

Appointment of teachers.

76. The Supervisor shall be responsible for issuing to all teachers letters of appointment which shall set out—

- (a) conditions of service;
- (b) salary scale; and
- (c) conditions of termination of appointment.

Salaries of teachers.

77. The Supervisor shall be responsible for ensuring that the salaries of all teachers are paid in full when due.

PART XII.

Holidays.

Notice of school holidays.

78. The Supervisor shall send to the Director as soon as is possible in each case notice of all holidays it is intended to give, including any special holidays given in honour of any particular event, and of all dates on which the usual work of the school will be suspended. Such notice shall reach the Director not less than ten days before the intended holiday.

Director may disapprove.

79. The Director may by notice in writing to the Supervisor forbid the granting of a holiday on any specified day or days and the Supervisor and principal shall thereupon ensure that the usual work of the school is continued on that day or days.

Director may require grant of holiday.

80. The Director may by notice in writing to the Supervisor of any school require that a holiday shall be given on any day specified in such notice and the Supervisor shall ensure that such holiday is given accordingly.

PART XIII.

General.

School name to be displayed.

81. At or near the entrance to every school there shall be prominently displayed a board or other form of notice bearing in conspicuous lettering the registered name of the school.

Identification of rooms.

82. At the entrance to every classroom there shall be a board or sign bearing an identification number or letter for such room. This number or letter must correspond with the number or letter for the room as shown on the approved plan.

Maximum number of pupils.

83. In every classroom there shall be kept exhibited in a prominent place a certificate signed by the Director certifying the maximum number of pupils permitted in that room, and no more than such maximum number shall be permitted in that room.

Size of classes.

84. Not more than 45 pupils shall be taught at one time by one teacher, except in special cases with the permission of the Director.

Attendance registers.

85. A separate attendance register in a form approved by the Director shall be kept for each class.

Equipment and educational facilities.

86. All schools shall be provided with apparatus, equipment and general facilities adequate for the courses of instruction to be given.

Syllabus and time-table subject to approval of Director.

87. (1) No instruction may be given in any school except in accordance with a syllabus approved by the Director.

(2) The Supervisor of every school shall submit to the Director whenever so required by the Director the syllabus of instruction of each class for his approval.

(3) The Director may give directions in writing to the Supervisor of any school as to the instruction which shall be or shall not be included in any such syllabus.

(4) Unless with the express permission of the Director in writing, military training in schools is prohibited.

(5) The Director may by order prohibit the presence or use of any specified document in schools.

(6) No document shall be used for instruction in a class without the previous approval of the Director.

(7) The Director may give directions in writing to the Supervisor of any school in respect of the preparation of the time-table of work of any class and may require any Supervisor to submit for his approval any such time-table.

(8) The time-table of each class shall be displayed in the classroom.

88. (1) No instruction, education, entertainment, recreation or propaganda or activity of any kind which shall be in any way of a political or partly political nature and detrimental to the interests of the Colony or of the public or of the pupils or contrary to the approved syllabus, shall be permitted amongst the masters or pupils either upon the school premises or upon the occasion of any school activity.

Political propaganda and symbols.

(2) The use or display by masters or pupils either upon the school premises or upon the occasion of any school activity of salutes, songs, dances, slogans, uniforms, flags or symbols which have a customarily political association and which shall have been declared in writing by the Director in his opinion to be detrimental to the interests of the Colony or of the public or of the pupils shall be unlawful.

89. (1) No person shall be allowed on school premises at any time for the purpose of teaching, examining or taking any part in the conduct of the school or classroom activities, or making any educational inspection or investigation, unless such person has received the written approval of the Director or is permitted there under the provisions of the Ordinance.

Unauthorized persons on school premises and use of school premises for unauthorized purposes.

(2) No school premises may be used at any time for purposes other than the ordinary conduct of the school without the prior permission in writing of the Director.

(3) No classes may be held nor any tuition given on school premises during holidays, or out of normal school hours, without the prior permission in writing of the Director.

90. A copy of the Ordinance and the regulations shall be kept in an accessible place in every school and shall be readily available to all school staff for reference.

Copy of Ordinance and regulations.

91. A contravention of a regulation or sub-regulation specified in the first column of the following table shall be an offence and the person specified in the second column of such table opposite such regulation or sub-regulation or any one or more of such persons shall if guilty of such contravention be liable to a fine of two thousand dollars or imprisonment for one year.

Latrines and Urinals in Schools other than Boarding Schools.

1. For latrines and urinals connected to a flush system the requirements shall be—

(a) For boys—

One pan and two urinals for every 30 pupils. Where urinals are not provided one pan shall be provided for every 20 pupils.

- (b) For girls—
One pan for every 20 pupils.
2. For latrines and urinals not connected to a flush system the requirements shall be—
- (a) For boys—
One pan and two urinals for every 30 pupils.
- (b) For girls—
One pan for every 20 pupils.

Latrines and Urinals in Boarding Schools.

1. For latrines and urinals connected to a flush system the requirements shall be—

(a) For boys—

One pan and one urinal for every 15 boarders.

(b) For girls—

One pan for every 15 boarders.

Note:—For the purpose of this Appendix, "urinal" means a separate urinal vessel or a trough not less than 18 inches long.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

Provident Fund Rules.

1. These rules may be cited as the Grant Schools Provident Fund Citation Rules, 1952.

2. In these rules—

"continuous contributory service" means continuous service while contributing to the fund or to other funds approved under rule 7 (1) (c);

"contributor" means a person who contributes compulsorily to the fund or who has exercised an option to contribute to the fund;

"Grant Code" means the code under the terms of which Government gives grants in aid to certain schools;

"grant schools" means the schools which receive such grants;

"fund" and "board" mean respectively the provident fund and board of control established under these rules.

3. The object of these rules is the maintenance and management of the contributory fund which since the 1st September, 1945, has provided for payments in the case of the superannuation, resignation, retirement, dismissal or death of permanent full time teachers in grant schools. Rights and liabilities and procedure in respect of such fund shall hereafter be entirely governed by these rules.

4. (1) The complete administration and control of the fund, subject to these rules, shall be vested in a board of control composed of a chairman who shall be nominated and replaced whenever it appears to be desirable by the Grant Schools Council, the Director or his representative, the Accountant General or his representative, and eight additional members who shall themselves be contributors.

Interpretation.

Object of rules.

Board of control.

(2) The eight additional members shall be nominated as occasion may require by contributors upon the staff of grant schools as follows—

- (a) 2 jointly by Roman Catholic Boys Schools;
- (b) 2 jointly by Roman Catholic Girls Schools;
- (c) 2 jointly by the Diocesan Boys School, the Diocesan Girls School, St. Paul's College (Co-educational) and St. Paul's Boys College;
- (d) 1 jointly by Ying Wa Boys and Ying Wa Girls Schools;
- (e) 1 jointly by St. Stephen's Girls School and Heep Yunn School.

(3) The eight additional members shall serve until the 1st September, 1953 and thereafter for two yearly periods unless renominated: Provided that if such a member ceases to be a contributor or is unable or unwilling to act, or resigns, or is absent for more than three months from the Colony, a contributor may be nominated as a member in similar manner in his place.

(4) Five members of the board shall form a quorum and the chairman shall have a casting vote.

(5) The board shall regulate its own procedure and in the absence of the chairman a temporary chairman shall be elected from amongst the members of the board.

5. (1) The board shall as necessary elect from amongst its members a secretary who shall summon such meetings as may be required by the board, of which he shall give at least 7 days notice with an agenda for discussion.

(2) The secretary shall maintain minutes of each meeting and a record of the members of the board from time to time.

(3) Annually and whenever so requested the secretary shall obtain from nominated members lists of the contributors whom they represent and deliver the same to the Accountant General or auditor.

6. (1) A treasurer of the fund shall be appointed by the Accountant General who may if and whenever the Accountant General thinks fit also act as his representative on the board under rule 4.

(2) Facilities for keeping the accounts of the fund shall be provided by Government.

(3) The treasurer shall keep full and complete accounts of the fund and, with such persons as the Accountant General may require to assist him, shall keep an account relating to every contributor.

(4) The treasurer shall prepare and submit for audit annual accounts as at the 31st August as soon as possible after that date in each year, which shall include an income and expenditure account and a balance sheet, to which shall be appended a statement of investments showing in respect of each security the nominal value, the middle market-price, the total market value, the previous book value, and appreciation or depreciation incurred during the year. Such statement of investments shall also show investments sold or matured, and investments acquired, during the year, and the necessary details to show appreciation or depreciation until sale or maturity, or since acquisition, during the year.

7. (1) Contribution to the fund shall be obligatory for all permanent full time teachers approved for the purpose of the grant code (including such teachers while on probation) with the following exceptions—

- (a) those assessed on unqualified salary scales;
- (b) those over the age of 50 upon first appointment;
- (c) teachers who produce satisfactory evidence of continuing contributions to provident or superannuation funds approved by the Director;

(d) members of religious orders and congregations or missionary bodies in respect of whose needs adequate provision is made by such order, congregation or missionary body.

(2) Contribution shall be optional in respect of—

- (a) teachers falling within paragraph (c) of sub-rule (1);
- (b) salaried teachers falling within paragraph (d) of sub-rule (1).

The option shall be in writing and irrevocable and shall be made within two months after the date that the right to exercise such option shall accrue and shall be retrospective to that date.

8. (1) Contribution shall be five per cent of basic salaries including principals' allowances and except with the consent of the Director shall only be made in respect of periods during which full basic salary is paid. Contributions.

(2) The contribution shall be deducted from salaries monthly by each supervisor who shall within seven days credit such deduction so made to a bank account specified by the treasurer and forward bank receipt in respect thereof to such treasurer.

(3) It shall be the duty of the supervisor to maintain an independent complete account for each contributor in his school which shall specify—

- (a) contributions paid;
- (b) donations made by government in accordance with rule 9;
- (c) such further credits and debits for the previous year as shall have been notified to him by the treasurer.

(4) The total of each such account shall be reconciled annually with the treasurer, and the detail shall be available for inspection by the contributor.

9. (1) For each contribution by a contributor, government shall pay to such fund each month an equivalent sum, referred to herein as the donation. Government's donation.

(2) Such donation shall be forthwith credited to each contributor's account by the supervisor and by the treasurer.

10. (1) It shall be the duty of the treasurer monthly or so often as he shall deem fit to report to the board the state of the fund's cash balance, and in accordance with his recommendation or otherwise any balance which in the opinion of the board should be invested shall be invested by the Crown Agents in such securities as are authorized for investment of colonial government funds. Investment.

(2) Such realization of securities as shall in the opinion of the board be necessary shall be effected by the Crown Agents.

(3) The board may in its discretion and for a period of not more than twelve months in advance give instructions to the Crown Agents for the reinvestment of interest payments (which interest payments shall nevertheless still be dealt with in the fund's accounts as income), or the proceeds of securities upon maturity.

(4) Requests to the Crown Agents shall be made through the medium of the Accountant General who shall annually and whenever requested by the treasurer or auditor obtain from the Crown Agents a statement of investments showing the nominal value and middle market price of the securities held.

11. (1) There shall be constituted with effect from the year ending 31st August, 1953 a reserve fund which shall be contributed to each year— Reserve fund.

- (a) by the crediting each year of any appreciation in the value of investments over the value at the previous year;

Appointment of secretary and his duties.

Appointment of treasurer and his duties.

Contributors.

- (b) by the crediting of the proceeds of any realization upon sale or maturity during the year insofar as such proceeds exceed the value of a security at the previous year;
- (c) by the crediting of the net amount of donation and dividends standing to the credit of any contributor to whom the donation shall not be payable under rule 13;
- (d) by the allocation of such proportion of the income derived from investments as the board may deem fit, such proportion to be not less than 25% unless the reserve fund that year equals or exceeds the sum specified in sub-rule (4).
- (2) There shall be debited to the reserve fund—
- (a) any depreciation each year in the value of investments over the value at the previous year;
- (b) any loss incurred upon sale or maturity during the year having regard to the value of a security at the previous year;
- (c) such outgoings or losses incurred by the fund as the Governor may in special circumstances authorize or direct in writing.
- (3) To the extent that the reserve fund may in any year be insufficient to meet the items specified in the preceding paragraph such items shall be borne by the income of the fund and any excess shall be debited to contributors in accordance with the next rule.
- (4) To the extent that the reserve fund shall in any year, after crediting and debiting the items referred to in this rule, exceed a minimum sum equal to 15% of the total investments as revalued that year, any excess may in the discretion of the board be credited to members in accordance with the next rule.

Dividends
and debits to
contributors'
accounts.

12. (1) At each annual general meeting the board shall distribute to contributors' accounts by way of a percentage of such account according to the proportion each such account bears to the total amount to be distributed—

- (a) the income of the fund after providing for any expenses and for the percentage contributed to the reserve fund under paragraph (1)(d) of rule 11;
- (b) any credit being the excess available under sub-rule (4) of rule 11, to the extent that the board decide to distribute the same;
- (c) any debit sum being the excess which cannot be borne by the reserve fund under sub-rule (3) of rule 11.

(2) Such resultant dividend or debit shall be declared as a convenient percentage and any small resultant credit which cannot conveniently be so expressed shall be credited to the reserve fund.

Benefits.

13. (1) Whenever a contributor shall cease to be employed as a teacher in a grant school for any of the following reasons—

- (a) superannuation on reaching the prescribed age limit at any time up to the end of the year 1959;
- (b) voluntary retirement, after 10 years continuous contributory service;
- (c) compulsory retirement, after 10 years continuous contributory service, for any cause except crime, misconduct or bankruptcy;
- (d) voluntary or compulsory retirement on grounds of ill-health certified by a Government Medical Board as constituting reasonable cause for retirement;
- (e) removal of a school from the list of grant schools;
- (f) death, if at the time he was still a contributor,

his account shall be closed, and there shall be paid out under rule 14 the sum standing to his credit, including all Government donations and all dividends that may have been declared up to and including the date of his

retirement or death, or the date on which a school ceased to be a grant school. For the purposes of this rule, service may, subject to the approval of the Director, be reckoned as continuous contributory service even though it has been broken for short periods or includes periods of leave without pay. Such periods however shall not except in the case of approved study leave or sick leave count towards the qualifying period of 10 years.

(2) Whenever a contributor shall—

- (a) retire or resign after less than 10 years' continuous contributory service except for any reason approved in sub-rule (1);
- (b) be dismissed, or resign in order to avoid being dismissed, from service in a grant school after either more or less than 10 years' continuous contributory service, on account of crime, misconduct or bankruptcy,

his account shall be closed, and there shall be paid out under rule 14 a sum equal to the total amount contributed by him up to the date of retirement, resignation, or dismissal plus such dividends as have been declared on that contribution and less any amounts debited thereto: Provided that where a contributor has been dismissed for fraud or dishonesty, he shall, unless it is otherwise determined by the Board, forfeit all rights under these regulations, and the Board shall be entitled to repay out of any monies otherwise due to him a sum equal to the value of the money or goods which he may have misappropriated.

(3) The question whether or not any contributor has been guilty of crime or misconduct shall for the purpose of this regulation, but for no other purpose, be determined by the Board with an appeal to the Director whose decision shall be final and conclusive between the parties and shall not be called in question in any court of law.

14. (1) Payments due to contributors under these rules shall be certified by the secretary and treasurer, and cheques in respect thereof and in respect of all disbursements by the fund shall be signed by the chairman and treasurer.

Payments
out.

(2) Where a contributor's account has been closed under rule 13, no dividend or debit shall be carried thereto under rule 12, and if after notice has been published in the *Gazette* no lawful claim is made within three years from the date on which the account was closed, the amount standing to the credit of the account shall be transferred to the credit of the reserve fund.

15. (1) A contributor may nominate a person to whom he desires a sum not exceeding \$500 to be paid upon his death. Such a nomination shall be in a form satisfactory to the chairman and shall at the time of signature by the contributor be countersigned by such chairman and deposited for safe custody with the secretary.

Payments
upon death.

(2) If the amount standing to the credit of a deceased contributor exceeds the amount so specified, such amount shall be paid to the person so nominated and the balance to his estate.

(3) If no such nomination has been made payment shall be made to the legal personal representatives of the deceased, or if the Accountant General has given an authority in accordance with section 59 of the Probate and Administration Ordinance, to the person the Accountant General considers to be entitled thereto.

(Cap. 10.)

16. (1) As soon as possible after the 31st August in each year and in any case by the 1st November the treasurer shall submit the accounts of the fund to an auditor appointed by the Governor.

Audit and
annual
general
meeting.

(2) During the month of December in each year the board shall hold its annual general meeting at which the chairman shall if approved by the board sign a copy of the balance sheet, income and expenditure account, statement of investments and statement as to the reserve fund, for submission for the information of the Governor.

17. The prescribed age limit for retirement for the purpose of these rules shall be 60 years of age except in special cases approved by the Director.

Age limit for retirement.

18. The board shall whenever necessary transmit to the Governor through the Colonial Secretary a report upon the working of these rules, and shall report for the consideration of the Governor in Council whenever amendments to the same appear to be desirable.

Alteration to rules.

19. In any case of doubt as to the interpretation or application of these rules the decision of the Governor shall be final.

Decision of doubtful cases.

FOURTH SCHEDULE

[s. 45]

Grant Schools Building Depreciation Fund Rules, 1952.

1. These rules may be cited as the Grant Schools Building Depreciation Fund Rules, 1952.

Citation.

2. In these rules—
“annual grants” or “grants” means the annual building depreciation grants payable under these rules;

Interpretation.

“grant school premises” means premises owned by grant school authorities, which are used by classes for which a grant in aid is paid by Government and which are approved by the Director as eligible for a building depreciation grant, and shall not include any premises used as boarding or lodging accommodation for pupils or teachers;

“fund” and “board” respectively mean the building depreciation fund and board of control established under these rules.

3. The object of the fund is to provide for the replacement of grant school premises that become unfit for use as a result of deterioration, and for that purpose it shall take over and absorb the assets of the building depreciation fund managed by the education department since the 1st May, 1946.

Object of fund.

4. (1) The general administration of the fund shall be vested in a board of control composed of *ex-officio* and elected members as follows—

Administration.

- ex-officio* { a nominee of the grant schools council (who shall be chairman);
- the Accountant General, or his representative;
- elected — five grant school managers, or so many as may be elected;
- secretary — the accountant, education department;
- treasurer — to be appointed by the Accountant General (who may when authorized act as that officer's representative).

(2) Managers of the grant schools may if they so desire choose five from among themselves to be their representatives on the board and such representatives shall serve for a period of two years. If a representative resigns, or is unable to act, or is absent for more than three months from the Colony, another representative may be elected in his place to complete the two-yearly period.

(3) Elections of representatives to the board may be held as soon as is convenient after the coming into operation of the Ordinance, and thereafter at two-yearly intervals.

(4) At meetings of the board, four members shall form a quorum and the chairman shall have a casting vote.

(5) Government shall provide facilities for the keeping of the accounts of the fund.

5. (1) There shall be paid into the fund annual grants which the Director may make as provided in this rule.

Annual grants to fund.

(2) In respect of grant school premises owned by school authorities an annual grant may be made of not less than 1% and not more than 3% of their capital value. For the purpose of calculating this annual grant, the capital value of the grant school premises on which a grant is payable and the depreciation rate shall be settled by Government and such capital value shall be reduced by the sum of any capital grants and the outstanding portion of any interest free loans paid by Government for the erection of the buildings and further reduced each year by the building depreciation grant made for the previous year.

(3) If a school ceases to be a grant school, no contribution to the fund shall be payable for the period of such cessation, but the sum standing to its credit in the fund shall remain available (but without the addition of any dividend under rule 10 unless and until the school shall again become a grant school) for the re-building of the school premises in accordance with rule 3, until the Governor shall, in his complete discretion, consider that such amount shall be repaid to Government and shall so order.

6. (1) The grants shall be paid by the Director into an account with a bank approved by the board, and bank receipts therefor shall be forwarded to the treasurer. Such account shall be in the name “The Grant Schools Building Depreciation Fund”.

Disposal and investment.

(2) Whenever it shall appear to the board that sums held locally are surplus to the requirements of the Fund for meeting current expenses and foreseeable withdrawals, such surplus sums shall, at the request of the board, be remitted by the Accountant General to the Crown Agents for investment in the name of the fund in such securities as are authorized for investment of Colonial Government funds.

(3) Such investments shall be revalued annually by the treasurer of the fund on the 31st March or business day immediately preceding in accordance with the middle market prices in London at the close of business on such day. The accounts of the fund shall thereupon be adjusted, in the manner set out in these rules, to allow for any appreciation or depreciation in value that shall have taken place.

7. The treasurer of the fund shall keep full and complete accounts of the fund and of individual schools in accordance with these rules and shall as soon as possible after the 31st March in each year prepare an income and expenditure account for the year ended on the 31st March and a balance sheet as at that date. Appended to such balance sheet shall be a statement of the investments held by the fund which shall show against the name of each security, the nominal value, the middle market price at the 31st March, the market value at that date, the previous book value, and the amount of any appreciation or depreciation incurred during the year.

Accounts.

8. The books and accounts of the fund shall be audited each year by an auditor appointed by the board. As soon as possible after they have been prepared, the treasurer shall sign and furnish for audit the balance sheet, statement of investments, and income and expenditure account. After they have been audited, these statements, together with the auditor's report, shall be submitted by the treasurer for the information and approval of the board. After approval by the board, the balance sheet and income and expenditure account shall be signed by the chairman, and forwarded for the information of the Governor.

Audit and approval.

Income
account.

9. (1) All interest or dividends received in respect of investments shall be credited to an income account and, unless instructions are given by the board to the contrary, shall be reinvested by the Crown Agents in the name of the fund in authorized securities. If not reinvested the amount shall be paid to the bank account aforesaid.

(2) There shall also be credited to the income account any net appreciation in the value of the investments as shall have been revealed by the revaluation on the 31st March in each year. Conversely there shall be debited to the income account any net depreciation in the value of the investments similarly revealed.

(3) The income account shall also be credited with the proceeds of any capital gain and debited with the amount of any capital loss resulting from the sale of investments.

Dividends.

10. (1) On the occasion of each annual general meeting, which shall be held in June, the board shall distribute any available income and credit it to the accounts of the schools by way of dividend calculated according to the proportion of each school's credit balance to the aggregate sum of all such balances. Such dividend shall be declared as a convenient percentage and any small balance remaining over shall remain in the income account.

(2) If depreciation of investments should be such as to leave no net income available for distribution, any net loss there may be shall be debited to the individual accounts of schools in the manner prescribed for the crediting of dividends in sub-rule (1).

Notification
by treasurer.

11. The treasurer shall notify each school manager of any such income or loss and of the total of his account adjusted accordingly.

Withdrawals.

12. The fund shall be drawn upon solely for the purpose of re-building school premises in accordance with rule 3. Applications for withdrawal shall be made in the first instance to the secretary of the fund, who shall bring them to the notice of the board. If a clear majority of the board so recommends, and the Director approves, withdrawal shall be allowed.


Cheques.

13. All cheques drawn on the bank account of the fund shall be signed jointly by the chairman of the board and the treasurer.

Decision of
doubtful
cases.

14. In any case of doubt as to the interpretation or application of these rules the decision of the Governor shall be final.
