NO CUT AND DRIED ELECTION - SIR DAVID
* * * *

THE REPEATED BALLOT SYSTEM WILL ENCOURAGE VOTERS TO COME FORWARD DURING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTION BECAUSE IT SHOWS THAT IT WILL NOT BE A CUT AND DRIED ELECTION, THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

IT WOULD NOT DISSUADE ELECTORAL COLLEGE VOTERS FROM TURNING OUT TO VOTE BECAUSE IT PROVIDED FOR A CONSENSUS AND AN ABSOLUTE MAJORITY, HE SAID.

+I THINK IT IS MORE INCLINED TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO THINK THAT THEY HAVE A FIGHTING CHANCE IF THEY STAND FOR ELECTION, AND I THINK IT'S GOT A GOOD CHANCE OF ENCOURAGING VOTERS TO COME FORWARD BECAUSE THEY WON'T THINK THAT IT IS A CUT AND DRIED ELECTION,+

SIR DAVID WAS SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AFTER OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE SECOND HONG KONG ABILYMPIC AT THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC.

HE SAID HE SUPPORTED THE TWO VOTING SYSTEMS FOR THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTION BECAUSE HE WAS +A GREAT BELIEVER IN THE FACT THAT THE CANDIDATES THAT WILL BE ELECTED, SHOULD BE ELECTED, WILL HAVE MAJORITY SUPPORT+.

HE WAS SURE THAT THE ELECTION WOULD GO ON SMOOTHLY AND HOPED THAT IT WOULD REPRESENT THE PEOPLE FULLY.

IN REPLY TO A QUESTION ON TRANSPORT FOR THE DISABLED, SIR DAVID SAID ALTHOUGH THERE MUST BE SOME AREAS WHERE IMPROVEMENTS COULD NOT BE MADE, HONG KONG HAD COME A LONG WAY IN THE PAST FEW YEARS.

+YOU CAN SEE THAT IN THE CONSTRUCTION, FOR EXAMPLE, OF OUR PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGES. VERY FEW CITIES IN THE WORLD HAVE PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGES WHICH IN THE MOST PART CATER FOR THE DISABLED, WHEREAS IN HONG KONG WE HAVE FOOTBRIDGES WHICH, GENERALLY SPEAKING, DISABLED PEOPLE CAN USE,+ HE SAID.

HE ADDED THAT IT WAS QUITE DIFFICULT TO PRODUCE, IN THE BUSY AND CROWDED STREETS OF HONG KONG, BUSES AND MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY FOR THE DISABLED.

+AND THAT IS WHY WE HAVE THE REHAB BUS SYSTEM IN HONG KONG.

+AND I SHOULD THINK THE CONCENTRATION OF EFFORT REALLY SHOULD BE IN EXTENDING THE REHAB BUS SYSTEM.+

ASKED WHETHER AVIATION MATTERS WOULD BE ON THE AGENDA OF THE FIRST MEETING OF THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP, SIR DAVID SAID HE COULD NOT SPECULATE ON IT.

+THERE IS REALLY NOTHING I CAN ADD TO THE NEWS ABOUT THE JLG THAN WHAT HAS APPEARED IN THE OFFICIAL PRESS RELEASES,+ HE SAID.

ASKED IF THE GOVERNMENT INTENDED TO HAVE ALL DIRECTORATE POSTS FILLED BY CHINESE OFFICERS IN THE RUN-UP TO 1997, SIR DAVID SAID, +YOU KNOW WHAT IT SAYS IN THE JOINT DECLARATION ABOUT THE GRADES IN THE GOVERNMENT SERVICE WHICH WILL BE OCCUPIED BY LOCAL PEOPLE.+

IN REPLY TO ANOTHER QUESTION, HE SAID THE NUMBER OF OVERSEAS OFFICERS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE HAD BEEN GRADUALLY REDUCING OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS IN ABSOLUTE TERMS.

+IT WON'T AFFECT HONG KONG,+ HE SAID.

SIR DAVID LAUNCHES SECOND ABILYMPIC
* * * * *

THE ACTING GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED ON THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG TO HELP THE DISABLED TO HELP THEMSELVES AND TO SERVE HONG KONG.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE SECOND HONG KONG ABILYMPIC AT THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC, SIR DAVID SAID THAT ON EACH WORKING DAY A DISABLED WORKER MET PEOPLE WHO BY THEIR RELATIONSHIP AND SUPPORT COULD MAKE HIM FEEL A PART OF THE HUMAN FAMILY.

AN EMPLOYER OF A DISABLED PERSON, NOT ONLY PROVIDED THE WORK TO BE DONE BUT ALSO CREATED AN INVISIBLE RELATIONSHIP WITHIN SOCIETY, GIVING OTHERS A CHANCE TO RECOGNISE AND ACCEPT THE DISABLED AS EQUAL MEMBERS OF THAT SOCIETY, HE SAID.

AND THE AIM OF THE ABILYMPIC, SIR DAVID SAID, WAS TO DEMONSTRATE TO EMPLOYERS IN HONG KONG THAT MANY DISABLED PERSONS, DESPITE THEIR DISABILITY, WERE ABLE TO WORK, SERVE THE COMMUNITY AND LEAD HAPPY AND RESOURCEFUL LIVES.

SIR DAVID SAID THAT THE GOVERNMENT FULLY SUPPORTED THESE OBJECTIVES.

THERE WERE NEARLY 2 000 DISABLED PERSONS ALREADY EMPLOYED IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE, AND THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT WOULD REFER DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS TO PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYERS.

SIR DAVID SAID THAT SINCE 1981 WHEN HONG KONG HAD ITS FIRST ABILYMPIC, COMMITTED AND RESPONSIBLE EMPLOYERS HAD TAKEN ON DISABLED PEOPLE IN A WIDE RANGE OF WORK.

THESE EMPLOYERS, HE SAID, BY THEIR PRESENCE HERE TODAY EMPHASISED THE SUCCESS OF THE SCHEME.

SIR DAVID THEN PRESENTED SOUVENIRS TO TEN EMPLOYERS WHO HAVE ENGAGED THE LARGEST NUMBER OF DISABLED PERSONS AS A TOKEN OF APPRECIATION FOR THE PART THAT THEY HAD PLAYED IN THE REHABILITATION OF THE DISABLED.

TWO MORE WEEKS TO GET I.D. CARDS

THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT TODAY (SATURDAY) REMINDED MEN BORN IN 1933, 1934, 1935 AND 1936 TO APPLY FOR NEW I.D. CARDS WITHIN THE NEXT TWO WEEKS.

+SINCE JULY 1, WE HAVE RECEIVED OVER 83 000 APPLICATIONS FROM MEN BELONGING TO THIS AGE-GROUP,+ A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 35 513 MORE APPLICATIONS WILL BE RECEIVED BEFORE THE CLOSE OF THIS PHASE ON AUGUST 3,+ HE SAID.

TO AVOID LAST-MINUTE RUSH, APPLICANTS ARE ADVISED TO CALL AT ANY OF THE EIGHT I.D. CARD ISSUE OFFICES WITHOUT DELAY.

THESE OFFICES ARE OPEN FROM 8 AM TO 9.30 PM, MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS, BUT WILL BE CLOSED ON JULY 29 WHICH IS A PUBLIC HOLIDAY.

MAY ORDERS-ON-HAND, EMPLOYMENT FIGURES RELEASED
* * * * *

THE AVERAGE VOLUME OF ORDERS-ON-HAND (IN TERMS OF MONTHS) IN THE 200 LARGEST FIRMS IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR DECLINED SLIGHTLY IN MAY 1985 COMPARED WITH THE PREVIOUS MONTH, ACCORDING TO THE RESULTS OF A SURVEY RELEASED TODAY BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

THE PLASTIC PRODUCTS, FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS AND ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES RECORDED SOME DECREASES IN THE AVERAGE VOLUME OF ORDERS, WHEREAS THE WEARING APPAREL AND TEXTILES INDUSTRIES REPORTED NO CHANGE.

EMPLOYMENT IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR AS A WHOLE REMAINED STABLE. AMONG INDIVIDUAL INDUSTRIES, INCREASES IN EMPLOYMENT WERE REPORTED IN THE FOOD AND DRINKS, PLASTIC PRODUCTS AND FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES, BUT DECLINES WERE REPORTED IN THE TEXTILES AND ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES.

MILD DECREASES IN BOTH PAYROLL AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS WERE RECORDED FOR THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR AS A WHOLE. THE MOST SIGNIFICANT DECREASE WAS REPORTED IN THE PLASTIC PRODUCTS INDUSTRY, WHICH WAS MAINLY DUE TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF SPECIAL BONUS AND SALARY REVISION BY A FEW FIRMS IN APRIL.

EMPLOYMENT IN THE CONSTRUCTION SECTOR INCREASED SLIGHTLY BUT REMAINED STABLE IN THE SERVICES SECTORS. BOTH PAYROLL AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS IN THE SERVICES SECTORS DECLINED IN MAY. THOSE IN HOTELS AND PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES SHOWED SHARPENED FALLS MAINLY DUE TO THE PAYMENT OF BONUSES BY A FEW FIRMS IN APRIL.

THE PERCENTAGE CHANGES IN ORDERS-ON-HAND, EMPLOYMENT AND PER CAPITA EARNINGS FOR THE LAST THREE MONTHS ARE SHOWN IN THE TABLES BELOW.

THE SURVEY COVERED A PANEL OF THE 200 LARGEST MANUFACTURING COMPANIES AND THE 50 LARGEST COMPANIES IN THE CONSTRUCTION AND SELECTED SERVICES SECTORS CHOSEN BY REFERENCE TO THEIR EMPLOYMENT IN MARCH 1983.

AS THE SAMPLE WAS NOT DRAWN ON A RANDOM BASIS, THE DEPARTMENT CAUTIONED THAT RESULTS ON MAGNITUDE OF CHANGE MIGHT NOT REFLECT THE EXPERIENCE OF THE ECONOMY AS A WHOLE, ALTHOUGH THEY SHOULD GIVE A USEFUL INDICATION OF THE DIRECTION OF CHANGE FOR A QUICK ASSESSMENT OF DEVELOPMENTS IN THE ECONOMY IN THE SHORT TERM.

MAJOR CAMPAIGN TO RE-EDUCATE FOOD HANDLERS * * * *

THE URBAN COUNCIL IS TO STAGE ITS ANNUAL FOOD HYGIENE CAMPAIGN FROM JULY 24 UNTIL THE END OF NEXT MONTH.

IT IS A YEARLY HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMME AIMED AT REMINDING FOOD OPERATORS AND FOOD HANDLERS OF THE IMPORTANCE OF SANITATION IN FOOD PREMISES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE COUNCIL SAID THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WILL FOCUS ON +FOOD POISONING AND ITS PREVENTION+.

THROUGHOUT THE CAMPAIGN, SENIOR OFFICERS FROM THE DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT WILL CONDUCT A SERIES OF SEMINARS FOR MANAGERIAL AND SUPERVISORY STAFF OF FOOD PREMISES, USING SPECIALLY-TAILORED SLIDES, FILM SHOWS AND DISCUSSIONS.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THROUGH THE VARIOUS ACTIVITIES OF THE CAMPAIGN WE CAN FURTHER ALERT FOOD BUSINESS OPERATORS TO THE IMPORTANCE OF FOOD HYGIENE, AND ALSO SUGGEST TO THEM SOME PRACTICAL METHODS TO RAISE THE HYGIENIC STANDARD OF THEIR PREMISES,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IT IS ALSO OUR AIM TO REDUCE THE OCCURRENCE OF FOOD-BORNE DISEASES SUCH AS CHOLERA, TYPHOID FEVER, DYSENTERY, VIRAL HEPATITIS AND FOOD POISONING WHICH ARE EASILY TRANSMITTED THROUGH CONSUMPTION OF UNCLEAR FOOD,+ HE ADDED.

THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WILL ALSO COVER THE NEW TERRITORIES, WITH THE HEALTH EDUCATION UNIT OF THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES BRANCH BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR ITS LAUNCHING.

DRAMATIC RISE IN CITIZEN'S ARRESTS

* * * *

CITIZEN'S ARRESTS HAVE RISEN DRAMATICALLY TO 14.3 PER CENT OF ALL ARRESTS, A DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF POLICE SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE PRESENTATION OF GOOD CITIZEN AWARDS TO A RECORD 70 PEOPLE, THE ACTING DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, OPERATIONS, MR GEORGE HINDHAUGH, SAID IT WAS QUITE REMARKABLE TO NOTE THE RECENT TREND IN CITIZEN'S ARRESTS THROUGHOUT HONG KONG.

"WHEN THE GOOD CITIZEN AWARD WAS LAUNCHED IN 1973, AS PART OF THE FIRST FIGHT VIOLENT CRIME CAMPAIGN, CITIZEN'S ARRESTS CONTRIBUTED ABOUT THREE PER CENT TO TOTAL ARRESTS," MR HINDHAUGH SAID.

"LAST YEAR, THEY ACCOUNTED FOR 11.7 PER CENT OF ALL ARRESTS AND, IN THE PERIOD FROM JANUARY TO MAY THIS YEAR, THEY SHOWED A DRAMATIC RISE TO 14.3 PER CENT.

"IN OTHER WORDS, 2,132 ARRESTS WERE MADE BY ORDINARY CITIZENS UPHOLDING THE LAWS -- AND THIS IS THE HIGHEST ON RECORD FOR ANY EQUIVALENT PERIOD."

MR HINDHAUGH SAID HE BELIEVED THERE WERE INCREASING NUMBERS OF HONG KONG PEOPLE WHO ARE WILLING TO LEAP INTO ACTION TO SAFEGUARD LIFE AND PROPERTY, TO ASSIST THE POLICE UNRESERVEDLY, AND TO TAKE A FIRM STAND ON THE SIDE OF LAW AND ORDER.

"THIS IS INDICATIVE OF A MATURING SENSE OF CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY AND A GREATER DESIRE BY INDIVIDUALS TO RESPOND UNSELFISHLY -- WHEN CALLED UPON -- IN THE INTERESTS OF COMMUNITY WELL-BEING," HE SAID.

ALL OF THE AWARDS PRESENTED AT TODAY'S CEREMONY, IN THE NEW WORLD CENTRE PLAZA, WERE FOR ACTS OF EXCEPTIONAL COURAGE, RESOURCEFULNESS OR INITIATIVE IN PREVENTING OR DETECTING CRIME, OR IN APPREHENDING CRIMINALS.

THE RECIPIENTS RANGED IN AGE FROM 14 TO 69 AND COVERED A WIDE RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS. THERE WERE 11 PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS, EIGHT STUDENTS, SIX CIVIL SERVANTS, A HOUSEWIFE, A MANAGER, A HAWKER, A SAILOR, A SALESMAN, A PAINTER AND A COOK. THERE WERE ALSO TWO AUXILIARY POLICEMEN AND TWO JUNIOR POLICE CALL LEADERS AND A JPC MEMBER.

ONE OF THE RECIPIENTS, MR CHU KWOK-KEI, A HAWKER, RECEIVED TWO SEPARATE AWARDS FOR HIS BRAVERY IN BRINGING TO JUSTICE THE SUSPECTS IN TWO 'SNATCHING' CASES.

SPECIAL SCHOOL WORKSHOP AND TRADE INSTRUCTORS ARE INVITED TO APPLY FOR A TWO-YEAR PART-TIME IN-SERVICE COURSE IN TEACHING AND INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF WORKING WITH THE HANDICAPPED IN THE FORTHCOMING ACADEMIC YEAR STARTING OCTOBER.

THE COURSE, RUN BY THE HONG KONG TECHNICAL TEACHERS' COLLEGE, IS AIMED AT EQUIPPING PARTICIPANTS WITH AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE NATURE OF VARIOUS HANDICAPS AND ASSOCIATED PROBLEMS AND THE TEACHING AND LEARNING PROCESSES AS THEY APPLY TO HANDICAPPED ADOLESCENTS AND ADULTS.
