CUSTOMS AND EXCISE AMONG MOST EFFICIENT IN WORLD

* * * *

HONG KONG EXISTS LARGELY BY INTERNATIONAL TRADE, AND THE MANY ACTIVITIES THAT THIS ENTAILS IN RESPONSE TO THE REQUIREMENT OF OUR OVERSEAS TRADING PARTNERS HAS GIVEN RISE TO ONE OF THE MOST EFFICIENT CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICES IN THE WORLD.

WHILE ITS MAJOR ACTIVITY IS STILL CONCERNED WITH FACILITATING THE SMOOTH FLOW OF GOODS OF ALL KINDS TO AND FROM HONG KONG, THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICE, NEVERTHELESS, STANDS HIGH IN INTERNATIONAL ASSESSMENT AS A DRUG-FIGHTING BODY.

ITS ANTI-NARCOTICS OPERATIONS, WHICH INVOLVE A SUBSTANTIAL PART OF ITS MANPOWER, RESULTED IN THE SEIZURE LAST YEAR OF SOME 190 KILOGRAMS OF NARCOTICS, WORTH ABOUT \$60 MILLION IN THE STREETS, AND THE ARREST OF 750 PERSONS.

BUT TRADE FACILITATION REMAINS AN IMPORTANT FUNCTION, PROBABLY MORE SO IN HONG KONG THAN IN MOST OTHER COUNTRIES, SAID THE COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE, MR DOUGLAS JORDAN.

HONG KONG'S TOTAL MERCHANDISE TRADE LAST YEAR, FOR INSTANCE, CAME TO \$260 BILLION, IN THE FORM OF ABOUT \$138 BILLION IN IMPORTS, \$80 BILLION WORTH OF EXPORTS AND SOME \$42 BILLION OF RE-EXPORTS.

ALL OF THIS INVOLVED THOUSANDS OF AIRCRAFT AND VESSELS - (AND ABOUT NINE MILLION PASSENGERS), IN ADDITION TO THE MILLIONS OF POSTAL PACKAGES, THOUSANDS OF CONTAINERS OF MANUFACTURED PRODUCTS, AND RAW MATERIALS AND OTHER ARTICLES.

IN FACT, THE SERVICE IS NOW RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DIRECT ENFORCEMENT OF 16 ORDINANCES INVOLVING REVENUE COLLECTION, COPYRIGHT, COUNTERFEIT, AND DANGEROUS DRUGS AND OTHER CONTRABAND.

TO COPE WITH THE INCREASING COMPLEXITY AND VOLUME OF ITS WORKLOAD, THE SERVICE LAST YEAR UNDERTOOK A MAJOR REORGANISATION OF ITS ACTIVITIES, WHICH IS NOW NEARLY COMPLETED. IN DOING SO, IT HAD TO INCREASE ITS MANPOWER BY 454 PERSONS TO ITS PRESENT STRENGTH OF 2 158, WHICH IS THE MAJOR PART OF THE 3 000 STRONG CUSTOMS AND CONTROLS DEPARTMENT.

WHEN THE SERVICE BEGAN IN 1909 AS A SMALL DIVISION OF WHAT WAS THEN THE IMPORT AND EXPORT DEPARTMENT, IT HAD A STAFF OF 26, RECALLED MR JORDAN. THE WORK THEN, HOWEVER, WAS EQUALLY VERY LIMITED IN A VERY MUCH SMALLER HONG KONG.

THE PRESENT CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICE NOW ORGANISED IN THE FIELD IN THREE LARGELY AUTONOMOUS REGIONS HAS THREE SPECIALISED SUPPORT BRANCHES AT HEADQUARTERS - THE GENERAL ADMINISTRATION UNIT DEALING WITH STAFFING AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT, A TECHNICAL BUREAU PROVIDING A +THINK-TANK+ FOR THE SERVICE AND THE CUSTOMS INVESTIGATION BUREAU (CIB).

/MR K.S. TONG,

MR K.S. TONG, WHO HEADS THE CIB, SAID THE NEW ARRANGEMENT ENABLES EACH REGION TO TAKE PROMPT ACTION WITHOUT HAVING TO REFER CONSTANTLY TO HEADQUARTERS FOR INSTRUCTIONS.

+THE CIB WILL ASSIST THE REGIONAL DIVISIONS ONLY IN MAJOR AND COMPLEX CASES, UPON REQUEST, OR WHEN INTER-REGIONAL ACTION IS CONTEMPLATED,+ HE ADDED.

IN ADDITION TO ITS GENERAL INVESTIGATION WORK THE CIB IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DETECTING ORGANISED DRUG RUNNING AND TRAFFICKING OF A MAJOR NATURE.

DRUG TRAFFICKERS, EXPLAINED MR TONG, ARE NOW EMPLOYING EVER MORE INGENIOUS AND SOPHISTICATED WAYS TO PLY THEIR NEFARIOUS TRADE.

SOME FOR INSTANCE ARE EMPLOYING NEW METHODS OF CONCEALMENT, SUCH AS INSIDE TROPICAL FRUITS AND CANNED FOOD. OTHERS TRY TO CATCH THE CUSTOMS OFF GUARD BY DIVERTING THEIR DRUGS THROUGH PLACES KNOWN FOR THEIR TIGHT REGULATIONS AND SURVEILLANCE - SUCH AS SINGAPORE, TOKYO, TAIPEI AND BEIJING - TO DISCOURAGE CUSTOMS ATTENTION IN HONG KONG.

MASSIVE DRUG SHIPMENTS, HOWEVER, CONTINUE TO BE MADE FROM SEA-GOING VESSELS. LAST YEAR A RECORD-HIGH SEIZURE OF DEHYDRATED OPIUM TOTALLING 82.7 KILOGRAMS WAS MADE ON BOARD ONE VESSEL FROM SINGAPORE. THE DRUGS WERE FOUND INSIDE A SPARE PISTON AND IN VARIOUS FALSE COMPARTMENTS OF THE SHIP. MORE RECENTLY 73 KILOGRAMS OF HEROIN BASE WAS DETECTED IN A CONSIGNMENT OF COMPRESSORS, AGAIN FROM SINGAPORE.

MR TONG EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE REAPPEARANCE OF A QUANTITY OF HIGH QUALITY NO. 4 HEROIN LAST YEAR, AND THE INFLUX OF DRUGS AS A RESULT OF BUMPER HARVESTS IN THE NOTORIOUS GOLDEN TRIANGLE OF THAILAND, BURMA AND LAOS.

+THERE IS SIMPLY NO LETTING UP ON OUR WATCH FOR DRUG TRAFFICKERS, AND OUR BATTLE OF WITS WITH BIG TRAFFICKERS AND THEIR COURIERS WILL GO ON,+ HE SAID.

MR JORDAN, A SENIOR OFFICER WITH THE UNITED KINGDOM CUSTOMS AND EXCISE BEFORE HE WAS APPOINTED COMMISSIONER IN 1977, SAID, *THE EXPANSION AND REORGANISATION OF THE SERVICE WERE NOT ONLY INTENDED TO IMPROVE ITS ANTI-NARCOTICS AND ANTI-COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT WORK - FOR WHICH IT IS ALREADY WELL KNOWN - BUT ALSO TO DEAL WITH OTHER VIOLATIONS DAMAGING THE ECONOMY OR TRADING INTEGRITY OF HONG KONG+.

+THE NECESSITY FOR AN ENTIRELY NEW ORGANISATION BECAME APPARENT WITH THE GROWTH OF HONG KONG, ITS INCREASING TRADE AND CHANGING TRADING PATTERNS. NOT LEAST AMONG THESE IS THE INCREASING TRADE AND TRAFFIC WITH CHINA, BOTH ACROSS THE LAND BOUNDARY AND BY SEA AND AIR+.

LAST YEAR, 41 CASES OF SMUGGLING BY SEA BETWEEN HONG KONG AND CHINA WERE INTERCEPTED, RESULTING IN 398 ARRESTS INVOLVING SMUGGLED GOODS WORTH ABOUT 16.25 MILLION DOLLARS, IN CONTRAST TO 1980 WHEN ONLY 11 CASES INVOLVING GOODS WORTH ABOUT 2.67 MILLION DOLLARS WERE INTERCEPTED, AND 66 ARRESTED.

ONLY THREE CASES OF SMUGGLING BY LAND ACROSS THE HONG KONG-CHINA BORDER WERE DISCOVERED IN 1981 AND NONE THE PRECEDING YEAR.

THE INCREASE IN THE SERVICE'S MANPOWER IS EXPECTED TO BE MATCHED BY A COMPARABLE UPGRADING OF ITS MATERIAL RESOURCES. METAL DETECTORS AND X-RAY MACHINES WILL BE INSTALLED THIS YEAR AT ALL CUSTOMS ENTRY POINTS TO DETECT WEAPONS AND OTHER CONTRABAND.

MEANWHILE, THE SERVICE'S CURRENT FLEET OF SEVEN HARBOUR AND PATROL LAUNCHES - SOME OF THEM OVER 24 YEARS OLD - WILL BE GRADUALLY REPLACED BY A MODERN FLEET OF FAST PATROL BOATS, SEVERAL OF WHICH WILL BE CAPABLE OF OPERATING AT SEA CONTINUOUSLY FOR AT LEAST THREE DAYS. THE FIRST OF THE NEW FLEET OF 14 VESSELS IS EXPECTED TO BE COMMISSIONED LATER THIS YEAR.

THE MODERNISATION OF ITS FLEET, HAS BEEN LONG OVERDUE. MOST SMUGGLERS' VESSELS CAN OUTFRAN ANY OF THE SERVICE'S BOATS. WITH 350 MILES OF COASTLINE AND 243 ISLANDS DOTTING HONG KONG'S 715 SQUARE MILES OF TERRITORIAL WATERS, ALL OF THEM POTENTIAL DRUG PICK-UP POINTS, THE NEED FOR A MUCH BIGGER AND BETTER-EQUIPPED FLEET CANNOT BE OVER-EMPHASISED, AN OFFICER SAID.

THE SERVICE MAINTAINS REGULAR AND DIRECT CONTACT WITH OVER 40 FOREIGN LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND ITS OFFICERS HAVE BEEN INVITED TO TRAIN THEIR COUNTERPARTS AND HELP ESTABLISH COMPARABLE SERVICES IN OTHER COUNTRIES. ITS OWN TRAINING SCHOOL IS AN \$8-MILLION COMPLEX OF BUILDINGS SITUATED AT 16-MILESTONE, CASTLE PEAK ROAD, NEW TERRITORIES. LAST YEAR, THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE TRAINING SCHOOL GRADUATED 664 OFFICERS, THE LARGEST NUMBER OF GRADUATES PRODUCED IN ANY SINGLE YEAR SINCE IT WAS OPENED IN 1974.

RECENTLY, THE SERVICE HAS INTENSIFIED ITS ACTIVITIES FOR THE PROTECTION OF COPYRIGHT, AND MANY INSTANCES OF INFRINGEMENT OF TRADE MARKS WERE BROUGHT TO THE COURTS AND SUCCESSFULLY PROSECUTED.

IN ADDITION TO INFRINGEMENT OF PRODUCT BRANDS THERE WERE ALSO CASES OF COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT, CONCERNING VIDEO CASSETTES, RECORDERS, PIRATED BOOKS AND MAGAZINES, AND SOUND TAPES. PORNOGRAPHIC TAPES WERE ALSO SEIZED IN LARGE QUANTITIES, AND LED TO 25 PERSONS BEING CHARGED UNDER THE OBJECTIONABLE PUBLICATIONS ORDINANCE.

EXCEPT ON GROUNDS OF SUSPICION, CARGO AND PASSENGERS ARE OTHERWISE EXAMINED ONLY ON A VERY SELECTIVE BASIS, IN LINE WITH TRADE FACILITATION POLICY AND THE FREE PORT STATUS OF HONG KONG, IT WAS EXPLAINED. BUT SUCH SELECTION IS RELATED TO A SOPHISTICATED INTELLIGENCE SYSTEM WHICH ENABLES THE CUSTOMS TO EXERCISE ITS ENFORCEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES WITHOUT UNDUE INTERFERENCE WITH THE TRADE AND TOURIST TRAFFIC OF HONG KONG.

SOME TIPS FOR TIN HAU WORSHIPPERS

WORSHIPPERS ATTENDING TIN HAU FESTIVAL CELEBRATIONS AT JOSS HOUSE BAY ON FRIDAY (APRIL 16) ARE URGED TO USE WHEREVER POSSIBLE THE SPECIAL FERRIES BEING LAID ON FOR THEM.

THE APPEAL CAME FROM THE DISTRICT OFFICER, SAI KUNG, MR CHAN SUI-JEUNG, WHO SAID THE FERRIES WERE A CONVENIENT WAY OF GETTING TO JOSS HOUSE BAY.

+I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO APPEAL TO THE WORSHIPPERS TO CARRY THEIR HONG KONG IDENTITY CARDS AND TAKE SPECIAL CARE WHEN GETTING ON OR OFF FERRIES.

+THIS ALSO APPLIES TO THOSE GOING BY BOAT,+ HE SAID.

MR CHAN SAID MARINE POLICE AND MARINE DEPARTMENT LAUNCHES WOULD KEEP A CLOSE WATCH ON BOATS GOING TO JOSS HOUSE BAY, AND OPERATORS WHO OVERLOADED VESSELS WERE LIABLE TO PROSECUTION.

+ADEQUATE POLICE AND MEDICAL FACILITIES WOULD BE AVAILABLE AT THE SCENE SHOULD EMERGENCY ARISE,+ HE ADDED.

MEANWHILE, A POLICE SPOKESMAN REMINDED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO BEWARE OF PICKPOCKETS WHO ARE USUALLY ACTIVE ON SUCH FESTIVE OCCASIONS.

HE ADDED THAT IT WAS AN OFFENCE TO POSSESS OR DISCHARGE FIREWORKS, AND THAT LION DANCES WERE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON THE SHORE.

THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT ALSO APPEALED TO WORSHIPPERS TO TAKE PRECAUTIONS AGAINST CAUSING FIRES, AND URGED SMOKERS TO MAKE SURE THAT CIGARETTE ENDS AND MATCHES WERE PROPERLY EXTINGUISHED BEFORE DISPOSING OF THEM. A CHECK SHOULD BE MADE BEFORE LEAVING THE AREA TO ENSURE THAT CANDLES, JOSS-STICKS AND PAPERS WERE NOT STILL BURNING.

SALES OR DISPLAYS OF HYDROGEN-FILLED BALLOONS WERE PROHIBITED AND VENDORS OR PURCHASERS OF HELIUM GAS FILLED BALLOONS WERE WARNED TO AVOID EXPOSING THEM TO OPEN FIRE BECAUSE OF THE RISK OF AN EXPLOSION.

A NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN APPEALED TO WORSHIPPERS TO PLACE ALL LITTER IN THE LARGE CONTAINERS BEING PROVIDED IN THE AREA FOR PUBLIC USE. IN PARTICULAR, HE URGED PASSENGERS ON THE FERRY NOT TO THROW RUBBISH ONTO THE SEA.

TAI HANG ROAD FLYOVER ONE-THIRD COMPLETE

WORK ON THE \$75 MILLION TAI HANG ROAD FLYOVER IS PROGRESSING SMOOTHLY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE HIGHWAYS OFFICE OF THE ENGINEERING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (MONDAY) THAT WORK ON THE PROJECT WAS ABOUT ONE-THIRD COMPLETE.

THE TWO-WAY FLYOVER, MEASURING 550 METRES IN LENGTH, WILL RUN FROM THE LOWER END OF TAI HANG ROAD THROUGH MORETON TERRACE CROSSING CAUSEWAY ROAD TO JOIN GLOUCESTER ROAD ON THE WEST SIDE OF VICTORIA PARK.

+THERE WILL BE CONNECTING RAMPS AT MORETON TERRACE AND TUNG LO WAN ROAD TO EASE TRAFFIC CONGESTION AT THE JUNCTION OF TAI HANG ROAD AND TUNG LO WAN ROAD,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE PROJECT, SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED BY THE END OF NEXT YEAR, ALSO INCLUDES THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGE AND AN OFF-STREET BUS TERMINUS.

THE 35-METRE COVERED FOOTBRIDGE WILL SPAN CAUSEWAY ROAD AT ITS JUNCTION WITH SHELTER STREET. THE NEW BUS TERMINUS WILL BE LOCATED AT THE CORNER OF MORETON TERRACE AND TUNG LO WAN ROAD.
