BARONESS PHILLIPS TO VISIT HK

* * * *

BARONESS PHILLIPS, LORD LIEUTENANT OF GREATER LONDON, AND HER DAUGHTER, THE HONOURABLE MRS GWYNETH DUNWOODY, LABOUR MP, WILL BE ARRIVING IN HONG KONG TOMORROW (SUNDAY) FOR A TEN-DAY VISIT AT THE JOINT INVITATION OF THE GOVERNMENT AND THE INTERNATIONAL PROFESSIONAL SECURITY ASSOCIATION (HONG KONG BRANCH).

DURING THEIR STAY, THEY WILL MEET SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, AND VISIT THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE, THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT, THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

THEY WILL ALSO CALL ON THE UMELCO, THE ICAC, THE URBAN COUNCIL AND THE BRITISH TRADE COMMISSION, AND TOUR GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS AND CLINICS, FACILITIES FOR THE REHABILITATION OF THE DISABLED AND THE CHI MA WAN VIETNAMESE REFUGEE CLOSED CENTRE.

BARONESS PHILLIPS, WHO IS PRESIDENT OF THE IPSA, WILL BE THE LEADING SPEAKER AT THE CRIME PREVENTION 1984 SEMINAR AND CONFERENCE TO BE OPENED NEXT WEEK.

THEY ARE EXPECTED TO GIVE A PRESS CONFERENCE ON JUNE 1 (FRIDAY) BEFORE THEIR DEPARTURE.

NEW COURSES TO STRENGTHEN KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION

* * * *

TWO NEW IN-SERVICE COURSES WILL BE HELD SHORTLY FOR KINDERGARTEN SUPERVISORS AND HEAD-TEACHERS IN A BID TO IMPROVE THE STANDARD OF KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION IN HONG KONG, THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR COLVYN HAYE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR HAYE WAS SPEAKING AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY OF THE DEPARTMENT'S FIRST TWO 12-WEEK PART-TIME IN-SERVICE TRAINING COURSES FOR KINDERGARTEN TEACHERS.

HE SAID THE NEW ADMINISTRATION COURSES, THE FIRST OF WHICH WOULD START THIS SEPTEMBER, WOULD CATER FOR SUPERVISORS AND HEAD-TEACHERS. THEY COULD BE FULLY TRAINED, OR WERE UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE GRADUATES, BUT HAD NOT RECEIVED SPECIALISED TRAINING IN KINDERGARTEN TEACHING.

MEANWHILE, THE DEPARTMENT WOULD CONTINUE TO CONDUCT 12-WEEK COURSES FOR MORE KINDERGARTEN TEACHERS IN THE COMING ACADEMIC YEAR IN LINE WITH RECOMMENDATIONS IN THE 1981 WHITE PAPER ON PRIMARY EDUCATION AND PRE-PRIMARY SERVICES, MR HAYE SAID.

/HE ADDED

HE ADDED THAT IN PRACTICE, THESE COURSES LASTED MUCH LONGER AS PARTICIPANTS WERE REQUIRED TO UNDERGO A SIX-MONTH POST-COURSE PERIOD OF SUPERVISED TEACHING PRACTICE, DURING WHICH THEIR TEACHING WAS CLOSELY MONITORED AND ASSESSED.

THE TRAINING PROGRAMMES, HE SAID, HAD BEEN CAREFULLY STRUCTURED TO GIVE COMPREHENSIVE COVERAGE OF BASIC ASPECTS OF KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION.

THESE BASIC ASPECTS INCLUDE THE MAJOR PRINCIPLES OF KINDERGARTEN PRACTICE, THE TECHNIQUES OF ORGANISING ACTIVITIES AND PLAY ACCORDING TO THE CHILD'S ABILITY AND INTERESTS, AND, IN PARTICULAR, THE PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A CURRICULUM BASED ON THE THEMATIC APPROACH.

THIS APPROACH IS RECOMMENDED BY THE KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION COMMITTEE IN ITS +GUIDE TO THE KINDERGARTEN CURRICULUM+ TO BE PUBLISHED SHORTLY.

EDUCATION WAS A LIFELONG PROCESS, AND EACH STAGE OF EDUCATION HAD ITS OWN OBJECTIVES, MR HAYE SAID.

+CHILDREN SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO PROGRESS SMOOTHLY FROM ONE STAGE OF EDUCATION TO ANOTHER WITH CONFIDENCE AND FULFILMENT, AND NOT WITH A SENSE OF CONFUSION AND FRUSTRATION.+

THE ACTIVITY APPROACH PROVIDED THE MOST EFFECTIVE BRIDGE BETWEEN KINDERGARTEN AND PRIMARY EDUCATION BY ENSURING A SMOOTH AND ANXIETY-FREE PROGRESSION FROM ONE STAGE TO THE OTHER, HE SAID.

+CHILDREN NEED TO BE GUIDED INTO THE PRIMARY CURRICULUM THROUGH A LEARNING SITUATION WHICH IS COMPLEMENTARY TO, AND COMPATIBLE WITH, THAT OF THE KINDERGARTEN, RATHER THAN HAVING TO FACE AN ABRUPT CHANGE IN ATTITUDE AND REQUIREMENTS AFTER A SHORT BREAK IN SUMMER.

+THIS IS PARTICULARLY SO WITH YOUNG CHILDREN, AN INCREASING NUMBER OF WHOM HAVE GONE THROUGH THEIR FIRST STEPS IN EDUCATION IN THE FORMAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT WE ADVOCATE IN OUR TRAINING PROGRAMMES,+ MR HAYE SAID.

HE POINTED OUT THAT SINCE THE INTRODUCTION OF THE NEW PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION SYSTEM, PRESSURE RESULTING FROM COMPETITIVE ADMISSION INTO PRIMARY ONE HAD BEEN CONSIDERABLY REDUCED.

+THIS LEAVES MORE ROOM FOR YOU, AS KINDERGARTEN TEACHERS, TO PURSUE A CURRICULUM AND TEACHING METHODS WHICH ARE GEARED MORE CLOSELY TO CHILDREN'S NEEDS,+ HE TOLD THE GRADUATES.

WOMEN AGED 19 TO 21 REMINDED TO APPLY FOR NEW I.D. CARDS

WOMEN BORN IN 1963, 1964 AND 1965 ARE BEING REMINDED TO APPLY FOR NEW IDENTITY CARDS BEFORE THE 11TH PHASE OF THE NEW I.D. CARD ISSUE SCHEME CLOSES ON JUNE 2 (SATURDAY).

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT POINTED OUT TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE DAILY TURN-UP RATE DURING THE FIRST THREE WEEKS OF THE PHASE HAD BEEN SLIGHTLY BELOW AVERAGE.

+THIS MIGHT HAVE BEEN DUE TO THE FACT THAT SOME PEOPLE IN THE AGE GROUPS HAD TO SIT FOR PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS DURING THIS PERIOD. WE EXPECT TO SEE AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS IN THE COMING WEEKS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

THOSE WHO HAVE TIME TO APPLY NOW ARE ADVISED TO DO SO IMMEDIATELY TO AVOID THE LAST-MINUTE RUSH.

THEY SHOULD BRING ALONG THEIR OLD I.D. CARDS WHEN THEY VISIT ANY ONE OF THE EIGHT ISSUE OFFICES WHICH ARE OPEN FROM 8 AM TO 9.30 PM, MONDAYS TO SATURDAYS.

THE PROCESS WILL TAKE ABOUT 30 MINUTES. APPLICANTS WILL BE ASKED TO COLLECT THEIR NEW CARDS 18 WORKING DAYS LATER.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO REMINDED MEN BORN IN 1965 AND BETWEEN 1948 AND 1959, INCLUDING GREEN-SEAL CARD HOLDERS, TO APPLY FOR NEW I.D. CARDS AT ONCE, IF THEY HAVE NOT YET DONE SO. THEIR OLD CARDS WILL SOON BE DECLARED INVALID.

DB TO FURTHER IMPROVE COMMUNITY WORK

THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT BOARD WILL FURTHER IMPROVE THE LIVING ENVIRONMENT AND COMMUNITY BUILDING WORK OF THE NEW TOWN IN THE COMING YEAR, THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR FUNG KWOK-KEUNG, SAID THIS (SATURDAY) EVENING.

SPEAKING AT THE DISTRICT'S AMATEUR SINGING CONTEST, HE SAID OF THE \$5.54 MILLION ALLOCATED TO THE DISTRICT BOARD THIS YEAR, ABOUT \$1.78 MILLION WOULD BE SPENT ON ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

HE POINTED OUT IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, THE DISTRICT BOARD HAD DONE MUCH WORK IN THE AREA OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING THE CONSTRUCTION OF SITTING-OUT AREAS, PAVILIONS AND FOOTPATHS, AND THE IMPROVEMENT OF VILLAGE STREET LIGHTING.

THE BOARD HAD ALSO MADE GREAT EFFORTS IN PROMOTING CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES, NOTABLY THE ANNUAL ARTS AND SPORTS FESTIVALS.

NTSD TO CLEAR UP RIVER INDUS AND RIVER BASIN TO IMPROVE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND PREVENT FLOODING /MR FUNG

MR FUNG POINTED OUT THAT THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THE BOARD WOULD DEPEND GREATLY ON THE CONTINUED SUPPORT AND PARTICIPATION OF THE RESIDENTS.

HE URGED ALL THOSE WHO CARE FOR THEIR COMMUNITY TO SUPPORT THE BOARD AND REGISTER AS VOTERS.

TONIGHT'S SINGING CONTEST WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE, RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG AND SING TAO NEWSPAPERS LIMITED.

COMMUNITY URGED TO PLANT MORE TREES

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IS VITAL IF MORE GREENERY IS TO BE ADDED TO THE NEWLY DEVELOPING AREAS IN THE NORTH DISTRICT, MR LIU CHING-LEUNG, AN UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE CLEAN HONG KONG NEW TERRITORIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR LIU URGED THE PUBLIC TO TAKE PART IN TREE PLANTING IN THEIR NEIGHBOURHOOD WHEN HE MADE A TWO-HOUR TOUR OF FANLING.

HE WAS ACCOMPANIED DURING THE VISIT BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (HEADQUARTERS) OF NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES, MR LI TIN-MING, AND THE URBAN SERVICES OFFICER OF NORTH DISTRICT, MR MA IU-KI.

AT A NEW AMENITY PLOT IN KAM TSIN VILLAGE, MR LIU WAS IMPRESSED THAT THE ONCE RUBBISH-RIDDEN SITE HAD TURNED INTO A BEAUTIFUL PATCH OF GREEN.

HE WAS TOLD THAT ABOUT 20 000 TREES AND SHRUBS HAD BEEN PLANTED IN THE NORTH DISTRICT LAST YEAR BY NTSD AND ANOTHER 30 000 WILL BE PLANTED THIS YEAR.

TO AROUSE PUBLIC INTEREST IN TREE PLANTING, A DISTRICT TREE PLANTING DAY WILL BE HELD IN FANLING ON MAY 28 (MONDAY).

THE PARTY THEN TOURED LUEN WO HUI WHERE THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, THE LANDS DEPARTMENT AND THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAD STAGED A JOINT OPERATION TO CLEAR ALL ILLEGAL STRUCTURES CAUSING OBSTRUCTION TO STREETS AND LANES.

MR LIU WAS IMPRESSED BY THE MARKED IMPROVEMENT TO THE GENERAL ENVIRONMENT AFTER THE OPERATION.

FREE TRIP TO U.S. FOR +SAFETY AT WORK+ WINNERS

AN 11-DAY, ALL-EXPENSES PAID TRIP TO THE WEST COAST OF THE UNITED STATES AND OTHER VALUABLE PRIZES WORTH MORE THAN \$100 000 WILL BE AWARDED TO THE FIVE MEMBERS OF THE WINNING TEAM OF THE ANNUAL +SAFETY AT WORK+ TV PROGRAMME.

THE 13-EPIISODE PROGRAMME, JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT, RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG AND THE FEDERATION OF HONG KONG INDUSTRIES FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR, HAS BEEN DEVELOPED FOR WORKERS IN THE MANUFACTURING AND CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRIES TO MAKE THEM AWARE OF THE IMPORTANCE OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY.

TRAFFIC MEASURES FOR ISLAND AND YUEN LONG
* * * * *

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE IN FORCE ON HONG KONG ISLAND AND IN YUEN LONG FROM MONDAY (MAY 21).

AT WING HING STREET IN NORTH POINT, THE FOLLOWING MEASURES WILL BE IMPLEMENTED FROM 10 AM TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC :

- * WING HING STREET BETWEEN ELECTRIC ROAD AND KING'S ROAD WILL BE REROUTED ONE-WAY EASTBOUND.

/* EASTBOUND VEHICLES

- * EASTBOUND VEHICLES ON WING HING STREET WILL BE ALLOWED TO TURN RIGHT INTO KING'S ROAD WESTBOUND.
- * LEFT TURNS FROM WING HING STREET EASTBOUND INTO KING'S ROAD EASTBOUND WILL BE PROHIBITED, EXCEPT FOR BUSES, PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES AND VEHICLES REQUIRING LOCAL ACCESS.
- * THE BAN ON ALL MOTOR VEHICLES EXCEPT BUSES AND PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES AT WING HING STREET EASTBOUND BETWEEN ELECTRIC ROAD AND KING'S ROAD WILL BE LIFTED.
- * THE SOUTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF WING HING STREET BETWEEN ELECTRIC ROAD AND KING'S ROAD WILL BE MADE AN URBAN CLEARWAY FROM 7 AM TO 10 AM AND FROM 4 PM TO 7 PM DAILY, DURING WHICH NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS THERE.

FROM 10 AM ON TUESDAY (MAY 22), VEHICLES ON ELECTRIC ROAD SOUTHBOUND WILL BE ALLOWED TO TURN LEFT INTO WING HING STREET EASTBOUND.

IN TAI HANG, TAI HANG ROAD BETWEEN ITS JUNCTION WITH PERKINS ROAD AND A POINT 20 METRES SOUTH OF THE SAME JUNCTION WILL BE RESTRICTED TO ONE LANE FOR TWO-WAY TRAFFIC FROM MONDAY (MAY 21) TO THURSDAY (MAY 24). THE MEASURE IS TO FACILITATE THE LAYING OF WATER MAINS.

MEANWHILE, ROAD CLOSURES AND TRAFFIC DIVERSIONS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN YUEN LONG FOR WORK ON A FOOTBRIDGE.

LONG YIP STREET BETWEEN THE ACCESS ROAD LEADING TO NAM PIN WAI AND THE NEW CROSS-NULLAH BRIDGE NEAR THE YUEN LONG EAST ROUNDABOUT WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FOR FIVE HOURS FROM MIDNIGHT ON MONDAY (MAY 21) TO 5 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY. THE CLOSURE WILL BE REPEATED ON TUESDAY (MAY 22) NIGHT.

DURING THE CLOSURE, THE NEW CROSS-NULLAH BRIDGE WILL BE OPEN TO TWO-WAY TRAFFIC, WHILE EASTBOUND TRAFFIC FROM PO YIP STREET WILL BE DIVERTED VIA ON LOK ROAD.

YUEN LONG ON LOK ROAD BETWEEN TAI CHEUNG STREET AND THE NEW CROSS-NULLAH BRIDGE NEAR THE YUEN LONG EAST ROUNDABOUT WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FOR FIVE HOURS FROM MIDNIGHT ON WEDNESDAY (MAY 23) TO 5 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY. THE CLOSURE WILL BE REPEATED ON THURSDAY (MAY 24) NIGHT.

DURING THE CLOSURE, EASTBOUND TRAFFIC ON YUEN LONG ON LOK ROAD WILL BE DIVERTED VIA TAI CHEUNG STREET AND KUK TING STREET, WHILE WESTBOUND TRAFFIC WILL BE DIVERTED VIA THE NEW CROSS-NULLAH BRIDGE, LONG YIP STREET AND THE BRIDGE AT THE JUNCTION OF LONG YIP STREET AND PO YIP STREET.
