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'HONG KONG A SAFE PLACE TO DO BUSINESS'

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HONG KONG IS A SAFE PLACE TO DO BUSINESS GIVEN ITS SOUND LEGAL SYSTEM WHICH IS GROUNDED IN THE COMMON LAW AND AN ESTABLISHED FREEDOM OF CONTRACT AND A RELIABLE AND FAIR JUDICIAL SYSTEM, THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL, MR MICHAEL THOMAS, SAID IN BRUSSELS YESTERDAY (THURSDAY).

SPEAKING AT A LUNCH MEETING OF THE BRITISH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR BELGIUM AND LUXEMBOURG, MR THOMAS DREW ATTENTION TO THE SPECIFIC ASSURANCES CONTAINED IN THE SINO-BRITISH AGREEMENT REGARDING THE CONTINUED INDEPENDENCE OF HONG KONG'S LEGAL AND JUDICIAL SYSTEM UP TO AND AFTER 1997.

CONSIDERATION WAS ALREADY BEING GIVEN TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FINAL COURT OF APPEAL IN HONG KONG, AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE AGREEMENT, IN THE EARLY 1990'S, HE ADDED.

ASKED ON HONG KONG'S FUTURE POSITION AS A FINANCIAL CENTRE, MR THOMAS EXPRESSED CONFIDENCE, NOTING HONG KONG'S IMPORTANCE TO CHINA AS WELL AS ITS ROLE AS A GATEWAY TO CHINA.

+HONG KONG'S WELL REGULATED BANKING SECTOR, SECURITIES AND COMMODITIES EXCHANGES AND FINANCIAL SERVICES SECTOR GENERALLY MAKE IT AN ATTRACTIVE CENTRE FOR INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS AS WELL,+ HE SAID.

MEANWHILE, AT A LUNCH MEETING OF THE NETHERLANDS-HONG KONG SOCIETY IN AMSTERDAM ON WEDNESDAY (APRIL 29), MR THOMAS WAS ASKED ON THE LEGAL AND FINANCIAL SAFEGUARDS FOR OVERSEAS INVESTORS IN HONG KONG AFTER 1997.

HE REITERATED THAT THE SINO-BRITISH AGREEMENT GUARANTEED THE CONTINUATION OF HONG KONG'S INDEPENDENT LEGAL SYSTEM AND JUDICIARY FOR 50 YEARS AFTER 1997.

+THE BASIS OF HONG KONG'S LEGAL SYSTEM IS, AND WILL REMAIN, THE COMMON LAW,+ HE STRESSED.

REPLYING A QUESTION ON THE LINK BETWEEN THE HONG KONG DOLLAR AND THE U.S. DOLLAR, MR THOMAS REFERRED TO THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S RECENT STATEMENT THAT THERE WERE DEFINITELY NO PLANS TO BREAK OR CHANGE THE LINK.

HE ALSO TOLD THE MEETING THE EXCELLENT RECORD OF CO-OPERATION AND CONCRETE ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP AND THE LAND COMMISSION, AND THE CURRENT HEALTHY STATE OF THE ECONOMY AMIDST CONCERNS OVER PROTECTIONIST TRENDS IN HONG KONG'S MAJOR MARKETS.

ON IMMIGRATION MATTERS, MR THOMAS OUTLINED THE RECENT MEASURES TAKEN TO STEM THE INFLOW OF CHILD ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS AND THE CONTINUING PROBLEM OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES AWAITING RESETTLEMENT FROM HONG KONG.

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**REGULATIONS AGAINST MARINE POLLUTION GAZETTED
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FOUR SETS OF REGULATIONS WERE GAZETTED TODAY (FRIDAY) UNDER THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF POLLUTION) (HONG KONG) ORDER 1987. THE REGULATIONS COME INTO FORCE ON MAY 6 AND GIVE EFFECT TO ANNEX II OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION FOR THE PREVENTION OF POLLUTION FROM SHIPS 1973 (MARPOL).

THE INTERNATIONAL MARITIME ORGANISATION DECIDED IN 1969 TO CONVENE A CONFERENCE ON MARINE POLLUTION FROM SHIPS BUT IT WAS NOT UNTIL 1973 THAT THE CONFERENCE MET IN LONDON.

DELEGATIONS FROM 72 COUNTRIES ATTENDED AS WELL AS OBSERVERS FROM EIGHT COUNTRIES AND SOME 20 INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS. THE GOVERNMENT ALSO SENT AN OBSERVER.

THE CONFERENCE PRODUCED A CONVENTION MADE UP OF FIVE ANNEXES DEALING WITH PREVENTION OF POLLUTION BY SHIPS FROM:

- (I) OIL;
- (II) NOXIOUS LIQUID SUBSTANCES IN BULK;
- (III) HARMFUL SUBSTANCES CARRIED BY SEA IN PACKAGED FORMS (INCLUDING FREIGHT CONTAINERS);
- (IV) SEWAGE FROM SHIPS; AND
- (V) GARBAGE FROM SHIPS.

THE CONVENTION REQUIREMENTS WERE EXCEEDINGLY COMPLEX AND STRINGENT. VARIOUS GOVERNMENTS FOUND DIFFICULTY IN COMPLYING WITH THESE STANDARDS AS THE EQUIPMENT REQUIRED TO BE FITTED TO SHIPS ON THEIR REGISTERS WAS NOT IN EXISTENCE. THIS LED TO A FURTHER INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE IN WHICH THE ORIGINAL CONVENTION REQUIREMENTS WERE MODIFIED AND CLARIFIED. THEREAFTER VARIOUS COUNTRIES RATIFIED THE CONVENTION AND MADE THE NECESSARY STATE LEGISLATION TO IMPLEMENT THE CONVENTION REQUIREMENTS.

THE VARIOUS ANNEXES WOULD NOT BECOME INTERNATIONALLY BINDING UNTIL A YEAR AFTER MORE THAN 15 NATIONS HAD RATIFIED IT WHO HAD, BETWEEN THEM, MORE THAN 50 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL WORLD TONNAGE OF MERCHANT SHIPS UNDER THEIR FLAG STATE CONTROL.

ANNEX I BECAME BINDING INTERNATIONALLY ON OCTOBER 2, 1983 AND ANNEX II ON APRIL 6, 1987. ANNEX III, IV AND V ARE NOT INTERNATIONALLY BINDING AS YET.

THE REGULATIONS GAZETTED TODAY HAVE TWO EFFECTS:

- * THEY ALLOW THE MARINE DEPARTMENT TO ISSUE APPROPRIATE INTERNATIONALLY VALID MARPOL ANNEX II CERTIFICATES TO SHIPS ON THE HONG KONG REGISTER. FAILURE TO DO SO COULD LEAD TO OTHER COUNTRIES REFUSING TO ALLOW HONG KONG SHIPS TO ENTER THEIR PORTS AND, IF THEY DID SO, TO DETAIN THEM;

/x THEY ALLOW

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* THEY ALLOW THE MARINE DEPARTMENT TO INSIST THAT INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING TRADING TO HONG KONG SHOULD HAVE THE APPROPRIATE CERTIFICATES WHEN CARRYING CERTAIN CHEMICALS IN BULK.

LAST YEAR THE FOLLOWING SHIPS CARRYING ONE OF THE SPECIFIED CHEMICALS ENTERED HONG KONG.

A SMALL PARCEL OF SOME 503 TONS OF ONE OF THE CAT. A CHEMICALS WAS IMPORTED IN 1985 FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SEVERAL YEARS. CAT. A SUBSTANCES ARE THE MOST HAZARDOUS IF DISCHARGED INTO THE MARINE ENVIRONMENT.

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FORMER FIRE SERVICES HEADQUARTERS SITE TO BE AUCTIONED
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CONSIDERABLE INTEREST IS EXPECTED WHEN THE OLD CENTRAL FIRE SERVICES HEADQUARTERS BUILDING SITE IN DES VOEUX ROAD IS OFFERED FOR SALE BY AUCTION AT THE END OF THIS MONTH.

THE AUCTION WILL BE HELD AT THE CITY HALL THEATRE ON MAY 29.

THE NON-INDUSTRIAL SITE MEASURES 2 098 SQUARE METRES AND IS FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, EXCLUDING GODOWN, RESIDENTIAL AND CAR PARKING PURPOSES. A HOTEL WILL BE PERMITTED.

THE BUILDING COVENANT STIPULATES THAT NOT LESS THAN 18 800 SQUARE METRES OF GROSS FLOOR AREA ARE TO BE COMPLETED ON THE SITE BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1991.

THE BUILDING DATED BACK TO 1926 AND WAS USED BY THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT UNTIL 1960. IT WAS USED AS GOVERNMENT OFFICES UNTIL 1982 WHEN IT WAS DEMOLISHED. THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY CORPORATION USED THE SITE UNTIL APRIL LAST YEAR WHEN IT WAS HANDED BACK TO THE GOVERNMENT.

TWO INDUSTRIAL SITES ARE ALSO TO BE SOLD AT THE SAME AUCTION BY THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT.

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ONE IS AT KA YIP STREET, CHAI WAN, AND MEASURES ABOUT 3 200 SQUARE METRES.

THE BUYER WILL BE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE AT LEAST 23 000 SQUARE METRES OF GROSS FLOOR AREA ON THE SITE BEFORE JUNE 30, 1991.

THE OTHER SITE, COVERING AN AREA OF ABOUT 1 057 SQUARE METRES, IS AT KING'S ROAD, QUARRY BAY.

UNDER THE BUILDING COVENANT, THE PURCHASER HAS TO DEVELOP NOT LESS THAN 6 000 SQUARE METRES OF GROSS FLOOR AREA ALSO BY JUNE 30, 1991.

IT IS STATED IN THE LEASE CONDITIONS FOR BOTH SITES THAT THEY CAN BE USED AS GODOWNS, BUT NOT FOR OFFENSIVE TRADES.

THE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD ON MAY 6, IS ORGANISED BY THE BELGIUM-HONGKONG SOCIETY TOGETHER WITH THE HONGKONG GOVERNMENT OFFICE IN BRUSSELS, THE BRUSSELS' CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, THE BRITISH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR BELGIUM AND LUXEMBOURG AND THE FINANCIAL EKONOMISCHE TIJD (A BELGIAN FINANCIAL ECONOMIC DAILY NEWSPAPER).

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FUND MANAGEMENT POWER GRANTED
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THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY HAS GRANTED AN EXEMPTION TO JARDINE MATHESON AND COMPANY TO ENABLE IT TO MANAGE THE FUNDS OF COMPANIES ASSOCIATED WITH IT.

THE EXEMPTION, PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (FRIDAY), WAS GRANTED UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE BANKING ORDINANCE.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT SECTION 12 OF THE BANKING ORDINANCE RESTRICTS THE BUSINESS OF TAKING DEPOSITS IN HONG KONG TO BANKS AND DEPOSIT-TAKING COMPANIES, BUT SECTION 13 EMPOWERS THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY TO EXEMPT ANY PERSON FROM SECTION 12 SUBJECT TO ANY CONDITIONS AS HE MAY IMPOSE.

ACCORDING TO THE GAZETTE NOTICE, JARDINE MATHESON AND COMPANY MAY TAKE DEPOSITS FROM COMPANIES AS SPECIFICALLY APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF BANKING OR FROM EMPLOYEES OF SUCH COMPANIES.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE EXEMPTION WAS TO ENABLE THE COMPANY TO MANAGE THE FUNDS OF COMPANIES ASSOCIATED WITH IT, WHICH TECHNICALLY AMOUNTS TO THE BUSINESS OF TAKING DEPOSITS.

+IT IS, HOWEVER, NOT TAKING DEPOSITS FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC WHICH THE BANKING ORDINANCE AIMS TO REGULATE,+ HE ADDED.

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AREA COMMITTEES PLAY VITAL ROLE IN DISTRICT AFFAIRS

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AREA COMMITTEES HAVE AN IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY IN IMPROVING RESIDENTS' WELFARE AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL, KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ALEX FONG, SAID THIS (FRIDAY) EVENING.

SPEAKING TO MEMBERS OF THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT'S EIGHT AREA COMMITTEES 1987-88 ORIENTATION SEMINAR AT THE MARTHA BOSS COMMUNITY CENTRE IN HO MAN TIN, MR FONG SAID THESE INCLUDED IMPROVEMENTS TO ENVIRONMENT, TRAFFIC, COMMUNITY PROJECTS AND THE PROMOTION OF RECREATION AND SPORTS IN THEIR AREAS.

MR FONG SAID THE MAIN TASK OF AREA COMMITTEE MEMBERS WAS TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS ON VARIOUS MATTERS CONCERNING THE WELFARE OF THEIR DISTRICTS.

THROUGH THESE VALUABLE RECOMMENDATIONS, THEY HELPED MAKE THE SOCIETY A BETTER AND HEALTHIER PLACE TO LIVE, HE SAID.

+THE SUCCESS OF AREA COMMITTEE DEPENDS VERY MUCH ON THE MEMBERS' ACTIVE PARTICIPATION AND THEIR CLOSE CONTACT WITH LOCAL RESIDENTS IN THE AREAS,+ SAID MR FONG.

HE ENCOURAGED AREA COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO PAY MORE ATTENTION ON LOCAL PROBLEMS AND TO RAISE QUESTIONS AT THEIR REGULAR MEETINGS IN WHICH REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS WERE REQUIRED TO ATTEND.

IN CASE OF MATTERS WHICH REQUIRED IMMEDIATE ATTENTION, THEY COULD ALSO CONTACT THE DISTRICT OFFICE WHICH WOULD LIAISE WITH APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS TO SOLVE THE PROBLEMS.

MR FONG SAID THE DISTRICT OFFICE WOULD GIVE FULL SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE TO THE AREA COMMITTEE IN DOING THEIR WORK.

THIS EVENING'S SEMINAR WAS ORGANISED TO PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR AREA COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO SHARE VIEWS AND EXPERIENCES ON VARIOUS MATTERS RELATING TO THE DISTRICT AND THEIR COMMITTEES.

MORE THAN 150 MEMBERS FROM THE EIGHT AREA COMMITTEES IN KOWLOON CITY ATTENDED THE SEMINAR.

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RABIES INFECTED AREA TO BE RESCINDED

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THE RABIES INFECTED AREA IN SO KWUN PO VILLAGE IN SHEUNG SHUI WILL BE RESCINDED WITH EFFECT FROM MAY 6, THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE ANNOUNCED TODAY (FRIDAY).

THIS FOLLOWED A REVIEW OF THE SITUATION BY THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT SINCE THE OCCURRENCE OF THE LAST RABIES CASE IN THE VILLAGE ABOUT SIX MONTHS AGO.

/THE DEPARTMENT'S

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THE DEPARTMENT'S SENIOR VETERINARY OFFICER, DR NORMAN CHENG, SAID THAT SINCE THE DESIGNATION OF THE INFECTED AREA LAST NOVEMBER, INTENSIVE ANTI-RABIES OPERATIONS INCLUDING HOUSE-TO-HOUSE VISITS, HAD PUT THE SITUATION UNDER CONTROL AND THERE HAD BEEN NO FURTHER OUTBREAK OF THE DEADLY DISEASE.

+THE DECISION TO RESCIND THIS RABIES INFECTED AREA DOES NOT MEAN THAT EFFORTS TO CONTROL THE DISEASE WILL BE RELAXED,+ HE SAID.

+IN FACT, THE DESIGNATION OF THE FRONTIER CLOSED AREA AS A RABIES INFECTED AREA WILL REMAIN IN FORCE TO PREVENT THE RE-INTRODUCTION OF THE DISEASE INTO THE TERRITORY.

+IN ADDITION, THE DEPARTMENT'S DOG CONTROL UNIT WILL CONTINUE TO INOCULATE DOGS AND CONTROL STRAY DOGS AND STRICTLY ENFORCE CONTROL MEASURES INCLUDING THE QUARANTINE OF IMPORTED DOGS AND CATS, AND COMPULSORY DETENTION OF BITER DOGS FOR OBSERVATION SO AS TO REDUCE THE RISK OF A RABIES OUTBREAK TO A MINIMUM.+

DR CHENG SAID THAT LAST YEAR MORE THAN 43 530 DOGS WERE INOCULATED AGAINST THE DISEASE AND OVER 15 200 STRAY DOGS ELIMINATED. SINCE JANUARY THIS YEAR, ANOTHER 14 000 DOGS WERE INOCULATED AND ANOTHER 5 200 STRAYS PUT DOWN.

HE WARNED THAT DUE TO THE UNIQUE EPIDEMIOLOGICAL NATURE OF RABIES, THE THREAT OF SPORADIC OUTBREAKS MIGHT STILL EXIST AND HE URGED DOG OWNERS TO HAVE THEIR DOGS INOCULATED AND TO EXERCISE PROPER CONTROL OVER THEIR PETS AT ALL TIMES.

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INNOVATIVE SPORTING PROGRAMME FOR INMATES
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THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS INTRODUCED AN INNOVATIVE PROGRAMME INTO ITS CORRECTIVE SYSTEM BY ENGAGING HONG KONG'S TOP-NOTCHED SPORTSMEN AND ARTISTS TO TRAIN PRISONERS AND YOUNG INMATES.

THE +ADVANCED RECREATIONAL TRAINING+ SCHEME, BEING OFFERED TO A SELECT GROUP OF TRAINING CENTRE INMATES AND PRISONERS IN A MAXIMUM SECURITY PRISON ON LANTAU, WAS LAUNCHED BY THE DEPARTMENT LAST MONTH, FOR DEVELOPING THE POTENTIALS AND TALENTS OF PERSONS IN CORECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS.

THE PROGRAMME INITIALLY COVERS SOCCER, TABLE-TENNIS, AND PAINTING. IF IT PROVES SUCCESSFUL IT WILL BE EXPANDED TO INCLUDE MORE SUBJECTS.

/HONG KONG'S

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HONG KONG'S NATIONAL FOOTBALL COACH, MR KWOK KA-MING, AND TABLE-TENNIS HEAD COACH OF THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE, MR CHENG CHUNG-YIN, ARE AMONG COACHES OF SPORTS TRAINING.

A WELL-KNOWN LOCAL PAINTER AND A LECTURER OF THE EXTRA-MURAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, MR KONG KAI-MING, HAS ALSO BEEN ENGAGED AS THE LECTURER OF THE ONE-YEAR PAINTING PROGRAMME FOR ADULT PRISONERS.

THE SPORTS TRAINING IS DESIGNED TO EQUIP PARTICIPATING INMATES WITH A HIGH-LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT IN SELECTED SPORTS SO THAT THEY MAY SUBSTAIN THEIR INTEREST ON RELEASE.

AT PRESENT, 14 INMATES OF LAI KING TRAINING CENTRE, AGED BETWEEN 17 TO 21, TAKE PART IN THE SOCCER TRAINING. THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS IN THE TABLE-TENNIS TRAINING IN PIK UK CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION IS 15. THEY BELONG TO THE 19 TO 23 AGE GROUP.

TRAINING SESSIONS ARE HELD ON THREE WEEKDAY EVENINGS AND A WEEKEND MORNING OR AFTERNOON. ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE FOR INMATES TO TAKE PART IN MATCHES WITH FELLOW INMATES AND GUEST TEAMS FROM OUTSIDE.

THE PAINTING PROGRAMME IS A JOINT EFFORT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT AND THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG. IT IS BASED ON THE CORRESPONDENCE COURSE PACKAGES PREPARED BY THE UNIVERSITY'S EXTRA-MURAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT. IT STARTS WITH MONOCHROME DRAWING, TO BE FOLLOWED BY WATER COLOUR PAINTING.
