GOVERNOR CONTINUES HIS VISITS TO DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARDS

THE ISLANDS DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD HAS LAUNCHED A VIGOROUS PROGRAMME IN PROMOTING CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES SINCE ITS FORMATION IN NOVEMBER LAST YEAR.

THE BOARD IS CONFIDENT THAT ITS PROGRAMME IS IN LINE WITH THE GOVERNMENT'S PROPOSED \$300 MILLION DEVELOPMENT +PACKAGE+ FOR THE DISTRICT.

THIS WAS ONE OF THE POINTS RAISED TODAY AT THE BOARD MEETING WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, IN HIS CURRENT ROUND OF VISITS TO NEWLY-ESTABLISHED DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARDS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR. DAVID AKERS-JONES, SIR MURRAY ALSO ATTENDED THE MEETING OF THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD TO LISTEN TO THEIR PLANS FOR THE COMING YEAR AND TO OFFER HIS HELP AND ADVICE.

AT THE ISLANDS DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD MEETING SIR MURRAY WAS TOLD THAT THE BOARD WAS SPENDING MORE THAN HALF OF THE \$300,000 ALLOCATED FOR THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR TO PROMOTE CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES.

THE BOARD HAS SPONSORED THE FORMATION OF THE DISTRICT CHILDREN'S CHOIR. YOUNG MEMBERS RECENTLY GAVE TWO SUCCESSFUL PERFORMANCES IN THE DISTRICT.

THE BOARD WILL SPONSOR THE ISLANDS DISTRICT CHINESE INSTRUMENTS ENSEMBLE, A DRAMA COMPETITION, A CALLIGRAPHY AND CHORAL SPEAKING COMPETITION AND A CALLIGRAPHY, PRINTING AND PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBITION DURING THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR.

A CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS SUB-COMMITTEE HAS BEEN FORMED TO PROMOTE THESE ACTIVITIES AND TO ENCOURAGE LOCAL PARTICIPATION.

SIR MURRAY WAS ALSO TOLD THAT THE BOARD HAD SET UP A MINOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT SUB-COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER AND RECOMMEND MINOR WORKS PROJECTS AND TO SUPERVISE IMPLEMENTATION. ALL RURAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN, EACH REPRESENTING HIS OWN DISTRICT, ARE SERVING ON THE SUB-COMMITTEE.

THE BOARD HAS DECIDED TO SET UP ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT GROUPS IN DIFFERENT SUB-DISTRICTS, SUCH AS CHEUNG CHAU, PENG CHAU, MUI WO AND LAMMA TO TAKE A HARD AND CRITICAL LOOK AT ITS ENVIRONMENT AND TO TAKE POSITIVE ACTION TO CLEAN IT UP.

A PILOT EXERCISE TO CLEAN-UP BLACK SPOTS AT CHEUNG CHAU HAS RECENTLY BEEN COMPLETED.

THE BOARD HOPES TO DOUBLE ITS FUNDS FROM \$300,000 TO \$600,000 FOR THE COMING FINANCIAL YEAR TO FURTHER EXPAND ITS PROGRAMME.

SIR MURRAY SPENT AN HOUR WITH MEMBERS OF THE ISLANDS DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD.

EARLIER, SIR MURRAY VISITED THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD AND ALSO SPENT AN HOUR WITH MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

SIR MURRAY WAS TOLD THAT THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD HAD CONCENTRATED ON CULTURAL, SOCIAL AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES AND HAD ORGANISED A WIDE VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES TO BE HELD THROUGHOUT THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR.

THE BOARD HAS ESTABLISHED FIVE SUB-COMMITTEES -- CULTURAL AND SOCIAL, SPORTS, LOCAL PUBLIC WORKS AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT, PUBLIC WORKS AND FINANCE -- TO DEVISE THE MOST EFFECTIVE WAYS OF SPENDING THE \$300,000 ALLOCATED TO THE BOARD.

MEMBERS OF THE CULTURAL AND SOCIAL SUB-COMMITTEE PLAN TO VISIT LOCAL OLD PEOPLE'S AND CHILDREN'S HOMES IN THE DISTRICT. THEY AIM TO SUBSEQUENTLY ESTABLISH A SOCIAL SERVICE UNIT TO TAKE ON VOLUNTEER PROJECTS IN SOCIAL SERVICES.

THE SPORTS SUB-COMMITTEE HAS ORGANISED DAY EXCURSIONS BY BOAT TO REMOTE PARTS OF THE DISTRICT TO SPECIALLY CATER FOR THE RECREATIONAL NEEDS OF YOUNG WORKERS. RESPONSE HAS BEEN FORMIDABLE AND FACTORY MANAGERS HAVE ASSISTED IN PUBLICISING THE PROGRAMME.

THE BOARD HAS REVIEWED PRIORITIES FOR LOCAL PUBLIC WORKS EXPENDITURE AND PIN-POINTED AREAS WHERE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS ARE NEEDED.

TWO UNIVERSITY UNDERGRADUATES HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE BOARD TO DESIGN A GARDEN AND AMENITY LAY-OUT FOR ONE OF THE LARGE PEDESTRIAN AREAS IN SAI KUNG TOWN. THE PROJECT WILL TAKE SEVERAL MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

NEW MEDICAL PROJECTS FOR EAST N.T.

* * * * *

A NUMBER OF MEDICAL PROJECTS ARE BEING PLANNED FOR THE EAST NEW TERRITORIES REGION TO COPE WITH THE RAPID DEVELOPMENT IN THE AREA, PARTICULARLY THE SHA TIN DISTRICT.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY THAT ONE MAJOR GENERAL HOSPITAL, ONE NEW GENERAL OUT-PATIENT CLINIC AND ONE POLYCLINIC WILL BE BUILT IN SHA TIN.

IN ADDITION, THE FANLING HOSPITAL WILL BE EXTENDED AND A NEW HOSPITAL AND A GENERAL OUT-PATIENT CLINIC ARE BEING PLANNED FOR TAI PO TO CATER FOR THE NEEDS OF THE EAST NEW TERRITORIES REGION AS A WHOLE.

IN THE SHORT TERM, THE EXISTING SHA TIN CLINIC AND MATERNITY HOME WILL HAVE MORE MEDICAL FACILITIES TO COPE WITH THE INCREASING POPULATION IN SHA TIN. ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING MADE TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY SERVICE IN THIS CLINIC UP TO MIDNIGHT BEGINNING IN OCTOBER.

CONSTRUCTION WILL SOON BEGIN ON A NEW GENERAL CLINIC, WHICH IS TO BE BUILT AT THE LEK YUEN HOUSING ESTATE.

THIS NEW CLINIC, WHEN COMPLETED IN EARLY 1980, WILL PROVIDE GENERAL OUT-PATIENT SERVICE, FAMILY HEALTH SERVICE, COMMUNITY MEDICINE AND HEALTH EDUCATION FACILITIES FOR THE LEK YUEN ESTATE RESIDENTS.

A NEW POLYCLINIC WILL ALSO BE BUILT AT SHA TIN TO PROVIDE RESIDENTS WITH A WIDE RANGE OF SPECIALIST SERVICES SUCH AS MEDICINE, GERIATRICS, SURGERY, ORTHOPAEDIC, OBSTETRIC AND GYNAECOLOGY, PAEDIATRIC, PSYCHIATRY, OPHTHALMOLOGY, EAR, NOSE AND THROAT AS WELL AS DERMATOLOGY.

THE POLYCLINIC, PROVIDING SUPPORTING SERVICES FOR THE NEW SHA TIN HOSPITAL, IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN SEPTEMBER 1982.

SITE FORMATION FOR THE NEW SHA TIN HOSPITAL HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE 1,400-BED REGIONAL HOSPITAL, WHICH WILL PROVIDE TEACHING FACILITIES FOR THE MEDICAL SCHOOL OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, WILL BEGIN SHORTLY. THE HOSPITAL, SERVING THE EAST NEW TERRITORIES REGION, IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED BY LATE 1982.

SMALLPOX VACCINATION CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FROM
U.K. ARRIVALS
* * * * *

THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT TODAY ANNOUNCED THAT ARRIVALS FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM ARE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE VALID INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATES OF VACCINATION AGAINST SMALLPOX FOR ENTRY INTO HONG KONG.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT EXPLAINED THAT THE HEALTH REQUIREMENT IS IMPOSED FOLLOWING INFORMATION FROM THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANISATION THAT BIRMINGHAM CITY IN U.K. HAS BEEN DECLARED A SMALLPOX INFECTED AREA.

ACCORDING TO W.H.O. RECOMMENDATION, A VACCINATION CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED FROM TRAVELLERS WHO, WITHIN THE PRECEDING 14 DAYS, HAVE VISITED A SMALLPOX INFECTED COUNTRY AS REFLECTED IN THE W.H.O.'S WEEKLY EPIDEMIOLOGICAL RECORDS.

THE HONG KONG HEALTH AUTHORITY TODAY RECEIVED THE LATEST COPY OF THE RECORDS FROM W.H.O. WHICH HAS INCLUDED U.K.'S BIRMINGHAM CITY AS A NEWLY INFECTED AREA.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE HEALTH REQUIREMENT WILL BE IMPOSED UNTIL THE AREA IS DECLARED FREE FROM THE DISEASE.

HE ADVISED HONG KONG PEOPLE INTENDING TO TRAVEL TO U.K. OR TO OTHER EUROPEAN CITIES VIA U.K. TO POSSESS A VALID INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF VACCINATION AGAINST SMALLPOX.

VACCINATION CERTIFICATES ARE OBTAINABLE FROM THE PORT HEALTH OFFICES AT LEE PO CHUN CHAMBER IN CENTRAL DISTRICT AND STAR HOUSE IN TSIM SHA TSUI OR FROM REGISTERED MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS WHO UNDERTAKE THIS SERVICE.

A CERTIFICATE BECOMES VALID SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE INNOCULATION IN THE CASE OF A PRIMARY VACCINATION AND IMMEDIATELY IN THE CASE OF A RE-VACCINATION.

BUSINESSMAN DONATES \$5 MILLION FOR TECHNICAL INSTITUTE

A PROMINENT HONG KONG BUSINESSMAN, MR. LEE WAI-LEE, TODAY PRESENTED THE GOVERNMENT WITH A CHEQUE FOR \$5 MILLION TOWARDS THE COST OF BUILDING A TECHNICAL INSTITUTE AT KOWLOON TONG.

MR. LEE HANDED A CHEQUE FOR THIS AMOUNT TO MR. E.P. HO, SECRETARY FOR SOCIAL SERVICES, AT A BRIEF CEREMONY IN MR. HO'S OFFICE AT THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT.

THE INSTITUTE, NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION, IS DUE TO BE READY TO TAKE ITS FIRST STUDENTS IN SEPTEMBER NEXT YEAR AND WILL BE NAMED AFTER MR. LEE.

IT WILL BE A FIVE-STOREY BUILDING WITH PLACES FOR 1,260 STUDENTS WHO WILL BE ABLE TO STUDY MORE THAN 30 DIFFERENT SUBJECTS. TOTAL COST OF THE BUILDING, WHICH WILL INCLUDE FACILITIES FOR THE HANDICAPPED, IS \$22 MILLION.

LABOUR FORCE SURVEY
* * *

THE SEPTEMBER 1978 LABOUR FORCE SURVEY - THE SIXTH IN THE SERIES OF THE SIX-MONTHLY LABOUR FORCE SURVEYS TO COLLECT UP-TO-DATE INFORMATION ON THE ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION - WILL BE CARRIED OUT BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT AT THE END OF THIS MONTH.

THE SURVEY WILL BE TAKEN ON A SAMPLE BASIS COVERING ABOUT 16,000 HOUSEHOLDS IN ALL DISTRICTS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT SAID BEFORE THE FIELD ENUMERATION, AN OFFICIAL LETTER IN BOTH ENGLISH AND CHINESE, WILL BE SENT TO HOUSEHOLDS SELECTED FOR THE SAMPLE SURVEY EXPLAINING ITS PURPOSES AND SEEKING THEIR CO-OPERATION IN PARTICIPATING.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID A NUMBER OF CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT ENUMERATORS WILL VISIT THESE HOUSEHOLDS BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 13 AND 27. EACH ENUMERATOR WILL CARRY AN OFFICIAL IDENTITY CARD WITH HIS PHOTOGRAPH ON IT FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSE.

QUESTIONS TO BE ASKED IN THE SURVEY WILL CONCERN PERSONAL AND HOUSEHOLD DATA SUCH AS AGE, EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, EMPLOYMENT STATUS, OCCUPATION, HOURS OF WORK AND TENURE, AND RENT. INFORMATION WILL ALSO BE SOUGHT ON EXPENDITURE ON DURABLE GOODS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID ALL INFORMATION COLLECTED WILL BE KEPT IN THE STRICTEST CONFIDENCE.

TOPLEY PRAISES ART AND DESIGN EXHIBITS

THE FIRST LARGE-SCALE EXHIBITION TO FEATURE ART AND DESIGN WORK CREATED BY STUDENTS IN GOVERNMENT, AIDED AND PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS TODAY DREW HIGH PRAISE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE EXHIBITION IN THE HONG KONG ARTS CENTRE, MR. TOPLEY SAID HE WAS SURPRISED AT THE VARIETY OF THE 600 EXHIBITS, WHICH RANGE FROM DRAWINGS, PAINTINGS, PRINTS, GRAPHIC DESIGNS AND JEWELLERY TO THREE-DIMENSIONAL WORK IN SCULPTURE, RELIEF AND CERAMICS.

MR. TOPLEY SAID THAT THE ART AND DESIGN PROGRAMME FOLLOWED IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS HAD DEVELOPED CONSIDERABLY IN RECENT YEARS AND NOW GAVE STUDENTS A CHANCE TO BE CREATIVE, SOMETHING WHICH WAS NOT ALWAYS POSSIBLE IN ACADEMIC SUBJECTS.

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN WEST KOWLOON

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT FROM 10 A.M. ON FRIDAY (SEPTEMBER 8) A NUMBER OF TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN WEST KOWLOON TO FACILITATE THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY WORK IN THE AREA.

THE ARRANGEMENTS INVOLVE THE RE-ROUTING OF THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF ROAD:-

- * THE SECTION OF TAI NAM STREET BETWEEN PRINCE EDWARD ROAD AND CEDAR STREET TO BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY WESTBOUND-
- * THE SECTION OF CEDAR STREET BETWEEN TAI NAM STREET AND YU CHAU STREET TO BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY NORTHBOUND-
- * THE SECTION OF CEDAR STREET BETWEEN TAI NAM STREET AND LAI CHI KOK ROAD TO BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY SOUTHBOUND- AND
- * THE SECTION OF PEI HO STREET BETWEEN LAI CHI KOK ROAD AND YEE KUK STREET TO BE RE-ROUTED ONE-WAY SOUTHBOUND.

IN CONNECTION WITH THE TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS, THE EXISTING PUBLIC LIGHT BUS STAND ON TAI NAM STREET WEST OF PRINCE EDWARD ROAD WILL BE RESITED TO TAI NAM STREET WEST OF CEDAR STREET.
