT FEASIBLE AND PRACTICAL WAYS TO DETER THE PROLIFERATION OF SUCH PUBLICATIONS.

HE ALSO URGED RESIDENTS, LOCAL VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS AND SCHOOLS TO TAKE AN ACTIVE PART IN THE CAMPAIGN TO PROMOTE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF SEX EDUCATION AND FAMILY LIFE.

THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD CARRIED OUT A STUDY OF PORNOGRAPHIC PUBLICATIONS LAST SUMMER AND FOUND THE READING OF SUCH MAGAZINES COMMON AMONG ADOLESCENTS.

AS FOLLOW-UP ACTION, THE BOARD LAUNCHED THE HEALTHY LIFE CAMPAIGN IN COLLABORATION WITH 33 LOCAL RELIGIOUS BODIES AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES IN THE DISTRICT.

THIS IS TO ARRANGE EDUCATIONAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES TO PROMOTE HEALTHY GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF YOUTHS AND TO PROMOTE MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING AMONG FAMILY MEMBERS.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR JACOB CHAN, SAID THE PROJECT WAS ORGANISED IN FOUR STAGES AND WOULD LAST UNTIL DECEMBER. THE STAGES WERE NAMED AFTER THE FOUR SEASONS IN A YEAR TO SYMBOLISE THE NATURAL GROWTH OF MAN FROM CHILDHOOD TO ADULTHOOD.

ACTIVITIES IN EACH STAGE WERE SPECIALLY DESIGNED TO CATER FOR THE NEEDS AND INTERESTS OF DIFFERENT TARGET GROUPS AND INCLUDED BOOK EXHIBITIONS, DRAWING SESSIONS, SPORTS, GAMES, SEMINARS AND VARIETY SHOWS, HE SAID.

THE ENTIRE PROJECT WOULD COST \$60 000 WITH \$47 000 CONTRIBUTED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING WERE THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MRS BRENDA FUNG, REGIONAL SOCIAL WELFARE OFFICER (WEST KOWLOON), MR ALEXANDER FUNG, AND THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MONG KOK CHRISTIAN CHURCHES, REV. DAVID CHU.

WARNING ON ELECTRICAL HAZARDS
* * * * *

CONTRACTORS AND PROPRIETORS ARE URGED TO TAKE ADEQUATE SAFETY MEASURES TO GUARD AGAINST ELECTRICAL HAZARDS.

THE APPEAL BY A LABOUR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN FOLLOWS A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH A CONTRACTOR WAS FINED \$45 000 FOR FAILING TO TAKE PROPER PROTECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT ON A CONSTRUCTION SITE.

THE CASE INVOLVED A WORKER WHO WAS ELECTROCUTED WHILE WELDING ON THE SITE IN AUGUST LAST YEAR.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (ELECTRICITY) REGULATIONS LAY DOWN THE BASIC REQUIREMENTS TO GUARD AGAINST HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DISTRIBUTION AND USE OF ELECTRICITY IN INDUSTRIES.

FACTORY PROPRIETORS AND CONTRACTORS SHOULD OBSERVE THESE SAFETY MEASURES AND ANY PERSON WHO CONTRAVENES THE REGULATIONS IS LIABLE TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$30 000 ON CONVICTION.

3 36 HECTARES OF RECLAIMED LAND FOR TUEN MUN

ANOTHER 36 HECTARES OF LAND WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR DEVELOPMENT AT TUEN MUN NEW TOWN AFTER RECLAMATION.

ABOUT 10 HECTARES OF THE NEWLY-RECLAIMED LAND, TO THE SOUTH OF THE NEW TOWN, WILL BE FOR INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, FIVE HECTARES FOR A HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME, 2.6 HECTARES FOR PUBLIC CARGO HANDLING SPACE AND THE REMAINDER FOR VARIOUS COMMUNITY, GOVERNMENT AND INSTITUTION PROJECTS, ROADS AND LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT RESERVES.

A 600-METRE-LONG SEAWALL, A RIVER WALL MEASURING 250 METRES AND A MAIN STORM DRAINAGE SYSTEM WILL ALSO BE CONSTRUCTED.

FILL MATERIAL FOR THE RECLAMATION WILL BE EXTRACTED FROM YUNG LONG AND TAN KWAI TSUEN IN TUEN MUN.

A ROAD WILL BE BUILT AT TAN KWAI TSUEN TO CONNECT CASTLE PEAK ROAD TO THE FILL SOURCE.

AT YUNG LONG, A JETTY WILL BE CONSTRUCTED TO FACILITATE TRANSPORTATION OF MATERIALS BY SEA.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN AUGUST AND BE COMPLETED IN TWO AND A HALF YEARS.

TENDERS FOR THE PROJECT ARE INVITED BY THE TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

SOUTHERN DB FUNDS FOR COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

* * * * *

RESIDENT ORGANISATIONS AND MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES IN THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT CAN APPLY FOR DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS THROUGH THEIR RESPECTIVE AREA COMMITTEES TO SPONSOR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES.

THE DISTRICT BOARD'S COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE HAS SET ASIDE A BLOCK ALLOCATION OF \$50 000 THIS YEAR FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN TIES BETWEEN THE DISTRICT BOARD, AREA COMMITTEES AND RESIDENT BODIES, THE DISTRICT'S SIX AREA COMMITTEES HAVE BEEN ENTRUSTED WITH THE POWER TO VET APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED UNDER THIS SCHEME AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CONSIDERATION AND ENDORSEMENT BY THE COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE.

A DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID THIS WOULD SHORTEN THE TIME AND SIMPLIFY PROCEDURES FOR APPLICATION FOR SPONSORSHIP.

+EACH AREA COMMITTEE IS ALLOCATED FUNDS ACCORDING TO THE POPULATION AND THE NUMBER OF RESIDENT ORGANISATIONS IN THE CONSTITUENCY,+ HE SAID.

+THE MAXIMUM GRANT TO EACH APPLICATION IS \$1 500, WHILE THAT FOR RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES SUCH AS PICNICS AND VEGETARIAN MEALS IS \$750,+ HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE HAD DECIDED TO RAISE THE MAXIMUM GRANT FOR NON-RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES FROM LAST YEAR'S \$1 000 TO \$1 500 THIS YEAR TO ENCOURAGE RESIDENT BODIES TO ORGANISE MORE MEANINGFUL ACTIVITIES.

HE NOTED THAT IN THE PAST YEAR, SOME 70 PER CENT OF ACTIVITIES ORGANISED UNDER THIS SCHEME WERE RECREATIONAL IN NATURE.

RESIDENT BODIES CAN OBTAIN APPLICATION FORMS AT THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE AND ITS BRANCH OFFICES AT ABERDEEN CENTRE, WAH FU AND STANLEY AND COMPLETED FORMS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED TEN DAYS BEFORE EACH AREA COMMITTEE MEETING.

APPLICATION FOR FUNDS EXCEEDING \$1 500 TO ORGANISE LARGE-SCALE ACTIVITIES MUST BE DIRECTED TO THE COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE. ENQUIRIES ON DETAILS OF BLOCK ALLOCATION SCHEME CAN BE MADE TO THE DISTRICT OFFICE ON 5-540271.

SPORTS EVENTS TO MARK QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY

A SERIES OF SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL EVENTS WILL BE PRESENTED BY THE URBAN COUNCIL ON BOTH SIDES OF THE HARBOUR ON JUNE 14 TO CELEBRATE THE QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY.

AT VICTORIA PARK, A FULL MORNING'S SPORTS PROGRAMME RANGING FROM BASKETBALL TO MINI-SOCCER WILL BE HELD. EVEN CHILDREN AGED BETWEEN SEVEN AND 13, AND SENIOR CITIZENS WILL BE ENCOURAGED TO JOIN IN TWO POTTED SPORTS EVENTS ESPECIALLY DESIGNED FOR THESE TWO AGE GROUPS.

FOR THE LESS ENERGETIC, THERE WILL BE JOGGING AND FITNESS EXERCISES IN THE MORNING. A FITNESS CENTRE, PROVIDING A SERIES OF PHYSICAL HEALTH TESTS AND INTRODUCING A NUMBER OF FITNESS ACTIVITIES, WILL ALSO BE SET UP.

IN KOWLOON, EVENTS WILL TAKE PLACE AT MORSE PARK AND THE CHEUNG SHA WAN PLAYGROUND. EVENTS AT MORSE PARK WILL BE EXTENDED TO THE SWIMMING POOL WHERE A WATER CARNIVAL, A SWIM-FOR-ALL AND A 50-METRE SWIMMING AWARD WILL BE HELD.

THE HIGHLIGHT OF THE PROGRAMME WILL BE AN EXCITING PARACHUTE DEMONSTRATION. OTHER EVENTS INCLUDE A BAND PERFORMANCE, A TAI CHI DISPLAY, DANCE DEMONSTRATION AND FUN GAMES SPECIALLY DESIGNED FOR THE MENTALLY HANDICAPPED.

EVENTS AT THE CHEUNG SHA WAN PLAYGROUND WILL BE PRECEDED BY AN ARMY BAND PERFORMANCE, FOLLOWED BY A THREE-A-SIDE BASKETBALL COMPETITION, WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL COMPETITION, VOLLEYBALL COMPETITION AND A FOOTBALL SKILL DEMONSTRATION.

DANCE ENTHUSIASTS ARE WELCOME TO JOIN IN A DANCE-FOR-ALL SESSION IN WHICH EXPERIENCED INSTRUCTORS WILL SHOW THE WAY IN VARIOUS BRANCHES OF DANCE SUCH AS JIVE, CHA CHA AND DISCO.

OTHER ITEMS INCLUDE A SILK EXERCISE DEMONSTRATION, A ROLLER-SKATING DEMONSTRATION AND A FISHING-FOR-ALL.

ALL EVENTS ARE FREE OF CHARGE AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE WELCOME TO JOIN AS PARTICIPANTS OR SPECTATORS. APPLICATION FORMS AND PARTICULARS ARE AVAILABLE AT ALL DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE RECREATION, AMENITIES AND SPORTS OFFICE OF THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

ABOUT 80 MEMBERS FROM THE FIVE AREA COMMITTEES IN THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT ATTENDED A DAY CAMP AT THE PO LEUNG KUK PAK TAM CHUNG HOLIDAY CAMP IN SAI KUNG TODAY (SUNDAY).

THE CAMP, ORGANISED BY THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICE, PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR AREA COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO LEARN MORE ABOUT GOVERNMENT WORK AND TO GET TO KNOW EACH OTHER BETTER.

THERE ARE AT PRESENT FIVE AREA COMMITTEES IN THE DISTRICT -- WAN CHAI EAST, WAN CHAI WEST, CAUSEWAY BAY CENTRAL, TAI HANG--SO KON PO, AND HAPPY VALLEY.

IT WOULD BE INTRODUCED AS ONE OF THE HOBBY CLASSES FOR TRAINING CENTRE INMATES TO SUPPLEMENT THE HALF-DAY EDUCATION AND HALF-DAY VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMME.

TWO TROOPS, WITH SCOUTS AGED BETWEEN 14 AND 17, WILL SOON BE SET UP AT LAI KING TRAINING CENTRE, WHILE A VENTURE TROOP FOR THOSE WHO ARE OVER 16 WILL BE SET UP AT CAPE COLLINSON CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION.

YOUNG INMATES CAN ENROL IN THE TROOPS ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS.

A GROUP OF 18 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS FROM VARIOUS INSTITUTIONS RECENTLY COMPLETED A SCOUT LEADER TRAINING COURSE CONDUCTED BY THE SCOUT ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG.

THEY WILL ASSIST IN THE FORMATION OF THE TROOPS AND ORGANISE SCOUTING ACTIVITIES AT THE TRAINING CENTRES.

PEOPLE INTERESTED IN THE REHABILITATION OF OFFENDERS PLACED ON PROBATION ARE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT'S VOLUNTEER SCHEME FOR PROBATIONERS.

VOLUNTEERS SHOULD PREFERABLY BE AGED 21 OR OVER, HAVE A SECONDARY EDUCATION, BE MATURE IN PERSONALITY AND WILLING TO MAKE FRIENDS WITH OFFENDERS.

THE NEWLY-RECRUITED VOLUNTEERS WILL TAKE AN ORIENTATION COURSE BEFORE THEY START TO ASSIST PROBATION OFFICERS BY BEFRIENDING, HELPING AND ADVISING PROBATIONERS MATCHED TO THEM ON A PERSONAL BASIS.
