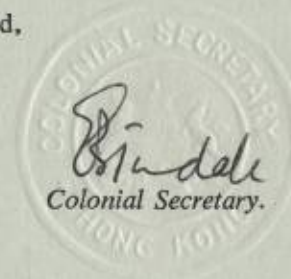

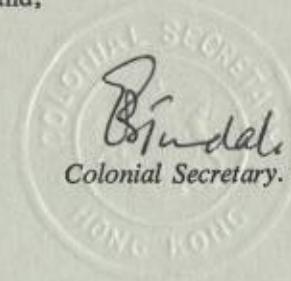

**THE HONGKONG AND SHANGHAI BANKING  
CORPORATION ORDINANCE.**

**(Chapter 70).**

Special Resolution of shareholders passed in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Ordinance on the 20th day of March, 1964.

That pursuant to section 4(2) of The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Ordinance The Hongkong and Shanghai Bank Regulations be amended as follows—

**I. TRANSFER OF SHARES.**

That paragraphs (1) and (2) of regulation 53 be deleted and the following substituted therefor—

“(1) Save as provided in paragraph (2), shares in the bank shall be transferred by an instrument under hand signed by the transferor and the transferee in the form set out in Appendix 2 or in any usual or common form which the board may approve.

(2) Shares on the London register may be transferred in the manner for the time being permitted by the Stock Transfer Act, 1963, as if they were securities to which section 1 of that Act applies.

(2A) The transferor of shares in the bank shall be deemed to remain the holder of such shares until the name of the transferee is entered in the appropriate registers in respect thereof.”.

**II. SCRIP FEES.**

(1) That regulation 18 be deleted and the following substituted therefor—

“18. If the board so requires, a fee not exceeding two dollars or its equivalent in local currency shall be paid for any new certificate issued under the regulations.”.


(2) That paragraph (4) of regulation 53 be deleted and the following substituted therefor—

“(4) If the board so requires, a fee not exceeding two dollars or its equivalent in local currency shall be paid before the issue of any new certificate, whether the same is issued consequent on a transfer or transmission of the shares to which it relates or the splitting up of an existing certificate.”.

## III. ARBITRATION.

That regulation 159 be amended by the deletion of the words "provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure" and the substitution therefor of the following—





## BANKRUPTCY ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 6).

## BANKRUPTCY (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 113 and by subsection (1) of section 114 of the Bankruptcy Ordinance, the Acting Chief Justice has made the following rules and prescribed the following fees and percentages—

1. These rules may be cited as the Bankruptcy (Amendment) Rules, 1964, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1964. Citation and commencement.
2. Rule 8 of the Bankruptcy Rules (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules) is amended by the deletion of the expression "Official Receiver" wherever it occurs, and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"Registrar". Amendment of rule 8. (Vol. VII, p. 361).
3. The principal rules are amended by the insertion, immediately before rule 30A, of the following new heading—  
"Service of petition orders, etc. on debtor". Insertion of heading to rule 30A.
4. Rule 51 of the principal rules is amended by the deletion of the word "one" in paragraph (1), and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"three". Amendment of rule 51.
5. Rule 61 of the principal rules is amended—  
(a) by the deletion of the word "other" and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"order"; and Amendment of rule 61.  
(b) by the deletion of the word "one" and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"three".
6. Rule 62 of the principal rules is amended by the deletion of the word "one" and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"three". Amendment of rule 62.
7. Part I of the Appendix to the principal rules is amended—

 (a) when the money consists of unclaimed dividends—on each dividend paid out;  
 (b) when the money consists of undistributed funds or balances—on the amount paid out."; and
- (i) by the deletion of items 17, 18 and 19 and the substitution therefor of the following new items—  
 "17. On an application to the court to approve a composition—a fee computed at the following rates on the gross amount of the composition, that is to say, \$15 on every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 up to \$50,000, and \$750 on every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 beyond \$50,000.

For the purpose of calculating this fee, "the gross amount" means the amount to be provided under the terms of the composition for ordinary and preferential creditors, and for costs, charges and expenses, and for fees and percentages (other than this fee).

Where a fee has been taken on a previous application to the court to approve a composition, or where a fee has been paid under item 9 of Table B, seven-eighths of the amount thereof shall be deducted from the fee payable on an application to approve a composition.

18. On an application to the court to approve a scheme of arrangement—a fee computed at the following rates on the gross amount of the estimated assets (but not exceeding the gross amount of the unsecured liabilities), that is to say, \$15 on every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 up to \$50,000, and \$7.50 on every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 beyond \$50,000:

Provided that where a fee has been taken on a previous application to the court to approve a scheme, or where a fee has been paid under item 9 of Table B, seven-eighths of the amount thereof shall be deducted from the fee payable on an application to approve a scheme.

19. On an application for release by a trustee—a fee of \$2.50 on every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 of the gross amount of the assets realized and brought to credit."







COMPANIES (WINDING-UP) (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsections (1) and (3) of section 281 of the Companies Ordinance, the Acting Chief Justice has made the following rules—

1. These rules may be cited as the Companies (Winding-up) (Amendment) Rules, 1964, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1964. Citation and commencement.

2. Rule 16 of the Companies (Winding-up) Rules (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules) is amended by the deletion of the word "fifty" and the substitution therefor of the following—  
"seventy-five". Amendment of rule 16. (Vol. VIII, p. 44).

3. The principal rules are amended by the addition, after rule 22, of the following new rule—  
Addition of new rule 22A.

"Deposit by petitioner.

22A. (1) Before presenting a petition the petitioner shall deposit with the Official Receiver the sum of three hundred dollars for the purpose of covering the fees and expenses to be incurred by the Official Receiver; and no petition shall be received unless the receipt of the Official Receiver for the deposit is produced to the Registrar.

(2) After presenting a petition the petitioner shall deposit with the Official Receiver, for the purpose set out in paragraph (1), such further sum as the court may, on the application of the Official Receiver, from time to time direct.

(3) The Official Receiver shall account for the money so deposited to the petitioner, or, if the company itself is the petitioner, to the liquidator of the company, and any money so deposited by a petitioner other than the company shall, except and so far as such money may be required by reason of insufficiency of assets for the payment of the fees of and expenses incurred by the Official Receiver, be repaid to the petitioner out of the proceeds of the assets of the company in the order of priority set out in paragraph (1) of rule 179."



1. This Order may be cited as the Companies (Fees and Percentages) (Amendment) Order, 1964, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1964. Citation and commencement.

2. HONG KONG AND KOWLOON WHARF AND GODOWN  
COMPANY LIMITED BY-LAWS, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Hong Kong and Kowloon Wharf and Godown Company Limited (By-laws) Ordinance, the Hong Kong and Kowloon Wharf and Godown Company Limited has made the following by-laws—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Hong Kong and Kowloon Wharf and Godown Company Limited By-laws, 1964. Citation.

2. (1) No person shall enter or be upon any pier or premises of the Company except with the permission of an official of the Company. Prohibition of entry and being upon piers and premises of Company without permission.

(2) For the purposes of this by-law, the permission of an official of the Company to enter and be upon any pier of the Company shall, subject to any revocation under paragraph (3) of this by-law, be deemed to have been given to any person who, through the entrance or way provided and upon payment of such fee, if any, for entry as may be stipulated by the Company for the class of persons to which he belongs, enters upon the pier for the purpose of gaining access to any passenger terminal situate on, or to any vessel berthed alongside, that pier.

(3) The Company, in the manner specified in paragraph (4), (5) or (6) of this by-law, as the case may be, may in writing at any time, and without assigning any reason therefor, revoke the permission deemed to have been given under paragraph (2) of this by-law in respect of any pier or premises either in relation to a particular person or class of persons or the employees or agents of any particular person or generally in relation to all persons.

(4) Where the aforesaid revocation relates to all persons generally or to any class of persons, copies of the revocation shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the Company's business premises and on the pier or piers concerned.

(5) Where the aforesaid revocation relates to the employees or agents of any person, a copy of the revocation shall be given or sent to that person.

(6) Where the aforesaid revocation relates to a particular person a copy of the revocation shall be given or sent to that person.

(7) Any official of the Company may, for good reason communicated to the person concerned, order any person who is upon any pier or premises of the Company, whether such person entered or is upon

the pier or premises with the permission of an official of the Company or not, to leave such pier or premises immediately.

(8) Any person who—

- (a) enters or is upon any pier or premises of the Company in contravention of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this by-law; or
- (b) fails to leave any pier or premises immediately upon being so ordered by any official of the Company pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (7) of this by-law,

shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

(9) Nothing in this by-law shall apply to any person who is in the employment of the Company.

Control of couriers and prohibition of soliciting patronage by others.

3. (1) No courier from any hotel, tourist agency or any like organization shall, in the course of his employment as such, enter or be upon the passenger terminal situate on, or on any other part of, any pier of the Company three hours before the expected arrival of any vessel carrying passengers that is to dock alongside such pier or at any other time while any such vessel is alongside the pier unless such courier is wearing a uniform clearly indicating the name of the hotel, tourist agency or other like organization that he represents.

(2) No hotel, tourist agency or any like organization shall send more than one uniformed courier, or more than such other number of uniformed couriers as the Company may in writing permit in any particular case, to meet any vessel at, or to board any vessel from, any of the Company's piers.

(3) No courier of any hotel, tourist agency or any like organization shall, in the course of his employment as such, remain upon the passenger terminal situate on, or other part of, any pier of the Company if there is then present at that passenger terminal or on any other part of the same pier any other uniformed courier of the same hotel, tourist agency or organization, whether such other courier entered upon the passenger terminal or other part of the pier before or after him, except where the presence on the passenger terminal or other part of the pier of more than one uniformed courier from the hotel, tourist agency or organization concerned on the occasion in question, is permitted under paragraph (2).

(4) Where the presence on any passenger terminal situate on, or on any other part of, any pier of the Company of more than one courier from any hotel, tourist agency or other like organization is on any occasion permitted under paragraph (2), no courier of such hotel, tourist agency or organization shall, in the course of his employment as such, remain upon the passenger terminal or other part of the pier concerned

if he together with all other couriers in uniform from the same hotel, tourist agency or organization then present at the passenger terminal or on any other part of the pier, exceed the number permitted as aforesaid.

(5) Every courier of an hotel, tourist agency or like organization shall, on entering the Company's pier in the course of his employment as such, have in his possession a list of all passengers whom he is directed to meet and shall, on demand, produce such list for examination—

- (a) to any official of the Company; or
- (b) to any other person who is authorized in writing by the Company to examine such lists and who produces such authority.

(6) No courier shall solicit the patronage of any passenger other than a passenger shown on the list in his possession specified in paragraph (5), and no other person shall solicit any passenger to patronize any business whatsoever or in any manner assist the courier of any hotel, tourist agency or any like organization in soliciting, obtaining or attempting to obtain, the patronage of any passenger, whether such passenger's name appears on the courier's list or not, but nothing in this paragraph shall be taken to prohibit a courier from giving assistance to any passenger who, not having been solicited by the courier or any person on his behalf, approached the courier with a request for his assistance.

(7) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

4. (1) No person shall take onto or remove or attempt to take onto or remove from any of the Company's piers or premises any merchandise, cargo or any other goods of any kind whatsoever except with the permission of an official of the Company.

Removal, etc. of merchandise, cargo and goods without permission prohibited.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

5. (1) No lorry, car, cart or other conveyance not in the service of the Company shall enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave any of the Company's piers or premises except with the permission of an official of the Company.

Prohibition of lorries entering or leaving premises without permission.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

6. (1) No person shall commit any nuisance of any description on or about any of the Company's piers or premises.

Nuisances prohibited.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

Prohibition of craft making fast, etc. to pier or premises without permission.

7. (1) No steamer, vessel, launch, boat, junk, sampan or other craft of any description whatsoever (other than craft in the service of the Marine Police, Fire Services, Immigration, Medical and Health (Port Health) or Commerce and Industry Department of the Government) shall—

- (a) make fast to, or hold on to, or lie alongside, or block the approaches to, any of the Company's piers or premises; or
- (b) make fast broadside to the sea wall of the Company's premises,

except with the permission of an official of the Company.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

Smoking prohibited.

8. (1) Save and except in the Company's main offices no person shall smoke on any part of the Company's piers or premises.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

Prohibition of interference, etc. with equipment, etc. without permission.

9. (1) No person shall interfere or meddle with or move in any way any of the Company's mobile equipment or trucks, or make use of its tramlines except with the permission of an official of the Company.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

(3) Nothing in this by-law shall apply to any person who is in the employment of the Company.

Prohibition of bringing cars, etc. onto pier or alongside manoeuvring vessel, without permission.

10. (1) No person shall without permission of the General Manager or Deputy General Manager enter upon or bring or attempt to bring any car, carriage, vehicle, launch, lighter or other craft onto or alongside any of the Company's piers, or alongside any vessel while such vessel is manoeuvring in or out of berth.

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

(3) Nothing in this by-law shall apply to any person who is in the employment of the Company.

Penalties.

11. Any person who is guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of fifty dollars for the first such offence and to a fine of one hundred dollars for every subsequent such offence.

Saving.

12. Nothing in these by-laws shall be taken to restrict, derogate from or otherwise interfere with any power or duty, or the exercise or performance of any power or duty, conferred or imposed by or under any law upon any person in the Service of the Crown.

13. The Hong Kong and Kowloon Wharf and Godown Company Limited By-laws are hereby cancelled.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 72 of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance, 1964 the Chief Justice has made the following rules—

PART I.

CITATION, COMMENCEMENT AND INTERPRETATION.

Citation and commencement.  
(16 of 1964).

1. These rules may be cited as the Admission and Registration Rules, 1964, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of section 72 of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance, 1964.

Interpretation.

2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—  
“articles” includes new articles, further articles, assigned articles and supplementary articles; and  
“prescribed fee” means the fee prescribed by rules made under section 72 of the Ordinance.

PART II.

SOLICITORS.

Notice of application for admission as solicitor.

3. (1) Any person seeking to be admitted as a solicitor in accordance with the provisions of section 4 of the Ordinance shall give to the Society notice in accordance with Form 1 in the Schedule and shall pay to the Society the prescribed fee.

(2) The Society, if it is satisfied that a person applying in accordance with paragraph (1) is entitled thereto, shall issue to him a certificate in accordance with Form 2 in the Schedule in the case of an application under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance or in accordance with Form 3 in the Schedule in the case of an application under sub-paragraph (ii) of that paragraph.

(b) in the case of a person seeking admission by virtue of sub-paragraph (ii) of that paragraph, shall be not less than six weeks,

after the service of the notice on the Society in accordance with paragraph (1) of rule 3 and in any event not less than ten days after the date of the filing of such motion paper and shall pay to the Registrar the prescribed fee.

(2) Every such motion paper shall be accompanied by the certificate issued to the person in accordance with paragraph (2) of rule 3 and—

(a) in the case of a person seeking admission by virtue of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance and of rule 20 of the Students Rules, 1964, (L.N. 105/64), the certificate of the two Benchers referred to in that rule;

(b) in the case of a person seeking admission by virtue of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance and not by virtue of rule 20 of the Students Rules, 1964—

(i) the articles under which such person served his term; and

(ii) a declaration as to service under articles in accordance with Form 4 in the Schedule; and

Schedule, Form 4.

(c) in the case of a person seeking admission by virtue of sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance—

(i) his certificate of admission;

(ii) a certificate from the proper authority issuing such certificate for admission that the certificate of admission is still valid and in force;

(iii) a statutory declaration as to fitness and character made by two practising barristers or solicitors, or by one practising barrister and one practising solicitor, of at least five years standing in one of the courts in Great Britain or Northern Ireland; and

(iv) an affidavit of identity in accordance with Form 5 in the Schedule completed by an officer of the Court.

(3) A copy of the motion paper referred to in paragraph (1) and of every document accompanying the motion paper in accordance with paragraph (2) shall be served on the Attorney General by the person seeking to be admitted not less than fourteen days before the date when the Court is to be moved.

5. (1) On the date of hearing of the motion under rule 4 or any adjournment thereof by the Court, the Attorney General, or a member of the Society appointed for that purpose by the Society or Counsel shall move the Court that the person concerned be admitted and enrolled as a solicitor.

(2) The Court, upon hearing the Attorney General, such member of the Society or Counsel and upon hearing any representation which may be made by or on behalf of the Society or of the Attorney General and upon being satisfied that the applicant is eligible for admission as a solicitor, may order that the applicant be admitted as a solicitor or, if the Court is not so satisfied, may dismiss the application upon such terms as regards costs or otherwise as the Court may deem appropriate.

(3) The Registrar shall deliver to every person who is admitted as a solicitor by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ordinance, as soon as is practicable after the admission of such person, a certificate of admission in accordance with Form 6 in the Schedule.

6. Before a person who has been ordered to be admitted as a solicitor in accordance with paragraph (2) of rule 5 is so admitted, he shall, in open court, subscribe the Oath of Allegiance in the form prescribed by the Promissory Oaths Ordinance and the oath following—

*"I, A.B., do swear (or solemnly, sincerely and truly declare and affirm) that I will truly and honestly demean myself in the practice of solicitor, according to the best of my knowledge and ability. So help me God."*

Provided that in the case of a declaration or affirmation the last four words of such oath shall be omitted.

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS (FEES) RULES, 1964.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 72 of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance, 1964, the Chief Justice has made the following rules—

1. These rules may be cited as the Legal Practitioners (Fees) Rules, 1964, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of section 72 of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance, 1964. Citation and commencement. (16 of 1964).

2. (1) The fees set forth in the First Schedule are prescribed for payment under the Ordinance. Fees. First Schedule.

(2) The fees set forth in the Second Schedule are prescribed for payment under the Students Rules, 1964. Second Schedule. (L.N. 105/64).

(3) The fees set forth in the Third Schedule are prescribed for payment under the Admission and Registration Rules, 1964. Third Schedule. (L.N. 99/64).

3. The fees set forth in the First, Second and Third Schedules shall be paid to the persons named in the fourth column of such Schedules, opposite such fees: Payment of fees. First, Second and Third Schedules.

Provided that the Chief Justice in his absolute discretion may order that the whole or any part of a fee paid by a solicitor under subsection (1) of section 6 of the Ordinance shall be transferred to the Society for the payment of the expenses of the Society.
