HOUSING PRIORITY FOR FAMILIES JUSTIFIED - FORD  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE PRESENT POLICY OF GIVING PRIORITY TO FAMILIES IS WELL JUSTIFIED IN A SITUATION WHERE SUBSIDISED PUBLIC HOUSING IS LIMITED.

THIS WAS STATED BY THE SECRETARY FOR HOUSING, MR DAVID FORD, AT A MEETING WITH A GROUP OF URBAN COUNCILLORS AND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS THIS AFTERNOON.

+EVEN THOUGH WE PRODUCE 35 000 FLATS A YEAR WE HAVE TO ESTABLISH PRIORITY AND SOME DESERVING GROUPS OF PEOPLE WILL BE DISAPPOINTED,+ MR FORD ADDED.

+THIS IS NOT TO SAY THAT WE HAVE IGNORED THE HOUSING NEEDS OF SINGLE PEOPLE. WE DO PROVIDE PERMANENT HOUSING FOR SINGLE PEOPLE ON A SHARED BASIS WHEN THEY ARE ELDERLY OR IN COMPASSIONATE CASES.

+SOME 17 PER CENT OR ABOUT 30 000 OF THE 190 000 SINGLE PERSONS IN HONG KONG ARE LIVING IN OUR ESTATES AND ABOUT 30 TO 40 PER CENT OF THE SINGLE PERSONS AFFECTED BY OUR DEVELOPMENT CLEARANCES ARE PROVIDED WITH PERMANENT HOUSING ON THE SAME BASIS.

+FOR THOSE SINGLE PEOPLE WHO DO NOT FALL INTO THESE CATEGORIES AND WISH TO BE HOUSED BY THE GOVERNMENT, DECENT HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION IS PROVIDED,+ MR FORD SAID.

THE SECRETARY POINTED OUT THAT EVEN THE AGED, INFIRMED OR HANDICAPPED WERE CARED FOR BY WELFARE AGENCIES IN HOSTELS, AND ABLE-BODIED SINGLE PEOPLE COULD HARDLY CLAIM BETTER TREATMENT.

REFERRING TO A GROUP OF SINGLE PEOPLE STAGING A PROTEST OUTSIDE THE SECRETARIAT, MR FORD NOTED THAT SOME OF THE PROTESTERS HAD CLAIMED THE HOSTELS MADE AVAILABLE WERE TOO FAR FROM THEIR PLACES OF WORK. HE THEREFORE SUGGESTED THAT THESE PEOPLE WOULD HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY, ON A FIRST-COME-FIRST-SERVED BASIS, TO MOVE TO A HOSTEL WHICH WOULD BE BUILT AT TSUEN WAN LATER THIS YEAR. MEANWHILE, THEY COULD MOVE INTO TRANSIT ACCOMMODATION IN TSUEN WAN PENDING THE COMPLETION OF THE NEW HOSTEL.

POLYTECHNIC TO OFFER DEGREE COURSE IN DESIGN  
\* \* \*

APPROVAL HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR A FURTHER DEGREE COURSE TO BE CONDUCTED AT THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC.

THE THREE-YEAR COURSE IN DESIGN (GRAPHIC DESIGN AND INDUSTRIAL DESIGN) WILL LEAD TO THE AWARD OF A BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE. DUE TO START IN 1984-85, IT WILL INITIALLY CATER TO 60 STUDENTS.

IT IS GEARED TOWARDS HELPING THE STUDENTS DEVELOP PROFESSIONAL EXPERTISE IN VARIOUS AREAS OF DESIGN WORK AND SHOULD CONTRIBUTE TOWARDS HONG KONG'S EFFORTS TO PRODUCE MORE ORIGINAL CONSUMER PRODUCT DESIGNS AND TO IMPROVE STANDARDS IN GRAPHIC DESIGN SUCH AS ILLUSTRATION, AUDIO-VISUAL DESIGN AND PHOTOGRAPHY.

THE DEGREE PROGRAMME HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE GOVERNMENT ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE AND FOLLOWING THE ADVICE OF THE COUNCIL FOR NATIONAL ACADEMIC AWARDS.

APPROVAL WAS GIVEN EARLIER FOR FIVE OTHER DEGREE COURSES TO BE OFFERED AT THE POLYTECHNIC, BEGINNING IN 1983-84. THESE ARE IN SOCIAL WORK, COMPUTER STUDIES, APPLIED SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS, ELECTRONIC ENGINEERING AND MECHANICAL ENGINEERING.

PUBLIC WARNED AGAINST EATING PUFFER FISH  
\* \* \* \*

THE PUBLIC ARE TODAY WARNED AGAINST EATING PUFFER FISH WHICH CAN RESULT IN FATAL CASES OF FOOD POISONING.

THE WARNING WAS REPEATED BY A SPOKESMAN FOR THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT FOLLOWING A COMPLAINT THAT THE FISH IS AVAILABLE FOR SALE IN THE LOCAL MARKET.

THE SPOKESMAN RECALLED THAT IN FEBRUARY THIS YEAR, A MAN DIED AND TWO OTHERS BECAME SERIOUSLY ILL AFTER EATING PUFFER FISH.

+THE POISON IN THE FISH CONCENTRATES IN THE INTERNAL ORGANS AND DIFFUSES INTO THE FLESH,+ HE EXPLAINED.

+NORMALLY, THE POISON IS MORE CONCENTRATED IN SUMMER AND THE MORE COLOURFUL THE SPECIES ARE, THE MORE POISONOUS THE FISH IS LIKELY TO BE.

+AS THE TOXIN LEVEL PRESENT IN PUFFER FISH VARIES FROM FISH TO FISH AND FROM SEASON TO SEASON, THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO GUARANTEE OF SAFETY FOR ANY PERSON WHO EATS SUCH FISH.+

THE SPOKESMAN NOTED THAT HEALTH STAFF OF THE DEPARTMENT ARE KEEPING A CLOSE WATCH ON THE SALE OF THE FISH IN THE MARKET.

CIRCULAR LETTERS HAVE ALSO BEEN SENT TO FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS ADVISING THEM NOT TO OFFER THE FISH FOR SALE AS FOOD ON DISHES.

UNDER THE FOOD AND DRUGS OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND URBAN SERVICES ORDINANCE, HE WARNED, ANY PERSON WHO SELLS PUFFER FISH FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION IS LIABLE TO BE PROSECUTED.

HOWEVER, HE POINTED OUT, THOSE IMPORTED PUFFER FISH MAY BE ALLOWED FOR SALE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- (I) THAT THEY ARE ACCOMPANIED WITH AN OFFICIAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE COMPETENT HEALTH AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTRY OF ORIGIN CERTIFYING THAT THE FISH DO NOT CONTAIN ANY HARMFUL SUBSTANCES;
- (II) THAT THEY ARE FIT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION; AND
- (III) THAT THEY ARE PERMITTED TO BE SOLD AS FOOD FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION IN THE COUNTRY OF ORIGIN.

IN ANY CASE, THE SPOKESMAN SAID, ANYONE FEELING UNWELL AFTER EATING FISH OR FISHMEAT SHOULD CONSULT A DOCTOR AT ONCE.

LEGCO TO DEAL WITH 13 BILLS, 8 QUESTIONS

THIRTEEN BILLS WILL BE INTRODUCED AND READ A SECOND TIME AT THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEETING TOMORROW.

DEBATE ON THE BILLS WILL THEN BE ADJOURNED TILL THE FINAL MEETING OF THE CURRENT SESSION ON AUGUST 10.

IN ADDITION, EIGHT QUESTIONS WILL BE ASKED BY UNOFFICIALS ON A VARIETY OF MATTERS.

THE BILLS TO BE CONSIDERED WERE RECENTLY GAZETTED AND ARE AS FOLLOWS:

DEBATE ON BILL RESUMING AUGUST 10

DEBATE ON THE EMPLOYMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, WHICH WAS INTRODUCED IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ON JULY 13, WILL RESUME ON AUGUST 10, INSTEAD OF TOMORROW (JULY 27), A SPOKESMAN FOR THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY.

THE BILL SEEKS TO INCREASE THE RATE OF PAID SICK LEAVE FOR ALL MANUAL WORKERS AND NON-MANUAL WORKERS EARNING NOT MORE THAN \$7 500 A MONTH, AND TO IMPLEMENT PROPOSALS TO EXTEND SICKNESS BENEFITS FOR THOSE EMPLOYEES WHO MAY BE SICK FOR QUITE A LONG PERIOD.

THE PURPOSE OF THE POSTPONEMENT IS TO ALLOW MORE TIME FOR UMELCO AND THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TO CONSIDER THE REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED FROM VARIOUS BODIES AND ORGANISATIONS SINCE THE BILL WAS GAZETTED, THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED.

KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS WILL DISCUSS THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE WHAMPOA DOCKYARD REDEVELOPMENT SCHEME IN HUNG HOM AT A MEETING ON THURSDAY (JULY 28).

THE PROPOSALS INCLUDE THE REZONING OF 2.1 HECTARES OF LAND ALONG THE SOUTHERN WATERFRONT FOR COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT, THE BUILDING OF MORE FLATS AND THE PROVISION OF A PRIMARY AND A SECONDARY SCHOOL.

HONG KONG STUDENTS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 22 CAN NOW APPLY FOR TWO JAPANESE GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED UNDER THE MONBUSHO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME.

THE SCHOLARSHIPS PROVIDE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES IN SOCIAL SCIENCE AND HUMANITIES AT A JAPANESE UNIVERSITY.

### BOOST IN USE OF CAR PARK EXPECTED

MONTHLY TICKETS FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT'S TSUEN WAN STATION MULTI-STOrey CAR PARK WILL BE AVAILABLE FROM 8 AM, THURSDAY (JULY 28).

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT SINCE ITS OPENING ON JULY 18, THE UTILISATION OF THE CAR PARK HAD BEEN ON THE INCREASE.

IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE SALE OF MONTHLY TICKETS, COMBINED WITH THE OPERATION AGAINST ILLEGAL PARKING IN THE VICINITY AND THE COMPLETION OF THE NEARBY COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT, WILL FURTHER BOOST THE USE OF THE CAR PARK.
