THREE NEW UNOFFICIALS FOR LEGCO

* * * * *

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR JACK CATER, TODAY ANNOUNCED A NUMBER OF CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

THREE NEW UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL HAVE BEEN APPOINTED FOR TWO YEARS - MR CHEUNG YAN LUNG, MRS SELINA CHOW AND MISS MARIA TAM.

TWO EXISTING UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ARE STEPPING DOWN AFTER A LONG PERIOD OF SERVICE. THEY ARE MR OSWALD CHEUNG AND MR LI FOOK-WO. THE OVERALL NUMBER OF UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS ON THE COUNCIL IS RAISED FROM 26 TO 27.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT LAST YEAR, HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, BY ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, HAD AMENDED THE ROYAL INSTRUCTIONS ENABLING THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF BOTH UNOFFICIAL AND OFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL TO BE INCREASED TO 27.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE ADDITIONAL APPOINTMENTS WOULD STRENGTHEN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, AND WOULD HELP TO SHARE OUT THE CONTINUALLY INCREASING WORKLOAD OF THE MEMBERS.

MR CHEUNG, MBE, JP, 58 YEARS OLD, IS A BUSINESSMAN WHO WAS BORN IN HONG KONG.

A FORMER CHAIRMAN OF THE NEW TERRITORIES HEUNG YEE KUK, MR CHEUNG HAS LONG BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH PUBLIC SERVICE IN HONG KONG AND THE NEW TERRITORIES. HE IS A MEMBER OF THE HONG KONG HOUSING AUTHORITY, THE MARKETING ADVISORY BOARD, THE POLICE CADET SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD AND THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD SCHEME COMMITTEE. HE IS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE OF THE COMMUNITY CHEST.

MRS SELINA CHOW, JP, WAS BORN IN HONG KONG IN 1945. SHE IS MARRIED WITH TWO CHILDREN. SHE HAS A BA DEGREE FROM HONG KONG UNIVERSITY. SHE IS A FILM PRODUCER WITH BRAINCHILD LTD.

SHE WAS APPOINTED TO THE URBAN COUNCIL IN 1980. SHE IS AN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBER OF THE FAMILY PLANNING ASSOCIATION, A MEMBER OF THE FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE, AND THE LAY ASSESSOR PANEL. SHE WAS PRESIDENT OF THE ZONTA CLUB 1974/75.

MISS TAM WAS BORN IN 1945 AND WAS EDUCATED IN HONG KONG. SHE TOOK HER LAW DEGREE AT LONDON UNIVERSITY. SHE IS A PRACTISING BARRISTER.

SHE HAS BEEN AN ELECTED MEMBER OF THE URBAN COUNCIL SINCE APRIL 1979. SHE IS A MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE HONG KONG COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SERVICE, THE HONG KONG FAMILY WELFARE SOCIETY AND THE HONG KONG BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB ASSOCIATION.

SHE WAS FORMERLY CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG ASSOCIATION OF BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONAL WOMEN.

UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS RE-APPOINTED FOR TWO YEARS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ARE MR ALEX WU SHU-CHIH, DR RAYSON LISUNG HUANG, MR CHARLES YEUNG SIU-CHO, MR HU FA-KUANG, MR WONG PO-YAN, MR W.C.L. BROWN, MR CHAN KAM-CHUEN, MR J.J. SWAINE AND MR STEPHEN CHEONG KAM-CHUEN.

THE APPOINTMENTS OF THE REMAINING 15 UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS RUN UNTIL AUGUST 31, 1982.

THE THREE NEW APPOINTMENTS OF THE UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS, AND ALL NINE RE-APPOINTMENTS, TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL WILL BE EFFECTIVE FROM TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 1.

TSING YI ZONING PLAN AMENDED

THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD TODAY ANNOUNCED AN AMENDMENT TO DRAFT TSING YI OUTLINE ZONING PLAN.

NOTICE OF THE AMENDMENT IS PUBLISHED IN TODAY'S GOVERNMENT GAZETTE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE BOARD SAID THAT THE AMENDMENT INVOLVED CHANGES OF THE NOTATIONS OF +LIGHT INDUSTRIAL+, +HEAVY INDUSTRIAL+ AND +SPECIAL INDUSTRIAL+ SITES TO +INDUSTRIAL+.

NOTES ATTACHED TO THE PLAN HAVE ALSO BEEN REVISED.

THE AMENDED PLAN MAY BE INSPECTED IN THE TOWN PLANNING OFFICE, 17TH FLOOR, MURRAY BUILDING, GARDEN ROAD, HONG KONG- THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN CITY DISTRICT OFFICES- CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, WEST WING ENTRANCE- THE DISTRICT OFFICE, TSUEN WAN, HONG KONG AND SHANGHAI BANK BUILDING, CASTLE PEAK ROAD, TSUEN WAN.

REORGANISATION OF RESPONSIBILITIES FOR WORKS,
LAND, TRANSPORT AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

THREE SENIOR GOVERNMENT APPOINTMENTS WERE ANNOUNCED TODAY.

MR DEREK JONES (PREVIOUSLY SECRETARY FOR THE ENVIRONMENT) IS TO BECOME SECRETARY FOR TRANSPORT, MR DAVID MCDONALD WILL BE SECRETARY FOR LANDS AND WORKS, AND MR JOHN TODD (PREVIOUSLY HEAD OF THE LANDS DIVISION OF ENVIRONMENT BRANCH) WILL BECOME DIRECTOR OF LANDS (DESIGNATE).

THE APPOINTMENTS TAKE EFFECT IN SEPTEMBER, ALTHOUGH INITIALLY MR MCDONALD WILL ALSO CONTINUE TO BE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS. BOTH MR JONES AND MR MCDONALD WILL CONTINUE AS OFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT THE NEW POSTS WERE PART OF THE FIRST PHASE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF A MAJOR REORGANISATION. THIS FIRST PHASE INVOLVES THE ABOLITION OF THE ENVIRONMENT BRANCH. THE BRANCH'S TRANSPORT DIVISION IS BEING STRENGTHENED AND TRANSFORMED INTO A NEW TRANSPORT BRANCH, WHILE THE LANDS DIVISION WILL INITIALLY FORM THE NUCLEUS OF THE NEW LANDS AND WORKS BRANCH.

IN ADDITION, ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACTIVITIES WILL BE GIVEN ADDED EMPHASIS BY PLACING THE RELEVANT DIVISION UNDER THE DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT SERVICES, MR IAN MACPHERSON, WHO WILL BE RETITLED DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS AND APPOINTED TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

THE SECOND STAGE OF THE REORGANISATION WILL TAKE PLACE TOWARDS THE END OF THE YEAR, AND WILL INVOLVE THE REPLACEMENT OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT BY A NUMBER OF SEPARATE 'WORKS' DEPARTMENTS, THE CREATION OF THE REST OF THE NEW LANDS AND WORKS BRANCH, AND THE STRENGTHENING OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT.

THE APPOINTMENT OF MR TODD AS DIRECTOR OF LANDS (DESIGNATE) WILL ENABLE DETAILED PLANNING TO PROCEED FOR THE CREATION OF A NEW LANDS DEPARTMENT, WHICH WILL TAKE OVER THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR LAND ADMINISTRATION WHICH IS CURRENTLY SPLIT BETWEEN A NUMBER OF DEPARTMENTS. THERE WILL ALSO BE A RATIONALISATION OF THE COMMITTEE STRUCTURE IN THIS AREA. THE AIM IS TO CREATE THE NEW DEPARTMENT IN ABOUT APRIL 1982.

HK BAR QUALIFICATION RECOGNISED IN ENGLAND, WALES
* * * *

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR JOHN GRIFFITHS, Q.C., ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT FOLLOWING TALKS HE CONDUCTED IN LONDON, THE BAR COUNCIL IN ENGLAND HAS AGREED TO THE MUTUAL RECOGNITION OF PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS WITH HONG KONG.

THIS MEANS THAT THE POST-GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN LAWS (PCLL) OF THE HONG KONG UNIVERSITY IS NOW ACCEPTED BY THE BAR COUNCIL, IN CONJUNCTION WITH ACTUAL PRACTICE AT THE BAR IN HONG KONG, AS AN APPROPRIATE QUALIFICATION FOR CALL TO THE BAR OF ENGLAND AND WALES.

IN MAKING THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, MR GRIFFITHS SAID HE WAS SURE ALL MEMBERS OF THE BAR IN HONG KONG WOULD BE PLEASED THAT THE STATUS AND QUALITY OF THE HONG KONG UNIVERSITY QUALIFICATION AND OF PRACTICE AT THE HONG KONG BAR HAD BEEN SO APPROPRIATELY RECOGNISED.

HE WAS ALSO DELIGHTED THAT THE CLOSE TIES BETWEEN ENGLAND AND HONG KONG HAD BEEN PUBLICLY RECOGNISED IN THIS WAY.

AGREEMENT WAS REACHED WITH THE BAR COUNCIL FOLLOWING NEGOTIATIONS BY MR GRIFFITHS AS LEADER OF THE HONG KONG BAR OVER THE PAST YEAR.

ON JULY 30, 1981 THE SENATE OF THE INNS OF COURT AND THE BAR APPROVED A NEW CONSOLIDATED REGULATION TO RECOGNISE THE HONG KONG QUALIFICATIONS.

THE REGULATION MAINLY PROVIDES FOR MEMBERS OF THE BAR OF HONG KONG OF NOT LESS THAN THREE YEARS STANDING TO BE CALLED TO THE BAR OF ENGLAND AND WALES, SUBJECT TO FULFILLING CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG BAR WILL BE EXEMPT FROM THE PRACTICAL EXERCISES IF THEY HAVE THE PCLL OR HAVE BEEN IN ACTIVE PRACTICE AT THE HONG KONG BAR FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THREE YEARS.

MR GRIFFITHS HAS WRITTEN TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG BAR TO INFORM THEM OF THIS GOOD NEWS.

YAU MA TEI DMC HOLDS FIRST MEETING
* * * *

THE YAU MA TEI DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (DMC), THE SEVENTH TO BE SET UP IN THE URBAN AREA, HELD ITS FIRST MEETING TODAY, AUGUST 21, 1981.

DEPARTMENTS REPRESENTED ON THE DMC INCLUDE THE POLICE, PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, EDUCATION, HOUSING, LABOUR, MEDICAL AND HEALTH, SOCIAL WELFARE, TRANSPORT, RECREATION AND SPORT, URBAN SERVICES, FIRE SERVICES AND HOME AFFAIRS.

+WE HOPE THAT BY BRINGING TOGETHER DEPARTMENTAL REPRESENTATIVES AT AN APPROPRIATE LEVEL WHO CAN SPEAK AUTHORITATIVELY AND ACT UPON DEPARTMENTAL MATTERS AFFECTING THE DISTRICT DIRECTLY, DISTRICT PROBLEMS CAN BE TACKLED WITH FRESH IMPETUS,+ SAID THE CHAIRMAN OF THE DMC, MR WILFRED WONG, CITY DISTRICT COMMISSIONER (YAU MA TEI/MONG KOK).

+ALTHOUGH YAU MA TEI, IN TERMS OF POPULATION AND AREA, IS A RELATIVELY SMALL DISTRICT WHEN COMPARED WITH THE OTHER SIX DISTRICTS WHERE DMCS ARE ALREADY IN OPERATION, THE COMPLEXITY AND MULTIPLICITY OF PROBLEMS CONFRONTING THIS OLD AND FULLY BUILT-UP DISTRICT CALL FOR STILL BETTER CO-ORDINATION OF INTER-DEPARTMENTAL EFFORTS,+ HE SAID.

MR WONG DISCLOSED THAT IN YESTERDAY'S MEETING, MEMBERS AGREED THAT PRIORITY WOULD BE GIVEN IN TACKLING THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS, QUITE A FEW OF THEM HAVE A LONG HISTORY AND HAVE NOT LENT THEMSELVES TO SATISFACTORY SOLUTION SO FAR. THE DMC HAD ALSO IDENTIFIED A NUMBER OF WORKING TARGETS TO BE DEALT WITH IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

+IN ORDER TO ENABLE THE DMC TO SET IN MOTION AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE, MEMBERS OF THE DMC WILL INSPECT SOME OF THE TARGET AREAS IN YAU MA TEI SHORTLY,+ MR WONG SAID.

+OF COURSE WE WILL NOT LOSE SIGHT OF THE NEED FOR MORE AND BETTER COMMUNITY FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES. THE DMC WILL PROMOTE RECREATIONAL, SPORTS, ART AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES IN THE DISTRICT, APART FROM INITIATING ACTION TO IMPROVE THE LOCAL CONDITIONS,+ HE REMARKED.

+THE DMC WILL WORK CLOSELY WITH THE YAU MA TEI DISTRICT BOARD WHEN IT IS SET UP IN MARCH NEXT YEAR. VIEWS AND SUGGESTIONS OF LOCAL RESIDENTS ARE ESSENTIAL TO THE SUCCESS OF THE DMC. TO ENCOURAGE GREATER PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, EFFORTS WILL BE MADE TO CONSULT MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ON MATTERS AFFECTING THE DISTRICT.

LEGCO MEMBERS VISIT FORESTRY WORK CAMP

TWO UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, THE HON W.C.L. BROWN AND THE HON ANDREW SO KWOK-WING, TODAY (FRIDAY) SAW FOR THEMSELVES PART OF THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME IN ACTION.

THEY FLEW BY HELICOPTER TO THE SHEK PIK COUNTRY PARK ON LANTAU ISLAND WHERE A SCHOOL FORESTRY WORK CAMP IS BEING RUN FOR 18 SCHOOL CHILDREN FROM THE BUDDHIST TAI KWONG MIDDLE SCHOOL.

ORGANISED JOINTLY BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, THE FORESTRY WORK CAMP SCHEME IS A POPULAR AND MEANINGFUL SUMMER ACTIVITY DESIGNED TO PROMOTE CONSERVATION EDUCATION AMONG SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS AND TO OFFER THEM A RECREATIONAL OUTLET WHILE MANAGING THE COUNTRYSIDE FOR THE COMMUNITY.

ACCOMPANYING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCILLORS ON THE VISIT WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE FOR YOUTH RECREATION, MR F. DE S. OZORIO, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR A.J. REEVE AND INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS (SCIENCE STUDIES) OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, MR K.K. LAI.

THEY WERE MET ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHEK PIK COUNTRY PARK MANAGEMENT CENTRE BY THE SENIOR CONSERVATION OFFICER OF THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, MR S.P. LAU, AND THE CONSERVATION OFFICER (EDUCATION), MR M.K. CHEUNG.

THE VISITORS WERE CONDUCTED ON A TOUR OF THE CAMP SITE WHERE THEY INSPECTED THE ACCOMMODATION AND OTHER FACILITIES MADE AVAILABLE BY THE ORGANISERS. THEY STOPPED NOW AND THEN TO TALK TO TEACHER LEADERS AND STUDENT CAMPERS, ABOUT THEIR DUTIES.

MR BROWN AND MR SO THEN PROCEEDED BY CAR TO A WORK SITE IN THE LANTAU COUNTRY PARK WHERE THEY SAW THE STUDENT CAMPERS AT WORK TENDING YOUNG PLANTATION TREES AND CLEARING OVERGROWN FOOTPATHS.

BEFORE WINDING UP THEIR VISIT, THEY EXCHANGED USEFUL IDEAS WITH THE ORGANISERS AND SCHOOL REPRESENTATIVES.

THE SHEK PIK CAMP IS ONE OF THE 80 FORESTRY WORK CAMPS IN 15 COUNTRY PARKS THROUGHOUT HONG KONG, KOWLOON AND THE NEW TERRITORIES, THAT THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT HAVE ORGANISED THIS YEAR.

THE SCHEME, FUNDED BY A DONATION FROM THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB, STARTED 16 YEARS AGO AS A SUMMER YOUTH ACTIVITY. IT HAS BECOME MORE POPULAR IN RECENT YEARS AS MORE COUNTRY PARKS OPENED.

A TOTAL OF 74 FORESTRY WORK CAMPS WERE RUN LAST YEAR FOR MORE THAN 2 000 SCHOOL CHILDREN.

CLEAN-UP AT TUEN MUN MARKET AND HAWKER AREAS ENDS

A WEEK-LONG CLEAN-UP EFFORT AT TUEN MUN MARKET AND HAWKER AREAS WHICH ENDED TODAY HAS BROUGHT ABOUT A MARKED IMPROVEMENT IN ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE IN THE VARIOUS MARKETS AND HAWKER TRADING AREAS.

A TOTAL OF 480 BASKETS OF REFUSE AND EIGHT LORRY-LOADS OF BULKY ITEMS WERE REMOVED FROM VARIOUS TRADING AREAS, IN THE EFFORT WHICH WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE OF TUEN MUN DISTRICT BOARD AND THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

THE CLEAN-UP WAS CARRIED OUT AT SAN HUI MARKET, TUEN MUN TEMPORARY HAWKER BAZAAR, TUEN MUN SAN HUI COOKED FOOD BAZAAR, SAN HUI MARKET NEW EXTENSION AND SHOP FRONT AREAS ALONG THE SAN TSING ROAD.

AT A CEREMONY MARKING THE CLOSE OF THE CAMPAIGN, A TUEN MUN DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER, MR CHEUNG KAM-HUNG, PRESENTED SOUVENIR BANNERS TO THE CIVIC-MINDED HAWKERS AND SHOP OPERATORS WHO HELPED IN THE CLEAN-UP.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE DEPUTY URBAN SERVICES OFFICER OF TUEN MUN, MR LAM CHI-CHUNG, MR CHEUNG ALSO TOURED THE MARKETS AND HAWKERS AREAS.

A TWO-HOUR CARNIVAL WILL BE HELD IN TAI HING ESTATE, TUEN MUN, TOMORROW (SATURDAY) EVENING.

THE CARNIVAL, WHICH IS TO BE HELD IN THE OPEN AREA NEAR HING WAI HOUSE, HAS BEEN ORGANISED BY TAI HING YOUTH SERVICE GROUP AND FUNDED BY TUEN MUN DISTRICT YOUTH RECREATION CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE. THE CARITAS SOCIAL CENTRE, TUEN MUN, AND TAI HING PUBLIC ENQUIRY SERVICE CENTRE ARE CO-SPONSORS OF THE EVENT.

THERE WILL BE 13 STALLS MANNED BY MEMBERS OF TUEN MUN JUNIOR POLICE CALL, THE YIN NGAI SOCIETY, MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES, TAI HING YOUTH GROUPS, COMMUNITY HALL YOUTH GROUP AND AN OLD AGED GROUP.
