SOCIAL PROGRAMMES MAKING GOOD PROGRESS

* * * * *

THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, SAID IN LONDON LAST NIGHT HONG KONG WAS WITHIN SIGHT OF OVERCOMING THE SOCIAL DEFICIENCIES IMPOSED ON IT BY HISTORY.

ADDRESSING THE DIPLOMATIC AND COMMONWEALTH WRITERS ASSOCIATION IN LONDON, HE SAID THAT THE MASSIVE PROGRAMMES IN HOUSING, EDUCATION, MEDICAL AND SOCIAL SECURITY WERE MAKING GOOD PROGRESS AND HE EXPECTED THE TARGETS TO BE ACHIEVED IN SIX YEARS.

THE MOST PRESSING PROBLEM, HE SAID, HAD BEEN HOUSING. BUT WITH THE PUBLIC HOUSING PROGRAMME NOW IN TOP GEAR THE PROBLEM OF HOUSING AS IT NOW EXISTS SHOULD BE BEHIND US BY 1983/84.

NEXT TO A LIVELIHOOD AND HOUSING, EDUCATION WAS NEXT PRIORITY, HE SAID, AND THE AIM HERE WAS TO BUILD A PUBLIC SECTOR OF EDUCATION THAT WOULD CATER FOR ALL UP TO THE END OF JUNIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL.

+BY 1971 SUFFICIENT PROGRESS HAD BEEN MADE FOR PRIMARY EDUCATION TO BE UNIVERSAL, FREE AND COMPULSORY. THE PROGRAMME HAS BEEN PUSHED FORWARD AND NEXT YEAR, SEPTEMBER 1978, THE JUNIOR SECONDARY COURSE WILL ALSO BECOME UNIVERSAL AND FREE, AND A YEAR LATER WILL BE MADE COMPULSORY,+ HE SAID.

IN THE TERTIARY SECTOR, HE ADDED, THE OPPORTUNITIES WERE FOR 17.9 PER CENT OF THE AGE GROUP- BY 1981 THE FIGURE WOULD BE 23 PER CENT AND, UNDER CURRENT PLANS, 27 PER CENT BY 1986.

SIR MURRAY TOLD THE ASSOCIATION THAT MEDICAL ATTENTION IN HONG KONG WAS RELATIVELY GOOD AND, DESPITE THE ABSENCE OF A NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE, MEDICAL ATTENTION WAS AVAILABLE TO ALL AND PROVIDED AT A LOWER COST TO PATIENTS THAN IN BRITAIN.

MAJOR NEW PROJECTS BETWEEN NOW AND 1983, HE ADDED, INCLUDED THREE MAJOR HOSPITALS OF OVER 1,200 BEDS, PLUS A WHOLE STRING OF CLINICS.

SIR MURRAY SAID HONG KONG HAD COME A LONG WAY FROM A +REFUGEE CITY+ TO ONE OF THE WORLD'S LEADING INDUSTRIAL AND TRADING TERRITORIES. +ITS PEOPLE ENJOY A STANDARD OF LIVING WHICH IS HIGH BY ASIAN STANDARDS AND WHICH IS IMPROVING.+

IN HIS WIDE RANGING SPEECH, SIR MURRAY ALSO SPOKE ON THE POLICE, ICAC AND HONG KONG'S TEXTILES.

ASKED WHETHER HE FELT THAT HE HAD HAD NO OPTION BUT TO DECLARE A PARTIAL AMNESTY, THE GOVERNOR SAID: +NO, IT WAS A MOMENT OF VERY CONSIDERABLE DANGER. THERE WAS CONSIDERABLE PUBLIC FEELING AT THE TIME IN FAVOUR OF PART OF THE CASE OF THE POLICE AND THE TOTAL UNITY OF OPINION SUBSEQUENTLY ACHIEVED, I AM SURE, WAS BASED ON A SENSE OF FAIRNESS OF THE AMNESTY.+

IN ANSWER TO ANOTHER QUESTION AS TO WHETHER THE PRESENCE OF BRITISH TROOPS IN HONG KONG WAS A FACTOR CONTRIBUTING TO STABILITY, SIR MURRAY SAID HE BELIEVED THEIR PRESENCE WAS OF IMPORTANCE, BUT HE MADE IT CLEAR THAT THE USE OF THE GARRISON WAS NOT CONTEMPLATED AT THE TIME.

EARLIER, SIR MURRAY SAID HE HAD NO FEAR FOR THE FUTURE OF ICAC AND THE IMPORTANCE OF ITS OPERATION.

SINCE ITS ESTABLISHMENT IN 1974, HE SAID, THE ICAC HAD CHANGED MUCH IN HONG KONG THAT MANY HAD REGARDED AS UNCHANGEABLE. +ITS OBJECTIVE WAS NOTHING SHORT OF A REVOLUTION IN PUBLIC ATTITUDES TO CORRUPTION.+

SIR MURRAY EXPRESSED GREAT SYMPATHY FOR THE MAJORITY OF HONEST MEN WHO MAKE UP THE POLICE FORCE WHICH, HE SAID, HAD ACHIEVED MUCH DESPITE THE UNSETTLING EFFECT ANTI-CORRUPTION MEASURES HAD HAD ON THE HONEST MEN IN THE FORCE.

+YOU CAN ALSO IMAGINE THE RESENTMENT OF THE HONEST AS EACH NEW COURT CASE RELEASED DIRECT OR INDIRECT CRITICISM ON THE FORCE AS A WHOLE,+ HE ADDED.

THE FORCE WAS NOW PERFORMING ITS DUTY IN AN EXEMPLARY MANNER, HE SAID. +NEVERTHELESS, RECENT EVENTS HAVE REVEALED MAJOR PROBLEMS OF MORALE, DISCIPLINE AND COMMUNICATION AND MUTUAL CONFIDENCE AT ALL LEVELS, WHICH MUST NOW BE CAREFULLY AND SYMPATHETICALLY STUDIED AND CORRECTED.

+IT WILL BE MY MAJOR CONCERN IN THE NEXT YEAR TO SEE THAT THIS IS DONE,+ SIR MURRAY SAID.

SIR MURRAY ALSO SAID IN REPLY TO ANOTHER QUESTION THAT THE AMNESTY HAD NOT HARMED RELATIONS WITH CHINA IN ANY WAY.

IN HIS ADDRESS, HE HAD NOTED THAT SINO-BRITISH RELATIONS REMAINED EXCELLENT. +INDEED IN THE 30 YEARS THAT I HAVE BEEN CONCERNED WITH ANGLO-CHINESE RELATIONS, I HAVE NEVER KNOWN THEM TO BE BETTER.+

THIS ALSO APPLIED TO RELATIONS WITH CHINA ABOUT HONG KONG, SIR MURRAY SAID, CITING AS EXAMPLES CHINA'S SPECIAL EFFORTS TO SUPPLY MORE WATER TO HONG KONG AND CHINA'S RECENT INVESTMENTS IN BANKS, RETAIL BUSINESS, REAL ESTATE AND SOME INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT.

+I THINK THIS PICTURE OF BUSY COMMERCIAL NORMALCY IS ONE FROM WHICH WE CAN TAKE CONFIDENCE FOR THE FUTURE,+ HE SAID.

ON HONG KONG'S TEXTILE TRADE, SIR MURRAY SAID THAT THE TERMS WHICH THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY WAS DEMANDING OF HONG KONG +ARE UNPRECEDENTEDLY HARSH AND COMPLETELY OUT OF LINE WITH PREVIOUS AGREEMENTS.+

HE SAID THE TALKS WERE OF VITAL IMPORTANCE TO HONG KONG AS THE TEXTILE AND CLOTHING INDUSTRIES EMPLOY HALF OF HONG KONG'S INDUSTRIAL WORKFORCE AND PROVIDE ABOUT HALF OF HONG KONG'S DOMESTIC EXPORTS.

SIR MURRAY SAID THERE WAS MUCH AT STAKE, AND NOT ONLY FOR HONG KONG, BUT HE EMPHASISED THAT +WHILE FAILURE TO REACH AGREEMENT COULD BE DIRE, SO TOO COULD BE THE WRONG SORT OF AGREEMENT.+

APPOINTMENT OF ICAC COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

A COMMITTEE HAS BEEN SET UP UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE HON. SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN TO MONITOR COMPLAINTS AGAINST THE ICAC.

THE COMMITTEE TO BE CALLED +ICAC COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE+ WOULD COMPRISE: DR. THE HON. S.Y. CHUNG, THE HON. Q.W. LEE, THE HON. MRS. JOYCE SYMONS, THE HON. J.H. BREMRIDGE, THE HON. R.H. LOBO, DR. THE HON. R.L. HUANG AND A LAW OFFICER.

THE ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY OF UMEICO AND AN OFFICER OF THE ICAC WILL SERVE AS JOINT SECRETARIES.

THE TERMS OF REFERENCE OF THE COMMITTEE ARE:

- * TO MONITOR AND WHERE IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE TO REVIEW THE HANDLING BY THE ICAC OF COMPLAINTS BY ANYONE AGAINST THE ICAC AND OFFICERS OF THE ICAC.
- * TO IDENTIFY ANY FAULTS IN ICAC PROCEDURES WHICH LEAD OR MIGHT LEAD TO COMPLAINTS, AND,
- * WHEN IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COMMISSIONER OF THE ICAC OR, WHEN CONSIDERED NECESSARY, TO THE GOVERNOR.

THE TERM OF THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMITTEE IS FROM TODAY (DECEMBER 1, 1977) TO DECEMBER 31, 1978.

THE COMMITTEE IS TO SUBMIT A SUMMARY OF THE CASES IT HAS CONSIDERED TO THE GOVERNOR SIX MONTHS AFTER ITS ESTABLISHMENT AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER.

BANKING DEPOSITS AT THE END OF OCTOBER 1977 STOOD AT \$50,301 MILLION, COMPRISING \$12,105 MILLION IN DEMAND DEPOSITS, \$18,317 MILLION IN TIME DEPOSITS AND \$19,879 MILLION IN SAVINGS DEPOSITS.

THERE WERE 74 LICENSED BANKS IN HONG KONG AT THE END OF OCTOBER.

MORE BUILDING PLANS APPROVED IN OCTOBER

* * *

A TOTAL OF 74 NEW BUILDING PLANS WERE APPROVED IN OCTOBER BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, COMPARED WITH 69 IN THE SAME MONTH LAST YEAR.

THIS BROUGHT TO 669, THE NUMBER OF BUILDING PLANS APPROVED FOR THE FIRST TEN MONTHS OF THIS YEAR.

OF THE 74 NEW PLANS APPROVED, 19 WERE FOR BUILDINGS ON HONG KONG ISLAND, 22 FOR KOWLOON AND 33 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THEY INCLUDED PLANS FOR A SCHOOL AT THE JUNCTION OF LA SALLE ROAD AND BOUNDARY STREET, A CHILDREN'S CENTRE AT TAI PO, A SUPERMARKET AT SAI KUNG, A CHAPEL AT CORNWALL STREET AND A RECREATIONAL GROUND AT CHI FU FA YUEN ESTATE.

THE TOTAL DECLARED COST OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH WAS \$163.31 MILLION, COMPARED WITH \$185.03 MILLION IN OCTOBER 1976.

THE TOTAL USABLE FLOOR AREA OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED DURING THE MONTH AMOUNTED TO 156,733 SQUARE METRES, COMPRISING 103,272 SQUARE METRES OF NON-DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA AND 53,461 SQUARE METRES OF DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA.

DURING THE MONTH, THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE GAVE CONSENT FOR WORK TO START ON 44 NEW BUILDING PROJECTS, INCLUDING A SCHOOL EXTENSION AT WONG CHUK HANG ROAD, A NAUTICAL STUDIES BUILDING AT HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC, A LECTURE HALL COMPLEX AT THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG AND A BUDDHIST HALL AT MA WAN.

THIRTY-NINE NEWLY COMPLETED BUILDINGS WERE CERTIFIED FOR OCCUPATION DURING THE MONTH, INCLUDING AN ELECTRICITY SUB-STATION AT TUEN MUN NEW TOWN, A CHURCH AT KWUN TONG AND A POWER STATION AT AP LEI CHAU.

THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE ALSO CONSENTED TO THE DEMOLITION OF 27 BUILDINGS.

GOVERNMENT DOCTORS HAVE AMPLE CHANCES
FOR PROMOTION AND ADVANCEMENT
* * * * *

WITH THE GRADUAL EXPANSION OF MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES, DOCTORS IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE WILL HAVE AMPLE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PROMOTION AND ADVANCEMENT PROVIDED THEY +DO NOT SUCCEMB TO THE LURE OF PRIVATE PRACTICE.+

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES (MEDICAL), DR. S.F. LAM, SAID THIS TODAY IN A TALK TO THE LIONS CLUB OF CASTLE PEAK.

SPEAKING ON THE PROBLEMS CONFRONTING THE DEPARTMENT, DR. LAM POINTED OUT THE DISCREPANCY BETWEEN THE RENUMERATION THAT IS PAID TO DOCTORS IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE AND WHAT SOME OF THEIR COUNTERPARTS COULD EARN IN PRIVATE PRACTICE.

+THIS DISCREPANCY WHICH APPEARS TO BE WIDENING IS CAUSING US SOME CONCERN,+ HE SAID.

IN HIS PERSONAL OPINION, HE SAID, THIS WAS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT CAUSES WHY DOCTORS LEAVE THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE.

+HOW TO BRIDGE THIS GAP AND NOT UPSET THE WHOLE SALARY STRUCTURE OF THE CIVIL SERVICE IS AN INTRIGUING PROBLEM THAT NEEDS THE GENUS OF A MILTON FRIEDMAN PLUS THE GUILLE OF A WILBER SMITH,+ HE SAID.

+BE THAT AS IT MAY, WE ARE LOOKING INTO WAYS AND MEANS OF BRIDGING THIS GAP AND WE HOPE TO COME UP WITH SOME WORKABLE SOLUTION,+ HE ADDED.

ON THE QUESTION OF ALLOCATION OF FUNDS, DR. LAM SAID ALL SERVICE UNITS WOULD LIKE A LARGER SLICE OF THE FINANCIAL CAKE.

+WHEN THIS IS APPORTIONED THE DIFFICULTY BEGINS AS TO HOW IT SHOULD BE DIVIDED TO MEET THE VARIOUS NEEDS OF THE SERVICE, BEARING IN MIND THAT EACH AND EVERY DISCIPLINE CAN MAKE OUT JUST AS STRONG A CASE AS TO WHY THEY SHOULD BE GIVEN MORE,+ HE SAID.

HOWEVER, DR. LAM SAID THERE WERE CERTAIN PRINCIPLES WHICH WERE USED AS GUIDELINES.

+THE MOST IMPORTANT IS THAT WE ARE A SERVICE DEPARTMENT AND OUR FIRST AIM IS TO SEE THAT THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY ARE CATERED FOR= THE URGENCY IS DETERMINED BY THE IMPORTANCE TO LIFE AND THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE AFFLICTED BY THE AILMENT.+

FOR EXAMPLE, HE SAID, PRIORITY MUST BE GIVEN TO TREATING THE COMMON EMERGENCIES LIKE ACUTE APPENDICITIS AND PERFORATED DUODENAL ULCERS RATHER THAN SOME HIGHLY SOPHISTICATED SURGERIES WHICH BENEFIT ONLY A FEW.

DR. LAM SAID GOVERNMENT DOCTORS HAVE CONTRIBUTED MUCH TO PROVIDING THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG A MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICE WHICH THEY COULD BE PROUD OF.

+UNFORTUNATELY LIKE MOST THINGS, THE GOOD THAT THEY HAVE DONE IS SUBMERGED BY THE UNWARRANTED BAD PUBLICITY BROUGHT ABOUT BY THE MISDEEDS OF A FEW,+ HE SAID.
