NEED FOR MORE PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS STRESSED

* * * * *

THERE ARE CLEARLY NOT ENOUGH PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS IN HONG KONG, SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (THURSDAY).

MR AKERS-JONES WAS SPEAKING AT THE GRADUATION OF STUDENTS OF THE HONG KONG COTTON SPINNERS ASSOCIATION PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOL, KWAI CHUNG.

+THERE ARE 13 PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS BUT THIS IS CLEARLY NOT ENOUGH WHEN THIS YEAR ALONE THERE ARE 13 000 APPLICATIONS FOR LESS THAN 3 000 PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOL PLACES,+ HE SAID.

TO MEET THE SHORTFALL, BY SEPTEMBER 1984 THERE SHOULD BE AN ADDITIONAL 12 PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS, 10 OF WHICH WOULD BE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES, WITH SOME SCHOOLS OPENING IN SEPTEMBER, 1983.

MOREOVER ENGINEERING SCIENCE, MARINE ENGINEERING AND SHEET METAL WORKS WERE BEING INTRODUCED INTO THE CURRICULUM.

+THE OVERWHELMING DEMAND FOR PLACES IN PRE-VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS PROVIDES THE PROOF THAT THE YOUNG PEOPLE OF HONG KONG ARE NOT, AS IS OFTEN SAID, NO LONGER INTERESTED IN INDUSTRIAL WORK AND ARE LOOKING ONLY FOR WHITE COLLAR WORK,+ MR AKERS-JONES SAID.

+OUR ABILITY TO FACE THE CHALLENGES OF INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES LIES IN THE STRENGTH OF OUR INDUSTRY, AND IN YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS TODAY, AND IN YOUR GOVERNMENT'S ABILITY TO PROVIDE THE EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN A STRONG AND PROGRESSIVE INDUSTRIAL SECTOR.+

MR AKERS-JONES TOLD THE 244 GRADUATING STUDENTS THAT THEIR SCHOOL WAS OPENED IN SEPTEMBER 1975, AS A RESULT OF THE FORESIGHT, ENDEAVOUR AND GENEROSITY OF THE PAST CHAIRMEN AND MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG COTTON SPINNERS ASSOCIATION.

THE SCHOOL AUTHORITIES HAD, BY THEIR CONCERN, ENSURED THAT GRADUATING STUDENTS HAD NO DIFFICULTY IN SECURING EMPLOYMENT IN THE TEXTILE AND ENGINEERING INDUSTRIES AND, IN TURN, THESE GRADUATES HAD BEEN MAKING AN INVALUABLE CONTRIBUTION TO THE ECONOMIC WELL-BEING OF HONG KONG.

+NOW YOUR SCHOOL WILL START FORM IV IN SEPTEMBER, AND SOME OF YOU GRADUATING THIS YEAR WILL BE ABLE TO PURSUE YOUR STUDIES AT SENIOR SECONDARY LEVEL HERE,+ MR AKERS-JONES SAID.

THE SCHOOL ACCOMMODATES ABOUT 1 100 STUDENTS IN 25 CLASSES COMPRISING NINE FORM I CLASSES, EIGHT FORM II CLASSES AND EIGHT FORM III CLASSES.

PARENTS URGED TO GIVE CHILDREN MORE TIME AND CARE

THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ANSON CHAN, TODAY (THURSDAY) CALLED ON PARENTS TO GIVE THEIR CHILDREN MORE TIME AND CARE AND TO HELP THEM BETTER PLAN THEIR FUTURE COURSE AFTER COMPLETING JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION.

SHE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF A THREE-DAY EXHIBITION WHICH GIVES AN INSIGHT INTO THE JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT SYSTEM AND PROVIDES INFORMATION ON FURTHER STUDIES AND EMPLOYMENT.

HELD AT THE TANG SHIU KIN SECONDARY SCHOOL IN OI KWAN ROAD, WAN CHAI, THE EXHIBITION IS ORGANISED BY STUDENTS OF THE SHU YAN COLLEGE'S DEPARTMENT OF COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE AS PART OF THEIR PROJECT TO HELP JUNIOR SECONDARY STUDENTS.

THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT'S FAMILY SERVICES CENTRES AND SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS ARE PREPARED TO OFFER CONSULTATION AND SUITABLE SERVICES TO BOTH THE STUDENTS AND PARENTS.

THEY MAY ALSO WORK TOGETHER WITH THE PARENTS TO ASSIST THE STUDENTS IN OVERCOMING DIFFICULTIES IN PHYSICAL AND MENTAL GROWTH SO AS TO ENABLE THE STUDENTS TO DEVELOP INDIVIDUAL POTENTIALS, SHE ADDED.

MRS CHAN PRAISED THE SHU YAN COLLEGE STUDENTS AND DESCRIBED THEIR SPECIAL PROJECT TO HELP THESE STUDENTS AS +MOST TIMELY AND VERY WORTHWHILE+.

SPEAKING AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY OF SIR ROBERT BLACK COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, HE TOLD THE GRADUATES THAT THEY WERE ENTERING TEACHING AT A PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT TIME IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF EDUCATION IN HONG KONG.

EXISTING TEACHERS AND YOUNG GRADUATES OF COLLEGES OF EDUCATION NEED HAVE NO FEARS IN THE NEXT FEW YEARS CONCERNING THEIR EMPLOYMENT PROSPECTS, MR HAYE SAID.

+MORE LANGUAGE TEACHERS HAVE ALREADY BEEN APPROVED FOR OUR SECONDARY SCHOOLS FROM SEPTEMBER 1982, AND I HOPE TO BE ABLE TO SAY THAT EVEN MORE TEACHERS HAVE BEEN APPROVED FOR OTHER SIGNIFICANT TASKS IN SCHOOLS IN THE VERY NEAR FUTURE,+ HE SAID.

MR HAYE HINTED THAT AN IMPORTANT FEATURE OF THE WHITE PAPER ON PRIMARY EDUCATION AND PRE-PRIMARY SERVICES EXPECTED TO BE PUBLISHED SHORTLY WOULD BE AN IMPROVEMENT IN THE TEACHER TO CLASS RATIO IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

HE ALSO REMINDED THE GRADUATES THAT THEY HAVE AN IMPORTANT TASK AHEAD OF THEM.

+NEXT TO THE PARENT, YOU AS TEACHERS ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT PEOPLE IN THE WORLD FOR YOUR PUPILS.

+NEXT TO THE HOME, THE CLASSROOM IS WHERE YOUNG MINDS AND CHARACTERS ARE MADE OR BROKEN,+ MR HAYE SAID.

PARTIAL OPENING OF \$90 MILLION WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD FLYOVER

THE WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD - STUBBS ROAD FLYOVER, BUILT BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AT A COST OF \$90 MILLION, WILL BE OPENED ONE WAY TO NORTHBOUND TRAFFIC AT 10.30 AM ON SATURDAY, JULY 18.

THE PARTIAL OPENING WILL ENABLE TRAFFIC HEADING TOWARDS WAN CHAI FROM REPULSE BAY AND ABERDEEN TO BY-PASS THE STUBBS ROAD - TAI HANG ROAD - WONG NAI CHUNG GAP ROAD ROUNDABOUT.

BUSES WILL CONTINUE TO USE EXISTING GROUND-LEVEL STOPS IN THE AREA.

THE FLYOVER IS EXPECTED TO BE OPENED TO SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC WHEN WORK ON THE NEW NORTHBOUND SLIP ROAD IN STUBBS ROAD IS COMPLETED IN ABOUT TWO MONTHS. MEANWHILE, THE MERGING OF TRAFFIC AT THE NORTHERN END OF THE FLYOVER WILL BE TEMPORARILY CONTROLLED BY TRAFFIC LIGHTS.

FAREWELL DINNER FOR TSUEN WAN PROJECT MANAGER

TSUEN WAN COMMUNITY LEADERS TODAY (THURSDAY) HELD A FAREWELL DINNER FOR THE DISTRICT'S PROJECT MANAGER, MR EDDY SHORT.

MR SHORT, WHO HAS HELD THE POST SINCE THE TSUEN WAN NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT WAS FIRST SET UP IN 1973, WAS RECENTLY PROMOTED ACTING DIRECTOR OF ENGINEERING DEVELOPMENT.

SPEAKING ON BEHALF OF COMMUNITY LEADERS, DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER, MR CHAN PO FONG, THANKED MR SHORT FOR HIS CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS THE DEVELOPMENT OF TSUEN WAN FOR THE PAST EIGHT YEARS.

HE SAID THE BUILDING OF TSUEN WAN TOWN HALL, AN INDOOR SPORTS HALL IN KWAI CHUNG, TSUEN WAN BY-PASS, THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY EXTENSION AND TSUEN WAN BAY RECLAMATION HAD ALL TAKEN PLACE WHILE MR SHORT HAD BEEN PROJECT MANAGER.

+WE BELIEVE THE PROJECT MANAGER'S OFFICE HAS A VERY IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY UNDER THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME,+ MR CHAN SAID.

+IT IS ONLY THROUGH THEIR WORK THAT COMMUNITY PROJECTS PROPOSED BY DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS CAN BECOME A REALITY.

+MR SHORT HAS ALWAYS SHOWN GREAT INTEREST IN HELPING THE BOARD AND ITS VARIOUS PROJECTS,+ HE SAID.

TSUEN WAN TOWN MANAGER, DR JAMES HAYES, DESCRIBED MR SHORT AS A +VERY SENSIBLE AND PRACTICAL PERSON WHO TAKES A HUMAN APPROACH TO PROBLEMS+.

+DISTRICT WORK REQUIRES A LOYALTY TO THE DISTRICT. THIS CAN ONLY DERIVE FROM TAKING A REAL INTEREST IN THE PLACE, WORKING WITH LOCAL PEOPLE, AND KNOWING THE DISTRICT AND ITS NEEDS,+ HE SAID.

+BUT DISTRICT NEEDS HAVE TO BE BALANCED AGAINST GOVERNMENT'S OVERALL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME AND PRIORITIES.

+THE COMPLEXITIES SURROUNDING THIS KIND OF WORK CLEARLY REQUIRE A SPECIAL TYPE OF PERSON TO DO IT EFFECTIVELY. EDDIE SHORT IS THAT SORT OF MAN,+ DR HAYES SAID.

+WE HAVE BEEN VERY FORTUNATE IN HAVING HIM HERE FOR SO LONG, BUT HE NOW HAS TO MOVE ON.+

ALSO PRESENT AT THE DINNER WERE SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR DAVID AKERS-JONES, THE DIRECTOR OF THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, MR BERNARD NEWMAN, THE NEW PROJECT MANAGER, MR C.N. FONG, AND OFFICIALS FROM VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS WITHIN THE DISTRICT.

COMMENDATION FOR SIX FIREMEN

* * * *

SIX FIREMEN WHO RESCUED TWO MEN FROM THE SLIPPERY AND NARROW LEDGES OF A FACTORY BUILDING IN KWUN TONG WERE TODAY PRESENTED WITH LETTERS OF COMMENDATION FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FIRE SERVICES, MR FREDERICK WATSON.

THE FIREMEN, ALL CREW MEMBERS OF A TURNTABLE LADDER, WERE PRESENTED WITH THE DIRECTOR'S COMMENDATION AT A CEREMONY AT KWUN TONG FIRE STATION.

KOWLOON COMMAND'S CHIEF FIRE OFFICER ANTHONY CONWAY PRESENTED THE COMMENDATION TO PRINCIPAL FIREMAN NG WAI-MING, ACTING PRINCIPAL FIREMAN SZE WAH-MAN AND FIREMEN SIU CHUN-KEUNG, WONG SING-HUNG, LEUNG WING-YUI AND LAM MAN-SUN.

IN PRESENTING THE COMMENDATION, MR CONWAY PRAISED THE CREW MEMBERS FOR EXCELLENT TEAMWORK.

+THIS SHOWS THAT BY EXTENSIVE TRAINING TO HANDLE COMPLICATED APPLIANCES, DIFFICULT ADVERSITIES CAN BE OVERCOME,+ MR CONWAY SAID.

+THE CREW MEMBERS OF THIS TURNTABLE LADDER HAVE SHOWN INITIATIVE AND THE ABILITY TO CARRY OUT THEIR DESIGNATED DUTY IN THE MOST DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES,+ HE ADDED.

THE FIRE BROKE OUT ON THE SIXTH FLOOR OF A FACTORY BUILDING IN WAI YIP STREET ON MAY 19, AND WAS SOON UPGRADED TO NUMBER THREE ALARM.

DURING THE FIRE-FIGHTING OPERATION, TWO MEN WERE FOUND BALANCING PRECARIOUSLY ON NARROW LEDGES AT THE BUILDING'S OPEN LIGHTWELL IN A NARROW LANE AT THE REAR OF THE FACTORY BLOCK.

THE LANE WAS COMPLETELY BLOCKED BY ILLEGAL STRUCTURES, PREVENTING ACCESS TO IT AND THE USE OF MANUAL LADDERS.

THE CREW OF THE TURNTABLE LADDER WAS THEN ORDERED TO RESCUE THE MEN WHO WERE AT THE FOURTH FLOOR LEVEL.

THE RESCUE OPERATION MADE IT NECESSARY TO EXTEND THE MECHANISED LADDER BEYOND ITS SAFETY LIMIT. ANOTHER PROBLEM WAS THAT THE LADDER HEAD COULD NOT BE RESTED AGAINST A WALL.

DESPITE MANY OBSTRUCTIONS, INCLUDING THE PRESENCE OF AIR-CONDITIONER UNITS, THE LADDER WAS SUCCESSFULLY OPERATED AND THE RESCUE OF THE TWO MEN COMPLETED IN THE SHORTEST POSSIBLE TIME.

GOVERNMENT STAFF MEET WITH YAU OI ESTATE BLOCK REPRESENTATIVES
* * * * *

THE TUEN MUN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BILLY LAM, TOGETHER WITH POLICE AND HOUSING DEPARTMENT STAFF, MET WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE SIX BLOCKS OF YAU OI ESTATE TONIGHT (THURSDAY) TO TALK ABOUT VARIOUS SECURITY PROBLEMS WHICH HAVE ARISEN IN THE ESTATE RECENTLY.

THE REPRESENTATIVES WERE TOLD BY THE DIVISIONAL SUPERINTENDENT, MR DAVE EDWARDS, OF STEPS BEING TAKEN TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION, INCLUDING DOUBLING MANPOWER OF THE ESTATE'S NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING UNIT AND THE DEPLOYMENT OF SPECIAL TEAMS TO CARRY OUT VERTICAL PATROLLING OF ALL BLOCKS. THE REPRESENTATIVES WERE URGED TO ENCOURAGE RESIDENTS TO REPORT TO THE POLICE IMMEDIATELY ANY SUSPICIOUS CHARACTERS OR BEHAVIOUR.

THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT SAID ACTION TO REPAIR DEFECTIVE GATES OF FLATS HAD ALREADY STARTED.

MR LAM SAID MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES HAD A VITAL ROLE TO PLAY IN IMPROVING SECURITY IN THE ESTATE AND SAID THE DISTRICT OFFICE WAS INTENSIFYING ITS EFFORTS TO GET THEM ESTABLISHED IN ALL SIX BLOCKS AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE NOW THAT THE BLOCKS WERE BEING FILLED. HE SAID AN MAC HAD ALREADY BEEN SET UP IN ONE BLOCK AND ANOTHER ONE WAS BEING FORMED. HE APPEALED TO RESIDENTS TO BECOME MAC MEMBERS.

MR LAM SAID HE WAS AWARE OF THE PROBLEMS NEWCOMERS TO TUEN MUN MIGHT FACE IN MOVING INTO AN UNFAMILIAR ENVIRONMENT, BUT SAID THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS WOULD CONTINUE TO DO ALL THEY COULD TO ASSIST THEM TO SETTLE DOWN. HE SAID SOME FACILITIES ALREADY EXISTED AND THERE WAS A PROGRAMME TO EXPAND THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN'S CENTRES, NURSERIES, KINDERGARTENS AND RECREATIONAL OUTLETS. +GOVERNMENT STAFF ARE DOING ALL THEY CAN TO MAKE SURE THESE ARE PROVIDED AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE TO MEET THE SITUATION CREATED BY THE EXTREMELY RAPID BUILD-UP OF POPULATION,+ MR LAM SAID.

YAU OI IS THE SECOND LARGEST ESTATE IN TUEN MUN WITH 20 000 RESIDENTS. TUEN MUN HAS A PRESENT POPULATION OF 130 000, DOUBLE WHAT IT WAS LAST YEAR, AND IT WILL EXPAND TO OVER 550 000 WHEN THE NEW TOWN IS FULLY COMPLETED BY THE END OF THE 1980S.

ABOUT 1 000 CHILDREN AND STAFF FROM 14 FISH MARKETING ORGANISATION SCHOOLS ARE TAKING PART IN A WEEK-LONG SUMMER CAMP AT WU KWAI SHA YOUTH VILLAGE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THIS YEAR'S CAMP, THE 13TH OF ITS KIND SINCE 1969, STARTED ON JULY 13.

A BALANCED PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES HAS BEEN WORKED OUT FOR THE CHILDREN TO GIVE THEM AN OPPORTUNITY TO ENJOY THEMSELVES, EXCHANGE IDEAS AND MAKE NEW FRIENDS.

THE PROGRAMME INCLUDES CULTURAL ACTIVITIES, COMPETITIVE GAMES AND SPORTS, A STALLS FAIR, INTEREST GROUPS INCLUDING FOLK DANCING AND SINGING AS WELL AS A BARBECUE.

THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, DR C.T. WONG VISITED THE CHILDREN IN THE CAMP TODAY (THURSDAY).

DR WONG TOLD THE CAMPERS THAT MORE THAN \$100 000 WAS SPENT ON THE CAMP EVERY YEAR. THE FUNDS WERE MET BY SUBVENTIONS FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB, WITH THE BALANCE FROM THE FISH MARKETING ORGANISATION.

HE URGED THE CHILDREN TO ENRICH THEIR KNOWLEDGE BY READING GOOD BOOKS DURING THE HOLIDAY.

TWO NEW CLASSROOMS WOULD BE ADDED TO FMO SCHOOLS AT SAI KUNG AND TSING YI AT THE NEW SCHOOL TERM LATER THIS YEAR, TO ALLOW A BIGGER ENROLMENT OF FISHERMEN'S CHILDREN.

THE GOVERNMENT HAS SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH A CONSORTIUM OF CONSULTANTS FOR A REGIONAL PLANNING STUDY IN THE NORTH EAST NEW TERRITORIES.

THE STUDY -- THE DEVELOPMENT INVESTIGATION OF NORTH EASTERN NEW TERRITORIES -- WILL TAKE 12 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

CONSULTANTS IN THE CONSORTIUM ARE FREEMAN FOX AND PARTNERS (FAR EAST), HALCROW FOX AND ASSOCIATES, E.B.C. HONG KONG AND WATSON HAWKSLEY ASIA.

THE PURPOSE OF THE STUDY IS TO ESTABLISH THE DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL OF THE NORTH EASTERN NEW TERRITORIES. IT WILL PROVIDE THE GOVERNMENT WITH THE INFORMATION NEEDED TO PREPARE AN INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY FOR HONG KONG.

CONTRACT TO CLEAN INCINERATOR FLUE GASES
* * * *

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT TODAY (THURSDAY) SIGNED A \$7.5 MILLION CONTRACT FOR WORK AND EQUIPMENT TO CLEAN FLUE GASES AT THE KENNEDY TOWN INCINERATION PLANT.

THE CONTRACT WAS SIGNED BY MR G.J. OSBORNE, PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL ENGINEER, AND MR DIETER VON HANSEMANN OF JEBSEN AND CO.

THE WORKS WILL INCLUDE THE REMOVAL OF EXISTING MECHANICAL GAS CLEANING EQUIPMENT, THE SUPPLY AND INSTALLATION OF TWO HIGH EFFICIENCY ELECTROSTATIC PRECIPITATORS AND ASSOCIATED CIVIL ENGINEERING AND BUILDING WORK.

DETAILED DESIGN IS UNDERWAY. SITE WORK WILL BEGIN IN JANUARY AND IS SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED IN 10 MONTHS.

MR OSBORNE SAID THAT ELECTROSTATIC PRECIPITATORS WERE USED FOR HIGH-EFFICIENCY CLEANING OF WASTE GASES ON MODERN INCINERATION PLANTS.

HE SAID THAT THE KENNEDY TOWN INSTALLATION WHICH WAS A PILOT SCHEME, WOULD PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR ENGINEERS TO EVALUATE THE POSSIBLE APPLICATION OF ELECTROSTATIC PRECIPITATORS TO OLDER EXISTING PLANTS.

THIS STUDY WOULD HELP THE GOVERNMENT TO DECIDE WHETHER THE ELECTROSTATIC PRECIPITATORS WOULD HELP IMPROVE EMISSION STANDARDS AT BOTH KENNEDY TOWN AND LAI CHI KOK INCINERATORS.
