PROVISIONAL TRADE FIGURES FOR APRIL
* * * * *

THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) PUBLISHED THE PROVISIONAL FIGURES FOR HONG KONG'S EXTERNAL MERCHANDISE TRADE DURING APRIL.

THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS WAS \$5,740 MILLION, MADE UP OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF \$4,154 MILLION AND RE-EXPORTS OF \$1,586 MILLION. WITH IMPORTS AT \$7,114 MILLION, THE VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT FOR APRIL WAS \$1,374 MILLION.

COMPARED WITH THE SAME MONTH IN 1978, THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS IN APRIL INCREASED BY 37 PER CENT OR \$1,111 MILLION AND THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS BY 58 PER CENT OR \$585 MILLION.

THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS, THAT IS DOMESTIC EXPORTS PLUS RE-EXPORTS, INCREASED BY 42 PER CENT OR \$1,696 MILLION. THUS THE GROWTH RATE OF TOTAL EXPORTS WAS ROUGHLY THE SAME AS THE GROWTH RATE OF IMPORTS AT 43 PER CENT.

IMPORTS WERE, BY VALUE, \$2,146 MILLION HIGHER THAN IN APRIL 1978.

COMMENTING ON THE TRADE FIGURES, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID IT WAS ENCOURAGING THAT, TAKING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THE YEAR TOGETHER, TOTAL EXPORTS WERE GROWING FASTER THAN IMPORTS.

COMPARING FIGURES FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THE YEAR WITH THOSE FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1978, THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS WAS 33 PER CENT HIGHER, THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS WAS 59 PER CENT HIGHER, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS WAS 39 PER CENT HIGHER AND THE VALUE OF IMPORTS WAS 37 PER CENT HIGHER.

GIVEN THAT THE VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1978 REPRESENTED AROUND 40 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT FOR THAT YEAR, THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT A VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT OF \$4,609 MILLION FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1979 COULD MEAN A VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT OF LESS THAN \$12,000 MILLION FOR THE YEAR AS A WHOLE.

THIS WAS SLIGHTLY BELOW THE VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT IMPLICIT IN THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S BUDGET SPEECH FORECAST ON THE ECONOMY.

THUS THE TRADE FIGURES SUPPORTED THE VIEW THAT THE ECONOMY WAS FOLLOWING THE COURSE PREDICTED IN THE BUDGET SPEECH.

IN CONSIDERING THE IMPLICATIONS OF THE TRADE FIGURES FOR THE ECONOMY, HE SAID IT MUST BE REMEMBERED THAT THE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THIS YEAR WERE ORDERED MONTHS BEFORE THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY ANNOUNCED THE MEASURES TO SLOW DOWN THE GROWTH RATE OF DOMESTIC DEMAND.

/EVEN SO,

EVEN SO, THE VISIBLE TRADE DEFICIT FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1979, AT RATHER LESS THAN 19 PER CENT OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS, WAS ALREADY SMALLER IN RELATIVE TERMS THAN IN THE SAME PERIOD LAST YEAR WHEN THE PROPORTION WAS RATHER MORE THAN 20 PER CENT.

CONTRACTS WORTH MORE THAN \$169 MILLION AWARDED LAST MONTH

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AWARDED 41 CONTRACTS WORTH MORE THAN \$169 MILLION LAST (APRIL) MONTH.

OF THESE, 22 WERE AWARDED ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE CENTRAL TENDER BOARD AND 19 ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PWD TENDER BOARD.

THE BIGGEST CONTRACT WAS FOR A MAJOR RECLAMATION AND LAND FORMATION PROJECT IN THE SOUTHWESTERN PART OF TUEN MUN NEW TOWN.

UNDER THE CONTRACT, 43 HECTARES OF LAND WILL BE PROVIDED FOR PUBLIC HOUSING, INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND OPEN SPACE.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT STARTED LAST MONTH AND WILL TAKE ABOUT 24 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

OTHER MAJOR CONTRACTS AWARDED IN APRIL INCLUDED THE BUILDING OF A MAJOR DISTRIBUTOR ROAD FROM PUI TO ROAD TO ON TING AND YAU OI HOUSING ESTATES NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION IN TUEN MUN AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PILLAR POINT SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS STAGE I.

TENDERS INVITED FOR SWITCHGEAR FOR ELECTRIFICATION OF KCR

TENDERS WERE INVITED TODAY (FRIDAY) FOR THE SUPPLY, INSTALLATION AND TESTING OF 25 KILOVOLT SINGLE PHASE SWITCHGEAR FOR THE ELECTRIFICATION OF THE KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY.

+FOUR SWITCHING STATIONS FOR THE CONTROL OF POWER SUPPLIES TO THE OVERHEAD LINE WILL BE BUILT ALONG THE 33-KILOMETRE RAILWAY,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT SAID.

THE FIRST SWITCHBOARD WILL BE DELIVERED IN NOVEMBER 1980 AND THE SWITCHING STATIONS ARE SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION BEFORE THE COMMISSIONING OF ELECTRIC TRAIN SERVICES IN 1982.

THE WORKS WILL BE SUPERVISED BY THE GOVERNMENT-APPOINTED CONSULTING ENGINEERS, TRANSMARK, WHILE THE PROJECT IS UNDER THE OVERALL SUPERVISION OF THE CIVIL ENGINEERING OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

PLAN TO BUILD SUBMARINE OUTFALL

THE GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO BUILD A SUBMARINE OUTFALL EXTENDING ABOUT 2,000 METRES IN A SOUTHERLY DIRECTION FROM THE SHORE BETWEEN SIU LAM SAN TSUEN AND SO KWUN TAN TO SERVE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENTS IN THE AREA.

SEWAGE FROM THE AREA AFTER TREATMENT WILL BE DISCHARGED THROUGH THE PROPOSED SUBMARINE OUTFALL INTO DEEP WATERS TO ACHIEVE ADEQUATE DILUTION AND DISPERSION.

THE EXTENT OF THE AREA OF FORESHORE AND SEA BED INVOLVED WAS DESCRIBED IN A NOTICE IN TODAY'S (FRIDAY) GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

ALL OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSAL OR ANY CLAIM OF PRIVATE RIGHT SHOULD SUBMIT IN WRITING TO THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS WITHIN A PERIOD OF TWO MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF THE NOTIFICATION.

THE NOTICE (IN BOTH ENGLISH AND CHINESE) WITH ITS RELATED PLAN CAN BE SEEN ON NOTICE BOARDS POSTED NEAR THE SITE.

ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN TO BE LAUNCHED ON SUNDAY

THIS YEAR'S ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN WILL BE OFFICIALLY OPENED BY MR. HILTON CHEONG-LEEN, UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, AT A CEREMONY TO BE HELD AT EDINBURGH PLACE ON SUNDAY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN PUBLICITY WORKING GROUP SAID THE FIRST PHASE OF THIS YEAR'S PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN WILL BE PRIMARILY AIMED AT PEDESTRIANS.

+AND, AS THIS YEAR IS THE 'INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF THE CHILD', WE HAVE ARRANGED FOR TWO CHILDREN TO PERFORM THE RIBBON-CUTTING CEREMONY,+ HE ADDED.

+THIS, WE FEEL, TIES IN WITH THE MESSAGE WE ARE ATTEMPTING TO CONVEY IN PART, IN THE FORTHCOMING PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN. BECAUSE EVEN THOUGH LESS THAN 15 PER CENT OF PEDESTRIAN ROAD ACCIDENTS INVOLVE CHILDREN, THERE IS STILL MUCH TO BE DONE IN EDUCATING THE YOUNG TO TAKE GREATER CARE ON THE ROADS.+

ROAD SAFETY PATROL TEAMS FROM VARIOUS SCHOOLS WILL BE ON PARADE TO START THE PROGRAMME, WHICH INCLUDES DISPLAYS OF ACROBATIC MOTORCYCLING, SKATE-BOARDING AND RADIO-CONTROLLED MODEL CARS.

A HIGHLIGHT OF THE PROGRAMME WILL BE A PROCESSION OF CHILDREN WHO WILL EACH DEPOSIT A PAPER FLOWER IN A CONTAINER TO SYMBOLISE THE 437 ROAD ACCIDENT FATALITIES IN 1978.

THERE WILL BE A CHILDREN'S ROAD SAFETY TOWN, IN WHICH +SEEING-EYE+ GUIDE DOGS WILL DEMONSTRATE THE SAFETY RULES FOR CROSSING A ROAD.

MANY SIDE ATTRACTIONS WILL ALSO BE FEATURED INCLUDING FILM SHOWS AT QUEEN'S PIER, THE MOBILE STREET THEATRE AND THE ROAD SAFETY BUS.

MUSIC WILL BE PROVIDED BY THE WELLINGTON SCHOOL BAND AND THE PIPES AND DRUMS OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE.

AS THIS CEREMONY WILL SIGNIFY THE LAUNCHING OF A TERRITORY-WIDE PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN, THE OFFICIAL GUESTS WILL INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVES FROM BOTH CITY DISTRICT OFFICES AND THE NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION.

OTHER GUESTS INCLUDE MEMBERS OF THE ROAD SAFETY ASSOCIATION, THE HONG KONG AUTOMOBILE ASSOCIATION AND THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, TRAFFIC DIVISION.

LOCAL PHOTOGRAPHIC EXPERTS AND SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WILL SELECT PRIZE-WINNING ENTRIES FOR THE +HONG KONG IN PROGRESS+ CONTEST ON SUNDAY.

THE CONTEST WHICH AIMS AT PROMOTING HONG KONG'S IMAGE BOTH OVERSEAS AND LOCALLY, WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY OF HONG KONG.

A TOTAL OF 926 ENTRIES WAS RECEIVED SINCE THE CONTEST WAS LAUNCHED THREE MONTHS AGO.

AUXILIARY MEDICAL SERVICE PRAISED

THE DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES, DR. K.L. THONG, SPOKE OF THE TRYING PERIOD WHICH THE AUXILIARY MEDICAL SERVICE, TOGETHER WITH OTHER ORGANISATIONS AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, ARE CURRENTLY EXPERIENCING WITH THE INFLUX OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES INTO HONG KONG.

SPEAKING AT THE AMS MESS DINNER THIS (FRIDAY) EVENING, HE SAID THAT IN THE LAST FEW MONTHS AMS PERSONNEL HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE OPERATIONS DAY AND NIGHT THROUGH FAIR AND FOUL WEATHER.

AT PRESENT, AMS VOLUNTEERS ARE STAFFING A MEDICAL CENTRE FOR REFUGEES AND THE MEDICAL TEAM ATTENDS TO MANY CLINICAL CASES DAILY AT VARIOUS REFUGEE CENTRES.

+THEY HAVE REMAINED IN THEIR STATIONS AND GIVEN THEIR BEST QUIETLY AND WITH EFFICIENCY,+ DR. THONG SAID.

+SUCH DEDICATION, I AM CONFIDENT, IS BEING APPRECIATED BY ALL CONCERNED AND I SHOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY OF SAYING 'WELL DONE' TO THOSE IN THE AMS WHO HAVE RESPONDED SO MAGNIFICENTLY TO THE CHALLENGE,+ HE ADDED.

PWD STAFF TO COMPETE IN DRAGON BOAT RACES

FOR THE FIRST TIME, THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT WILL ENTER FOUR TEAMS IN THIS YEAR'S DRAGON BOAT RACES TO BE HELD IN VARIOUS PARTS OF HONG KONG.

THREE OF THESE TEAMS, INCLUDING A LADIES TEAM, ARE NEWCOMERS. THEY COMPRISE STAFF FROM THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE, ARCHITECTURAL OFFICE, TOWN PLANNING OFFICE AND CROWN LANDS AND SURVEY OFFICE.

THESE TEAMS WILL COMPETE IN RACES TO BE HELD IN SHAU KEI WAN AND YAU MA TEI.
