STRATEGY TO ENHANCE ROAD SAFETY

\* \* \* \* \*

THE GOVERNMENT WILL CONTINUE ITS DRIVE TO IMPLEMENT A COMPREHENSIVE ROAD SAFETY STRATEGY TO FURTHER ENHANCE ROAD SAFETY, THE SECRETARY FOR TRANSPORT, MR ALAN SCOTT, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE ROAD SAFETY PATROLS OF THE ROAD SAFETY ASSOCIATION AT VICTORIA PARK, MR SCOTT SAID A MAIN ELEMENT IN THE STRATEGY WAS TO TACKLE PEDESTRIAN ACCIDENTS.

+FROM THE END OF THIS MONTH THERE WILL BE A PROGRAMME CONCENTRATING PARTICULARLY ON CHILDREN IN THE FIVE TO 11 AGE GROUP. PUBLICITY EFFORTS TO SHOW THE CORRECT, SAFE WAY TO CROSS A ROAD, WILL BE BACKED UP BY PROVIDING MORE ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION IN THE SCHOOL CURRICULUM, PARTICULARLY BY THE INTRODUCTION THIS YEAR OF ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION KITS AND A FILM.

+THE SAFETY OF CHILDREN WHEN THEY ARE PASSENGERS IN SCHOOL BUSES MUST ALSO BE REMEMBERED AND THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT IS URGING OPERATORS OF KINDERGARTENS TO PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION TO THE SAFETY OF SCHOOL CHILDREN TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL,+ HE SAID.

MR SCOTT SAID THE GOVERNMENT ALSO PLANNED TO PROVIDE A SECOND ROAD SAFETY TOWN IN NORTH POINT FOLLOWING THE FIRST ONE IN SAU MAU PING.

BUT IN THE MEANTIME, HE SAID, A PROGRAMME FOR MOBILE ROAD SAFETY TOWNS WOULD BE INTRODUCED NEXT MONTH FOR LARGE ESTATES TO ENABLE MORE CHILDREN TO LEARN AND UNDERSTAND ROAD SAFETY SKILLS.

MR SCOTT POINTED OUT THAT A USEFUL OPPORTUNITY WOULD ARISE NEXT MONTH WHEN THE ROAD SAFETY DIVISION OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT WOULD BEGIN COMPUTER PLOTTING TO IDENTIFY ACCIDENT BLACK SPOTS FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN.

+WHEN THE PROBLEM AREAS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED, THE ROAD SAFETY ASSOCIATION CAN REVIEW ITS DISTRIBUTION OF PATROLS AND CONCENTRATE ITS PROMOTIONAL EFFORTS ON AREAS WHERE CROSSING PATROLS ARE NEEDED MOST,+ HE SAID.

ON PROGRESS BEING MADE IN ROAD SAFETY, MR SCOTT SAID FATALITIES PER 100 000 POPULATION DECLINED FROM 9.3 IN 1981 TO 8.7 IN 1982.

ALTHOUGH TOTAL CASUALTIES AT 715 PER 10 000 VEHICLES REMAINED STEADY BETWEEN 1981 AND 1982, THIS WAS A CONSIDERABLE IMPROVEMENT OVER FIVE YEARS AGO WHEN THERE WERE 861 CASUALTIES FOR EVERY 10 000 VEHICLES, HE ADDED.

INDUSTRIAL MISSION TO CALIFORNIA A SUCCESS  
\* \* \* \*

SEVERAL INDUSTRIAL PROJECTS INVOLVING CO-OPERATION BETWEEN HONG KONG AND U.S. INTERESTS ARE EXPECTED TO BE CONCLUDED FOLLOWING A RECENT VISIT TO CALIFORNIA BY AN INDUSTRIAL INVESTMENT MISSION ORGANISED BY THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT.

THE INDUSTRIALISTS WHO HAVE RETURNED FROM THE MISSION ARE NOW DISCUSSING FURTHER WAYS OF COOPERATING WITH THEIR POTENTIAL PARTNERS WHOM THEY MET IN THE SILICON VALLEY OF CALIFORNIA.

A TOTAL OF NINE HONG KONG INDUSTRIALISTS TOGETHER WITH DR ANDREW CHUANG, THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF CHUANGS'S (HOLDINGS) LTD; MR VIC MILLER, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE HONG KONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATES CORPORATION; MR ROBERT ASHWORTH, PRINCIPAL CONSULTANT OF THE INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT'S SAN FRANCISCO INDUSTRIAL PROMOTION OFFICE, PARTICIPATED IN THE MISSION LED BY MR PAUL WONG, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF INDUSTRY.

+THIS WAS THE FIRST OF A SERIES OF MISSIONS WE HAVE PLANNED WITH PARTICIPATION BY LOCAL INDUSTRIALISTS. A MISSION HAS JUST RETURNED FROM JAPAN OVER THE WEEKEND AND OTHER MISSIONS HAVE BEEN SCHEDULED TO VISIT SWEDEN AND THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY,+ MR WONG SAID.

+WE MADE KNOWN TO THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY IN THE SILICON VALLEY THE VALUE OF HONG KONG AS A BASE FOR OFFSHORE MANUFACTURING INVESTMENTS AND MET COMPANIES INTERESTED IN DISCUSSING JOINT OPERATIONS IN HONG KONG.+

AT A SEMINAR IN THE SILICON VALLEY, MR WONG, DR CHUANG AND MR MILLER DISCUSSED WITH MORE THAN THIRTY EXECUTIVES FROM U.S. ELECTRONICS FIRMS THE INVESTMENT CLIMATE AND OTHER FACTORS CONCERNING INDUSTRIAL INVESTMENTS IN HONG KONG.

A SERIES OF INDIVIDUAL MEETINGS WERE ALSO ORGANISED TO ENABLE THE MISSION MEMBERS TO DISCUSS WITH THEIR POTENTIAL PARTNERS JOINT VENTURE PRODUCTION OF HIGH TECHNOLOGY ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS IN HONG KONG.

THE MISSION ALSO VISITED THE STANFORD RESEARCH INSTITUTE (SRI) WHERE THEY WERE BRIEFED BY SEVERAL SPECIALISTS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY, ESPECIALLY OF SEMI-CONDUCTORS AND CABLE TV SYSTEMS.

THE HONG KONG INDUSTRIALISTS FOUND THAT THE SRI - A MAJOR NON-PROFIT MAKING RESEARCH ORGANISATION WITH SOME 3 000 STAFF ENGAGED IN RESEARCH RELATING TO LIFE SCIENCES, ENGINEERING AND ECONOMICS - COULD BE AN EXCELLENT SOURCE OF SUPPORT FOR THEIR EFFORTS IN DEVELOPING NEW PRODUCTS AND TECHNOLOGIES.

+THE MISSION WAS A SUCCESS. IT GAVE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR LOCAL INDUSTRIALISTS INTERESTED IN SECURING NEW TECHNOLOGY TO MEET FACE TO FACE WITH POTENTIAL JOINT VENTURE PARTNERS AND STUDY THEIR FACILITIES, SO THAT THEY CAN GAIN FIRST-HAND INFORMATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE TYPE OF OPERATIONS THEY WERE TALKING ABOUT,+ DR CHUANG SAID.

+THESE COMPANIES INCLUDE MANUFACTURERS OF MINI-COMPUTERS, COMPUTER PERIPHERALS AS WELL AS TELECOMMUNICATION SYSTEMS AND EQUIPMENT WHICH HAVE GREAT DEVELOPMENT POTENTIAL IN HONG KONG,+ DR CHUANG ADDED.

### SAFETY MEASURES IN SCHOOL LABORATORIES

\* \* \* \*

SUPERVISORS, SCHOOL HEADS, SCIENCE TEACHERS AND LABORATORY TECHNICIANS ARE URGED TO PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION TO SAFETY IN SCHOOL LABORATORIES.

IF A SCIENCE LABORATORY IS USED AS A CLASSROOM FOR NON-SCIENCE LESSONS DUE TO FLOATING CLASS ARRANGEMENTS, THE TEACHER INVOLVED SHOULD SEE TO IT THAT THE STUDENTS DO NOT ENTER THE LABORATORY UNLESS HE IS PRESENT AND THAT THEY DO NOT DISTURB OR REMOVE ANY OF THE SCIENCE MATERIALS IN THE LABORATORY.

EVERY LABORATORY SHOULD BE EQUIPPED WITH AT LEAST ONE APPROPRIATE FIRE EXTINGUISHER WHICH IS EASILY ACCESSIBLE, A FIRE BLANKET AND A BUCKET OF SAND, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY.

+WHENEVER A LABORATORY IS NOT IN USE, ITS GAS AND ELECTRICITY SUPPLIES SHOULD BE SWITCHED OFF AT THE MAINS,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO SAID THAT STUDENTS SHOULD BE TAUGHT HOW TO EVACUATE A LABORATORY IN THE MOST EFFECTIVE MANNER IN THE EVENT OF FIRE. +IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ANY SUCH EVACUATION SHOULD BE CARRIED OUT IN AN ORDERLY, CONTROLLED MANNER, AND THAT EVERYTHING BE DONE TO AVOID PANIC AMONGST STUDENTS,+ HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN ADVISED SCHOOLS TO KEEP ONE OF THE TWO EXIT DOORS OF THE LABORATORY UNLOCKED WHILE PRACTICAL LESSONS ARE IN PROGRESS. +FURTHERMORE, SCHOOLS ARE REMINDED THAT THE PASSAGES FOR THE LABORATORY EXITS SHOULD ALWAYS BE KEPT CLEAR OF OBSTACLES.+

THE ATTENTION OF SCIENCE TEACHERS AND LABORATORY TECHNICIANS IS DRAWN TO THE STORAGE OF POTASSIUM AND SODIUM METALS IN THEIR LABORATORIES. +THESE METALS SHOULD BE COVERED WITH PARAFFIN IN WELL-SEALED GLASS BOTTLES IN METAL CONTAINER AND STORED DRY,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

IN THIS CONNECTION, SCIENCE TEACHERS AND LABORATORY TECHNICIANS WERE ASKED TO TAKE NOTE OF THE +SAFETY IN THE LABORATORY+ PAMPHLET WHICH WAS PUBLISHED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND DISTRIBUTED TO SCHOOLS PREVIOUSLY.
