SIR EDWARD OFF TO PEKING  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, LEFT FOR PEKING TODAY (FRIDAY) ON A SHORT VISIT AS THE GUEST OF THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR, SIR RICHARD EVANS.

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AT THE AIRPORT, SIR EDWARD SAID HE WOULD PROBABLY BE ABLE TO SEE THE DIRECTOR OF THE HONG KONG AND MACAU AFFAIRS OFFICE OF THE STATE COUNCIL, MR JI PENGFEI, IN PEKING BUT HE WOULD NOT GET THE FINAL PROGRAMME UNTIL HE ARRIVED THERE.

+WHAT I'M GOING TO DO WITH THE LEADERS IS A GENERAL REVIEW OF THE DEVELOPMENTS HERE. WE HAVEN'T GOT A SPECIFIC AGENDA BUT I WILL HAVE A GENERAL REVIEW WITH THEM.+

SIR EDWARD SAID HIS TRIP WAS ORIGINALLY PLANNED AS +PARTLY RELAXED AND PARTLY A LITTLE BUSINESS+.

+IT'S BECOME A LITTLE MORE BUSINESS SINCE THEY ARE PLANNED, BUT I'M STILL LOOKING FORWARD TO SEEING THE AMBASSADOR AND I'M GOING UP TO CHENGDE FOR SATURDAY NIGHT.+

SIR EDWARD IS DUE BACK ON TUESDAY.

HE WAS SEEN OFF BY THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES; THE ACTING SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, MR OSWALD CHEUNG; THE ACTING SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, MR S.L. CHEN; AND THE DIRECTOR OF INFORMATION SERVICES, MR JOHN CHAN.

OFFICIALS MAKE USEFUL VISIT ON NUCLEAR ENERGY

THE TEAM OF OFFICIALS WHO RECENTLY WENT TO THE UNITED KINGDOM FOR DISCUSSIONS WITH THE UK ATOMIC ENERGY AUTHORITY HAVE REPORTED THAT THEY HAD A USEFUL VISIT. DURING MEETINGS AT AEA ESTABLISHMENTS AT HARWELL AND CULCHETH CLARIFICATION ON A NUMBER OF POINTS WAS PROVIDED BY THE CONSULTANTS ON BOTH THE PHASE I ACCIDENT ASSESSMENT REPORT AND ON CONTINGENCY PLANNING.

AT HARWELL THE EXTENT TO WHICH CONTINGENCY PLANNING WOULD BE REQUIRED WAS DISCUSSED. PROPOSALS MADE BY THE CONSULTANTS ON A POSSIBLE STRUCTURE OF AN ORGANISATION THAT MIGHT BE SET UP IN HONG KONG TO ASSESS THE HAZARDS THAT COULD POTENTIALLY AFFECT HONG KONG FROM AN ACCIDENTAL RELEASE OF RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL AND WHICH WOULD ARRANGE FOR NECESSARY COUNTER MEASURES TO BE EXECUTED WERE CONSIDERED IN DETAIL.

THE QUESTION OF THE MANPOWER REQUIREMENTS OF SUCH AN ORGANISATION, ITS TRAINING AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS, INCLUDING THE NEED FOR REGULAR EXERCISES TO ENSURE ITS EFFECTIVENESS, WERE ALSO DISCUSSED.

IN ADDITION TO PROVIDING CERTAIN SUPPLEMENTARY TECHNICAL INFORMATION THAT WAS REQUESTED BY THE TEAM, IT WAS AGREED THAT BROAD GUIDANCE ON HOW THE CONTINGENCY PLAN SHOULD BE DRAWN UP WOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE CONSULTANT'S FINAL REPORT. IT IS HOPED THAT THIS WILL BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. IT WAS FURTHER AGREED THAT IT WAS IMPORTANT THE REPORTS SHOULD BE WRITTEN IN A WAY WHICH THE GENERAL PUBLIC COULD READILY UNDERSTAND.

FOLLOWING THE MEETING AT HARWELL THE TEAM MOVED TO CULCHETH FOR DISCUSSIONS ON ACCIDENT ASSESSMENT. THE CONSULTANTS CONFIRMED THAT THE PHASE I REPORT WAS INTENDED AS AN INITIAL ASSESSMENT OF THE PROBABILITIES OF DIFFERENT ACCIDENTS AT THE DAYA BAY POWER STATION, AND PROVIDED A PRELIMINARY INDICATION OF THE POSSIBLE RADIOLOGICAL CONSEQUENCES FOR HONG KONG.

THE FINDINGS WERE BASED ON STUDIES THAT RELATED TO TYPICAL EXISTING WESTERN EUROPEAN PLANTS WHICH THE CONSULTANTS CONSIDERED WERE LIKELY TO BE SIMILAR TO THE DAYA BAY STATION. THESE FINDINGS WOULD, HOWEVER, BE EXTENDED AND REFINED IN PHASE II TO MAKE THEM PLANT AND SITE SPECIFIC. AT THE SAME TIME, ACCOUNT WOULD ALSO BE TAKEN OF POSSIBLE WATER AND FOOD CHAIN PATHWAYS OF EXPOSURE.

FOLLOWING THE ACCIDENT AT CHERNOBYL, BOTH SIDES RECOGNISED THAT THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE CONSULTANCY AGREEMENT HAD CHANGED CONSIDERABLY FROM THAT PREVAILING AT THE TIME OF SIGNATURE. ACCORDINGLY, IT WAS CONSIDERED THAT THE TREATMENT OF CERTAIN ASPECTS OF THE STUDY SHOULD BE EXTENDED. THE EXTENT OF THIS ADDITIONAL WORK, WHICH WILL REQUIRE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE POWER STATION, IS CURRENTLY BEING DEVELOPED.

IT IS PLANNED THAT DURING THE COURSE OF THE PHASE II ASSIGNMENT, WHICH SHOULD BE COMPLETED IN 18-24 MONTHS, THE CONSULTANTS WILL VISIT HONG KONG FROM TIME TO TIME TO DISCUSS WITH OFFICIALS THE PROGRESS OF THE CONSULTANCY.

THE CHERNOBYL ACCIDENT WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. IT WAS NOTED THAT BECAUSE THE CHERNOBYL REACTOR OPERATED ON A VERY DIFFERENT CONCEPT TO ANY COMMERCIAL PLANT IN THE WEST IT WAS DIFFICULT TO MAKE COMPARISONS WITH IT AND THE FRAMATOME PRESSURISED WATER REACTOR PLANNED FOR DAYA BAY.

THE CONSULTANTS POINTED OUT THAT IN THE CASE OF THE ACCIDENT AT THE THREE MILE ISLAND POWER STATION, WHERE THE REACTOR SYSTEM WAS A PWR AND WHERE A PARTIAL CORE MELT DOWN WAS EXPERIENCED, THERE WAS NO SIGNIFICANT HARM TO THE PUBLIC BECAUSE NEARLY ALL THE RADIOACTIVITY WAS RETAINED INSIDE THE CONTAINMENT BUILDING.

THE CHERNOBYL REACTOR ACCIDENT ON THE OTHER HAND LED TO A LARGE RELEASE OF RADIOACTIVITY BECAUSE IT DID NOT HAVE SIMILAR CONTAINMENT.

THE CONSULTANTS ADVISED THAT THEY WOULD BE ATTENDING THE IAEA MEETING AT VIENNA ON THE CHERNOBYL ACCIDENT AND WOULD REPORT TO THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT ON IT.

ANY LESSONS THAT MIGHT BE LEARNT FROM CHERNOBYL WOULD BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT IN THE PHASE II REPORT ON ACCIDENT ASSESSMENT.

HONG KONG STRESSES GOOD TRADE PRACTICES

A TRADE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (FRIDAY) THAT TALKS IN WASHINGTON D.C. CONCERNING THE UNITED STATES GENERALISED SCHEME OF PREFERENCES HAD ENDED.

THE TWO-DAY TALKS TOOK PLACE ON WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY AND WERE PART OF THE PRESIDENTIAL REVIEW OF THE SCHEME.

THE HONG KONG DELEGATION AT THE TALKS WAS LED BY ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF TRADE, NORTH AMERICA, MR ROBERT FOOTMAN. THE U.S. DELEGATION WAS LED BY ASSISTANT U.S. TRADE REPRESENTATIVE, MR PETER ALLGEIER, AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE U.S. GSP PROGRAMME, MR DAVID SHARK.

COMMENTING ON THE TALKS, MR FOOTMAN SAID THERE HAD BEEN A USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES: +THE AMERICAN DELEGATION EXPLAINED THE LATEST POSITION UNDER THE REVIEW AND THE PARAMETERS UNDER WHICH IT HAD TO BE CONDUCTED.+

+ONCE AGAIN THE OPPORTUNITY WAS TAKEN TO STRESS HONG KONG'S OPEN MARKET, ITS GOOD TRADE PRACTICES AND STRONG INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, PATENTS, TRADE MARK AND COPYRIGHT ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS. I BELIEVE THAT THESE POINTS WERE FULLY TAKEN ON BOARD BY THE U.S. DELEGATION.

+THE DISCUSSIONS INCLUDED ALL AREAS OF THE REVIEW, AND WE MUST NOW AWAIT THE RESULTS WHICH WILL BE ANNOUNCED IN EARLY JANUARY NEXT YEAR,+ HE ADDED.

THE PRESIDENTIAL REVIEW WILL DETERMINE COMPETITIVE NEED LEVELS FOR EACH BENEFICIARY TERRITORY ON A PRODUCT BY PRODUCT BASIS, AND WILL ALSO DETERMINE WHETHER THE COMPETITIVE NEED LEVELS SHOULD BE WAIVED ALTOGETHER IN RESPECT OF ANY PRODUCTS FOR INDIVIDUAL BENEFICIARIES.

UNDER THE REVIEW THE PRESIDENT IS REQUIRED TO TAKE INTO ACCOUNT VARIOUS FACTORS INCLUDING AN INDIVIDUAL BENEFICIARY'S LEVEL OF DEVELOPMENT, ITS COMPETITIVENESS IN RESPECT OF INDIVIDUAL PRODUCTS, AND ITS TRADE PRACTICES.

THE REVIEW HAS BEEN UNDER WAY SINCE FEBRUARY 1985 WITH SUBMISSIONS BEING MADE BY ALL THE INTERESTED PARTIES INCLUDING HONG KONG.

IN 1985 U.S. IMPORTS OF GSP ITEMS FROM HONG KONG AMOUNTED TO U.S.\$3 726 MILLION, OF WHICH U.S.\$1 208 MILLION WAS GRANTED DUTY FREE TREATMENT.

TSUEN WAN DIVIDED INTO TWO ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS  
\* \* \* \* \*

TSUEN WAN WILL BE SPLIT INTO TWO ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS FROM MONDAY (SEPTEMBER 1) TO PROVIDE A MORE COMPREHENSIVE RANGE OF SERVICES AND FACILITIES TO ITS POPULATION OF MORE THAN 673 000 PEOPLE.

A CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION SPOKESMAN SAID UNTIL NOW THE DISTRICT HAD BEEN SERVED BY TWO DISTRICT BOARDS UNDER A SINGLE ADMINISTRATIVE SYSTEM.

WHEN THE KWAI CHUNG AND TSING YI DISTRICT BOARD CAME INTO BEING IN APRIL 1985, THE GOVERNMENT CONSIDERED THAT IT WAS APPROPRIATE TO MAINTAIN A SINGLE ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT SO AS TO ENSURE BALANCED DEVELOPMENT OVERALL AND TO ALLOW TIME FOR THE NEW BOARD TO GAIN ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+OVER THE PAST 14 MONTHS BOTH THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT BOARD AND THE KWAI CHUNG AND TSING YI DISTRICT BOARD HAVE DEVELOPED THEIR OWN IDENTITIES, AND THERE IS NO LONGER ANY NEED TO MAINTAIN A SINGLE ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

+THE TWO DISTRICTS, WHICH CAN STAND ON THEIR OWN GEOGRAPHICALLY, HAVE FAIRLY LARGE POPULATIONS WITH TSUEN WAN HAVING MORE THAN 233 000 PEOPLE AND KWAI CHUNG AND TSING YI NEARLY 440 000 RESIDENTS.+

+WITH THE SPLITTING OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF TSUEN WAN THERE WILL BE A BETTER AND MORE BALANCED PROVISION OF FACILITIES AND SERVICES INSTEAD OF HAVING TO SHARE THESE SPORTS, RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL FACILITIES.+

+THE SPLIT WILL HAVE MINIMAL EFFECT ON OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AS MOST OF THESE SERVICES ARE ALREADY PROVIDED ON A 'TWO DISTRICT' BASIS, WITH A FEW EXCEPTIONS.+

FROM MONDAY, THE KWAI CHUNG SUB-DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS OF THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE WILL BE KNOWN AS KWAI TSING DISTRICT OFFICE, SERVING KWAI CHUNG AND TSING YI.

ITS ADDRESS WILL BE THE KWAI HING GOVERNMENT OFFICES BUILDING, 10TH FLOOR, 166-174 HING FONG ROAD, KWAI CHUNG, NEW TERRITORIES (TEL : 0-212855).

THE KWAI TSING DISTRICT OFFICER IS MR BRIAN COAK.

THE TSUEN WAN SUB-DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS WILL BECOME THE NEW TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE. ITS ADDRESS WILL REMAIN THE TSUEN WAN STATION MULTI-STOREY CARPARK BUILDING, FIRST FLOOR, 174-208 CASTLE PEAK ROAD, TSUEN WAN, NEW TERRITORIES (TEL. : 0-425096).

THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICER IS MR ANGUS MIU.

AS THE TWO DISTRICTS WILL BECOME INDEPENDENT, THE POST OF THE DISTRICT COMMISSIONER WILL LAPSE ON THE SAME DAY.

THE DISTRICT OFFICE ATTACHED GREAT IMPORTANCE TO THE ROLE OF MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES WHICH SERVED AS A VITAL LINK BETWEEN THE OFFICE AND THE LOCAL COMMUNITIES, ASSISTANT DISTRICT OFFICER, NORTH, MR PETER TAM, SAID TODAY (FRIDAY).

MR TAM, WHO HAS BEGUN A SIX MONTH VISITING PROGRAMME TOGETHER WITH DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS, TOLD OFFICE-BEARERS OF CHOI YUEN ESTATE AND CHOI PO COURT MAC'S LAST NIGHT THAT THEY WERE THE BRIDGETOWER IN THE GOVERNMENT CONSULTATIVE MACHINERY.

+SINCE YOU ARE IN CLOSE CONTACT WITH RESIDENTS IN YOUR BUILDING, YOU ARE WELL PLACED IN DIASEMINATING INFORMATION OF PUBLIC INTEREST AS WELL AS PROVIDING AN IMPORTANT SOURCE FOR TAPPING PUBLIC VIEWS NOT ONLY ON LOCAL ISSUES BUT ALSO ON GOVERNMENT POLICIES,+ HE SAID.

MR TAM SAID THAT MOST OF THE MAC'S IN THE DISTRICT WERE FUNCTIONING INDEPENDENTLY AND HAD DONE WELL IN IMPROVING THE SECURITY, CLEANLINESS AND MAINTENANCE OF THEIR BUILDINGS.

VACANCY DECLARED IN KOWLOON CITY DB

A VACANCY FOR AN ELECTED MEMBER ON THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD WAS DECLARED TODAY (FRIDAY).

IN A NOTICE PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD, MR WONG SIK-KONG, ANNOUNCED THAT THE VACANCY, IN THE HO MAN TIN SOUTH CONSTITUENCY, FOLLOWED THE RESIGNATION OF ELECTED MEMBER MR LEE WAI-HAU ON AUGUST 9.

THE VACANCY WILL BE FILLED BY A BY-ELECTION IN MID-OCTOBER.

NOMINATIONS OF CANDIDATES WILL BE CALLED FOR BY THE RETURNING OFFICER (THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICER) ON SEPTEMBER 12 AND FORMS OF NOMINATION WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO PROSPECTIVE CANDIDATES.

AIRPORT RESTRICTED ZONE STARTS MONDAY

THE ARRIVALS FORECOURT OF THE AIRPORT PASSENGER TERMINAL BUILDING HAS BEEN GAZETTED TODAY (FRIDAY) AS A +24-HOUR NO STOPPING RESTRICTED ZONE+ TO VEHICLES WITH EFFECT FROM NEXT MONDAY (SEPTEMBER 1) UNLESS AUTHORISED IN WRITING.

THIS MEASURE IS TO ENHANCE TRAFFIC FLOW ALONG THE ARRIVALS FORECOURT, WHICH HAS BEEN THE SCENE OF EXTREMELY BUSY VEHICLE MOVEMENTS.

ACCORDINGLY, KERBSIDE LOADING WILL BE RESTRICTED TO TOURIST INDUSTRY-RELATED TRANSPORT.

PRIVATE CARS WILL BE REQUIRED TO LOAD AND EXIT DIRECT FROM THE AIRPORT MULTI-STOREY CAR PARK.

102 ILLEGAL HAWKERS ARRESTED AS USD CRACKDOWN CONTINUES

THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS ARRESTED A TOTAL OF - 102 ILLEGAL DRINKS AND COOKED-FOOD HAWKERS OVER THE WEEK AS IT CONTINUES ITS CRACKDOWN ON THESE HAWKERS TO SAFEGUARD PUBLIC HEALTH.

+THE ARRESTS WERE MADE AS GENERAL DUTIES TEAMS FROM THE DEPARTMENT SUSTAINED THEIR STEPPED-UP PATROLS ON THE STREETS,+ SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT TODAY.

HE SAID ALL THE ARRESTED HAWKERS HAD BEEN CHARGED WITH CAUSING OBSTRUCTION AND ILLEGAL HAWKING, AND SOME OF THEM HAD ALSO BEEN CHARGED WITH SELLING RESTRICTED FOOD.

+A TOTAL OF 1 377 KILOGRAMMES OF FOOD ITEMS AND 111 LITRES OF DRINKS WERE ALSO SEIZED,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN AGAIN WARNED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC NOT TO PATRONISE ILLEGAL COOKED FOOD AND DRINKS HAWKERS OTHERWISE THEY WOULD PUT THEIR HEALTH AT RISK.

MEANWHILE, HEALTH INSPECTORS FROM THE DEPARTMENT ALSO CARRIED OUT 3 741 INSPECTIONS OF LICENSED FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS, INCLUDING COOKED FOOD STALLS, DURING WEEK.
