JUNE PRICE AND VOLUME MOVEMENTS OF EXTERNAL TRADE

* * * * *

THE VOLUME OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS DECREASED BY 3 PER CENT, WHILE THAT OF RE-EXPORTS GREW BY 10 PER CENT IN THE FIRST HALF OF 1990 AS COMPARED WITH THE SAME PERIOD IN 1989, ACCORDING TO THE STATISTICS RELEASED TODAY (MONDAY) BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

TAKING THEM TOGETHER, THERE WAS AN OVERALL INCREASE OF 4 PER CENT IN THE VOLUME OF TOTAL EXPORTS. IMPORTS INCREASED BY 3 PER CENT IN VOLUME TERMS.

THE GROWTH IN THE VOLUME OF TRADE IS DERIVED FROM THE GROWTH IN TRADE VALUES, HAVING DISCOUNTED THE EFFECT OF PRICE CHANGES.

AS REGARDS PRICE CHANGES OVER THE SAME PERIOD OF COMPARISON, THE PRICES OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS AND RE-EXPORTS ROSE BY 2 PER CENT AND 4 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY, WHILE THOSE OF IMPORTS ROSE BY 2 PER CENT. AS A RESULT, THE TERMS OF TRADE INDEX (EXPRESSED AS A RATIO OF TOTAL EXPORT PRICE INDEX TO IMPORT PRICE INDEX) INCREASED BY 1 PER CENT.

PRICES ARE BASED ON UNIT VALUES WHICH DO NOT TAKE INTO ACCOUNT CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OR QUALITY OF GOODS TRADED, EXCEPT FOR SOME SELECTED COMMODITIES FOR WHICH SPECIFICATION PRICE INDEXES ARE AVAILABLE.

COMPARING THE MONTH OF JUNE 1990 WITH JUNE 1989, THE VOLUME OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS DECREASED BY 2 PER CENT, WHILE THAT OF RE-EXPORTS INCREASED BY 11 PER CENT. TAKING THEM TOGETHER, THE VOLUME OF TOTAL EXPORTS INCREASED BY 6 PER CENT. THE VOLUME OF IMPORTS INCREASED ALSO BY 2 PER CENT.

OVER THE SAME PERIOD OF COMPARISON, PRICES OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS AND RE-EXPORTS ROSE BY 2 PER CENT AND 3 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY. IMPORT PRICES INCREASED BY 2 PER CENT.

THE CHANGES IN THE VALUE, UNIT VALUE AND VOLUME OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS BY PRINCIPAL COMMODITY GROUP FOR JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989 ARE SHOWN IN TABLE 1.

THE VOLUME OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF MOST COMMODITY GROUPS DECREASED IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989, INCLUDING RADIOS OF ALL KINDS (-46 PER CENT); FOOTWEAR (-40 PER CENT); TRAVEL GOODS, HANDBAGS AND SIMILAR ARTICLES (-31 PER CENT); DOMESTIC ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES (-29 PER CENT); METAL MANUFACTURES (-25 PER CENT); METAL ORES AND SCRAP (-5 PER CENT); TEXTILE YARN AND THREAD (-4 PER CENT); AND CLOTHING (-3 PER CENT).

ON THE OTHER HAND, INCREASES IN DOMESTIC EXPORT VOLUME WERE RECORDED IN WATCHES AND CLOCKS (+33 PER CENT); ELECTRONIC COMPONENTS (+10 PER CENT); TEXTILE MADE-UPS AND RELATED ARTICLES (+9 PER CENT); AND TEXTILE FABRICS (+2 PER CENT).

/THE PRICES

THE PRICES OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF MOST COMMODITY GROUPS INCREASED IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989. THESE INCLUDED METAL MANUFACTURES (+7 PER CENT); ELECTRONIC COMPONENTS (+5 PER CENT); TEXTILE YARN AND THREAD (+3 PER CENT); TEXTILE FABRICS (+3 PER CENT); FOOTWEAR (+2 PER CENT); TRAVEL GOODS, HANDBAGS AND SIMILAR ARTICLES (+2 PER CENT); CLOTHING (+2 PER CENT); TEXTILE MADE-UPS AND RELATED ARTICLES (+2 PER CENT); AND DOMESTIC ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES (+1 PER CENT).

HOWEVER, DECREASES IN DOMESTIC EXPORT PRICES WERE RECORDED IN METAL ORES AND SCRAP (-5 PER CENT) AS WELL AS WATCHES AND CLOCKS (-1 PER CENT).

THE CHANGES IN THE VALUE, UNIT VALUE AND VOLUME OF IMPORTS BY END-USE CATEGORY FOR JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989 ARE SHOWN IN TABLE 2.

IMPORTS OF FOODSTUFFS DECREASED BY 2 PER CENT IN VOLUME TERMS IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989. DECREASES WERE RECORDED IN THE IMPORT VOLUME OF RICE; SWINE; AND SUGAR. INCREASES WERE RECORDED IN THE IMPORT VOLUME OF WHEAT AND FLOUR; AND TEA AND COFFEE.

OVER THE SAME PERIOD OF COMPARISON, THE IMPORT VOLUME OF CONSUMER GOODS INCREASED BY 13 PER CENT. COMMODITY ITEMS WITH CONSIDERABLE INCREASES IN IMPORT VOLUME INCLUDED TOBACCO MANUFACTURES; FOOTWEAR; AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES. A DECREASE WAS RECORDED IN THE IMPORT VOLUME OF HOUSEHOLD TYPE ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES.

THE IMPORT VOLUME OF RAW MATERIALS AND SEMI-MANUFACTURES WAS VIRTUALLY UNCHANGED IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989. INCREASES IN IMPORT VOLUME WERE NOTED FOR WOOD, LUMBER AND CORK; AND WATCH AND CLOCK MOVEMENTS, CASES AND PARTS. DECREASES WERE RECORDED IN THE IMPORT VOLUME OF WOOL AND OTHER ANIMAL HAIR; MAN-MADE FIBRES; AND YARN OF WOOL AND MIXTURES.

IMPORTS OF FUELS DECREASED BY 40 PER CENT IN VOLUME TERMS IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989.

AS REGARDS CAPITAL GOODS, THE IMPORT VOLUME DECREASED BY 8 PER CENT IN JUNE 1990 OVER JUNE 1989. DECREASES IN THE IMPORT VOLUME WERE RECORDED IN TRANSPORT EQUIPMENT; OTHER INDUSTRIAL MACHINERY (OTHER THAN TEXTILE MACHINERY AND ELECTRICAL MACHINERY); AND TEXTILE MACHINERY. ON THE OTHER HAND, INCREASES WERE RECORDED IN OFFICE MACHINES; AND SCIENTIFIC, MEDICAL, OPTICAL, MEASURING AND CONTROLLING INSTRUMENTS AND APPARATUS.

COMPARING JUNE 1990 WITH JUNE 1989, THE IMPORT PRICES OF MOST END-USE CATEGORIES INCREASED : CONSUMER GOODS (+4 PER CENT); FOODSTUFFS (+4 PER CENT); AND CAPITAL GOODS (+3 PER CENT). IMPORT PRICES OF FUELS SHOWED LITTLE CHANGE. ON THE OTHER HAND, THE IMPORT PRICES OF RAW MATERIALS AND SEMI-MANUFACTURES DECREASED BY 1 PER CENT.

THE CHANGES IN THE VALUE, UNIT VALUE AND VOLUME OF RE-EXPORTS BY END-USE CATEGORY FOR JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989 ARE SHOWN IN TABLE 3.

COMPARING JUNE 1990 WITH JUNE 1989, THE VOLUME OF RE-EXPORTS OF CONSUMER GOODS AND CAPITAL GOODS INCREASED BY 21 PER CENT AND 14 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY. ON THE OTHER HAND, THE VOLUME OF RE-EXPORTS OF FUELS; FOODSTUFFS; AND RAW MATERIALS AND SEMI-MANUFACTURES DECREASED BY 14 PER CENT, 8 PER CENT AND 1 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY.

PRICES OF RE-EXPORTS OF MOST END-USE CATEGORIES INCREASED IN JUNE 1990 AS COMPARED WITH JUNE 1989: FUELS (+5 PER CENT); CONSUMER GOODS (+3 PER CENT); RAW MATERIALS AND SEMI-MANUFACTURES (+3 PER CENT); AND CAPITAL GOODS (+2 PER CENT). HOWEVER, RE-EXPORT PRICES OF FOODSTUFFS SHOWED LITTLE CHANGE.

EXPERT TO ADVISE ON BUSINESS SPONSORSHIP STRATEGY

IN AN EFFORT TO PROMOTE BUSINESS SPONSORSHIP FOR THE ARTS, THE GOVERNMENT HAS INVITED THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF BRITAIN'S ASSOCIATION FOR BUSINESS SPONSORSHIP OF THE ARTS, MR COLIN TWEEDY, TO VISIT THE TERRITORY TO ADVISE ON A STRATEGY FOR ENCOURAGING THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY TO INVEST IN THE ARTS.

THE SECRETARY FOR RECREATION AND CULTURE, MR AUGUSTINE CHUI, TODAY (MONDAY) EXPLAINED THAT MANY COMPANIES IN EUROPE AND NORTH AMERICA SAW SPONSORSHIP OF THE ARTS AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THEIR MARKETING STRATEGIES.

"WE HOPE TO ENCOURAGE BUSINESSES AND ARTS ORGANISATIONS IN HONG KONG TO SEE SPONSORSHIP AS A MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL ACTIVITY," HE SAID.

MR TWEEDY ARRIVED HERE YESTERDAY AND WILL BE IN HONG KONG UNTIL SEPTEMBER 21. HE WILL BE MEETING LEADING MEMBERS OF THE BUSINESS AND THE ARTS COMMUNITIES, INCLUDING MEMBERS OF THE NEWLY-ESTABLISHED FOUNDATION OF BUSINESSES IN SUPPORT OF THE ARTS, WHICH IS SPONSORING HIS VISIT.

STATEMENT TO CLARIFY NEWSPAPER REPORT

* * * * *

THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT IS ISSUED JOINTLY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HOSPITAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO CLARIFY A NEWSPAPER REPORT ON DISPENSING WRONG MEDICINE:

"ALL DISPENSERS, WHETHER FULL OR PART-TIME, EMPLOYED BY THE GOVERNMENT ARE PROFESSIONALLY QUALIFIED AND THERE ARE NO REASONS TO DOUBT THEIR PROFESSIONAL STANDARD AS ALL OF THEM HAVE RECEIVED PROPER TRAINING.

"CASES OF DISPENSING WRONG MEDICINE ARE EXTREMELY RARE, AND INDEED IN RECENT YEARS, NO SUCH REPORTS IN OUR HOSPITALS AND CLINICS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED. AND THE TWO DEPARTMENTS ARE CONFIDENT OF THE VERY HIGH PROFESSIONAL STANDARD OF OUR DISPENSING SERVICES."

11 FILIPINOS APPREHENDED FOR UNAPPROVED EMPLOYMENTS

* * * * *

ACTING ON INFORMATION, IMMIGRATION INVESTIGATORS RAIDED 10 ESTABLISHMENTS INCLUDING FASHION SHOPS, BEAUTY SALOONS AND AN EMPLOYMENT AGENCY IN CENTRAL IN THE MORNING OF SEPTEMBER 8.

IDENTITY CHECKS WERE CONDUCTED ON MORE THAN 70 PERSONS AT THESE PLACES.

DURING THE OPERATION, 10 FILIPINA DOMESTIC HELPERS AND A FILIPINO VISITOR, AGED BETWEEN 26 AND 46, WERE APPREHENDED.

THEY WERE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN UP UNAPPROVED EMPLOYMENTS AS HAIRDRESSERS OR SHOP/AGENCY ASSISTANTS AT THESE ESTABLISHMENTS. ONE OF THE DOMESTIC HELPERS WAS ALSO FOUND TO HAVE OVERSTAYED IN HONG KONG.

FIVE HONG KONG RESIDENTS ARE ASSISTING WITH THE INVESTIGATION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT SAID: "UNDER THE LAWS OF HONG KONG, A FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPER IS ONLY ALLOWED TO WORK FOR A SPECIFIC EMPLOYER UNDER A SPECIFIC EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT ATTESTED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

"HE/SHE SHOULD NOT WORK IN ANOTHER HOUSEHOLD OR CARRY OUT NON-HOUSEHOLD CHORES. IT IS ALSO AN OFFENCE FOR THE EMPLOYER TO ASK HIS/HER DOMESTIC HELPER TO DO SO."

HE ALSO WARNED THOSE WHO HAVE BREACHED THEIR CONDITION OF STAY HERE THAT THEY ARE LIABLE TO PROSECUTION AND UPON CONVICTION TO A FINE OF \$5,000 AND IMPRISONMENT FOR TWO YEARS.

THOSE WHO AID AND ABET OTHER PEOPLE TO COMMIT THE OFFENCES ARE ALSO LIABLE TO PROSECUTION AND PENALTY.

STORAGE IN HONG KONG'S RESERVOIRS AT 9 AM TODAY (MONDAY) STOOD AT 52.3 PER CENT OF CAPACITY OR 306.825 MILLION CUBIC METRES.

THIS TIME LAST YEAR THE RESERVOIRS CONTAINED 379.532 MILLION CUBIC METRES OF WATER, REPRESENTING 64.8 PER CENT OF CAPACITY.

TENDERS SOUGHT FOR COMMUNITY CENTRE

THE ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEIGHBOURHOOD COMMUNITY CENTRE IN TIN SUM ESTATE, SHA TIN.

COMPRISING A SIX-STOREY BLOCK, A SINGLE-STOREY HALL AND A BASKETBALL COURT, THE CENTRE WILL IMPROVE THE COMMUNITY AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES FOR THE LOCAL RESIDENTS.

WORK ON THE PROJECT IS EXPECTED TO START IN DECEMBER AND BE COMPLETED IN 14 MONTHS.
