BUS SERVICES TO BE STRENGTHENED  
\* \* \* \*

BUS SERVICES ON HONG KONG ISLAND WILL BE STRENGTHENED TO COPE WITH INCREASING PASSENGER DEMAND WHEN NEW SCHOOL TERM BEGINS ON SEPTEMBER 1 (WEDNESDAY), A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY.

CMB ROUTE 10B CURRENTLY ONLY OPERATING DURING MORNING PEAK IN ONE DIRECTION WILL START FULL DAY TWO-WAY OPERATION BETWEEN HEALTHY STREET WEST AND CLEVERLY STREET AT 10 MINUTE FREQUENCIES DURING PEAK PERIODS.

ROUTE 2 WILL HAVE ITS TERMINUS AT CLEVERLY STREET IN CENTRAL TO BE EXTENDED TO THE MACAU FERRY TERMINAL.

THE TERMINAL POINT OF ROUTE 3 IN POK FU LAM WILL BE RELOCATED FROM QUEEN MARY HOSPITAL TO POKFIELD ROAD.

THIS WILL SHORTEN THE BUS JOURNEY DISTANCE SO THAT THE PEAK PERIOD FREQUENCY CAN BE IMPROVED TO EVERY FIVE MINUTES.

TO BETTER MEET PASSENGER DEMAND, ROUTE 23A BETWEEN LAI TAK TSUEN AND SEYMOUR ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED VIA YEE WO STREET INSTEAD OF PERCIVAL STREET AND LEIGHTON ROAD.

FOUR ADDITIONAL VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOCATED TO ROUTE 90M (BETWEEN AP LEI CHAU AND ADMIRALTY MTR STATION) TO IMPROVE THE FREQUENCY TO EVERY 7-1/2 MINUTES.

TO BETTER SERVE COMMUTERS TO BRAEMAR HILL ROAD AND TIN HAU TEMPLE ROAD, ROUTE 25 WILL RUN AT 7-1/2 MINUTE INTERVALS, WHILE ROUTE 27 WILL ALSO RUN ADDITIONAL TRIPS DURING THE MORNING PEAK PERIODS.

CMB WILL BE CARRYING OUT A STUDY IN SEPTEMBER ON BUS SERVICES IN THE MID-LEVELS, AND THE RESULTS WILL BE USED TO FURTHER IMPROVE THE SITUATION.

NEW STAMPS OUT ON MONDAY

THE PUBLIC ARE REMINDED THAT THE POST OFFICE WILL ISSUE A NEW SET OF DEFINITIVE STAMPS ON MONDAY (AUGUST 30), TO REPLACE THE ONE WHICH HAS BEEN IN USE FOR ALMOST TEN YEARS.

ALL POST OFFICES WILL OPEN FOR BUSINESS ON THAT DAY WHICH IS A PUBLIC HOLIDAY, WITH BUSINESS HOURS AS ON A NORMAL WEEKDAY, EXCEPT THE AIRPORT POST OFFICE WHICH WILL OPEN FROM 9 AM TO 5 PM. THERE WILL ALSO BE ONE DELIVERY OF MAIL ON THAT DAY.

LAND PROJECT FOR TUEN MUN NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT

\* \* \*

THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED A \$89 MILLION CONTRACT TO TOBISHIMA CORPORATION FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE TUEN MUN NEW TOWN.

THE CONTRACT INVOLVES THE FORMATION OF ABOUT 48.6 HECTARES OF LAND IN THE NORTH-WEST AND EASTERN PARTS OF THE NEW TOWN, AND ASSOCIATED DRAINAGE WORKS.

MR S.K. KWEI, PROJECT MANAGER OF THE TUEN MUN NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, SAID THAT THE LAND FORMED IN THE NORTH-WEST WOULD PROVIDE ACCOMMODATION FOR ABOUT 66 000 PEOPLE IN PUBLIC HOUSING.

+THE REMAINING LAND WILL BE FOR GOVERNMENT, INSTITUTION AND COMMUNITY USE WHILE THE LAND TO BE FORMED IN THE EASTERN PART WILL BE USED AS A VILLAGE RESITE AREA,+ HE SAID.

IN ADDITION, LAND WILL ALSO BE PROVIDED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO MAJOR ROADS LINKING THE AREAS WITH OTHER PARTS OF THE NEW TOWN IN FUTURE.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL START IN THE MIDDLE OF SEPTEMBER AND WILL TAKE ABOUT 24 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

**MORE CANDIDATES URGED FOR FIVE UNCONTESTED CONSTITUENCIES**

A TOTAL OF 204 PEOPLE INCLUDING 14 WOMEN HAVE BEEN REGISTERED AS CANDIDATES FOR NEXT MONTH'S URBAN DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS SINCE NOMINATIONS BEGAN ON AUGUST 6, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR GRAHAM BARNES, SAID TODAY.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THERE WERE STILL FIVE UNCONTESTED CONSTITUENCIES, EACH WITH ONLY ONE CANDIDATE.

+THE FIVE ARE MID-LEVELS AND PEAK, WONG CHUK HANG AND BAYS, TO KWA WAN SOUTH, NAM CHEONG EAST AND WANG TAU HOM,+ HE SAID.

+WE HOPE MORE PEOPLE, SPECIALLY FROM THE FIVE CONSTITUENCIES, WILL COME FORWARD AS CANDIDATES.+

+THERE IS NOT MUCH TIME LEFT FOR HESITATION AS TUESDAY (AUGUST 31) WILL BE THE LAST DAY FOR NOMINATIONS.

+WE ARE LOOKING FOR PEOPLE FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE AND PEOPLE WHO HAVE THE GENUINE CONCERN FOR LOCAL AFFAIRS.

**CUSTOMS' ROLE IN TRADE FACILITATION AND  
LAW ENFORCEMENT STRESSED**

THE SECRETARY FOR SECURITY, MR LEWIS DAVIES TODAY (SATURDAY) TOLD NEW RECRUITS OF THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE SERVICE THAT THE NEW INDEPENDENCE OF THE DEPARTMENT - A RECOGNITION OF BOTH ITS IMPORTANCE TO THE COMMUNITY AND ITS PROFESSIONAL NATURE - HAD PLACED GREATER RESPONSIBILITIES ON EACH OF THEM.

ADDRESSING THE PASSING OUT PARADE OF 21 PROBATIONARY INSPECTORS AND 107 CUSTOMS OFFICERS, MR DAVIES UNDERLINED THE IMPORTANCE OF CUSTOMS' ROLE IN TRADE FACILITATION AS WELL AS LAW ENFORCEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROTECTION OF THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF HONG KONG PEOPLE.

TENDERS HAVE BEEN INVITED BY THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR THE CONVERSION OF THE FORMER QUARRY BAY JUNIOR SCHOOL INTO A RESIDENTIAL HOME FOR BOYS UNDER PROBATION SUPERVISION.

THE PROJECT WILL INCLUDE WORKS SUCH AS THE ENLARGEMENT OF THE KITCHEN AND FOOD STORE, PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL SHOWER AND TOILET FACILITIES, A SICK BAY AND OFFICES.

WORK IS SCHEDULED TO START IN OCTOBER AND BE COMPLETED IN ABOUT FIVE MONTHS.

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS IN ENGLISH TEACHING

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRE WILL ORGANISE A SERIES OF SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS IN ENGLISH IN SEPTEMBER AND NOVEMBER.

A TALK ON THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH AS A SECOND/FOREIGN LANGUAGE WILL BE DELIVERED BY A VISITING PROFESSOR OF EDUCATION FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF VICTORY, CANADA, ON SEPTEMBER 11 BETWEEN 9.30 AM AND 11 AM AT THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRE AT 9A BONHAM ROAD, HONG KONG.

HEADS OF SCHOOLS ARE WELCOMED TO NOMINATE THEIR TEACHERS TO ATTEND THE TALK. THEIR NOMINATIONS SHOULD REACH THE SENIOR INSPECTOR OF THE TEACHING CENTRE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

THE CENTRE WILL ALSO HOLD TWO IDENTICAL WORKSHOPS ON THE TEACHING OF LISTENING COMPREHENSION FOR TEACHERS OF ENGLISH IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS FROM NOVEMBER 1 TO 13.

THE WORKSHOPS, WHICH WILL BE HELD AT THE KOWLOON OFFICE OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRE AT 2/F, MA TAU KOK ROAD GOVERNMENT OFFICES, KOWLOON, WILL INCLUDE SHORT TALKS ON THE TEACHING OF LISTENING COMPREHENSION AND DEMONSTRATION OF VARIOUS LISTENING COMPREHENSION EXERCISES.

THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS FOR EACH WORKSHOP WILL BE LIMITED TO 20. A CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE WILL BE AWARDED TO ALL TEACHERS WHO HAVE SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED A WORKSHOP.

HEADS OF SCHOOLS ARE REQUESTED TO SUBMIT THE NAMES OF THEIR TEACHERS WHO WISH TO ATTEND THE WORKSHOP IN ORDER OF PRIORITY TO THE SENIOR INSPECTOR, ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRE AT 9A BONHAM ROAD, HONG KONG ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 8.

AS REGARDS REMEDIAL TEACHING, THE CENTRE WILL BE HOLDING TWO IDENTICAL SEMINARS FOR TEACHERS OF ENGLISH IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS FROM NOVEMBER 15 TO 25 AT ITS BONHAM ROAD OFFICE. FOUR IDENTICAL SEMINARS WILL ALSO BE HELD FOR TEACHERS OF ENGLISH IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS BETWEEN NOVEMBER 16 AND 26 AT THE CENTRE.

THESE SEMINARS WILL DEAL WITH THE PREPARATION, SELECTION AND ADAPTATION OF TEACHING MATERIALS AND OTHER PRACTICAL SUGGESTIONS ON TEACHING REMEDIAL GROUPS.

THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS FOR EACH SEMINAR WILL BE LIMITED TO 30. APPLICATIONS WILL BE TREATED ON A FIRST-COME-FIRST-SERVED BASIS.

HEADS OF SCHOOLS ARE REQUESTED TO SUBMIT THE NAMES OF THEIR TEACHERS WHO WISH TO ATTEND THE SEMINARS IN ORDER OF PRIORITY TO THE SENIOR INSPECTOR OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRE AT 9A BONHAM ROAD, HONG KONG ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 18.

LUNG KWU TAN VILLAGERS UNDERTAKE CLEANSING SERVICES

TUEN MUN COMMUNITY LEADERS TODAY (SATURDAY) AWARDED FULL MARKS TO THE VILLAGE CLEANSING SERVICES BEING CARRIED OUT BY A LOCAL GROUP AT LUNG KWU TAN, UNDER A PILOT SCHEME LAUNCHED IN MAY THIS YEAR.

THE COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN THE VILLAGE CLEANSING PILOT SCHEME IS AIMED AT ENCOURAGING VILLAGERS IN THE RURAL AREAS TO PLAY A KEY ROLE IN CLEANSING THEIR OWN PLACES OF RESIDENCE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY.

LUNG KWU TAN IS ONE OF THE FOUR VILLAGES WHERE THE CONTRACTING-OUT SERVICES ARE NOW BEING UNDERTAKEN BY LOCAL VILLAGE GROUPS, FOR A PERIOD OF NINE MONTHS.

OTHER VILLAGES ARE WANG TOI SHAN IN YUEN LONG, TAI PO TSAI AND HANG HAU IN SAI KUNG.

AT LUNG KWU TAN, THE RURAL ORGANISATION IS CARRYING OUT THE NORMAL DUTIES OF THE CLEANSING STAFF OF THE NTSD AT FIVE REMOTE VILLAGES UNDER THE CONTRACT.

THESE VILLAGES ARE TUK MEI CHUNG, SHA PO KONG, LAM LONG, PAK LONG AND LUNG TSAI AT THE CASTLE PEAK PENINSULA AND HAVE A POPULATION OF ABOUT 1 500.

TO MONITOR THE PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACTING-OUT SERVICES, AN INDEPENDENT ASSESSMENT TEAM FROM LOCAL COMMUNITY LEADERS, DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE URBAN SERVICES OFFICE OF TUEN MUN WAS SET UP AND INSPECTION CARRIED OUT REGULARLY.

VISITING THE CLEANSING SERVICES TODAY WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ASSESSMENT TEAM, MR POON CHIN-HUNG, WHO IS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE TUEN MUN DISTRICT CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE AND MEMBERS OF THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN DISTRICT COMMITTEE, MISS NG SIU-FONG, MR LAW KWAI-CHUEN, AS WELL AS MR CHENG KAI-MING OF TUEN MUN DISTRICT OFFICE AND HEALTH INSPECTOR CHU WAI-TAK OF THE NTSD.

AFTER THE TOUR, MR POON SAID THE MEMBERS WERE IMPRESSED BY THE PERFORMANCE OF THE CLEANSING WORK CARRIED OUT BY THE VILLAGERS.

KITE-FLYING FUN DAY

SCENIC SAI KUNG - A NATURAL PLAYGROUND FOR THOUSANDS OF HOLIDAY REVELLERS DURING WEEKENDS - IS ALSO A HAVEN FOR KITE-FLYING ENTHUSIASTS.

THE AREA WITH ITS LUSH HILLS IS AN IDEAL PLACE FOR PEOPLE TO PURSUE THEIR HOBBY WITHOUT BREAKING THE LAW - FOR IT IS AN OFFENCE TO FLY KITES WITHIN FIVE KILOMETRES OF THE AIRPORT.

ON ANY WEEKEND, A NUMBER OF THESE GRACEFUL OBJECTS CAN BE SEEN GLIDING AND WEAVING IN THE SKY.

MANY ARE FLOWN BY PARTICIPANTS OF THE +KITE-FLYING FUN DAY+ ORGANISED BY THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE OF THE RECREATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT.

THE RSS TAKES ABOUT 100 PEOPLE OF VARIOUS AGES TO SUCH AN OUTING. APART FROM TEACHING THEM HOW TO FLY A KITE, THE RSS ALSO PROVIDES TRANSPORT AND KITES.

THE KITES PROVIDED BY THE RSS ARE MADE OF PLASTIC MATERIAL AND OF DIFFERENT DESIGNS.

+THERE ARE MANY PEOPLE WHO WISH TO FLY KITES, BUT ONLY A LIMITED NUMBER CAN BE ACCEPTED FOLLOWING ENROLMENT,+ SAID MR YEUNG WAI-HUNG OF THE RSS WHO RECENTLY ORGANISED A KITE-FLYING EVENT FOR KOWLOON CITY RESIDENTS.

ASKED ABOUT SAFETY PRECAUTIONS, MR YEUNG SAID: +THE RSS HAS PLAYED A ROLE IN LAST YEAR'S SAFE KITE-FLYING CAMPAIGN JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT AND THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICE. A SAFE KITE-FLYING FOR ALL FUN DAY WAS PRESENTED BY THE RSS.+

LAST YEAR, THE RSS ORGANISED KITE FLYING EVENTS FOR NEARLY 1 000 PEOPLE.

### KWUN TONG HAS LARGEST NUMBER OF VOTERS

ABOUT 2 000 RESIDENTS OF NGAU TAU KOK EAST ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND A VARIETY SHOW TOMORROW (SUNDAY) EVENING WHICH HAS BEEN SPECIALLY ORGANISED TO PUBLICISE THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM.

NGAU TAU KOK EAST IS ONE OF THE 12 CONSTITUENCIES IN KWUN TONG WHICH, AMONG THE TEN URBAN DISTRICTS, HAS THE LARGEST NUMBER OF 120 000 REGISTERED VOTERS FOR THE COMING URBAN DISTRICT BOARD ELECTIONS.

FRESH WATER SUPPLY TO SOME PREMISES IN THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR EIGHT HOURS FROM 10 PM ON TUESDAY (AUGUST 31) TO 6 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY TO FACILITATE WORK ON THE SUPPLY SYSTEM.
