HONG KONG PLAYING IMPORTANT ROLE AS REGIONAL BUSINESS CENTRE
* * * * *

HONG KONG'S SUCCESS AS A REGIONAL BUSINESS CENTRE IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO A NUMBER OF REASONS, INCLUDING ITS STABLE AND WELL ESTABLISHED LEGAL SYSTEM AND THE EASE OF MOVEMENT ENJOYED BY ITS BUSINESSMEN, THE SECRETARY FOR MONETARY AFFAIRS, MR DOUGLAS BLYE, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

HE SAID THERE IS A TENDENCY — BECAUSE THERE IS A HABIT OF THINKING IN TERMS OF HONG KONG-CHINA ECONOMIC RELATIONS — TO OVERLOOK THE FACT THAT HONG KONG IS A REGIONAL CENTRE IN WHICH AND FROM WHICH CONTRACTS ARE ARRANGED FOR THE SUPPLY OF GOODS AND SERVICES, WHICH QUITE FREQUENTLY DO NOT TOUCH HONG KONG.

HE SAID, +I BELIEVE HONG KONG HAS BECOME A CENTRE FOR THIS TYPE OF BUSINESS ACTIVITY AND OTHER ACTIVITIES; BECAUSE IT HAS A GOVERNMENT WHICH CONSISTENTLY ADHERES TO THE PHILOSOPHY OF NON-INTERVENTIONISM; BECAUSE IT IS A MAJOR FINANCIAL CENTRE; BECAUSE OF THE STABILITY WHICH ARISES FROM A CONSTITUTION WHICH IS KNOWN TO GIVE NO ARBITRARY POWERS TO ANY INDIVIDUAL OR BODY; BECAUSE IT HAS A LEGAL SYSTEM WHICH HAS STABILITY AND AUTHORITY DERIVING FROM ITS BASIS IN COMMON WITH THE SYSTEMS OF THE UNITED STATES, CANADA AND MANY OTHER COMMONWEALTH COUNTRIES, AND IN THE LONG ESTABLISHED COMMON LAW SYSTEM OF ENGLAND AND WALES; BECAUSE IT IS ONE OF THE BEST COMMUNICATION CENTRES IN THE WORLD, IF NOT THE BEST; AND NOT LEAST, BECAUSE BUSINESSMEN CAN MOVE INTO AND OUT OF THE TERRITORY WITH RELATIVE EASE.+

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF AN EXHIBITION AND SYMPOSIUM ORGANISED BY VICTORIA JAYCEES AND CITIBANK TODAY, MR BLYE SAID HE HAS NO DOUBTS THAT HONG KONG IS A VERY IMPORTANT INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL CENTRE, WHICH IS EVIDENCED BY THE FACT THAT NO LESS THAN 83 INTERNATIONAL BANKS HAVE BRANCHES OPERATING IN HONG KONG.

HONG KONG'S STANDING WAS ENHANCED BY THE REMOVAL OF INTEREST TAX ON FOREIGN CURRENCY DEPOSITS IN FEBRUARY LAST YEAR, LEADING TO A 200 PER CENT INCREASE IN SUCH DEPOSITS FROM \$32 BILLION TO \$96 BILLION UP TO THE END OF NOVEMBER.

+BUT IN CASE ANYONE SHOULD DEDUCE FROM THE FIGURES I HAVE QUOTED THAT THERE HAS BEEN, TO USE THE POPULAR JARGON, AN OUTFLOW FROM HONG KONG, I SHOULD EXPLAIN THAT OUR LATEST MONETARY STATISTICS SHOW THAT HONG KONG DOLLAR DEPOSITS HAVE REMAINED STABLE AT A LEVEL OF AROUND \$134 BILLION,+ MR BLYE SAID.

SEMINAR BACKS METRIC SYSTEM

* * * *

THE FACT THAT THE METRIC SYSTEM WILL BENEFIT BOTH CONSUMERS AND TRADERS IN HONG KONG, BECAUSE IT MAKES CALCULATION EASY AND IS ADOPTED BY MOST COUNTRIES IN THE WORLD, WAS POINTED OUT AT A SEMINAR HELD TODAY (SATURDAY), AT THE DUKE OF WINDSOR BUILDING IN WAN CHAI.

THE SEMINAR, ON THE SUBJECT +METRICATION AND THE CONSUMER+, WAS ORGANISED BY THE METRICATION COMMITTEE AS PART OF ITS +METRIC 10 DAYS+ PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN.

SPEAKERS AT THE SEMINAR WERE PROFESSOR S.Y. KING, FORMER CHAIRMAN OF THE METRICATION COMMITTEE, MR WARNER S.Y. YEH OF SONCA INDUSTRIES LTD., MR S.S. TAM OF JARDINE ENGINEERING CO. LTD. AND MR PETER Y.F. LO OF THE ECONOMIC SERVICES BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT.

PROFESSOR KING SAID THAT THE METRIC SYSTEM'S LOGICAL SEQUENCE OF DENOTING DECIMAL UNITS MADE THE SYSTEM EASY TO LEARN AND TO REMEMBER.

HE ALSO EXPLAINED THAT IN THE INTERNATIONAL SYSTEM OF UNITS (SI), BY ADDING A DECIMAL SYSTEM OF PREFIXES TO THE NAMES OF BASE UNITS, ONE COULD FORM A SERIES OF UNIT NAMES THAT DESCRIBED THE SIZE OF THE UNITS IN TERMS OF MULTIPLES OF TEN.

HE CITED THE EXAMPLE OF +METRE+, WHICH IS THE BASE UNIT NAME FOR LENGTH. BY ADDING PREFIXES THAT DESCRIBE THE MAGNITUDE OF THE UNITS, MULTIPLE NAMES SUCH AS +KILOMETRE+ (A THOUSAND METRES) AND +CENTIMETRE+ (ONE-HUNDREDTH OF A METRE) ARE FORMED.

HOWEVER, THERE ARE IN USE TWO CHINESE TERMS FOR EACH OF SOME OF THE METRIC UNITS.

PROFESSOR KING STRESSED THAT ANY CHINESE UNIT TERM MUST CONFORM TO THE +PREFIX PLUS BASE UNIT+ PRINCIPLE, ADDING THAT THERE WAS ALREADY A TRADITIONAL SERIES OF CHINESE DECIMAL PREFIXES.

THE CHINESE UNIT TERMS THAT THE METRICATION COMMITTEE RECOMMEND TO THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG, +MEI+ FOR +METRE+, +CHIN HAK+ FOR +KILOGRAM+ AND +CHIN MEI+ FOR +KILOMETRE+, CONFORM TO THE SI PRINCIPLE, WHILE OTHER TERMS VIOLATE IT.

COMMENTING ON THE METRIC CONVERSION OF THE ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES INDUSTRY, MR YEH SAID THE CHANGE WOULD SAVE MONEY AND EFFORT FOR THE INDUSTRY. HE EXPLAINED THAT THE MOVE WOULD PREVENT SIMULTANEOUS USE OF TWO DIFFERENT SYSTEMS, REDUCE THE GOODS IN STOCK AND THEREBY FACILITATE CASH FLOW.

HE SAID THAT PUBLICITY AND EDUCATION WERE IMPORTANT FOR THE CONVERSION.

MR YEH RECALLED THAT THE SALE OF REFRIGERATORS AND TELEVISION SETS HAD GONE METRIC LAST NOVEMBER. HE ADDED THAT THE METRICATION COMMITTEE WOULD CONDUCT A SURVEY IN MARCH, 1983, TO TEST THE TRADE'S RESPONSE TO THE MOVE AND PREPARE PLANS FOR THE CONVERSION OF WASHING MACHINES, ELECTRIC HEATERS AND STOVES.

MR YEH DISCLOSED THAT, TO CONFORM TO GOVERNMENT REQUIREMENTS, WIRES AND CABLES IN HONG KONG WILL BE OF METRIC DIMENSIONS IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

COMMENTING ON THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES ORDINANCE ENACTED IN 1885, WHICH IS CLOSELY RELATED TO WEIGHING INSTRUMENTS, MR TAM NOTED THAT THE ORDINANCE EMPLOYED ONLY IMPERIAL AND CHINESE UNITS AND THEREFORE REQUIRED TO BE AMENDED IN METRIC UNITS.

HE SAID THAT THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT HAD CONSULTED OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS ON THE BANNING OF NON-METRIC WEIGHING INSTRUMENTS.

HOWEVER, MR TAM SAID THAT ANY NEW ORDINANCE SHOULD ALLOW SUFFICIENT TIME FOR USERS AND MANUFACTURERS TO CONVERT EXISTING WEIGHING INSTRUMENTS TO METRIC ONES, OR PRODUCE NEW INSTRUMENTS.

A SURVEY CONDUCTED BY THE METRICATION COMMITTEE REVEALED THAT 85 PER CENT OF THE WEIGHING INSTRUMENTS IN HONG KONG WERE NON-METRIC, WHILE METRIC-ONLY ONES ACCOUNTED FOR LESS THAN ONE PER CENT.

THE MOST POPULAR WEIGHING INSTRUMENT IN USE, ACCORDING TO THE SURVEY, IS THE +CHING+, WHICH MAKES UP 29 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL.

AS FAR AS THE GOVERNMENT IS CONCERNED, MR LO SAID THE GOVERNMENT WAS DETERMINED TO IMPLEMENT THE METRICATION PROGRAMME. HE ADDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD TAKEN THE LEAD IN THE METRICATION DRIVE. IN ADDITION TO INTRODUCING LEGISLATION, THE GOVERNMENT HAS ALREADY GONE METRIC IN THE AREAS OF EDUCATION, SUPPLIES AND PUBLIC WORKS.
