LAST DAY FOR II'S TO REGISTER

TOMORROW (SUNDAY) IS THE LAST DAY FOR ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS FROM CHINA TO REGISTER FOR AN IDENTITY CARD.

THOSE WHO HAVE NOT REGISTERED BY MIDNIGHT TOMORROW WILL BE LIABLE TO REPATRIATION TO CHINA.

+TIME IS RAPIDLY RUNNING OUT FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT YET COME FORWARD,+ A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN WARNED TODAY.

+THEY MUST REGISTER IMMEDIATELY. IT IS THEIR LAST CHANCE.+

THE SPOKESMAN WARNED ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS NOT TO DELUDE THEMSELVES OF THE CONSEQUENCES OF FAILING TO REGISTER THEMSELVES.

+AS THE CHIEF SECRETARY SAID IN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL LAST THURSDAY '... FROM NOW ON LIFE FOR THEM IN HONG KONG WILL NOT JUST BE UNPLEASANT, IT WILL BE INTOLERABLE; SOONER OR LATER THEY WILL BE DETECTED AND THEY WILL BE REPATRIATED'+

THE SPOKESMAN REMINDED ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS THAT THEY WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO OBTAIN JOBS WITHOUT ID CARDS.

+IT WILL BE AGAINST THE LAW FOR EMPLOYERS TO ENGAGE THEM,+ HE SAID. +MOREOVER THOSE WHO CONTINUE TO WORK WITHOUT ID CARDS WILL BE LIABLE TO BE DISMISSED WITHOUT NOTICE AND WITHOUT PAYMENT IN LIEU.

+AND, WITHOUT ID CARDS, THEY ARE LIABLE TO BE REPATRIATED.+

REGISTRATION SHOULD BE MADE WITHOUT DELAY AT THE SPECIAL REGISTRATION CENTRE AT VICTORIA BARRACKS, COTTON TREE DRIVE.

APPLICANTS MUST REGISTER PERSONALLY. THEY SHOULD BRING THREE RECENT PASSPORT-SIZE PHOTOGRAPHS OF THEMSELVES WITH THEIR NAMES CLEARLY WRITTEN ON THE BACK.

UP TO 12 NOON TODAY (SATURDAY), 5 015 PEOPLE HAD REGISTERED SINCE THE SPECIAL CENTRE IN VICTORIA BARRACKS OPENED ON THURSDAY.

PRESENTATION OF INSIGNIA

NINETY-SIX MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY WHO RECEIVED DECORATIONS AND COMMENDATIONS BY THE QUEEN WILL RECEIVE THEIR INSIGNIA AT A PRESENTATION CEREMONY TO BE HELD IN GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT 6 PM ON MONDAY (OCTOBER 27).

THE INSIGNIA TO BE PRESENTED INCLUDE SEVEN OBE'S, ONE ISO, TEN MBE'S, AND ONE QPM.

HEADING THE LIST OF RECIPIENTS ARE MR MARTIN ROWLANDS, SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE, WHO WILL RECEIVE THE CBE, AND MAJOR-GENERAL JOHN CHAPPLE, COMMANDER BRITISH FORCES, WHO WILL RECEIVE THE CBE (MILITARY DIVISION).

SPECIAL PARKING ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE INTRODUCED FROM 3 PM TO 7.30 PM ON MONDAY FOR THE PRESENTATION CEREMONY.

ALL CARS CARRYING GUESTS MAY ENTER BY THE MAIN GATE OF GOVERNMENT HOUSE. AFTER THE GUESTS HAVE ALIGHTED, VEHICLES BEARING +G.H.+ LABELS MAY PARK IN THE FORECOURT OR TENNIS COURTS AS DIRECTED, OR, IF CHAUFFEUR DRIVEN, MAY RETURN AT 6.30 PM.

VEHICLES BEARING GREEN LABELS MUST LEAVE BY THE EAST GATE AND MAY THEN PARK IN UPPER ALBERT ROAD, LOWER ALBERT ROAD, THE SLIP ROAD TO THE SOUTH OF THE UNITED STATES CONSULATE GENERAL BUILDING, THE METERED CAR PARK BETWEEN KENNEDY ROAD AND GARDEN ROAD AND THE CAR PARK AT CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, LOWER ALBERT ROAD.

OPENING OF KWAI CHUNG INDOOR GAMES HALL
* * *

THE OSMAN RAMJU SADICK MEMORIAL GAMES HALL IN KWAI CHUNG -- THE FIRST INDOOR SPORTS VENUE IN THE NEW TERRITORIES -- WILL BE OFFICIALLY OPENED ON MONDAY (OCTOBER 27) TO PROVIDE MORE RECREATIONAL AND SPORTING FACILITIES FOR THE 700 000 PEOPLE OF TSUEN WAN NEW TOWN.

THE DIRECTOR OF URBAN SERVICES, MR BRIAN WILSON AND MR OMAR RAMJU SADICK WILL OFFICIATE AT THE OPENING CEREMONY. THE \$7.35 MILLION PROJECT WAS JOINTLY FINANCED BY THE GOVERNMENT AND MR SADICK.

BUILT ON A 4 000 SQUARE METRE SITE AT THE JUNCTION OF HING FONG ROAD AND KWAI ON ROAD, A LOCATION CLOSE TO A PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE, THE INDOOR GAMES HALL IS MANAGED BY THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

THE CENTRAL GAMES AREA OF THE HALL IS LARGE ENOUGH FOR TWO BASKETBALL COURTS, OR EIGHT BADMINTION COURTS, OR THREE VOLLEYBALL COURTS. IT HAS A SEATING CAPACITY OF 680.

AFTER THE OPENING THERE WILL BE A GYMNASTIC DISPLAY BY STUDENTS OF HO FUNG COLLEGE, A FOLK DANCE PERFORMANCE BY THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE DANCE INSTRUCTORS' TEAM AND A JUDO DEMONSTRATION BY MEMBERS OF KWAI CHUNG JUNIOR POLICE CALL.

THE BAND OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE WILL PROVIDE MUSIC.

FORMER REGIONAL COMMISSIONER OF NORTH WESTERN NEW TERRITORIES, MR JIMMY SWEETMAN, TODAY (SATURDAY) SUCCEEDED MR HARNAM GREWAL AS DIRECTOR OF NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES.

MR GREWAL HAS LEFT THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT ON TRANSFER AND IS NOW ON LEAVE.

MR SWEETMAN HAS PREVIOUSLY SERVED IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, SOCIAL SERVICES BRANCH, HOME AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT, RESETTLEMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT.

IN THE MEANTIME, MR BOWEN PO-WING LEUNG HAS ASSUMED HIS OFFICE AS ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (NORTH) OF THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

MR LEUNG JOINED THE CIVIL SERVICE IN JUNE 1973 AND HAS SERVED IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, HOME AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT.

HE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE WORK OF THE NORTH REGION OF THE NEW TERRITORIES INCLUDING TAI PO, NORTH NEW TERRITORIES, YUEN LONG AND TUEN MUN.

CLEAN FOR CHARITY CAMPAIGN KICKS OFF

HONG KONG'S NATURAL BEAUTY IS TOO OFTEN SPOILT BY LITTER, DIRT AND THE DUMPING OF REFUSE.

THE CO-OPERATION AND INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC IN CLEANING UP THE TERRITORY HAS TO BE REKINDLED.

THESE REMARKS WERE MADE BY THE SECRETARY FOR THE ENVIRONMENT, MR DEREK JONES, AT THE OPENING OF THE COMMUNITY CHEST'S 'CLEAN FOR CHARITY' CAMPAIGN IN EDINBURGH PLACE TODAY.

MR JONES SAID THAT SINCE 1972 WHEN THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN CAMPAIGN BEGAN, THE GROWTH IN THE POPULATION AND ITS GREATER AFFLUENCE HAD INCREASED BY ALMOST 50 PER CENT THE AMOUNT OF REFUSE COLLECTED BY THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

+BUT MORE STILL NEEDS TO BE DONE,+ HE SAID. +IN PARTICULAR, THE CO-OPERATION AND INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC IN CLEANLINESS NEEDS TO BE REKINDLED.+

IT WAS A TIMELY INITIATIVE BY THE CHEST, SAID MR JONES, COMING AS IT DID AFTER THE GOVERNOR'S RECENT ANNOUNCEMENT THAT THE GOVERNMENT AND THE URBAN COUNCIL INTENDED TO EMBARK NEXT YEAR ON A NEW CAMPAIGN.

+OBVIOUSLY IT IS BETTER TO PURSUADE PEOPLE TO AVOID LITTERING RATHER THAN TO COERCE THEM,+ HE SAID. +AND I WELCOME, AS I KNOW THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN COMMITTEE DOES, ANY MOVE WHICH WILL HELP IN THIS TASK.+

MR JONES SAID THE INITIATIVE WAS GIVEN ADDED MERIT IN THAT IT WOULD, AT THE SAME TIME AS HELPING TO RID HONG KONG OF REFUSE, RAISE MONEY FOR ALL THE CHARITABLE PURPOSES SUPPORTED BY THE COMMUNITY CHEST.

HE SAID: +I HOPE THE SCHEME WE ARE LAUNCHING TODAY WILL GROW AND GAIN THE SUPPORT OF ALL IMPORTANT ORGANISATIONS IN OUR COMMUNITY.+

LABOUR LAW BREAKERS TAKEN TO COURT

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT LAST (SEPTEMBER) MONTH TOOK OUT 954 PROSECUTIONS FOR BREACHES OF LABOUR LEGISLATION.

OF THE CASES HANDLED BY THE DEPARTMENT'S PROSECUTIONS UNIT, 932 RESULTED IN CONVICTION AND FINES IMPOSED BY THE COURTS TOTALLED MORE THAN \$737 000.

THE MAJORITY OF CASES WERE RELATED TO BREACHES OF THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS ORDINANCE AND VARIOUS REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE ORDINANCE, INCLUDING THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS.

AMONG THEM, 371 CONCERNED VIOLATION OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY REGULATIONS AND FINES AMOUNTED TO MORE THAN \$436 200.

OF THESE CASES, 208 (WITH \$221 950 IN FINES) WERE FOR BREACHES OF THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (GUARDING AND OPERATION OF MACHINERY) REGULATIONS AND 108 (WITH \$167 350 IN FINES) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION SITE (SAFETY) REGULATIONS.

OFFENCES IN CONNECTION WITH EMPLOYMENT OF WOMEN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACCOUNTED FOR 529 CASES WITH \$276 100 IN FINES.
