MORE NEWS REPORTS ABOUT DISTRICTS URGED

* * * * *

KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICER, MR KEVIN MAK, THIS (MONDAY) AFTERNOON CALLED ON THE MEDIA TO GIVE MORE ATTENTION TO DISTRICT AFFAIRS, SO AS TO HELP PROMOTE RESIDENTS' COMMUNITY AWARENESS.

SPEAKING AT A PRESS CONFERENCE ON THE TV PROGRAMME, +GOOD MORNING, KWUN TONG+, MR MAK SAID: +WHETHER IT IS NEWS REPORTS ON THE WORK OF THE DISTRICT BOARD AND DISTRICT AFFAIRS, OR FEATURES ABOUT THE DISTRICT'S LEGENDS AND DAILY LIFE, THE MEDIA HAVE A VITAL ROLE TO HELP FOSTER RESIDENTS' KNOWLEDGE AND CONCERN ABOUT THEIR DISTRICTS.+

THE ELECTRONIC MEDIA, IN PARTICULAR, SHOULD PROVIDE MORE INFORMATIVE PROGRAMMES TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT IN HONG KONG, HE SAID.

+RESIDENTS MUST KNOW MORE ABOUT DISTRICT AFFAIRS BEFORE THEY CAN DEVELOP THEIR SENSE OF BELONGING AND EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS ON DISTRICT MATTERS,+ MR MAK SAID.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD, MR LAM HANG-FAI, SAID: +IN THE PAST 10 YEARS AND IN THE NEXT DECADE, MANY PEOPLE OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT HAVE MADE OR WILL MAKE TO KWUN TONG THEIR HOME.+

+IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE HELP NEW-COMERS TO THIS DISTRICT FEEL AT HOME, WHICH IS ONE OF THE TARGETS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD,+ HE ADDED.

MR LAM SAID THE PROGRAMME +GOOD MORNING, KWUN TONG+ WAS ONE WAY IN WHICH THE BOARD COULD ACHIEVE THIS.

SPEAKING ABOUT THE PROGRAMME, WHICH WILL BE HELD IN YUET WAH STREET PLAYGROUND ON JULY 19 AND BROADCAST LIVE ON TVB-JADE, THE DEPUTY PRODUCTION CONTROLLER OF THE HONG KONG TELEVISION BROADCASTS LIMITED, MR TANG WAI-HUNG, SAID IT WOULD INCLUDE FEATURES ON THE HISTORY OF KWUN TONG, INTERVIEWS WITH LOCAL PERSONALITIES AND DISCUSSIONS ON DISTRICT ISSUES.

NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS INCREASES

* * * * *

A TOTAL OF 90 554 WHOLESALERS, RETAIL AND IMPORT-EXPORT ESTABLISHMENTS, RESTAURANTS AND HOTELS WERE IN OPERATION DURING THE WHOLE OR PART OF 1983, WITH 551 711 PERSONS ENGAGED, ACCORDING TO SURVEY RESULTS RELEASED TODAY BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

COMPARED WITH 1982, THE NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS AND PERSONS ENGAGED INCREASED BY EIGHT PER CENT AND FOUR PER CENT RESPECTIVELY.

/IN 1983, THESE

IN 1983, THESE ESTABLISHMENTS GENERATED \$381 559 MILLION IN SALES AND OTHER RECEIPTS, AND SPENT \$18 672 MILLION ON COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES, \$34 918 MILLION ON OPERATING EXPENSES, AND \$313 527 MILLION ON PURCHASES OF GOODS FOR SALE.

COMPARED WITH 1982, SALES AND OTHER RECEIPTS INCREASED BY 18 PER CENT, WHILE COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES, OPERATING EXPENSES AND PURCHASES OF GOODS FOR SALE WENT UP BY 16 PER CENT, 17 PER CENT AND 19 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY.

VALUE ADDED, REPRESENTING THE CONTRIBUTION TO THE GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT OF HONG KONG, GREW BY 23 PER CENT TO \$40 605 MILLION IN 1983, FROM \$32 903 MILLION IN 1982.

ANALYSED BY ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, THE SURVEY REVEALED THAT IN 1983, IMPORT-EXPORT TRADE RECORDED THE LARGEST SHARE OF SALES AND OTHER RECEIPTS, AT \$249 599 MILLION OR 66 PER CENT OF THE SECTOR TOTAL.

RETAIL TRADE ACCOUNTED FOR ANOTHER 16 PER CENT, WHILE WHOLESALE TRADE TOOK UP 13 PER CENT, RESTAURANTS FOUR PER CENT, AND HOTELS-BOARDING HOUSES ONE PER CENT.

IMPORT-EXPORT TRADE CONTRIBUTED 56 PER CENT OF TOTAL VALUE ADDED IN THE SECTOR. THE REMAINING CONTRIBUTION WAS ACCOUNTED FOR BY RETAIL TRADE (18 PER CENT), RESTAURANTS (13 PER CENT), WHOLESALE TRADE (EIGHT PER CENT) AND HOTELS-BOARDING HOUSES (FIVE PER CENT).

WHEN COMPARED WITH 1982, IMPORT-EXPORT TRADE HAD THE LARGEST INCREASE IN SALES AND OTHER RECEIPTS (22 PER CENT), FOLLOWED BY WHOLESALE TRADE (14 PER CENT), HOTELS-BOARDING HOUSES (13 PER CENT), RETAIL TRADE (10 PER CENT) AND RESTAURANTS (10 PER CENT).

IN TERMS OF VALUE ADDED, IMPORT-EXPORT TRADE ALSO RECORDED THE LARGEST INCREASE (35 PER CENT), FOLLOWED BY WHOLESALE TRADE (15 PER CENT), HOTELS-BOARDING HOUSES (14 PER CENT), RESTAURANTS (10 PER CENT) AND RETAIL TRADE (NINE PER CENT).

THE 1983 SURVEY WAS ONE IN A SERIES OF ANNUAL SURVEYS CONDUCTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASCERTAINING THE STRUCTURE AND OPERATING CHARACTERISTICS OF THE DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE AND SERVICE SECTOR AND UPDATING ITS CONTRIBUTION TO THE GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT OF HONG KONG.

DATA COLLECTED IN THE SURVEY INCLUDED TYPE OF OWNERSHIP, FLOOR AREA, NUMBER OF PERSONS ENGAGED, NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES, COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES, OPERATING EXPENSES, PURCHASES OF GOODS FOR SALE, STOCKS, SALES AND OTHER RECEIPTS, AND CAPITAL EXPENDITURE.

THE DEPARTMENT IS NOW PREPARING A REPORT ON THE 1983 SURVEY OF WHOLESALE, RETAIL AND IMPORT-EXPORT TRADES, RESTAURANTS AND HOTELS, WHICH WILL CONTAIN A DETAILED ANALYSIS OF THE RESULTS BY MAJOR TRADE GROUP AND ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS.

VIEWS ON RC BILL WILL BE CONSIDERED

VIEWS EXPRESSED ON THE REGIONAL COUNCIL BILL WILL BE CONSIDERED BY UMELCO, MEMBERS OF THE KWAI CHUNG/Tsing YI DISTRICT BOARD WERE TOLD TODAY.

THE ASSURANCE WAS GIVEN BY MR CHEUNG YAN-LUNG, CHAIRMAN OF THE PROVISIONAL REGIONAL COUNCIL THIS (MONDAY) AFTERNOON WHEN HE AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL CONTINUED THEIR VISITS TO THE DISTRICT BOARDS IN THE NON-URBAN AREAS.

MR CHEUNG TOLD THE BOARD THAT IT WAS ENCOURAGING THE DISTRICT BOARDS HAD SHOWN INTEREST IN THE BILL.

SUBJECTS RELATING TO MUNICIPAL SERVICES IN THE DISTRICT WERE ALSO DISCUSSED DURING THE MEETING WHICH WAS CO-CHAIRLED BY MR CHEUNG AND MR HO TUNG-CHING, CHAIRMAN OF THE KWAI CHUNG/Tsing YI DISTRICT BOARD.

MR CHEUNG ALSO SAID THAT THE PROVISIONAL REGIONAL COUNCIL WOULD MAKE AN EFFORT TO PROMOTE THE CULTURAL, RECREATION AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES IN THE DISTRICT.

RSD MOUNTS ANTI-RODENT OPERATION IN TAI PO
* * * * *

THE REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT TODAY (MONDAY) MOUNTED A THREE-WEEK ANTI-RODENT OPERATION IN TWO TEMPORARY HOUSING AREAS IN TAI PO.

THEY ARE THE YUE KOK TEMPORARY HOUSING AREA AND SHUEN WAN TEMPORARY HOUSING AREA, WITH A TOTAL POPULATION OF MORE THAN 15 000 PEOPLE.

THE OPERATION IS AIMED AT INSTILLING PUBLIC AWARENESS OF RODENTS AS A SANITARY NUISANCE AND TO SUPPRESS RODENT BREEDING IN THE TWO TEMPORARY HOUSING AREAS, A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

DURING THE OPERATION, RODENT CONTROL TEAMS WILL BE DEPLOYED TO INSPECT ALL POSSIBLE RODENT BREEDING PLACES AND APPLYING TRAPS OR POISON BAITS ONCE RAT BREEDING IS TRACED.

HEALTH INSPECTORS OF THE RSD WILL VISIT RESIDENTS TO GIVE TECHNICAL ADVICE ON EFFECTIVE MEASURES TO ELIMINATE RODENT BREEDING AND EDUCATION TALKS ON WAYS TO DEAL WITH ANY ASSOCIATED HEALTH HAZARDS.

THEY WILL ALSO DISTRIBUTE POSTERS, HANDBILLS AND LEAFLETS TO RESIDENTS.

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT THERE WERE NO EFFECTIVE LONG-LASTING METHODS TO EXTERMINATE RATS BECAUSE ALL CONTROL MEASURES COULD BE EASILY OFFSET BY THE RAPID RATE OF REPRODUCTION OF RATS.

AS RATS WOULD MAKE FULL USE OF AVAILABLE FOOD AND SHELTERING PLACES TO BREED, THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE BEST WAY TO STOP THEM FROM MULTIPLYING WAS TO KEEP ALL FOOD IN CONTAINERS AND LEAVE NO REFUSE IN THE OPEN.

THE CHIEF BUILDING SURVEYOR OF THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE, MR C.P. TSANG, WILL BE BRIEFING THE MEDIA ON ILLEGAL STRUCTURES IN HOI FUNG BUILDING IN YAU MA TEI AT 10 AM TOMORROW (TUESDAY).

THE BUILDING, AT 137-139 SHANGHAI STREET, IS ONE OF THE BUILDINGS SELECTED BY THE ACTION GROUP ON MULTI-STOREY BUILDING PROBLEMS, FORMED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD, TO IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENT.

FOLLOWING THE BRIEFING, A TOUR WILL BE CONDUCTED TO SEE THE BUILDING'S ILLEGAL STRUCTURES AND EXTENSIONS TO BE CLEARED.

TO MARK THE OPENING CEREMONY ON SATURDAY AT YAN OI SQUARE, A SPECTACULAR VARIETY SHOW CONSISTING OF VARIOUS INTERESTING GAME STALL COMPETITIONS, SPECIALLY DESIGNED FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGE OF SIX AND 15 WILL BE STAGED.

A MOST REMARKABLE GIFT OF NATURE IS THE BAMBOO, THE MOST VERSATILE GRASS IMAGINABLE. IT CAN BE USED AS A MEDICINE, TO MAKE ROPES, FOR FISHING RODS, TO MAKE SKIS OR POLE-VAULTS, OR OF COURSE IT CAN BE EATEN. LITERALLY THERE ARE A THOUSAND AND ONE DIFFERENT USES TO WHICH MANKIND PUTS THIS REMARKABLE GRASS.

THE BOOKLET +HONG KONG BAMBOOS+ IS THE LATEST PRODUCTION IN THE URBAN COUNCIL'S VALUABLE SERIES OF BOOKLETS ON THE FLORA AND FAUNA OF HONG KONG.

IT WAS WRITTEN BY DR PAUL PUI-HAY BUT OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, MESSRS CHIA LIANG-CHI AND FUNG HOK-LAM OF THE SOUTH CHINA INSTITUTE OF BOTANY, ACADEMIA SINICA AND MR SHIU-YING HU OF THE ARNOLD ARBORÉTUM, HARVARD UNIVERSITY.
