POLICE COMMISSIONER VISITS CHINA

COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR ROY HENRY HAS ACCEPTED AN INVITATION TO VISIT CHINA FOR THREE DAYS LATER THIS MONTH.

MR HENRY, WHO WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY SUPERINTENDENT M.K. NG OF THE INTERPOL BUREAU, MR Y.P. CHENG, CHIEF GOVERNMENT INTERPRETER AND CHIEF INSPECTOR Y.T. MA, HIS PERSONAL ASSISTANT, WILL LEAVE HONG KONG ON MONDAY. AFTER SPENDING TWO DAYS IN PEKING, HE WILL VISIT GUANGZHOU BEFORE RETURNING TO HONG KONG ON THURSDAY.

SAID MR HENRY: +CHINA HAS RECENTLY JOINED INTERPOL AND I WILL BE DISCUSSING HOW WE CAN WORK TOGETHER. WE WILL ALSO TOUCH ON OTHER MATTERS OF MUTUAL INTEREST SUCH AS COMMUNICATIONS AND LIAISON.+

VIEWS SOUGHT ON MEDICAL SERVICES

* * * *

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC OR INTERESTED ORGANISATIONS ARE INVITED TO GIVE THEIR VIEWS TO THE MANAGEMENT CONSULTANTS WHO HAVE BEEN APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO REVIEW THE DELIVERY OF MEDICAL SERVICES IN HONG KONG'S HOSPITALS.

THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE REVIEW, TO BE CONDUCTED BY W.D. SCOTT AND CO., IS TO EXAMINE THE EXISTING ORGANISATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF HOSPITALS AND, IN PARTICULAR, TO CONSIDER WHAT CHANGES ARE NEEDED IN THEIR ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE, STAFFING AND INTERNAL ADMINISTRATION TO ENABLE THEM TO COPE EFFECTIVELY WITH CONTINUED EXPANSION IN THE YEARS AHEAD.

IN THE FORTHCOMING WEEKS MEMBERS OF THE CONSULTANCY TEAM WILL BE VISITING CERTAIN SELECTED HOSPITALS AND GATHERING VIEWS FROM PERSONS AND ORGANISATIONS IN THE MEDICAL FIELD. HOWEVER, WITHIN THE TIME CONSTRAINTS IMPOSED IT WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE FOR THEM TO CONSULT WITH ALL PARTIES HAVING AN INTEREST IN THE REVIEW.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC OR INTERESTED ORGANISATIONS ARE ACCORDINGLY INVITED TO MAKE WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS TO THE CONSULTANTS. SUBMISSIONS SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO:-

THE PRECISE TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE REVIEW ARE AS FOLLOWS:-

- (A) TO REVIEW THE ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE FOR MANAGING GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS, WITH THE AIM OF ASSESSING THE POTENTIAL FOR ACHIEVING BETTER INTEGRATION BETWEEN THESE HOSPITALS ON A FUNCTIONAL BASIS AND TO ADVISE WHETHER THIS AIM SHOULD BE MET THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AUTONOMOUS AUTHORITIES FOR MANAGING GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS;
- (B) TO EXAMINE THE INTERNAL ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS, WITH PARTICULAR REGARD TO THE ROLES OF THE SENIOR MEDICAL AND NURSING STAFF AND OF NON-MEDICAL ADMINISTRATORS, AND TO ADVISE ON THE CHANGES NEEDED TO STRENGTHEN HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATION, INCLUDING THE TRAINING REQUIRED TO ENHANCE THE ADMINISTRATIVE SKILLS OF SENIOR MEDICAL AND NURSING STAFF;
- (C) TO ADVISE HOW MORE EFFECTIVE USE MIGHT BE MADE OF EXISTING RESOURCES IN ORDER TO OVERCOME THE PROBLEMS ARISING FROM OVERCROWDED CONDITIONS IN GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS AND TO SUGGEST WHAT ALTERNATIVE METHODS OR FACILITIES SHOULD BE PLANNED TO RELIEVE THE LOAD ON HOSPITAL BEDS;
- (D) TO PROPOSE MORE EFFECTIVE METHODS OF CONTROLLING COSTS IN GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS AND TO SUGGEST HOW STAFF AT ALL LEVELS MIGHT BE MADE MORE PRODUCTIVE;
- (E) TO ADVISE WHETHER THERE ARE BETTER ALTERNATIVES TO THE PRESENT METHOD OF STAFFING HOSPITALS;
- (F) TO ADVISE WHETHER THE UTILIZATION OF GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS MIGHT BE IMPROVED IF THERE WERE A STRUCTURE OF CHARGES THAT TOOK ACCOUNT OF THE SERVICES PATIENTS RECEIVED AND OF THEIR ABILITY TO PAY;
- (G) TO DEVISE PLANS TO IMPROVE THE WORKING ENVIRONMENT IN HOSPITALS, INCLUDING TEACHING AND RESEARCH FACILITIES, AND TO IMPROVE PATIENTS' COMFORT AND STAFF MORALE; AND
- (H) TO INDICATE HOW SUITABLE PROVISION SHOULD BE MADE FOR THOSE PATIENTS WHO SEEK A HIGHER STANDARD OF ACCOMMODATION THAN THAT PROVIDED IN THIRD-CLASS WARDS IN GOVERNMENT AND SUBVENTED HOSPITALS AND WHO CAN AFFORD TO MEET PART OF THE COST OF HOSPITALIZATION INCLUDING ENLISTING THE HELP OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF MEDICAL INSURANCE.

DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION DEPENDS ON SUPPORT

THE GROWTH AND MATURITY OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION DEPENDED ON THE CONTINUING SUPPORT OF RESIDENTS, WHO KNOW BEST THE NEEDS AND PROBLEMS OF THEIR COMMUNITY, ACTING TAI PO DISTRICT OFFICER, MS ANISSA WONG SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE 1985 TAI PO DISTRICT LUNAR NEW YEAR PROGRAMME, MS WONG SAID THAT IN ADDITION TO PROVIDING CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR RESIDENTS, THE DISTRICT BOARD ALSO ADVISED THE GOVERNMENT ON THE PRIORITIES OF PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS, MATTERS AFFECTING THE RESIDENTS' WELL-BEING, AND HELPED REFLECT PUBLIC OPINIONS ON GOVERNMENT POLICIES.

+THE GOVERNMENT HAS SPARED NO EFFORT IN IMPROVING RELATIONS AT DISTRICT LEVEL AND TO PROVIDE MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR RESIDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN LOCAL AFFAIRS,+ SHE SAID.

WITH ITS LAST BLOCK CONVERTED LAST MONTH, HUNG HOM ESTATE IS NOW THE SECOND MARK I/II ESTATE WHERE REDEVELOPMENT WORKS ARE COMPLETED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE TENANTS.

THE FIRST FULLY REDEVELOPED ESTATE IS SHEK KIP MEI IN SHAM SHUI PO.

AT HUNG HOM ESTATE, INTAKE IS CONTINUING FOR THE 259 SELF-CONTAINED FLATS PRODUCED FROM IN-SITU CONVERSION OF THE LAST OF FOUR BLOCKS THERE.

BIGGER AND COMPLETE WITH INDIVIDUAL KITCHENS AND TOILETS, THESE CONVERTED FLATS PROVIDE MORE COMFORTABLE HOMES FOR 700 PEOPLE.

THE FIRST THREE BLOCKS WHICH HAVE BEEN CONVERTED AT THE ESTATE ARE HOUSING 3 400 PEOPLE.

WITH THE COMPLETION OF THE REDEVELOPMENT SCHEME, OVERCROWDING AT HUNG HOM ESTATE IS NOW A THING OF THE PAST. THE ORIGINAL POPULATION OF 5 500 PEOPLE HAS BEEN REDUCED BY 25 PER CENT.

REDEVELOPMENT WORKS ARE CONTINUING IN 10 OTHER MARK I/II ESTATES AND IT IS PLANNED TO HAVE THEM COMPLETED BY EARLY 1990'S.

TUEN MUN TO GET NEW POLICE STATION

A NEW POLICE STATION IS TO BE BUILT ON A 2 990-SQUARE-METRE-SITE NEAR BUTTERFLY ESTATE IN TUEN MUN TO SERVE THE POPULATION OF THE SOUTHERN PART OF THE NEW TOWN.

KNOWN AS THE NEW CASTLE PEAK DIVISIONAL POLICE STATION, IT CONSISTS OF A COMPOSITE BLOCK, PARTLY 10-STOREY AND PARTLY TWO-STOREY HIGH, AND THREE SINGLE-STOREY ANCILLARY BUILDINGS SURROUNDING A COMPOUND.

FACILITIES TO BE PROVIDED INCLUDE DUTY ROOM, LECTURE ROOM, ARMOURY, MOTOR TRANSPORT OFFICE, REPORT ROOM, CELLS, OFFICE, BARRACKS, CANTEEN, RECREATION AND LAUNDRY FACILITIES, DOG KENNELS AND STOREROOMS.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN APRIL AND BE COMPLETED IN JULY 1986.

THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE PROJECT.

THE DEADLINE IS NOON ON FRIDAY, MARCH 15. LATE TENDERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

SEVEN NEW ROADS, TOTALLING 1.3 KILOMETRES IN LENGTH, ARE TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON RECLAIMED LAND NEAR PILLAR POINT, TUEN MUN, AS PART OF THE CONTINUING PROGRAMME OF DEVELOPMENT IN THE NEW TOWN.

THE DUAL SINGLE-LANE CARRIAGEWAYS ARE TO PROVIDE LOCAL ACCESS TO SITES PLANNED FOR A LOG STORAGE AREA FOR SAWMILL OPERATORS, BOATYARDS, MARINE WORKSHOPS AND A PUBLIC WATERFRONT.

WORK WILL INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF A 260-METRE-LONG, FOUR-CELL REINFORCED CONCRETE CULVERT AND ASSOCIATED FOUL AND STORMWATER DRAINAGE WORKS.

THE PROJECT ALSO INCLUDES SOME PROTECTION WORKS TO SLOPES ACROSS LUNG MUN ROAD WHICH IS IN THE AREA, AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CAR PARK IN KIN ON STREET WHERE A NUMBER OF INDUSTRIAL ESTABLISHMENTS HAVE BEEN SET UP.
