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LADY YOUDE CALLS FOR EFFORT AGAINST CHILD ABUSE

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MEASURES AGAINST CHILD ABUSE CALL FOR THE UNITED EFFORTS OF THE SOCIAL SERVICES, THE POLICE, THE COMMUNITY AND THE VOLUNTARY AGENCIES, LADY YOUDE SAID THIS EVENING (TUESDAY) IN OPENING THE +AGAINST CHILD ABUSE+ CENTRE AT CHOI WAN ESTATE.

+CHILD ABUSE IS AN ISSUE WHICH CONCERNS US ALL. IT BRINGS GREAT SUFFERING NOT ONLY TO THE CHILD, BUT TO THE FAMILY INVOLVED, AND MUCH SADNESS TO THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH IT OCCURS.

+ITS CAUSES ARE LEGION, AND THE MEASURES NOW BEING ADOPTED TO DEAL WITH IT ARE EQUALLY WIDE-RANGING,+ SHE SAID.

LADY YOUDE ADDED THAT +AGAINST CHILD ABUSE+ PLAYED A VALUABLE ROLE AS A SOURCE OF DIRECT HELP TO THE FAMILIES AS WELL AS TO THE ABUSED CHILDREN.

SHE THEN CONGRATULATED THE AGENCY ON ITS +INITIATIVE AND HUMANITARIAN CONCERN+ WHICH HAD LED TO THE PROVISION OF THE CENTRE AND WISHED IT SUCCESS IN ITS AIM TO REDUCE AND, HOPEFULLY, ELIMINATE CHILD ABUSE IN HONG KONG.

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SIR PHILIP GOING ON VACATION

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THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, WILL BE LEAVING HONG KONG TOMORROW EVENING (DECEMBER 1) FOR ABOUT ONE MONTH'S VACATION LEAVE.

DURING HIS ABSENCE, MR DENIS BRAY WILL ACT AS CHIEF SECRETARY IN ADDITION TO BEING SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS.

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TAC ENDORSES KMB ROUTE DEVELOPMENT PLAN

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THE TRANSPORT ADVISORY COMMITTEE TODAY ENDORSED THE ROUTE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR THE KOWLOON MOTOR BUS COMPANY WHICH WILL REQUIRE THE COMPANY TO EXPAND ITS FLEET BY 200 NEW BUSES IN 1983 AND A FURTHER 140 BUSES IN 1984.

THE COMMITTEE ALSO AGREED TO CANCEL THE CENTRAL-TO-MEI FOO FERRY SERVICE FROM JANUARY 1 NEXT YEAR.

THE ROUTE DEVELOPMENT PLAN, COVERING THE FIRST TWO YEARS OF A FIVE-YEAR PROGRAMME, GENERALLY FOLLOWS THE MODERATE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME AS RECOMMENDED BY THE KMB OPERATION REVIEW SUB-GROUP.

A REPORT ANALYSING THE FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS OF KMB IMPLEMENTING THIS PLAN WAS CONSIDERED. IN THE LIGHT OF THE FINANCIAL FORECAST, THE NEED FOR A MODERATE FARES REVISION SOMETIME IN THE FIRST HALF OF NEXT YEAR SEEMS LIKELY.

VARIOUS OPTIONS TO DELAY THE FARE INCREASE WERE CONSIDERED, BUT IT BECAME EVIDENT THAT, OTHER THAN BY CUTTING BACK ON THE ROUTE DEVELOPMENT PLAN - AND THIS WOULD MEAN A DETERIORATION IN THE LEVEL OF SERVICE PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC - SIGNIFICANT SAVINGS CANNOT BE ACHIEVED BY ANY OTHER MEANS.

THE REASON ADVANCED FOR CANCELLATION OF THE CENTRAL-TO-MEI FOO FERRY SERVICE WAS THE SIGNIFICANT REDUCTION OF AN AVERAGE 76 PER CENT IN PATRONAGE FOLLOWING THE OPENING OF THE TSUEN WAN EXTENSION OF THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY. ATTEMPTS BY THE FERRY COMPANY TO KEEP THE SERVICE VIABLE, INCLUDING THE INTRODUCTION OF ORDINARY FERRY SAILINGS AND HOVERFERRIES AT LOWER FARES, HAVE FAILED TO ATTRACT MORE PASSENGERS.

IN AGREEING TO THE CANCELLATION, THE TAC NOTED THAT ALTERNATIVE MODES OF TRANSPORT BETWEEN MEI FOO AND CENTRAL ARE AVAILABLE. MOREOVER, THE FOUR VESSELS IN USE, TWO HOVERFERRIES AND TWO DOUBLE-DECKERS, WOULD BE REDEPLOYED TO IMPROVE SERVICE ON OTHER ROUTES. AN ADDITIONAL BERTH IN THE CENTRAL DISTRICT AREA WOULD ALSO BE RELEASED TO INCREASE THE EFFICIENCY OF FERRY OPERATIONS SERVING THE AREA.

A PEDESTRIAN PROBLEM SPOTS REVIEW COMPILED BY THE ROAD SAFETY DIVISION OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT WAS CONSIDERED BY MEMBERS.

THIS LATEST ANNUAL REVIEW HAS SYSTEMATICALLY ATTEMPTED TO IDENTIFY PEDESTRIAN PROBLEMS ON SITE, GIVING PARTICULAR REGARD TO THE ACCIDENT SITUATION AS IT AFFECTS PEDESTRIANS. IMPROVEMENTS TO FACILITIES ARE AIMED MORE AT PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS, THAN AT REDUCTION OF CONFLICT BETWEEN TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIANS.

MEMBERS ALSO CONSIDERED AN INFORMATION PAPER ON THE RECENT BUS ACCIDENTS AND NOTED THAT THE NUMBER OF BUS ACCIDENTS IN RECENT YEARS HAD NOT BEEN DISPROPORTIONATE TO THAT OF OTHER CAR ACCIDENTS.

SIR DAVID TRENCH FUND GRANTS

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MORE THAN \$2 MILLION WILL BE ALLOCATED NEXT YEAR FROM THE SIR DAVID TRENCH FUND FOR RECREATION FOR THE PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT AND OTHER NON-CAPITAL PROJECTS.

ORGANISATIONS NEEDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE PROVISION OF SOCIAL, CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS FACILITIES SHOULD NOW APPLY FOR GRANTS.

THE FUND IS ADMINISTERED BY THE COUNCIL FOR RECREATION AND SPORT.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE COUNCIL SAID TODAY (TUESDAY) PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO INITIATION OF NEW PROJECTS AND NEW AGENCIES WHICH HAVE DIFFICULTY IN OBTAINING GOVERNMENT SUBVENTIONS OR ASSISTANCE FROM OTHER MAJOR SOURCES.

REQUESTS FROM SCHOOLS WILL GENERALLY BE REFERRED TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FOR COMMENT AND, SIMILARLY, APPLICATIONS FROM LOCAL ORGANISATIONS FOR NEIGHBOURHOOD PROJECTS WILL BE REFERRED TO THE RELEVANT SPONSORING DEPARTMENTS.

APPLICATION FORMS ARE AVAILABLE AT ALL DISTRICT OFFICES, THE VARIOUS OFFICES OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE AND ALSO FROM THE COUNCIL FOR RECREATION AND SPORT.

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CALL FOR UNITED EFFORT IN WORK SAFETY

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A CALL FOR A UNITED EFFORT IN PROMOTING WORK SAFETY WAS MADE TODAY BY MR WONG WAH-SANG, MANAGING DIRECTOR OF CHUNG WAH SHIPBUILDING AND ENGINEERING CO. LTD.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF AN INDUSTRIAL SAFETY SEMINAR FOR SHIPBUILDING AND SHIPREPAIRING INDUSTRY HELD AT THE CHINESE Y.M.C.A. IN WATERLOO ROAD, MR WONG URGED GOVERNMENT, EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES +TO JOIN HANDS IN CONTAINING WORK ACCIDENTS WHICH HAVE TAKEN SO MANY LIVES AND CAUSED SO MUCH MISERY TO THE COMMUNITY+.

THIS FIRST TRI PARTITE SEMINAR HELD IN HONG KONG FOR THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIPREPAIRING INDUSTRY OFFERED A GOOD OPPORTUNITY FOR OPEN DISCUSSION AND EXCHANGE OF VIEWS ON MATTERS RELATING TO SAFETY, HE SAID. IT ALSO SHOWED THE WHOLE-HEARTED SUPPORT OF ALL CONCERNED FOR THE PROMOTION OF VOLUNTARY SAFETY MOVEMENT IN INDUSTRY, MR WONG SAID.

/MR WONG .....

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MR WONG SAID 217 ACCIDENTS WERE RECORDED IN THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIPREPAIRING INDUSTRY IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF THIS YEAR, AN INCREASE OF 20 PER CENT OVER THE 183 ACCIDENTS IN THE FIRST QUARTER.

OUT OF THOSE ACCIDENTS, 38 WERE FALLS, WHILE 62 WERE RELATED TO STEPPING ON OR STRIKING AGAINST OBJECTS.

+THIS SHOWS THAT A LOT OF PEOPLE STILL ATTACH LITTLE IMPORTANCE TO SAFE WORKING PRACTICES AND GOOD SAFETY MANAGEMENT AT WORKPLACES. CLEARLY MUCH MORE HAS TO BE DONE IN THIS RESPECT,+ HE SAID.

WHILE SAFETY LEGISLATION AND ITS STRICT ENFORCEMENT WAS NECESSARY IN MAINTAINING A BASIC STANDARD OF SAFETY AND HEALTH IN INDUSTRY, NO SAFETY PROMOTION PROGRAMME WAS LIKELY TO SUCCEED WITHOUT THE ACTIVE PARTICIPATION AND UNRESERVED CO-OPERATION OF ALL THOSE WHO ACTUALLY MANAGED OR WORKED AT THE WORKPLACE - THE EMPLOYERS, SUPERVISORS AND WORKERS, HE SAID.

AT THE ONE-DAY SEMINAR ORGANISED BY THE SHIPBUILDING AND SHIPREPAIRING INDUSTRY SAFETY SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD, THE PARTICIPANTS HEARD TALKS GIVEN BY SAFETY PROFESSIONALS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICERS AND SAW TWO FILMS ON INDUSTRIAL SAFETY.

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COMPUTER SCANNER IN OPERATION AT QEH  
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THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS BEGUN OPERATIONS OF A HIGHLY ADVANCED COMPUTERISED BODY SCANNER AT QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL.

THE COMPUTERISED TOMOGRAPHY SCANNER, WHICH COSTS ABOUT \$4.5 MILLION, HAS BEEN INSTALLED IN H-BLOCK OF THE HOSPITAL AND WILL BE A CONSIDERABLE AID TO THE INSTITUTE OF RADIOLOGY AND ONCOLOGY IN DIAGNOSING SERIOUS ILLNESSES.

ONE OF THE MANY FUNCTIONS OF THE MACHINE INCLUDES BODY AND HEAD SCANS, WHICH WILL HELP DETECT AND IDENTIFY POSSIBLE CANCER GROWTHS AS WELL AS EXAMINING HEAD INJURY CASES TO FIND OUT IF THERE IS INTERNAL HEMORRHAGE.

THE DIRECTOR OF MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICES, DR K.L. THONG WILL PERFORM A BRIEF CEREMONY TO MARK THE BEGINNING OF FULL OPERATIONAL SERVICES OF THE NEW COMPUTERISED SCANNER ON DECEMBER 3 (FRIDAY).

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BOOKLET TO SAFEGUARD THE HOME

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MANY SERIOUS ACCIDENTS THAT COULD HAVE BEEN PREVENTED HAVE OCCURRED IN THE HOME AS A RESULT OF IGNORANCE AND CARELESSNESS.

THIS IS POINTED OUT IN A 24-PAGE BILINGUAL BOOKLET RECENTLY PUBLISHED BY THE GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES AS PART OF THIS YEAR'S HOME SAFETY CAMPAIGN.

THE BOOKLET, ENTITLED '+SAFETY STARTS AT HOME+', SAYS THERE ARE AT LEAST ELEVEN DANGER AREAS IN THE HOME.

THESE INCLUDE GAS WATER HEATERS, ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES, FLAMES AND FUELS, BABIES' BED COVERS, HOT OR STEAMING UTENSILS, SHARP OBJECTS, WINDOWS AND HIGH PLACES, MEDICINES, MOVING MACHINERY, LAUNDRY EQUIPMENT AND BATH TUBS.

IT GIVES MORE THAN 100 SAFETY HINTS, INCLUDING FIRST AID TIPS, TELLING THE READER HOW TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS AND WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS.

DOMESTIC SAFETY SHOULD BE A LONG-TERM ENDEAVOUR, REQUIRING THE CO-OPERATION OF THE GOVERNMENT, THE SCHOOL AND THE FAMILY, IT SAYS.

STRESSING THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTAL GUIDANCE, THE BOOKLET SUGGESTS THAT PARENTS SHOULD START TEACHING THEIR CHILDREN ABOUT HOME SAFETY BY SETTING GOOD EXAMPLES.

THE BOOKLET DRAWS ON THE EXPERTISE OF FOUR GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS INCLUDING THE ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES, THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH, THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT AND THE FIRE SERVICES.

THE CONSUMER COUNCIL HAS ALSO PROVIDED VALUABLE ADVICE ON THE CONTENT.

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TO MAKE READING EASY AND INTERESTING, THE BOOKLET IS WRITTEN IN SIMPLE LANGUAGE AND CONSISTS OF CARTOON ILLUSTRATIONS.

OTHER GOVERNMENT EFFORTS HAVE BEEN MADE TO PUBLICISE HOME SAFETY.

THESE INCLUDE TV AND RADIO PROGRAMMES, TALKS, POSTERS, LEAFLETS, MOBILE STREET THEATRE SHOWS, FEATURE ARTICLES AND PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

THE BOOKLET IS AVAILABLE FREE AT VARIOUS DISTRICT OFFICES.

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#### BANKING MANPOWER SURVEY STARTING TOMORROW

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THE BANKING TRAINING BOARD OF THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL WILL START A MANPOWER SURVEY TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY) TO ASCERTAIN THE MANPOWER AND TRAINING REQUIREMENTS IN THE BANKING AND DEPOSIT-TAKING COMPANIES (DTCS) SECTORS.

QUESTIONNAIRES, EXPLANATORY NOTES AND JOB DESCRIPTIONS WERE SENT TO BANKS AND DTCS TWO WEEKS AGO.

INTERVIEWERS FROM THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT WILL BE VISITING THESE ESTABLISHMENTS TO COLLECT THE COMPLETED QUESTIONNAIRES AND, IF NECESSARY, TO HELP IN ANSWERING THEM.

THE ESTABLISHMENTS ARE REQUIRED TO SUPPLY INFORMATION ON THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES AND VACANCIES, TRAINING ACTIVITIES, PERIOD OF TRAINING AND OTHER RELATED MANPOWER AND TRAINING MATTERS.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TRAINING BOARD, MR DEREK F. WHARTON, REITERATED THAT INFORMATION COLLECTED IN THE SURVEY WOULD BE HANDLED IN STRICT CONFIDENCE AND WOULD BE PUBLISHED ONLY IN THE FORM OF STATISTICAL SUMMARIES WITHOUT REFERENCE TO INDIVIDUAL ESTABLISHMENTS.

THE SURVEY WILL END ON DECEMBER 18, 1982.

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**KCR TO REDUCE ELECTRIFIED NIGHT SERVICE**  
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THE FREQUENCY OF ELECTRIC TRAINS RUNNING BETWEEN KOWLOON AND SHA TIN WILL BE REDUCED AFTER 8 PM EACH NIGHT STARTING TOMORROW (DECEMBER 1).

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY SAID THE MEASURE IS TO FACILITATE WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TEMPORARY TAI WAI STATION.

HE EXPLAINED THAT THERE WILL BE ONLY ONE SINGLE TRACK (DOWN LINE) IN OPERATION BETWEEN BEACON HILL NORTH AND SHA TIN AND, AS A RESULT, NORMAL TRAIN SCHEDULES WILL BE SLIGHTLY ALTERED AFTER 8 PM EVERY NIGHT.

THE SPOKESMAN APOLOGISED TO COMMUTERS FOR ANY INCONVENIENCE CAUSED BUT STRESSED THAT THE TEMPORARY TAI WAI STATION IS URGENTLY NEEDED TO COPE WITH THE ELECTRIFICATION PROGRAMME.

+PEOPLE LIVING IN TAI WAI ARE ALREADY LOOKING FORWARD TO HAVING A RAILWAY STATION BUILT IN THEIR DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

THE TEMPORARY TAI WAI STATION IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN JULY NEXT YEAR.

MEANWHILE, KCR WILL INTRODUCE A SUPPLEMENTARY TIMETABLE FOR OPERATING TRAINS AT NIGHT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. COPIES OF THE TIMETABLE ARE DISPLAYED AT ALL STATIONS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT OFFICE REMINDED OWNERS OF ALL VESSELS, INCLUDING SAMPANS, FISHING VESSELS, TRADING VESSELS AND OTHERS THAT A LICENCE IS A LEGAL REQUIREMENT UNDER THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (MISCELLANEOUS CRAFT) REGULATIONS.

THE FRONT COVER SHOWS YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE UNIFORMS OF VARIOUS YOUTH GROUPS - FROM THE JUNIOR POLICE CALL TO THE GIRL GUIDES' ASSOCIATION. EACH PAGE INSIDE CARRIES A PHOTOGRAPH OF A MEMBER OF A YOUTH GROUP.

THE FOREWORD NOTES THAT NEARLY A QUARTER OF THE TERRITORY'S POPULATION ARE UNDER 15 AND THAT HONG KONG'S MANY YOUTH ORGANISATIONS ENCOURAGE YOUNG PEOPLE TO PLAY A FULL PART IN COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES.

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ONE-WAY TRAFFIC ON NGAU TAU KOK ROAD

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NGAU TAU KOK ROAD FROM JORDAN VALLEY NORTH ROAD TO SHING SHUN ROAD WILL BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY NORTHBOUND FROM 10 AM ON THURSDAY (DECEMBER 2) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NORTHERN ELEVATED ROAD.

THE ARRANGEMENT WILL LAST FOR ABOUT EIGHT MONTHS, DURING WHICH TRAFFIC ON KWUN TONG ROAD SOUTHBOUND HEADING FOR JORDAN VALLEY WILL BE DIVERTED VIA THE SLIP ROAD OUTSIDE BLOCK 1 OF THE LOWER NGAU TAU KOK ESTATE AND THE NORTHBOUND SECTION OF NGAU TAU KOK ROAD.

THIS DIVERSION WILL APPLY TO KMB ROUTE 2A AND 6D, BOTH OF WHICH TERMINATE AT NGAU TAU KOK.

MEANWHILE, BUS NOS. 13A, 13D AND 89 ON KWUN TONG ROAD SOUTHBOUND WILL HAVE TO USE ELEGANCE ROAD TO REACH NGAU TAU KOK ROAD SOUTHBOUND.

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ALSO STARTING FROM 10 AM ON THURSDAY, THE TURNING MOVEMENTS FORMERLY BANNED AT THE FOLLOWING JUNCTIONS WILL BE LIFTED:

- \* THE RIGHT TURN FROM NGAU TAU KOK ROAD NORTHBOUND INTO JORDAN VALLEY NORTH ROAD;
- \* THE LEFT TURN FROM KWUN TONG ROAD SOUTHBOUND INTO THE SLIP ROAD OUTSIDE BLOCK 12 OF THE LOWER NGAU TAU KOK ESTATE; AND
- \* THE LEFT TURN FROM THIS SLIP ROAD INTO KWUN TONG ROAD SOUTHBOUND.

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#### WATER CUTS IN THREE DISTRICTS
