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LAND SALES FORECAST FOR SIX MONTHS ANNOUNCED  
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THE GOVERNMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) RELEASED DETAILS OF THE LAND IT INTENDS TO OFFER FOR SALE BY AUCTION AND TENDER OVER THE SIX-MONTH PERIOD STARTING OCTOBER 1.

A TOTAL OF 32 SITES WILL BE OFFERED, BRINGING THE AMOUNT OF LAND SOLD SINCE APRIL 1 THIS YEAR TO 25.5 HECTARES OF THE 55 HECTARES APPROVED BY THE LAND COMMISSION FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

TWO OF THE SITES FOR SPECIALISED USES WILL BE ON 10-YEAR LEASES, WHILE THE REMAINDER WILL BE GRANTED FOR THE FULL LEASE TERM TO 2 047.

ONE OF THE 10-YEAR LEASES WILL BE FOR A 3.2 HECTARE AMUSEMENT PARK IN TUEN MUN, WHILE THE OTHER IS FOR A 2 040-SQUARE-METRE SITE FOR A MARINE WORKSHOP AT YIM TIN TSAI IN TAI PO.

AUCTION SALES WILL INCLUDE A RESIDENTIAL SITE OF 1.5 HECTARES AT TIN HAU TEMPLE ROAD, BRAEMAR HILL, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO ATTRACT KEEN BIDDING.

SEVERAL SMALLER SITES FOR COMMERCIAL AND/OR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS ALONG THE CENTRAL, WAN CHAI AND SHAU KEI WAN COMMERCIAL CORRIDOR ARE INCLUDED, AS WELL AS INDUSTRIAL SITES ON CHAI WAN RECLAMATION, SHA TIN AND SAI KUNG.

TENDER SALES WILL FEATURE THREE PRIVATE SECTOR PARTICIPATION SCHEME SITES AT CHUK YUEN, TUEN MUN AND SHA TIN. THESE WILL BE DEVELOPED TO PROVIDE ABOUT 6 300 FLATS FOR COMPLETION FROM 1989 ONWARDS.

FOURTEEN SITES WILL BE OFFERED FOR SALE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES UNDER THE LETTER A/B TENDER SYSTEM, INCLUDING A SITE IN THE CENTRAL AREA OF TAI PO, WHICH WILL REQUIRE THE PURCHASER TO INCLUDE A PUBLIC MARKET AND LIBRARY IN A COMMERCIAL AND/OR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT, PLUS TWO SITES IN SHA TIN AND TUEN MUN AND SEVERAL SMALLER SITES IN YUEN LONG ALSO FOR COMMERCIAL AND/OR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT.

GOVERNMENT LAND AGENT, MR BOB POPE, SAID THE LAND SALES PROGRAMME WAS PROVISIONAL AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

FIVE AUCTIONS ARE SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE STARTING ON OCTOBER 29. THERE WILL BE FIVE CASH TENDERS AND TWO LETTERS A/B TENDERS.

FURTHER DETAILS AND DATES WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE AND IN MAJOR NEWSPAPERS IN THE NORMAL WAY.

COPIES OF THE TENTATIVE LAND SALES PROGRAMME FOR THE SIX-MONTH PERIOD ARE AVAILABLE FROM BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT HEADQUARTERS ON THE THIRD FLOOR OF MURRAY BUILDING OR FROM ANY DISTRICT LANDS OFFICE.

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APPOINTMENTS AND RE-APPOINTMENTS

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THE GOVERNMENT TODAY (FRIDAY) ANNOUNCED THE RE-APPOINTMENT OF TWO OFFICIAL MEMBERS TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND THE APPOINTMENT OF TWO NEW OFFICIAL MEMBERS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

THE SECRETARY FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY, MR E.P. HO, HAS BEEN RE-APPOINTED TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 1987, AND THE SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DONALD P.H. LIAO, UNTIL AUGUST 31, 1988.

THE NEW SECRETARY FOR LANDS AND WORKS, MR GRAHAM BARNES, AND THE NEW SECRETARY FOR EDUCATION AND MANPOWER, MR RON BRIDGE, HAVE BEEN APPOINTED OFFICIAL MEMBERS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

NOTICES OF THE RE-APPOINTMENT AND APPOINTMENT WERE GAZETTED TODAY.

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DRIVERS TO PAY EXACT TUNNEL TOLLS

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DRIVERS USING +EXACT PAYMENT+ LANES AT GOVERNMENT TUNNELS WILL BE REQUIRED BY LAW TO TENDER THE EXACT TOLL PAYABLE, UNDER THE ROAD TUNNELS (GOVERNMENT) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1986 PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY.

THE NEW REGULATIONS, WHICH WILL COME INTO EFFECT ON OCTOBER 13, ARE AIMED AT IMPROVING THE TRAFFIC FLOW AT GOVERNMENT TUNNELS, PARTICULARLY AT LION ROCK TUNNEL.

EXPLAINING THE PURPOSE OF THE NEW PROVISIONS, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID SIGNS HAD BEEN POSTED ON FOUR LION ROCK TUNNEL TOLL BOOTHS (TWO IN EACH DIRECTION) SINCE APRIL 1, 1985 ADVISING TUNNEL USERS, UNDER THE ROAD TUNNELS (GOVERNMENT) REGULATIONS, THAT THEY SHOULD TENDER THE EXACT TOLL.

+EXPERIENCE HAS SHOWN THAT EXACT PAYMENT LANES COPE WITH MORE VEHICLES EACH HOUR DURING PEAK PERIODS THAN ORDINARY LANES, BUT THEIR EFFECTIVENESS IS REDUCED BECAUSE THE SIGNS ARE ADVISORY AND MANY DRIVERS USING THE LANES STILL ASK FOR CHANGE,+ HE SAID.

ADDITIONAL SIGNS AND POSTERS ERECTED TO REMIND DRIVERS TO TENDER THE EXACT TOLL AND REGULAR ANNOUNCEMENTS OVER THE TUNNEL'S PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM HAD HAD LITTLE EFFECT, HE SAID.

THE +EXACT PAYMENT+ SIGNS ERECTED AT THE CROSS-HARBOUR TUNNEL HAD PROVED TO BE MORE EFFECTIVE AS THEY WERE PROVIDED FOR STATUTORILY UNDER THE CROSS-HARBOUR TUNNEL BY-LAWS AND WERE GENERALLY OBSERVED BY DRIVERS, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

UNDER THE NEW REGULATIONS, A DRIVER IN AN +EXACT PAYMENT+ LANE WHO TENDERED MORE THAN THE TOLL AMOUNT AND REQUIRED CHANGE WOULD COMMIT AN OFFENCE AND BE LIABLE TO A FINE OF \$1 000.

/+THE LEVEL .....

+THE LEVEL OF PENALTY IS SET AT \$1 000 IN ORDER TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE PENALTY FOR A SIMILAR OFFENCE AT THE CROSS-HARBOUR TUNNEL,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IT WILL NOT, HOWEVER, BE AN OFFENCE IF THE DRIVER TENDERS MORE THAN THE TOLL AMOUNT BUT REQUIRES NO CHANGE,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT PUBLICITY WOULD BE ARRANGED TO ENHANCE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE NEW REGULATIONS.

THE OPPORTUNITY HAS ALSO BEEN TAKEN, IN RELATION TO THE DISPLAY AT A TUNNEL OF ANY TRAFFIC SIGN OR ROAD MARKING PRESCRIBED BY THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TRAFFIC CONTROL) REGULATIONS, TO AMEND THE REGULATIONS TO THE EFFECT THAT A DRIVER WHO FAILS TO CONFORM TO THE INDICATION OF ANY SIGN OR ROAD MARKING WHILE DRIVING IN A TUNNEL, IS LIABLE TO THE SAME LEVEL OF PENALTY AS IF HE HAD FAILED TO SO CONFORM WHEN DRIVING ON A ROAD.

THE OFFENDER IS LIABLE ON FIRST CONVICTION TO A FINE OF \$5 000 AND TO IMPRISONMENT FOR THREE MONTHS, AND ON SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION TO A FINE OF \$10 000 AND TO IMPRISONMENT FOR SIX MONTHS.

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#### EDUCATION COMMISSION SEEKS PUBLIC VIEWS \* \* \* \* \*

THE EDUCATION COMMISSION IS CALLING FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS ON TWO ISSUES WHICH IT WISHES TO CONSIDER IN THE NEXT PHASE OF ITS WORK.

A SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (FRIDAY) THE EDUCATION COMMISSION HAD NOW COMPLETED WORK ON ITS SECOND REPORT, AND WAS PREPARING TO STUDY FURTHER ISSUES FOR FUTURE REPORTS.

FOLLOWING A REQUEST TO THE ADMINISTRATION FROM THE UMELCO STANDING PANEL ON EDUCATION, AND AFTER CONSULTATION, THE COMMISSION HAD UNDERTAKEN TO STUDY CURRICULUM AND BEHAVIOURAL PROBLEMS IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND JUNIOR SECONDARY CLASSES.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE COMMISSION HAD DRAWN UP TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THIS STUDY. THESE WERE:

FIRST, TO EVALUATE THE ADEQUACY, APPROPRIATENESS AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE CURRICULUM IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND JUNIOR SECONDARY CLASSES PARTICULARLY IN MEETING THE NEEDS OF THE ACADEMICALLY LESS GIFTED PUPILS AND EQUIPPING THEM FOR THE FUTURE=

SECOND, TO IDENTIFY THE NATURE AND MAGNITUDE OF BEHAVIOURAL PROBLEMS IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND JUNIOR SECONDARY CLASSES, AND TO EVALUATE THE ADEQUACY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF EXISTING ARRANGEMENTS AND SERVICES FOR HELPING PUPILS WITH SUCH PROBLEMS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE COMMISSION INVITED THE VIEWS OF EDUCATORS AND ALL CONCERNED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ON THESE ISSUES.

+THE COMMISSION WOULD LIKE TO RECEIVE PUBLIC COMMENTS BY THE END OF DECEMBER THIS YEAR,+ HE SAID. +THE COMMISSION'S TIMETABLE FOR THESE REVIEWS IS FLEXIBLE, BUT THE COMMISSION INTENDS TO DRAW UP RECOMMENDATIONS IN THE COURSE OF 1987.+

PUBLIC VIEWS AND COMMENTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SECRETARY TO THE EDUCATION COMMISSION, EDUCATION AND MANPOWER BRANCH, THIRD FLOOR, EAST WING, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, LOWER ALBERT ROAD, HONG KONG.

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TRADE DESCRIPTIONS BILL TIGHTENED  
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THE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS (AMENDMENT) BILL, WHICH WILL IMPROVE THE APPLICATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS ORDINANCE, WAS GAZETTED TODAY (FRIDAY).

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE ORDINANCE, ENACTED IN 1980, PROVIDED CONSUMERS WITH PROTECTION FROM FALSE AND MISLEADING DESCRIPTIONS GIVEN TO GOODS SUPPLIED IN THE COURSE OF TRADE.

THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT, WHICH ADMINISTERED THE ORDINANCE, HAD IDENTIFIED A NUMBER OF AREAS WHERE THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDINANCE COULD BE IMPROVED.

SEVERAL AMENDMENTS ARE PROPOSED IN THE BILL.

FIRSTLY, PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE DETENTION AND FORFEITURE OF GOODS HAVE BEEN REVISED.

SECONDLY, WHILE OFFICERS OF THE CUSTOMS OFFICER GRADE ARE EMPOWERED UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICE ORDINANCE TO EFFECT ARRESTS, SIMILAR POWERS ARE TO BE GIVEN TO OTHER AUTHORISED OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT, NAMELY THOSE OF THE INDUSTRY OFFICER GRADE WHO PLAY A MAJOR ROLE IN POLICING THE ORDINANCE.

THIRDLY, PROVISIONS RESTRICTING THE DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION BY ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO TRADE MARK OWNERS ARE REVISED.

FINALLY, PRESUMPTIONS REGARDING EVIDENCE IN COURT OF THE COUNTRY OF ORIGIN FOR IMPORTED GOODS WITH FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS ARE INTRODUCED.

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THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS WOULD ENHANCE THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT'S CAPABILITIES IN COMBATTING COUNTERFEITERS AND +PIRATES+ AND ARE FURTHER EVIDENCE OF THE GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO THE PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS.

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UK ORDER ON REPEAL OF LAWS GAZETTED

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THE HONG KONG (LEGISLATIVE POWERS) ORDER 1986, WHICH WAS LAID BEFORE THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT LAST MONTH, WAS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (FRIDAY).

THIS IS THE FIRST OF A SERIES OF UNITED KINGDOM ORDERS WHICH GIVE THE HONG KONG LEGISLATURE THE POWER TO REPEAL OR AMEND UNITED KINGDOM LAWS WHICH RELATE TO HONG KONG.

THE ORDER CAME INTO EFFECT ON AUGUST 26 AND INVOLVES THE LOCALISATION OF CIVIL AVIATION, MERCHANT SHIPPING AND ADMIRALTY JURISDICTION LAWS.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THESE LAWS CAN NOW BE AMENDED OR REPEALED LOCALLY WITHOUT REFERENCE TO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

ANTI-PICKPOCKETING SIGNBOARDS WOULD ALSO BE ERECTED AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS IN THE DISTRICT TO AROUSE PUBLIC AWARENESS IN KEEPING A CLOSE WATCH OVER PROPERTY.

+THE COMMITTEE IS ALSO VERY CONCERNED WITH THE SITUATION CONCERNING FALSE BURGLARY ALARMS IN THE DISTRICT,+ MRS CHAN SAID.

SHE URGED PEOPLE AND COMPANIES USING BURGLARY ALARMS TO CARRY OUT REGULAR MAINTENANCE TO ENSURE EFFICIENT AND PROPER OPERATION.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE CEREMONY, THE YAU MA TEI DISTRICT OFFICER, MR AUGUSTINE CHENG, COMMENDED THE DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE FOR ITS EFFORTS IN PROMOTING RESPONSIBLE CITIZENSHIP.

+THE COMMITTEE ALSO PLAYS AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN CO-ORDINATING DISTRICT EFFORTS IN ASSISTING THE POLICE TO COMBAT CRIME,+ MR CHENG SAID.

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#### JUNK BAY TUNNEL CONTRACT SIGNED

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A \$134.5 MILLION CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE MAIN JUNK BAY TUNNEL CIVIL WORKS WAS SIGNED TODAY (FRIDAY) BY THE DIRECTOR OF TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT, MR KENNETH KWOK, AND A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE CONTRACTOR, MESSRS VIANINI LAVORI S.P.A.

THE CONTRACT IS FOR THE MAIN CIVIL ENGINEERING WORKS FOR THE PRINCIPAL ROAD ACCESS WHICH WILL PROVIDE A DIRECT TUNNEL LINK FROM JUNK BAY ROAD IN KWUN TONG TO JUNK BAY NEW TOWN.

MAJOR ITEMS OF WORK WILL INCLUDE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO 900-METRE-LONG TUNNEL TUBES, EACH WITH TWO TRAFFIC LANES.

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ROCK TUNNELLING WILL BE USED FOR 700 METRES, WHILE 200 METRES AT THE EASTERN END WILL BE CONSTRUCTED USING CUT-AND-COVER METHODS.

THE CONCRETE LINED TUNNEL WILL BE PROVIDED WITH A 7.4-METRE-WIDE ROADWAY IN BOTH TUBES.

THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF THE FIRM CONSTRUCTION OF THE SOUTH TUBE, WITH THE NORTH TUBE AS PROVISIONAL WORKS SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION THAT INSTRUCTIONS TO CARRY THEM OUT WILL BE GIVEN BY NOT LATER THAN MARCH 1 NEXT YEAR.

THE NORTH TUBE TUNNEL, WHICH WAS TO HAVE BEEN BUILT AS A SEPARATE PHASE, MAY NOW BE BUILT CONCURRENTLY WITH THE SOUTH TUBE, SUBJECT TO THE NECESSARY INCREASE IN FUNDS BEING AGREED.

THE DATE FOR ORDERING THE PROVISIONAL WORKS ALSO TAKES INTO ACCOUNT THE NEED TO COMPLETE OTHER PROCEDURES FOR CONSTRUCTING THE NORTH TUBE, SUCH AS THOSE UNDER THE ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE.

ALSO INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT IS THE LAYING OF LARGE DIAMETER WATERMAINS BELOW THE ROAD IN THE SOUTH TUBE. THEY FORM A PORTION OF THE FRESH WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM FROM PAK KONG TREATMENT WORKS IN SAI KUNG, CURRENTLY UNDER CONSTRUCTION, AND WILL EVENTUALLY DISTRIBUTE FRESH WATER TO EAST KOWLOON, HONG KONG ISLAND AND JUNK BAY NEW TOWN.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL START THIS MONTH AND BE COMPLETED IN TWO-AND-A-HALF YEARS.

IT IS THE FIRST OF A NUMBER OF CONTRACTS REQUIRED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE PRINCIPAL ACCESS TO JUNK BAY.

FUTURE CONTRACTS WILL INCLUDE THE EASTERN APPROACHES FROM THE TUNNEL TO THE JUNK BAY RECLAMATION THAT COMPRISES MAJOR ROAD AND BRIDGEWORKS; ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL CONTRACTS FOR LIGHTING, VENTILATION, TRAFFIC CONTROL AND SURVEILLANCE, AND TOLL COLLECTION; CONSTRUCTION OF THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING; AND, A ROADWORKS CONTRACT FOR THE SECTION FROM JUNK BAY ROAD TO THE WEST END OF THE TUNNEL, INCLUDING THE TOLL PLAZA.

THE WHOLE OF THE WORKS RELATED TO THE PRINCIPAL ACCESS ARE EXPECTED TO COST AROUND \$520 MILLION AND TO BE COMPLETED IN 1990.

TRAFFIC TO JUNK BAY WILL INITIALLY BE SERVED BY THE IMPROVED PO LAM ROAD.

HOWEVER, AS POPULATION BUILDS UP IN THE NEW TOWN, THERE WILL BE A NEED FOR AN ALTERNATIVE ACCESS TO JUNK BAY AND THIS WILL BE CATERED FOR BY THE TUNNEL IN ADVANCE OF TRAFFIC DEMAND.

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MOON FESTIVAL WILL BE EXPO HIGHLIGHT  
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THE COLOURFUL TRADITIONS OF THE MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL WILL PROVIDE HONG KONG WITH ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY TO DISPLAY ITS RICH FOLKLORE AT EXPO 86 IN VANCOUVER LATER THIS MONTH.

THE HONG KONG PAVILION IS ORGANISING A LANTERN PARADE ON SEPTEMBER 19 AND 5 000 HAND-MADE PAPER LANTERNS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED.

TRADITIONALLY FALLING ON THE 15TH DAY OF THE EIGHTH MOON, THE EVENT PROMISES TO BE AMONG THE MOST MEMORABLE FOR VISITORS TO EXPO.

OFFICIALS PLAN TO INVITE REPRESENTATIVES FROM OTHER PAVILIONS AND CHILDREN FROM THE LOCAL CHINESE COMMUNITY TO JOIN THE LANTERN PARADE AS IT SETS OUT FROM THE HONG KONG PAVILION AT 8.10 PM. IT WILL BE LED OFF BY AN ELABORATELY COSTUMED +MOON LADY+ ACCOMPANIED BY A GIANT MOONCAKE.

THE APPEAL FOLLOWED THE CONFIRMATION OF TWO MORE IMPORTED CASES OF CHOLERA EARLIER TODAY. THE PATIENTS ARE WOMEN, AGED 22 AND 24, ONE SINGAPOREAN AND THE OTHER MALAYSIAN.

THEY WERE CLOSE CONTACTS OF A JAPANESE WOMAN NOW BEING TREATED AT PRINCESS MARGARET HOSPITAL AFTER IT WAS CONFIRMED ON TUESDAY THAT SHE HAD CHOLERA, A CASE THAT WAS ALSO CLASSIFIED AS IMPORTED.

THE TWO HAD RETURNED TO HONG KONG FROM INDONESIA ON AUGUST 29 AND THE DEPARTMENT WAS SUCCESSFUL IN CONTACTING THEM YESTERDAY (THURSDAY). BOTH WERE ADMITTED TO PRINCESS MARGARET HOSPITAL IN SATISFACTORY CONDITION. THEY HAD DEVELOPED MILD SYMPTOMS OF DIARRHOEA THE DAY AFTER THEIR RETURN.

+CHOLERA IS ENDEMIC IN THIS PART OF THE WORLD AND IT IS THEREFORE ESSENTIAL TO OBSERVE STRICT PERSONAL AND FOOD HYGIENE AT HOME AND WHILE TRAVELLING ABROAD,+ A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IT IS OF UTMOST IMPORTANCE THAT PEOPLE RETURNING TO HONG KONG SHOULD CONSULT A DOCTOR IF THEY DEVELOP SYMPTOMS OF VOMITTING, DIARRHOEA AND FEVER.+

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JAPANESE BANK GRANTED LICENCE  
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THE MITSUI TRUST AND BANKING CO. LTD. HAS BEEN GRANTED A BANKING LICENCE TO CONDUCT BUSINESS IN HONG KONG, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (FRIDAY).

INCORPORATED IN JAPAN, THE MITSUI TRUST AND BANKING CO. LTD. ENTERED GENERAL BANKING BUSINESS IN 1948. ONE OF ITS SUBSIDIARIES, MITSUI TRUST FINANCE (HONG KONG) LTD., IS A HONG KONG REGISTERED DEPOSIT-TAKING COMPANY.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT A TOTAL OF EIGHT FOREIGN BANKS, INCLUDING THREE FROM JAPAN, HAVE BEEN GRANTED BANKING LICENCES SO FAR THIS YEAR. HE SAID THAT THIS REFLECTED HONG KONG'S IMPORTANT ROLE AS AN INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL CENTRE.

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COUNTRY PARK VISITORS SET RECORD IN 1985-86  
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HONG KONG'S COUNTRY PARKS HAVE PROVED SO POPULAR THAT THEY ATTRACTED MORE THAN 68 MILLION VISITORS IN THE PAST TEN YEARS, WITH THE HIGHEST ANNUAL FIGURE OF 9.45 MILLION VISITORS BEING RECORDED IN 1985-86.

THE NEW RECORD, EQUIVALENT TO AN AVERAGE OF TWO VISITS PER HONG KONG CITIZEN, REPRESENTS A FOURFOLD INCREASE OVER THE ANNUAL TOLL OF 2.36 MILLION VISITORS IN 1976-77 WHEN THE FIRST COUNTRY PARKS WERE DESIGNATED.

THE ACTING SENIOR DEVELOPMENT OFFICER (COUNTRYSIDE) OF THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, MR WONG FOOK-YEE, SAID THIS TODAY (FRIDAY) WHEN OUTLINING THE FINDINGS OF A MAJOR COUNTRY PARKS VISITOR SURVEY TO A LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF KOWLOON NORTH.

THE SURVEY, THE SECOND SINCE 1983, WAS CONDUCTED IN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER LAST YEAR AMONG 5 530 VISITORS SELECTED AT RANDOM TO FIND OUT THE USAGE PATTERN OF PARK VISITORS AND TO IDENTIFY THEIR NEED FOR PARK FACILITIES AND SERVICES.

MR WONG SAID: +THE COUNTRY PARK IS A PUBLIC ASSET, DEVELOPED TO PROVIDE RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN A NATURAL SETTING FOR THE ENJOYMENT OF EVERYONE IN HONG KONG IRRESPECTIVE OF SEX, AGE, EDUCATIONAL LEVEL AND OCCUPATION.

+ACHIEVEMENT OF THIS OBJECTIVE HAS BEEN REFLECTED IN THE SURVEY.+

THE SURVEY SHOWED THAT SAI KUNG COUNTRY PARK WAS THE MOST POPULAR OF THE 21 COUNTRY PARKS, FOLLOWED BY SHING MUN, KAM SHAN, PLOVER COVE AND ABERDEEN COUNTRY PARKS, HE SAID.

IT ALSO INDICATED THAT BARBECUING WAS THE MOST POPULAR ACTIVITY INSIDE COUNTRY PARKS. OTHERS INCLUDED LEISURE WALKING, PICNICKING, HIKING, CYCLING, FITNESS EXERCISE AND CAMPING.

MR WONG SAID THAT OF PARK VISITORS INTERVIEWED IN THE SURVEY IT WAS FOUND THE MOST ACTIVE GROUP WAS BETWEEN 15 AND 39 YEARS OF AGE.

THE AGE GROUP DISTRIBUTION WAS QUITE EVEN WITH 26 PER CENT IN THE 20 - 24 AGE GROUP= 21 PER CENT IN THE 25 - 29 AGE GROUP= 21 PER CENT IN THE 30 - 39 AGE GROUP= 20 PER CENT IN THE 15 - 19 AGE GROUP= 10 PER CENT IN THE 40 - 59 AGE GROUP= AND ABOUT TWO PER CENT AGED 60 OR OVER.

/+HOWEVER, THE .....

+HOWEVER, THE SEX DISTRIBUTION WAS RATHER UNEVEN. AMONG THE VISITORS INTERVIEWED, 67 PER CENT WERE MALE AND 33 PER CENT FEMALE. THE SEX RATIO WAS ABOUT TWO TO ONE, WITH FEMALE VISITORS OVER THE AGE OF 25 CONSIDERABLY FEWER THAN THEIR MALE COUNTERPARTS,+ MR WONG SAID.

THE SURVEY REVEALED THAT ABOUT 70 PER CENT OF THE VISITORS WERE OF SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL LEVEL AND 20 PER CENT OF POST-SECONDARY AND UNIVERSITY STANDARD WITH THE REMAINING 10 PER CENT BELONGING TO THE +PRIMARY OR BELOW+ CATEGORY.

+VISITOR COMPOSITION IS, HOWEVER, NOT BIASED TOWARDS ANY PARTICULAR GROUP IN TERMS OF OCCUPATION,+ MR WONG SAID.

WHILE A LARGE PROPORTION OR 28 PER CENT WERE CLERICAL, SALES AND SERVICES EMPLOYEES, 21 PER CENT WERE STUDENTS, 17 PER CENT WERE IN THE PROFESSIONAL AND MANAGERIAL CLASSES, 13.7 PER CENT WERE SEMI-SKILLED AND UNSKILLED WORKERS, 10 PER CENT WERE IN THE TECHNICAL GRADE, AND 5.6 PER CENT WERE HOUSEWIVES. THE REMAINING 4.7 PER CENT INCLUDED RETIRED AND UNEMPLOYED CITIZENS.

MR WONG SAID THAT OVER 93 PER CENT OF PEOPLE VISITED THE COUNTRY PARKS IN GROUPS OF VARYING SIZES WITH FRIENDS, FAMILY MEMBERS, SCHOOL FRIENDS AND COLLEAGUES.

+THE GROUP SIZE AND GROUP NATURE HAVE INDICATED THAT VISITS TO COUNTRY PARKS ARE POPULAR SOCIAL, FAMILY AND COMMUNITY AFFAIRS,+ MR WONG SAID.

+I AM GLAD THAT APART FROM PROVIDING ENJOYMENT FOR THE PUBLIC, THE COUNTRY PARKS ARE PLAYING A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN HELPING ESTABLISH A BETTER SOCIAL LINK AND INTER-PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP IN A CASUAL AND INFORMAL ENVIRONMENT.+

+COUNTRY PARKS ARE INDEED PART OF HONG KONG'S CULTURE.+

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A NEW FIRE STATION TO REPLACE THE OLD GARDEN ROAD FIRE STATION IN CENTRAL WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED BY CHIEF FIRE OFFICER, MR JOHN BREDBURY THIS (FRIDAY) MORNING.

THE STATION, HE SAID, HAD A PRIME ROLE TO PLAY DEALING WITH FIRES AND OTHER EMERGENCIES IN THE BUSY DISTRICT.

THE NUMBER OF FIRE AND SPECIAL SERVICE CALLS WERE ON AVERAGE ABOUT 80 PER MONTH, WHILE ATTACHED AMBULANCES RESPONDED TO MORE THAN 2 500 CALLS SINCE THE STATION WAS COMMISSIONED LAST NOVEMBER.
