DAYA BAY ISSUE TOO COMPLICATED FOR REFERENDUM
* * * *

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT A REFERENDUM WOULD NOT BE A SATISFACTORY WAY TO DEAL WITH THE SUBJECT OF THE DAYA BAY NUCLEAR POWER PLANT.

ANSWERING QUESTIONS FROM REPORTERS AFTER THE COMMUNITY CHEST'S +BIKE FOR A MILLION+, SIR DAVID SAID: +I DON'T THINK YOU CAN DECIDE THINGS LIKE THIS BY REFERENDUM. IT'S NOT A SATISFACTORY WAY OF DEALING WITH SUCH A COMPLICATED SUBJECT REALLY.+

ON LEGCO'S TWO FACT-FINDING MISSIONS, SIR DAVID NOTED THAT THEY HAD A VERY THOROUGH ITINERARY.

+SO I WOULD HOPE THEY WOULD COME BACK BRINGING WITH THEM THE IMPRESSIONS OF NOT SO MUCH OF EXPERTS, BUT OF THE ORDINARY CITIZENS OF HONG KONG, WHAT THEY WOULD EXPECT TO FEEL AND FIND OUT IF THEY HAD GONE ON THIS FACT-FINDING MISSION THEMSELVES,+ HE SAID.

ASKED ABOUT THE VALUE OF THESE TRIPS, SIR DAVID SAID THEY WERE ESSENTIALLY FACT-FINDING TRIPS.

+THEY ARE NOT GOING AS EXPERTS. THEY'VE MADE THIS QUITE CLEAR. THEY ARE GOING AS INTELLIGENT PEOPLE, GETTING THE VIEWS OF INTELLIGENT PEOPLE IN THE COUNTRIES THAT THEY VISIT.+

SIR DAVID SAID WHEN THE DELEGATIONS COME BACK THEY WOULD MAKE A REPORT NOT ONLY TO THE GOVERNMENT BUT ALSO THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG.

SIR DAVID DISAGREED WITH A SUGGESTION THAT THE DELEGATIONS WOULD ONLY COLLECT POSITIVE RESULTS OF NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS.

HE SAID: +NO, I THINK THEY HAVE MADE IT QUITE CLEAR IN VISITING AUSTRIA FOR EXAMPLE WHICH HAS IN FACT STOPPED BUILDING NUCLEAR POWER STATIONS, SO I UNDERSTAND, AND THERE IS A LOT OF CONCERN IN AUSTRIA ABOUT NUCLEAR POWER STATIONS.+

SIR DAVID SAID THE DELEGATIONS WOULD BE BACK BY ABOUT THE THIRD WEEK IN AUGUST, +SO THERE SHOULD BE PLENTY OF TIME TO HEAR WHAT THEY HAVE TO SAY.

+BUT ESSENTIALLY, AS WE'VE SAID MANY TIMES BEFORE, THE POWER STATION IS NOT BEING BUILT IN HONG KONG AND IT'S NOT OUR DECISION IN HONG KONG WHETHER TO BUILD IT OR NOT.+

/ASKED WHAT

ASKED WHAT THE GOVERNMENT WOULD DO IF THE MISSIONS FOUND IT UNFAVOURABLE TO BUILD THE NUCLEAR POWER PLANT, SIR DAVID SAID: +I THINK WE MUST WAIT UNTIL THE TEAMS HAVE GONE ON THEIR JOURNEYS AND HAVE TALKED TO PEOPLE WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT THESE THINGS IN OTHER COUNTRIES AND THEN COME BACK TO HONG KONG AND REPORT TO THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG BEFORE WE JUMP TO CONCLUSIONS.+

IN REPLY TO A QUESTION ON AN EDUCATION CAMPAIGN TO BE LAUNCHED BY GOVERNMENT ON THE ISSUE, SIR DAVID SAID EDUCATION WAS ESSENTIALLY LETTING PEOPLE KNOW THE FACTS ABOUT THESE NUCLEAR STATIONS.

+IT'S NOT AN EXERCISE IN INFLUENCING PEOPLE BUT IN EDUCATING PEOPLE,+ HE SAID.

ASKED IF THE GOVERNMENT HAD CONTACTED THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT ON ITS ATTITUDE ON THIS ISSUE, SIR DAVID SAID: +I THINK WE HAVE MADE OUR POSITION CLEAR. THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY IN HIS SPEECH IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL GAVE A FULL EXPLANATION OF THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT'S POSITION WITH REGARD TO THE STATION.+

ASKED IF HE THOUGHT THAT THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SHOULD HAVE MORE OFFICIAL MEMBERS, SIR DAVID SAID THERE WERE PROBLEMS IN LEGCO, AS THE PRESS MUST REALISE FROM TIME TO TIME, THAT THE OFFICIALS WHO WERE THERE WERE NOT SUFFICIENTLY WELL VERSED IN THE BACKGROUND TO THE QUESTIONS AND ALTHOUGH THEY COULD ANSWER THE MAIN QUESTION, VERY OFTEN THE INFORMATION TO DEAL WITH THE SUPPLEMENTARIES WAS NOT AT THEIR FINGER TIPS.

+SO IT WOULD BE HELPFUL PARTICULARLY IN SOME SUBJECT AREAS TO HAVE ONE OR TWO OR THREE MORE OFFICIALS IN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.+

ASKED IF MORE OFFICIALS WOULD BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL IN THE NEXT SESSION, HE SAID: +WE'LL HAVE TO SEE,+ ADDING THAT HE UNDERSTAND SOME MEMBERS WOULD NOT LIKE TO SEE THAT BROUGHT UP BEFORE THE REVIEW AND BEFORE THE NEW LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ASSEMBLES IN 1988 AT THE END OF THIS TERM.

HE SAID IT WOULD DEPEND VERY MUCH ON THE OPINION OF THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, THE APPOINTED MEMBERS AND THE ELECTED MEMBERS.

+IT THEY ARE GENERALLY SATISFIED WITH THE LEVEL OF OFFICIAL REPRESENTATION AT THE MOMENT, THEN I DON'T THINK THE GOVERNMENT WOULD WISH TO PUSH IT.+

HE SAID HE WOULD SEEK THE COUNCILLORS' VIEWS ON THIS.

+WE ARE IN CONSTANT COMMUNICATION,+ HE SAID.

INSOLVENCY FUND MEETING MAJORITY OF WAGE CLAIMS
* * * * *

THE EXISTING PREFERENTIAL LIMIT OF \$8 000 IN RESPECT OF WAGE CLAIMS NOT EXCEEDING FOUR MONTHS IS PROVIDING ADEQUATE PROTECTION FOR MOST EMPLOYEES.

THIS WAS STATED IN THE FIRST ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PROTECTION OF WAGES ON INSOLVENCY FUND PUBLISHED RECENTLY.

ACCORDING TO THE REPORT, 8 159 APPLICANTS FOR EX-GRATIA PAYMENTS WERE RECEIVED FROM EMPLOYEES OF 321 INSOLVENCY CASES DURING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD ENDED MARCH THIS YEAR.

OF THESE, ONLY 50 APPLICANTS WERE OWED WAGES OF MORE THAN FOUR MONTHS WHILE 6 809 WERE OWED WAGES OF ONE MONTH, 1 047 UP TO TWO MONTHS, 184 UP TO THREE MONTHS AND 69 UP TO FOUR MONTHS.

AS FOR WAGE CLAIMS, 6 732 CASES WERE BELOW THE LEVEL OF \$4 000, 671 CASES BETWEEN \$4 001 AND \$6 000, 309 CASES BETWEEN \$6 001 AND \$8 000, AND 447 CASES ABOVE THE PREFERENTIAL LIMIT OF \$8 000.

THE REPORT NOTED THAT BY MARCH 31, 1986, 5 890 APPLICANTS WERE PAID \$13.5 MILLION. IN FACT, IT POINTED OUT, PROMPT PAYMENTS COULD BE EFFECTED IF DETAILED AND UP-TO-DATE WAGE AND EMPLOYMENT RECORDS WERE KEPT BY INSOLVENT EMPLOYERS AND MADE READILY AVAILABLE FOR VERIFICATION BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE, EMPLOYERS ARE REQUIRED TO KEEP AND MAINTAIN A RECORD AT ALL TIMES SETTING OUT THE WAGE AND EMPLOYMENT PARTICULARS OF EACH WORKER EITHER AT THE EMPLOYER'S PLACE OF BUSINESS OR AT THE PLACE WHERE THE WORKER IS EMPLOYED.

IT SHOULD CONTAIN SUCH INFORMATION AS THE WORKER'S NAME, IDENTITY CARD NUMBER, JOB TITLE, WAGES PAID TO HIM, WAGE PERIOD, AMOUNT OF END OF YEAR PAYMENT, NOTICE PERIOD AND DATES OF COMMENCEMENT AND TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

THE RECORD SHOULD COVER THE PERIOD OF THE WORKER'S EMPLOYMENT DURING THE PRECEDING SIX MONTHS AND MUST ALSO BE RETAINED FOR ANOTHER SIX MONTHS AFTER THE WORKER CEASES TO BE EMPLOYED.

ANOTHER FEATURE OF THE REPORT SHOWED THAT OF THE 8 159 APPLICATIONS RECEIVED IN THE YEAR UNDER REVIEW, 2 890 WERE FILED BY WORKERS IN THE ELECTRICAL MACHINERY-APPLIANCES INDUSTRY, 2 239 IN RESTAURANTS-HOTELS, 1 617 IN THE CLOTHING-TEXTILES INDUSTRY, 296 IN THE WHOLESALE-RETAIL AND IMPORT-EXPORT TRADES, AND 229 IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY.

THE REPORT ALSO REVEALED THAT OF THE 321 INSOLVENCY CASES, 225 HAD AN EMPLOYMENT SIZE OF LESS THAN 20 WORKERS, 82 HAD BETWEEN 20 AND 99 WORKERS, AND 14 HAD MORE THAN 100 WORKERS.

AT THE END OF THE YEAR, THE BOARD HAD INITIATED ACTION TO RECOVER PAYMENTS BY FILING PROOF OF DEBT IN RESPECT OF 50 INSOLVENCY CASES WITH THE OFFICIAL RECEIVER AND SIX WITH PRIVATE RECEIVERS.

FIRST COASTAL CYCLE TRACK OPENED
* * * * *

A CYCLE TRACK-FOOTPATH ALONG THE SEAWARD SIDE OF TOLO HIGHWAY WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED TO THE PUBLIC TODAY (SUNDAY) AFTER THE +BIKE FOR A MILLION+ EVENT ORGANISED BY THE COMMUNITY CHEST.

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, OFFICIATED AT THE EVENT WHICH TOOK PLACE AT THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE.

THE 4.4-METRE-WIDE COMBINED CYCLE TRACK AND FOOTPATH EXTENDS FOR 7.3 KILOMETRES ALONGSIDE THE HIGHWAY FROM NEAR THE RACECOURSE AT SHA TIN TO ISLAND HOUSE AT TAI PO.

CYCLISTS AND PEDESTRIANS CAN ENJOY THE SCENIC SEASCAPE OF TOLO HARBOUR WHILE RIDING OR STROLLING AGAINST A BACKDROP OF THE PAT SIN RANGE AND MA ON SHAN.

THE LANDSCAPED TRACK IS SEPARATED FROM THE CARRIAGEWAY BY A SAFETY FENCE AND IN SOME PLACES IS ON A DIFFERENT LEVEL.

UNDERPASSES CONNECT THE CYCLE TRACK-FOOTPATH TO THE LANDWARD SIDE OF THE ROAD AT FOUR LOCATIONS.

THE TRACK ALSO FORMS THE LINK BETWEEN THE CYCLE TRACK NETWORKS OF THE TWO NEW TOWNS.

BUILT AS PART OF THE \$700 MILLION TOLO HIGHWAY PROJECT, IT HAS BEEN DESIGNED AND CONSTRUCTED BY THE TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT. THE HIGHWAY WAS OPENED TO TRAFFIC LAST SEPTEMBER.

NEW SCHOOL TO BE BUILT ON GLENEALY SITE
* * * * *

A NEW PRIMARY SCHOOL WILL BE BUILT ON THE SITE OF GLENEALY SCHOOL IN HORNSEY ROAD ON HONG KONG ISLAND, REPLACING ONE WHICH WAS DEMOLISHED SOME YEARS AGO.

PLANS FOR THE FIVE-STOREY SCHOOL, WHICH HONG KONG LAND GROUP HAS APPLIED TO BUILD, WERE APPROVED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE (B.O.O.) IN JUNE.

BESIDES CLASSROOMS, THE SCHOOL ON THE 2 200-SQUARE-METRE SITE WILL HAVE A LIBRARY, MEDICAL ROOM, CHANGING ROOM, GENERAL OFFICE, ASSEMBLY HALL, PLAYGROUND, NETBALL COURT, CAR PARK, PUMP ROOM AND CARETAKER'S QUARTERS.

THE PLANS ARE ACCEPTABLE TO THE ENGLISH SCHOOLS' FOUNDATION (ESF).

CONSTRUCTION DETAILS WILL BE ANNOUNCED LATER.

ALSO APPROVED IN JUNE WERE PLANS FOR AN 18-CLASSROOM ESF SCHOOL AT SHA TIN.

IT WILL BE BUILT ON A 14 290-SQUARE-METRE SITE BETWEEN SUI WO ROAD AND SUI WO LANE.

THE FOUR-STOREY STRUCTURE WILL INCLUDE AN ASSEMBLY HALL, PLAYGROUND, LIBRARY AND BASKETBALL AND VOLLEYBALL COURTS.

A TOTAL OF 39 PLANS WERE APPROVED DURING THE MONTH, WITH MORE THAN HALF - 22 - BEING APARTMENT OR APARTMENT-COMMERCIAL PROJECTS.

THEY INCLUDED TWO FACTORY BLOCKS AND A DANGEROUS GOODS STORE ON TSING YI FOR SWIRE PACIFIC LIMITED; AN ADMINISTRATION BUILDING OF 13 STOREYS AT THE KWAI CHUNG CONTAINER PORT FOR HONG KONG INTERNATIONAL TERMINALS LIMITED; AND A TRANSPOSER BUILDING AT SHA TAU KOK FOR ASIA TELEVISION LIMITED.

ALSO APPROVED WERE FOUR APARTMENT BLOCKS AT DISCOVERY BAY FOR HONG KONG RESORT COMPANY LIMITED.

THE NUMBER OF NEW BUILDING PLANS SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL WAS 55.

IN THE SAME MONTH, THE B.O.O. GAVE APPROVAL FOR WORK TO BEGIN ON 37 NEW BUILDING PROJECTS OF WHICH 20 WERE APARTMENT OR APARTMENT-COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS. INCLUDED WAS A 132-ROOM HOTEL IN KIMBERLEY ROAD, KOWLOON.

A TOTAL OF 38 COMPLETED BUILDINGS WERE CERTIFIED FOR OCCUPATION.

CONSENT TO DEMOLISH WAS GIVEN IN 16 INSTANCES, AFFECTING 22 BUILDINGS.

THE DANGEROUS BUILDINGS SECTION CARRIED OUT 345 INSPECTIONS AND RECEIVED A TOTAL OF 77 COMPLAINTS; THE CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION RECEIVED 491 COMPLAINTS ABOUT ILLEGAL BUILDING WORKS AND CHANGES OF USE AND CARRIED OUT 879 INSPECTIONS.

THE COST OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS ABOUT \$5.67 BILLION, OF WHICH ABOUT \$5.3 BILLION WAS FOR BUILDINGS ON HONG KONG ISLAND. THIS BRINGS THE TOTAL SO FAR THIS YEAR TO ABOUT \$9.8 BILLION.

KAIFONGS AND VOLUNTARY WORKERS IN WONG TAI SIN TODAY (SUNDAY) PARADED THROUGH THE STREETS OF THE DIAMOND HILL SQUATTER AREAS TO EXPOSE THE +LITTER BUG+ (LAP SAP CHUNG) TO RESIDENTS.

THE PARADE WAS ONE OF THE PROGRAMMES IN THE OPENING CEREMONY TO LAUNCH THE DISTRICT'S SQUATTER AREA CLEANLINESS CAMPAIGN.

CHAIRMAN OF THE DISTRICT BOARD'S SQUATTER AREA COMMITTEE, MRS LEE LO YUK-SIM, SAID THE CLEANLINESS CAMPAIGN WOULD LAST ABOUT A MONTH.

THE CAMPAIGN IS AIMED AT IMPROVING THE ENVIRONMENT AND SANITATION OF SQUATTER AREAS IN THE DISTRICT, SHE SAID.

MRS LEE URGED RESIDENTS TO CLEAN DRAINAGES REGULARLY AND TO AVOID DUMPING RUBBISH.

WOMEN OF THE ABOVE AGE GROUP SHOULD BRING ALONG THEIR OLD I.D. CARDS AND CALL AT ANY ONE OF THE EIGHT NEW I.D. CARD ISSUE OFFICES.

THEY CAN ALSO MAKE USE OF THE PHONE-IN SERVICE TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT BY CALLING THE OFFICE OF THEIR CHOICE BETWEEN 9 AM AND 5 PM FROM MONDAY TO FRIDAY, AND BETWEEN 9 AM AND NOON ON SATURDAY.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT AS APPLICANTS IN THE COMING PHASE ARE BETWEEN 66-70 YEARS OLD, SOME OF THEM MIGHT BE IN POOR HEALTH, AND IT COULD CAUSE THEM A GREAT DEAL OF HARDSHIP AND INCONVENIENCE TO GO TO THE ISSUE OFFICES.
