IMPROVING ENVIRONMENT REQUIRES COMMUNITY EFFORT: GOVERNOR

\* \* \* \* \*

IMPROVING THE ENVIRONMENT IS SOMETHING WHICH IS GOING TO NEED A GREAT DEAL OF EFFORT FROM THE WHOLE COMMUNITY, THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, SAID THIS (TUESDAY) EVENING.

SIR DAVID WAS SPEAKING IN AN INTERVIEW IN THE FIRST EPISODE OF A RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG ENVIRONMENT SERIES, "ALL ABOUT US", WHICH WAS SHOWN ON TELEVISION.

HE SAID THE TIME HAD COME FOR HONG KONG TO USE ITS INCREASED PROSPERITY, AND INCREASED AWARENESS OF THE PROBLEM, TO IMPROVE THE WHOLE OF THE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE GOOD OF THE WHOLE COMMUNITY.

"THIS IS SOMETHING WHICH INVOLVES THE GOVERNMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT IS DETERMINED TO PLAY ITS PART," SIR DAVID SAID.

HE POINTED OUT THAT DURING THE LAST 10 OR 20 YEARS HONG KONG HAD DEVELOPED AT A TREMENDOUS PACE, AND THIS HAD BROUGHT GREAT ADVANTAGES TO THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE AND HAD ALSO BROUGHT PROBLEMS.

"ONE OF THOSE PROBLEMS WHICH WE CAN SEE ALL AROUND US EVERY DAY IS THE PROBLEM OF POLLUTION," HE SAID.

REFERRING TO GOVERNMENT ACTION, HE SAID THERE WERE PLANS TO SPEND UP TO \$15 BILLION IN THE NEXT 10 YEARS IN INFRASTRUCTURAL PROJECTS TO IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENT.

SIR DAVID SAID IMPROVING THE ENVIRONMENT INVOLVED THE INDUSTRIALISTS THINKING ABOUT HOW TO DEAL WITH THE PROBLEM OF INDUSTRIAL WASTE.

AND, ABOVE ALL, IT INVOLVED EVERY INDIVIDUAL MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY.

THAT INVOLVEMENT RANGED FROM WHETHER OR NOT MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY SUPPORTED THE EFFORT BEING PUT INTO IMPROVING THE COMMUNITY, TO THE SIMPLE FACT OF WHETHER PEOPLE TOOK LITTER HOME FROM COUNTRY PARKS AND MADE THEIR OWN INDIVIDUAL EFFORT TO IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENT.

"I BELIEVE THE TIME HAS NOW COME WHEN ALL OF US AS A COMMUNITY WANT TO MAKE EFFORTS TO MAKE HONG KONG AN EVEN BETTER PLACE TO LIVE IN," SIR DAVID ADDED.

CONSULTATION ON THE SECURITIES REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT

\* \* \* \* \*

A TOTAL OF TWELVE SUBMISSIONS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC AND KEY ORGANISATIONS IN THE MARKETS ON VARIOUS RECOMMENDATIONS PUT FORWARD BY THE SECURITIES REVIEW COMMITTEE, THE SECRETARY FOR MONETARY AFFAIRS, MR DAVID NENDICK, SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON THE SECURITIES REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT ENDED YESTERDAY (MONDAY).

MAJOR ORGANISATIONS IN THE MARKETS INCLUDING THE TWO EXCHANGES, THE SECURITIES COMMISSION, THE COMMODITIES TRADING COMMISSION AND THE HONG KONG STOCKBROKERS ASSOCIATION HAVE EXPRESSED THEIR VIEWS ON MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE.

"ALL RESPONDENTS BROADLY WELCOME THE REPORT AND WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE EARLY IMPLEMENTATION OF ITS MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS," MR NENDICK SAID.

"IN PARTICULAR, THEY FAVOUR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INDEPENDENT REGULATORY AUTHORITY TO BRING GREATER EFFECTIVENESS TO THE REGULATION OF THE SECURITIES AND FUTURES MARKETS," HE ADDED.

MR NENDICK REITERATED THE GOVERNMENT'S FIRM COMMITMENT TO MAINTAINING HONG KONG'S STATUS AS AN INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL CENTRE AND TO PROCEED WITH THE SPEEDY IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SRC RECOMMENDATIONS.

"THE SPECIAL UNIT ESTABLISHED IN THE MONETARY AFFAIRS BRANCH FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATIONS IS NOW AT FULL SWING," HE SAID.

"HAVING CONSIDERED THE SUBMISSIONS AND VIEWS EXPRESSED BY MARKET USERS, THE GOVERNMENT WILL BE SEEKING THE ADVICE OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL ON MAJOR PROPOSALS IN THE SECURITIES REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE," HE ADDED.

"WE WILL CONTINUE TO LIAISE WITH RELEVANT PARTIES AND WILL CONSULT THEM AS AND WHEN WE FORMULATE DETAILED PROPOSALS BEFORE SUBMITTING THEM TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL FOR CONSIDERATION," SAID MR NENDICK.

FINANCE COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER DCA

\* \* \* \* \*

MEMBERS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE WILL BE ASKED TO NOTE THE TERMS OF THE 1988 DEFENCE COSTS AGREEMENT (DCA) WITH THE UNITED KINGDOM GOVERNMENT AT A MEETING TO BE HELD TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

THEY WILL ALSO BE ASKED TO APPROVE PROVISION OF \$1,407 MILLION FOR PAYMENT OF THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT'S CASH CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS THE COSTS OF THE GARRISON IN 1988-89 AND TO APPROVE THE PAYMENT OF \$266 MILLION TO COVER VALUE ADDED TAX (VAT) AND SALARIES TAX ON ALLOWANCES INCURRED UNDER THE 1981 DEFENCE COSTS AGREEMENT.

AMONG OTHER ITEMS ON THE AGENDA, THE FINANCE COMMITTEE WILL BE ASKED TO ACCEPT THE FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS FOR UPGRADING THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT'S COMPUTER SYSTEM AND OTHER EXPENSES LARGELY ASSOCIATED WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF SEPARATE SALARIES TAXATION FOR WORKING WIVES IN 1990.

THE NON-RECURRENT COST OF INTRODUCING THIS SEPARATE TAXATION AND MAKING OTHER IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SYSTEM IS ESTIMATED AT \$27,785,000.

THE ADDITIONAL ANNUAL RECURRENT COST INVOLVED IS ESTIMATED AT ABOUT \$23,282,000 FROM 1990-91 AND \$23,395,000 FROM 1991-92 ONWARDS.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS WILL ALSO BE ASKED TO APPROVE THE CREATION OF A NEW SUBHEAD "UPGRADING OF THE COMPUTER SYSTEM IN INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT" UNDER THE CAPITAL WORKS RESERVE FUND AND MAJOR EQUIPMENT SYSTEMS WITH A PROJECT ESTIMATE OF \$15,907,000.

THE SUM IS TO MEET THE CAPITAL COST OF UPGRADING THE COMPUTER SYSTEM REQUIRED FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF SEPARATE TAXATION AND TO SATISFY INCREASED PROCESSING DEMANDS.

13 QUESTIONS, 10 BILLS BEFORE LEGCO

MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL WILL ASK 13 QUESTIONS AND CONSIDER 10 BILLS IN THE COUNCIL MEETING TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

THE CHIEF SECRETARY WILL ALSO MOVE A MOTION THAT CERTAIN AMENDMENTS BE MADE TO THE COUNCIL'S STANDING ORDERS.

OF THE 10 BILLS, THREE WILL BE INTRODUCED FOR FIRST AND SECOND READINGS AND DEBATE ON THEM WILL THEN BE ADJOURNED.

THEY ARE THE SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (1987-88) BILL 1988, SOCIETIES (AMENDMENT) (NO. 3) BILL 1988, AND SUPPLEMENTARY MEDICAL PROFESSIONS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988.

THE OTHER BILLS ARE EACH DUE TO BE GIVEN A SECOND READING, AND THEN TO GO THROUGH THE COMMITTEE STAGE AND THIRD READING.

SIX OF THESE BILLS ARE THE BANKRUPTCY (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988, COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1988, DANGEROUS GOODS (CONSIGNMENT BY AIR) (SAFETY) (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988, COMPLEX COMMERCIAL CRIMES BILL 1988, SOCIETIES (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1988, AND EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988.

THE TENTH BILL IS A PRIVATE ONE, THE RAINIER INTERNATIONAL BANK (TRANSFER OF HONG KONG UNDERTAKING) BILL 1988.

LAY OFF PROVISIONS UNDER REVIEW

\* \* \* \* \*

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT IS CONSIDERING WHETHER THERE IS A NEED TO AMEND THE PROVISION ON "LAY OFF" UNDER SECTION 31E OF THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID A REVIEW ON THE SUBJECT IS NOW IN HAND.

THIS FOLLOWS A RECENT HIGH COURT RULING THAT SECTION 31E DOES NOT REFER TO THE NUMBER OF WORKING DAYS ON WHICH WORK IS PROVIDED BUT RATHER THE NUMBER OF WORKING DAYS IN ANY PERIOD OF FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS ON WHICH WORK IS NOT PROVIDED.

"THE HIGH COURT JUDGE THEREFORE RULED THAT AN EMPLOYEE SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE CONSTRUCTIVELY LAID OFF IF AN EMPLOYER DOES NOT PROVIDE WORK FOR 12 DAYS IN ANY FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE EXPLAINED THAT THE ORIGINAL INTENTION OF THE LAW IS TO REQUIRE EMPLOYERS TO PROVIDE A TOTAL OF AT LEAST 12 DAYS WORK IN ANY PERIOD OF FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS, WHICH IS A MINIMUM OF HALF THE NORMAL SUPPLY OF WORK.

"THIS INTERPRETATION HAS BEEN CONFIRMED BY LABOUR TRIBUNAL RULINGS IN THE PAST AND WAS ALSO CONFIRMED BY A HIGH COURT RULING ON JUNE 21, 1984," HE SAID.

"SO IN REPLY TO GENERAL ENQUIRIES, ADVICE BASED ON THE JUNE 1984 HIGH COURT DECISION HAS BEEN GIVEN BY LABOUR OFFICERS.

"BUT IN THE CASE OF AN ACTUAL DISPUTE, THE PARTIES WOULD NORMALLY BE REFERRED TO THE ORIGINAL TEXT OF THE LAW OR ASKED TO SEEK ADVICE FROM THEIR LAWYERS ON FINE POINTS OF LAW."

THE SPOKESMAN NOTED THAT THE PRESENT WORDING OF THE LAW IS CAPABLE OF DIFFERENT INTERPRETATIONS AND THE SITUATION IS BY NO MEANS SATISFACTORY.

TO AVOID DISPUTES, PARTICULARLY IN TIMES OF SHORTAGE OF ORDERS, HE ADVISED MANagements TO ADVISE BETTER MANPOWER PLANS SO THAT AT LEAST 13 DAYS WORK CAN BE PROVIDED IN ANY PERIOD OF FOUR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS.

#### SEMINAR ON LABOUR INSPECTION OPENS

A THREE-DAY RESIDENTIAL SEMINAR ON SELF-REGULATORY AND PARTICIPATORY APPROACHES IN LABOUR INSPECTION WAS OPENED AT THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY, SHA TIN, TODAY (TUESDAY).

IT IS ORGANISED JOINTLY BY THE INTERNATIONAL LABOUR ORGANISATION'S ASIAN REGIONAL PROJECT FOR LABOUR ADMINISTRATION (ARPLA) AND THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY WERE THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR TONY HAMMOND; THE CHIEF TECHNICAL ADVISER OF ARPLA, MR A.N.A.H. SIDDIQUI; MR MUINUDDIN KHAN OF ARPLA IN BANGKOK; CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF TRADE UNIONS, MR CHENG YIU-TONG; AND CHAIRMAN OF THE PUBLICITY PROGRAMME SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND HEALTH COMMITTEE, MR K.Y. TONGSON.

MORE THAN 70 PERSONNEL ENGAGED IN SAFETY AND HEALTH ACTIVITIES IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND 10 FACTORY INSPECTORS OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT ARE TAKING PART.

THE SEMINAR PROVIDES A FORUM FOR PARTICIPANTS TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE PROMOTION OF SAFETY AND HEALTH AT WORK.

TOPICS TO BE DISCUSSED INCLUDE RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN LABOUR INSPECTION IN OTHER COUNTRIES, PRINCIPLES OF SELF-REGULATORY SAFETY MOVEMENT, CONCEPT OF IN-PLANT SAFETY PROGRAMMES, OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND HYGIENE, CONSTRUCTION SITE SAFETY, AND WORK OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S FACTORY INSPECTORATE DIVISION.

AS PART OF THE SEMINAR, THE PARTICIPANTS WILL BE TAKEN ON A TOUR OF A BREWERY AND A CAN-MAKING FACTORY AT THE TAIPO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE TO FAMILIARISE THEMSELVES WITH SAFETY MANAGEMENT THERE.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE INDEPENDENT COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY TO BE ESTABLISHED TO CONSIDER THE 1988 CIVIL SERVICE PAY DISPUTE HAVE BEEN AGREED BETWEEN THE OFFICIAL SIDE AND THE STAFF SIDE OF THE SENIOR CIVIL SERVICE COUNCIL AT A MEETING TODAY (TUESDAY).

THE AGREED TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY ARE:-

"HAVING REGARD TO GOVERNMENT'S DECLARED POLICY THAT CIVIL SERVICE PAY AND FRINGE BENEFITS SHOULD BE BROADLY COMPARABLE WITH THOSE PAID BY GOOD EMPLOYERS IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND TAKING INTO ACCOUNT -

- (A) THE NEED TO ATTRACT AND RETAIN STAFF OF A CALIBRE CAPABLE OF PROVIDING AN EFFICIENT SERVICE;
- (B) THE NEED TO MAINTAIN STAFF MORALE;
- (C) DIFFERENCES IN THE PAY PACKAGE, EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES AND WORKING CONDITIONS BETWEEN THE CIVIL SERVICE AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR;
- (D) THE NEED FOR CIVIL SERVANTS TO SHARE IN THE EFFECTS OF CHANGES IN THE ECONOMY; AND
- (E) GENERAL BUDGETARY CONSIDERATIONS,

THE COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY IS REQUIRED TO:

- (A) REVIEW THE METHODOLOGY EMPLOYED IN THE 1987-88 PAY TREND SURVEY AND THE INTERPRETATION OF ITS FINDINGS;
- (B) REVIEW AND ADVISE SPECIFICALLY ON THE 1988 PAY ADJUSTMENT IN THIS LIGHT; AND
- (C) CONSIDER THE METHODOLOGY AND FINDINGS OF THE 1986 PAY LEVEL SURVEY AND COMMENT ON THEIR VALIDITY AS A BASIS FOR MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO CIVIL SERVICE PAY;

AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS."

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT STEPS WERE BEING TAKEN TO APPOINT THE CHAIRMAN AND TWO MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY, WHICH WAS EXPECTED TO START WORK SOON.

#### BELGIAN BUSINESSMEN TOLD OF HK OPPORTUNITIES

\* \* \* \*

THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR TRADE AND INVESTMENT THAT HONG KONG OFFERS WERE OUTLINED BY THE SECRETARY FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY, MR HAMISH MACLEOD, IN BRUSSELS TODAY (TUESDAY).

ADDRESSING A MEETING OF THE BELGIUM-HONG KONG SOCIETY, MR MACLEOD ALSO GAVE AN ANALYSIS OF CURRENT TRADE TRENDS AND DEALT WITH HONG KONG'S EXPANDING ECONOMIC LINKS WITH CHINA AND OTHER PACIFIC BASIN COUNTRIES.

HE SAID THERE SEEMED TO BE A GROWING, IF BELATED, RECOGNITION IN EUROPE OF THE IMPORTANCE OF THE PACIFIC BASIN.

REFERRING TO THE CHINA TRADE, MR MACLEOD EXPLAINED HOW CHINA HAD IN RECENT YEARS REPLACED THE UNITED STATES AS HONG KONG'S LARGEST TRADING PARTNER, WITH THE TERRITORY TO SOME EXTENT RESUMING ITS TRADITIONAL ENTREPOT ROLE.

HE SAID THAT CHINA'S OPENING UP TO TRADE, COUPLED WITH A VERY TIGHT LABOUR SITUATION IN HONG KONG, HAD LED TO MOVEMENT OF LABOUR-INTENSIVE PROCESSES OVER THE BORDER, WITH AN ESTIMATED ONE TO TWO MILLION CHINESE WORKERS DOING SUB-CONTRACTING WORK FOR HONG KONG.

THIS, MR MACLEOD STRESSED, DID NOT MEAN THAT HONG KONG HAD CEASED TO BE A MANUFACTURING/EXPORTING CENTRE. WHILE SIMPLER PROCESSES HAD MOVED TO CHINA, MARKETING, DESIGN AND MANAGEMENT REMAINED IN HONG KONG.

MR MACLEOD LISTED THE ATTRACTIONS OF INVESTING IN HONG KONG: GOOD COMMUNICATIONS, LOW TAX, STABLE AND PREDICTABLE GOVERNMENT, LACK OF RED TAPE, TARIFFS AND SO ON AND A HARD WORKING LABOUR FORCE.

HE SAID THE BEST PROSPECTS FOR INVESTMENT COULD BE FOUND IN ELECTRONICS, METAL AND HEAVY ENGINEERING AND IN THE ELECTRICAL INDUSTRY.

HE WAS SURE THAT BELGIUM, AS A LEADING MANUFACTURER AND TRADER, COULD GREATLY BENEFIT FROM TRADE AND INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES IN HONG KONG.

ON THE FUTURE, MR MACLEOD SAID HE HOPED THAT THOSE WHO BELIEVED IN FREE TRADE COULD RESIST PROTECTIONIST PRESSURE. TOUCHING ON HONG KONG'S BROADER ROLE IN TRADE AND ECONOMICS, HE STRESSED THAT HONG KONG WAS A GOOD MARKET IN ITS OWN RIGHT.

HONG KONG, HE POINTED OUT, COULD BOAST A BUOYANT ECONOMY AND HE HOPED THAT THOSE PRESENT WOULD TAKE ADVANTAGE OF IT, WHETHER AS MANUFACTURER, EXPORTER OR INVESTOR.

MORE THAN 60 SENIOR INDUSTRIALISTS, DIPLOMATS, AND OFFICIALS FROM THE BELGIAN GOVERNMENT AND THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION ATTENDED THE MEETING.

THE THIRD TERM KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD HAS PUBLISHED A REPORT ON ITS WORK DURING THE PERIOD FROM APRIL, 1985 TO THE END OF MARCH THIS YEAR.

ACCORDING TO THE 90-PAGE FULL COLOUR REPORT, THE BOARD HAD DEALT WITH VARIOUS DISTRICT MATTERS INVOLVING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT, TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, SOCIAL SERVICES AND HOUSING.

/IT HAD .....

IT HAD ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE WELFARE OF THE YOUTH AND THE ELDERLY, THE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL NEEDS OF LOCAL RESIDENTS AS WELL AS PARTICIPATED IN A MAJOR FUND-RAISING CHARITY EVENT.

IN THE AREA OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT, SOME 580 ILLEGAL STRUCTURES WERE DEMOLISHED IN THE 15 CLEARANCE OPERATIONS UNDER THE 'FAR-FLING' PROGRAMME.

TENDERS ARE BEING INVITED BY THE TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT TO UPGRADE TRANSPORT AND SEWAGE FACILITIES AND CARRY OUT RECLAMATION WORKS AS PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF TAI PO NEW TOWN.

THE CONTRACT WORKS WOULD INCLUDE THE UPGRADING OF THE EXISTING TING KOK ROAD FROM TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE TO PLUMMER VILLAGE, TOTALLING 0.6 KILOMETRE, AND THE EXTENSION OF A SEGREGATED CYCLE TRACK FROM TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE TO TAI MEI TUK WITH A TOTAL LENGTH OF 6.5 KILOMETRES.

IT WOULD ALSO INVOLVE THE RECLAMATION OF ABOUT THREE HECTARES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED AT TAI MEI TUK TO PROVIDE LAND FOR CONSTRUCTION OF TRANSPORT FACILITIES SUCH AS A BUS TERMINUS AND PARKING LOTS, AND THE PROVISION OF A SEWER TO EXTEND THE EXISTING SEWERAGE SYSTEM FROM THE TAI PO INDUSTRIAL ESTATE TO SAM MUN TSAI.

THE CONSTRUCTION OF A FOUR-METRE WIDE SURFACED TRACK TO MAINTAIN VILLAGE ACCESS AND THE REPROVISIONING OF TWO EXISTING PIERS ARE ALSO INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT.

CONSTRUCTION WORKS WOULD START IN OCTOBER 1988 AND TAKE TWO YEARS TO COMPLETE.

MOTORISTS SHOULD WATCH OUT FOR A SERIES OF TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS TO BE IMPLEMENTED IN SHEUNG SHUI FROM 10 AM ON FRIDAY (JULY 8), THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED.

THE MEASURES ARE TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC CIRCULATION IN THE AREA.

UNDER THE ARRANGEMENTS, THE SECTION OF LUNG SUM AVENUE BETWEEN JOCKEY CLUB ROAD AND SHEUNG SHUI ALLIANCE PRIMARY SCHOOL WILL BE RE-ROUTED FROM ONE-WAY WESTBOUND TO TWO-WAY TRAFFIC.

AS A RESULT, MOTORISTS WILL BE ABLE TO DRIVE ALONG JOCKEY CLUB ROAD AND LUNG SUM AVENUE TO THE SHEUNG SHUI KCR STATION.

THE FOLLOWING ROAD SECTIONS WILL BE MADE URBAN CLEARWAYS:

- \* THE WESTBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF LUNG SUM AVENUE FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH JOCKEY CLUB ROAD TO A POINT ABOUT 200 METRES WEST OF THE SAME JUNCTION WILL BECOME A PEAK-HOUR (I.E. 7 AM TO 10 AM AND 4 PM TO 7 PM) DAILY URBAN CLEARWAY.
