

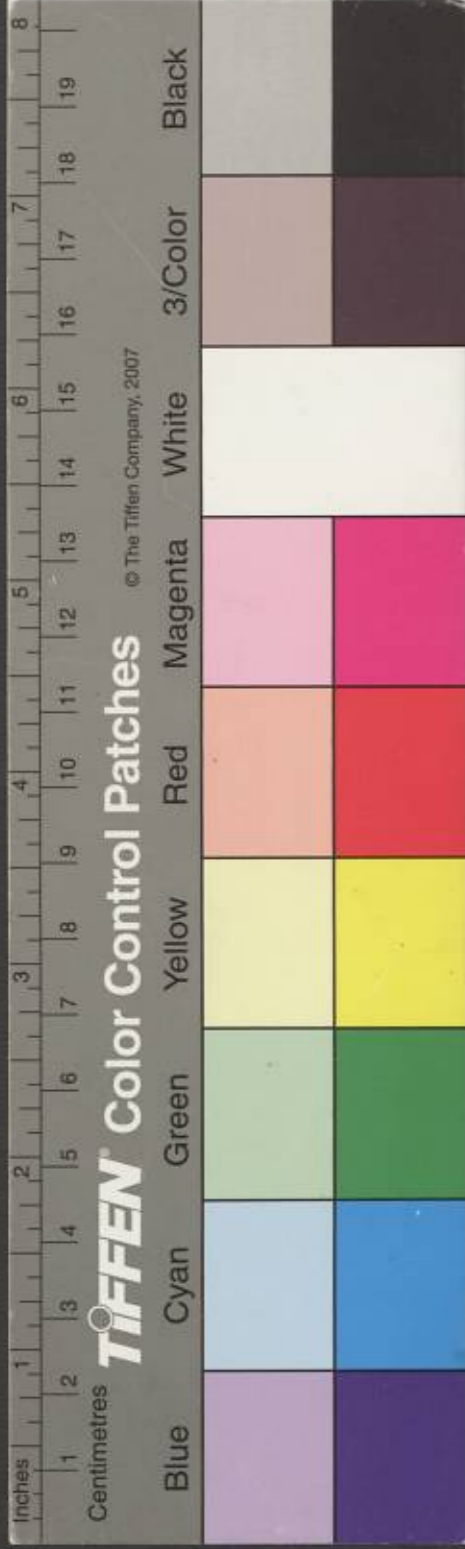

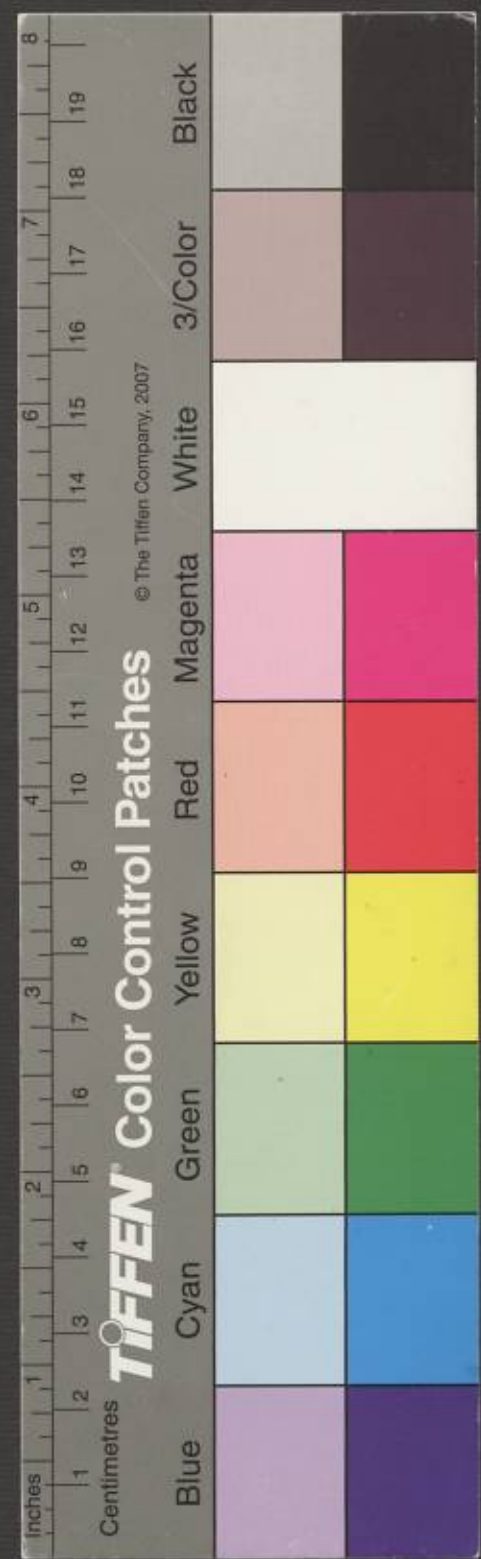

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of the Factories and Workshops Ordinance, 1932 (Ordinance No. 27 of 1932), it is provided that the said Ordinance shall come into operation upon such date as may be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor:



By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander in Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

Whereas by the fourth section of the Supreme Court (Admiralty Procedure) Amendment Ordinance, 1932 (Ordinance No. 33 of 1932), it is provided that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation unless and until the Governor notifies by Proclamation His Majesty's pleasure thereon, and that thereafter it shall come into operation upon such day as the Governor shall notify by the same or any other Proclamation:

Now I, the said Sir WILLIAM PEEL, do hereby proclaim that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the said Ordinance, and that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on the 15th day of April, 1933.



Governor.

Whereas the office of the District Officer for the Southern District of the New Territories has been moved from the building known as "The Government Offices" situate in Pedder Street, Victoria, in this Colony, to the first floor of the building known as St. George's Building, at the corner of Chater Road and Ice House Street, Victoria aforesaid, and it is expedient that the present office should be appointed and declared to be a court-house for all purposes and functions of a magistrate :

And Whereas it is convenient (without prejudice to any previous proclamation, notification or authorization) that all the court-houses of magistrates in this Colony should be included in this proclamation :

Now therefore I Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same, do hereby appoint the following several places as Court-houses where a magistrate may sit to hear and try and determine and deal with complaints and informations and other matters to be heard and tried and determined and dealt with by him as a magistrate in an open court, including, where the magistrate is authorised for the purpose, the holding of a Small Debts Court as mentioned in section 58 of the New Territories Regulation Ordinance, 1910.

1. The Magistracy, Victoria.
2. The Marine Magistrates Court, Harbour Office Building, Victoria.
3. The Magistracy, Kowloon.
4. The Magistracy, Taipo.
5. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Ping Shan in the Northern District of the New Territories.
6. The District Land Office at Ping Shan in the Northern District of the New Territories.
7. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Au Tau in the Northern District of the New Territories.



8. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sheung Shui in the Northern District of the New Territories.
9. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Lok Ma Chau in the Northern District of the New Territories.
10. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Castle Peak in the Northern District of the New Territories.
11. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sha Tau Kok in the Northern District of the New Territories.
12. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sai Kung in the Northern District of the New Territories.

WHEREAS by section 49 of the Divorce Ordinance, 1932, (Ordinance No. 35 of 1932), it is provided that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation unless and until the Governor notifies by Proclamation that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the same and that thereafter it shall come into operation upon such day as the Governor shall notify by the same or any other Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS by section 6 of the Divorce Amendment Ordinance, 1933, (Ordinance No. 9 of 1933), it is provided that that Ordinance shall be read and construed as one with, and shall come into operation at the same time as, the Divorce Ordinance, 1932, which it amends and which shall not be brought into operation by Proclamation until His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the said Divorce Amendment Ordinance, 1933, is known:

NOW I, the said Sir WILLIAM PEEL, do hereby notify that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow either of the said Ordinances (No. 35 of 1932, and No. 9 of 1933) and that the said Ordinances shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1933.
