PLANS FOR 11 NEW YOUTH CENTRES EACH YEAR

PRESENT PLANNING, TAKING ACCOUNT OF CONSTRAINTS IN TRAINED MANPOWER AND WELFARE PREMISES, PROVIDES FOR 11 NEW YOUTH CENTRES EACH YEAR, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR SELWYN ALLEYNE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE BRADBURY CENTRE, ANOTHER NEW YOUTH CENTRE RUN BY THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS. JOINTLY OFFICIATING AT THE CEREMONY WAS MR D.B. MINNS, MANAGING DIRECTOR OF HONG KONG BANK TRUSTEE LIMITED.

MR ALLEYNE SAID THAT YOUTH CENTRES ARE PROVIDED TO MEET NEEDS ON A LOCAL BASIS, AT A RATIO OF ONE CENTRE FOR EACH 20 000 POPULATION.

+THEIR MAIN OBJECTIVES ARE TO PROVIDE YOUNG PEOPLE WITH OUTLETS FOR THEIR ENERGIES IN HEALTHY RECREATIONAL PURSUITS AS WELL AS ADEQUATE OPPORTUNITIES TO DEVELOP THEIR ABILITIES, TO TEST THEIR SKILLS AND TO INVOLVE THEMSELVES IN WORTHWHILE ACTIVITIES AND INTERESTS,+ HE SAID.

AT PRESENT THERE ARE 113 YOUTH CENTRES WHICH RECEIVE SUBVENTION FROM THE GOVERNMENT.

MR ALLEYNE SAID THAT YOUTH WORKERS WERE FACING NEW CHALLENGES IN THE FACE OF THE INCREASING PROSPERITY AND SOPHISTICATION OF YOUNG PEOPLE, NOT TO MENTION THE MANY TYPES OF LEISURE AND ENTERTAINMENT PURSUITS COMPETING FOR THEIR ATTENTION.

+THEY MUST BE PREPARED TO DEVELOP PROGRAMMES THAT ARE IMAGINATIVE AND SUFFICIENTLY STIMULATING TO ATTRACT YOUNGSTERS TO YOUTH CENTRES AND TO KEEP THEM COMING BACK,+ HE SAID.

+THEY MUST ALSO BE PREPARED TO REACH OUT TO THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ARE LESS LIKELY TO ATTEND ORGANISED ACTIVITIES OF THIS SORT.+

MR ALLEYNE SAID THAT THE OPENING OF THE BRADBURY CENTRE, AT 55 MODEL LANE, NORTH POINT, WAS +PARTICULARLY WELCOME, IN THAT IT OFFERS SERVICES TO YOUNG PEOPLE LIVING IN THE NORTH POINT DISTRICT, WHERE FEW FACILITIES OF THIS SORT EXIST.+

THE CONSTRUCTION COST OF THE FOUR-STOREY BUILDING HOUSING THE CENTRE HAS BEEN MET IN FULL BY A DONATION FROM THE BRADBURY TRUST FUND. THE FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN MET THROUGH A GRANT OF \$160 000 FROM THE LOTTERIES FUND.

IN HIS SPEECH, MR MINNS, WHO IS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BRADBURY CHARITABLE TRUST FUND, SAID THAT IN MANY RESPECTS, THE FUND HAD, BY WAY OF TIMELY DONATIONS, BEEN A PIONEER IN MANY PROJECTS IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE FIELD.

HE SAID THAT THE FUND WOULD TRY TO DO MORE IN SAFEGUARDING AND PROVIDING FOR THE NEEDS OF THE YOUNG, THE WEAK, THE SICK AND THE DISADVANTAGED IN HONG KONG.

HE NOTED THAT IN THE LAST TEN YEARS, THE FUND HAD DONATED MORE THAN \$27 MILLION AND THAT DONATIONS AGREED TO BUT NOT YET PAID AMOUNTED TO ABOUT \$40 MILLION.

EDUCATION CHIEF STRESSES IMPORTANCE OF REMEDIAL TEACHING
* * * * *

SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS WERE URGED BY THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR COLVYN HAYE, TO EXAMINE HOW REMEDIAL TEACHING COULD MOST EFFECTIVELY BE INTRODUCED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THEIR PUPILS.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE SUBSIDISED SCHOOLS COUNCIL 10TH ANNIVERSARY SEMINAR THIS MORNING (SATURDAY) AT ST STEPHEN'S COLLEGE IN STANLEY.

IN HIS OPENING ADDRESS ON +EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION IN THE '80'S+, MR HAYE SAID THAT REMEDIAL TEACHING IN BOTH PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS WAS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY TO HELP THE LESS CAPABLE STUDENTS TO IMPROVE THEIR ACADEMIC ATTAINMENT.

THIS WAS PARTICULARLY SO IN VIEW OF THE COMPULSORY NINE-YEAR EDUCATION WHERE CHILDREN OF VARIOUS ABILITIES WERE REQUIRED TO ATTEND SCHOOL, THE DIRECTOR SAID.

MR HAYE ENVISAGED THAT PROBLEMS FACED BY EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATORS IN THE '80'S WOULD MAINLY BE THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION AND HIS DEPARTMENT WOULD HELP PUBLIC SECTOR SCHOOLS RESOLVE THEM WITH ADDITIONAL RESOURCES, INCLUDING MORE TEACHERS AND BETTER FACILITIES.

HOWEVER, HE REMINDED HIS AUDIENCE THAT THEY MUST NOT FORGET THE OTHER BASIC OBJECTIVES OF EDUCATION, SUCH AS CHARACTER FORMATION OF STUDENTS AND FOSTERING AMONG THEM A SPIRIT OF PUBLIC AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, BOTH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE OF SCHOOLS.

THE DIRECTOR ALSO URGED SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS NOT TO IGNORE THE IMPORTANCE OF ESTABLISHING A CLOSER CONTACT BETWEEN PARENTS AND SCHOOLS.

+THE MAJORITY OF PARENTS HAVE THE WELL-BEING OF THEIR CHILDREN AT HEART AND THEY ARE BOUND TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY ACTIVITIES TO HELP BRIDGE THE GAP BETWEEN SCHOOLS AND PARENTS,+ MR HAYE SAID.

MORE ROAD WORKS SOON

IMPROVEMENT WORK ON TWO OF THE EXISTING ROADS ON TSING YI ISLAND WILL BEGIN SHORTLY.

TENDERS FOR THE WORK ARE BEING INVITED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

THE WORK FORMS PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF TSUEN WAN NEW TOWN WHICH INCLUDES THE DEVELOPMENT OF TSING YI.

WORK ON THE PROJECT WILL INCLUDE THE WIDENING OF HEUNG SZE WUI ROAD AND TSING YI ROAD TO PROVIDE DUAL CARRIAGEWAYS AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW ROUNDABOUT AT THE WEST END OF TSING YI BRIDGE, TWO FOOTBRIDGES AT THE EAST END OF CHEUNG MEI ROAD AND A SUBWAY OUTSIDE CHEUNG CHING ESTATE.

THE WORK WILL START IN FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR AND WILL TAKE ABOUT 18 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

WORK WILL ALSO START SHORTLY ON THE WIDENING AND RECONSTRUCTION OF MAIN STREET ON AP LEI CHAU.

TENDERS FOR THE PROJECT ARE BEING INVITED BY THE HIGHWAYS OFFICE OF THE ENGINEERING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT AT PRESENT THE ROAD PAVEMENT OF MAIN STREET, ONE OF THE EXISTING OLD MAIN ROADS ON AP LEI CHAU, WAS IN A VERY DILAPIDATED CONDITION.

ON COMPLETION, THE NEW ROAD WILL HAVE A 7.3-METRE TWO-LANE CARRIAGEWAY WITH 2.5-METRE FOOTPATHS ON BOTH SIDES.

WORK ON THE PROJECT WILL START IN FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR AND WILL TAKE ABOUT TWELVE MONTHS TO COMPLETE.
