NEW LOOK PLANNED FOR TOWN SQUARES IN TSUEN WAN
* * * * *

RESIDENTS OF TSUEN WAN NEW TOWN WILL BE ABLE TO ADVISE THE GOVERNMENT NEXT WEEK ON HOW THEY FEEL THEIR TOWN CAN BE BEAUTIFIED.

THE TSUEN WAN RECREATION AND AMENITIES (ADVISORY) COMMITTEE, WHICH HAS A MAJORITY OF UNOFFICIALS DRAWN FROM THE LOCAL COMMUNITY, IS PLANNING TO GIVE A NEW LOOK TO EACH OF THE FIVE TOWN SQUARES IN TSUEN WAN AS PART OF THE LONG-TERM PLAN TO IMPROVE THE TOWN'S ENVIRONMENT.

A SIX-DAY EXHIBITION STARTING NEXT TUESDAY (JUNE 21) WILL SHOW A NUMBER OF PROPOSED DESIGNS AND MODELS FOR THE TOWN SQUARES AND PEOPLE ATTENDING WILL BE INVITED TO COMMENT.

THEIR SUGGESTIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR INCORPORATION INTO FUTURE IMPROVEMENT SCHEMES PLANNED FOR TAI PEI SQUARE, YI PEI SQUARE, SAM PEI SQUARE, HAU TEI SQUARE AND LO TAK COURT.

THE DESIGNS AND MODELS HAVE BEEN PREPARED BY A GROUP OF THIRD-YEAR ARCHITECTURE STUDENTS FROM THE HONG KONG UNIVERSITY UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF THEIR DEPARTMENT HEAD, PROF. K.C. LYE.

THE EXHIBITION, ENTITLED '+TSUEN WAN -- OLD AND NEW+', WILL BE OFFICIALLY OPENED ON MONDAY (JUNE 20) BY THE TSUEN WAN TOWN MANAGER, MR. JAMES HAYES, PROF. LYE, AND THE TSUEN WAN RURAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN, MR. PETER YEUNG.

MR. HAYES SAID TODAY THE EXHIBITION AIMS AT INVOLVING MORE PEOPLE OF TSUEN WAN IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR NEW TOWN.

HE SAID THE EXHIBITION WOULD GIVE LOCAL PEOPLE THE OPPORTUNITY OF EXPRESSING THEIR VIEWS ON HOW THEY FEEL THEIR TOWN SQUARES SHOULD LOOK IN FUTURE.

+ I HOPE THEY WILL TAKE A KEEN INTEREST IN THE IMPROVEMENT SCHEME AND THEIR SUGGESTION WOULD BE MOST WELCOME,+ HE SAID.

MR. HAYES SAID SUGGESTION BOXES WOULD BE PROVIDED TO COLLECT IDEAS DURING THE ENTIRE PERIOD OF THE EXHIBITION.

THE EXHIBITION IS A JOINT VENTURE BY THE TSUEN WAN RECREATION AND AMENITIES (ADVISORY) COMMITTEE, THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE ARCHITECTURE DEPARTMENT OF THE HONG KONG UNIVERSITY.

APART FROM THE DESIGNS AND MODELS, IT WILL DISPLAY PHOTOGRAPHS OF HISTORICAL BUILDINGS AND MEASURED DRAWINGS OF SOME OF THE PLACES IN TSUEN WAN -- SAM TUN UK, WO YI HOPE VILLAGE, HOI PA OLD VILLAGE AND TIN HAU TEMPLE.

PROPOSALS TO ALTER THE 1977-78 VALUATION LISTS

* * * * *

THE RATING AND VALUATION DEPARTMENT HAS DEALT WITH MOST OF THE PROPOSALS LODGED BY RATEPAYERS IN MARCH FOR THE ALTERATION OF THE 1977-78 VALUATION LISTS.

ABOUT 100 PROPOSALS ARE STILL BEING CONSIDERED AND IT IS EXPECTED THAT DECISIONS ON THESE WILL BE MADE SOON.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THAT EACH PROPOSAL LODGED WAS GIVEN CAREFUL CONSIDERATION BY THE VALUER FOR THE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE CONCERNED PREMISES WERE SITUATED. THE VALUER'S RECOMMENDATION WAS THEN SCRUTINISED AND A DECISION MADE ON IT BY A MORE SENIOR OFFICER OF THE DEPARTMENT BEFORE A FORMAL NOTICE OF DECISION WAS SENT TO THE RATEPAYER.

REDUCTIONS IN RATEABLE VALUE HAD BEEN ALLOWED IN SOME 1,800 CASES.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT A NUMBER OF THE NOTICES OF DECISION, HAVING BEEN SENT BY RECORDED DELIVERY, HAD BEEN RETURNED BY THE POST OFFICE AS UNDELIVERABLE, AND THE DEPARTMENT WAS NOW TRYING TO CONTACT THE PERSONS CONCERNED BY TELEPHONE OR BY VISITING THE PREMISES.

ANY PERSON WHO LODGED A PROPOSAL BUT HAS NOT RECEIVED A NOTICE OF DECISION FROM THE COMMISSIONER BY THE END OF JUNE SHOULD CONTACT THE DEPARTMENT.

NEED FOR MAINTENANCE OF GOOD ORDER IN SCHOOLS

* * *

THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. KENNETH TOPLEY SAID TODAY +I AM SERIOUSLY CONCERNED WITH THE NEED TO MAINTAIN GOOD ORDER AND DISCIPLINE IN ALL SCHOOLS IN HONG KONG.+

MR. TOPLEY WAS COMMENTING ON THE RECENT INCIDENTS AT THE PRECIOUS BLOOD GOLDEN JUBILEE SECONDARY SCHOOL.

IN A PUBLIC STATEMENT THE DIRECTOR SAID: +IT IS MY DUTY TO ENSURE THAT ALL MATTERS RELATING TO EDUCATION IN HONG KONG ARE CONDUCTED PROPERLY.

+I DO NOT WISH TO SEE A REPETITION OF INCIDENTS SIMILAR TO THOSE WHICH OCCURRED RECENTLY AT PRECIOUS BLOOD GOLDEN JUBILEE SECONDARY SCHOOL. I HAVE THEREFORE ISSUED LETTERS OF WARNING TO ALL TEACHERS CONCERNED WHO WERE DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY INVOLVED IN A PUPILS' DEMONSTRATION AT THE SCHOOL. IF THERE IS A REPETITION OF THIS BEHAVIOUR, I WILL BE OBLIGED TO CONSIDER SERIOUS ACTION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE EDUCATION ORDINANCE.+

MR. TOPLEY URGES PARENTS OF PUPILS ATTENDING THE SCHOOL TO EXERCISE THEIR INFLUENCE ON THEIR CHILDREN BY COUNSELLING THEM TO BEHAVE IN AN ORDERLY AND APPROPRIATE MANNER. PARENTS SHOULD REALISE THAT PUPILS ABSTAINING FROM ATTENDING CLASSES ON THEIR OWN INITIATIVE OR AT THE INITIATIVE OF OTHERS WERE PARTICIPATING IN ACTIONS NOT IN THEIR BEST INTEREST. A BREACH OF SCHOOL REGULATIONS COULD LEAD TO SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES FOR PUPILS.

AS REGARDS DEPARTMENTAL INVESTIGATIONS INTO ALLEGED IRREGULARITIES OF THE SCHOOL ACCOUNTS, THE DIRECTOR REPEATS THAT THE MATTER IS NOW IN THE HANDS OF THE POLICE ON THE ADVICE OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS. NO FURTHER COMMENT ON THIS MATTER IS THEREFORE PROPER.

THE DIRECTOR, HOWEVER, ACCEPTS THE NEED FOR STRONG AND PROPER MANAGEMENT OF THE SCHOOL AND TO THIS END APPOINTED AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT OFFICER AS A MANAGER OF THE SCHOOL AT THE FIRST HINT OF ALLEGED MALADMINISTRATION IN MID-APRIL. +THERE CAN BE NO JUSTIFICATION FOR THE INVOLVEMENT OF CHILDREN SUBSEQUENTLY IN MATTERS WHICH HAD BEEN TAKEN FIRMLY IN HAND BY THE DEPARTMENT AT THE OUTSET,+ MR. TOPLEY SAID.

THE DIRECTOR TAKES THE OPPORTUNITY OF THIS PUBLIC STATEMENT TO SAY THAT CONTRACTS RECENTLY SIGNED BY THE TEACHERS OF THE SCHOOL WERE LEGALLY BINDING ON BOTH THE TEACHING STAFF AND THE SCHOOL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE. THE CONDITIONS OF SERVICE OUTLINED BY THESE CONTRACTS SHOULD BE SCRUPULOUSLY OBSERVED BY BOTH PARTIES.

IN CONCLUSION THE DIRECTOR BELIEVES THAT THE PUBLIC GENERALLY WILL WELCOME THIS EXPRESSION OF HIS CONCERN AND DETERMINATION NOT TO TOLERATE THE DISRUPTION OF GOOD ORDER AND DISCIPLINE IN SCHOOLS.

RECORD PRODUCTION BY PRINTING DEPARTMENT

* * * * *

DESPITE THE LOSS OF SOME OF ITS HIGH CALIBRE STAFF AND RESTRICTIONS CAUSED BY THE TWO YEARS OF RECESSION, THE PRINTING DEPARTMENT HAS ACHIEVED AN IMPRESSIVE RECORD IN PRODUCTION OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS FROM 1974 TO 1977.

IN THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1976-77, THE PAPER THROUGHPUT REACHED A RECORD 2,358 TONS WITH A STAFF STRENGTH OF 396, COMPARED WITH 1,890 TONS IN 1974-75 WHEN THE DEPARTMENT HAD 413 STAFF.

THE WORKLOAD OF THE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN INCREASING AT AN AVERAGE RATE OF NINE PER CENT OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS ALTHOUGH THE FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS IMPOSED AS A RESULT OF WORLD-WIDE RECESSION, CAUSED A MOMENTARY DROP IN INPUT DURING 1975-76.

A NUMBER OF FACTORS HAS CONTRIBUTED TO THIS INCREASE, SUCH AS THE GROWING DEMAND FOR THE USE OF COLOUR IN GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS, WHICH MORE THAN DOUBLED IN 1976-77 OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR, AND THE RISE IN IN-PLANT PRODUCTIVITY AS A RESULT OF THE DROP IN VALUE OF CONTRACTS PLACED OUTSIDE.

THIS VALUE IN 1976-77 PLUNGED TO \$1.7 MILLION COMPARED WITH \$7.9 MILLION IN 1973-74.

+THOUGH THERE WAS AN EVER INCREASING WORKLOAD, IT WAS HANDLED MORE EFFECTIVELY DUE TO BETTER DIRECTION, RATIONALISATION OF PRODUCT WHEREVER POSSIBLE, MORE SKILFUL UTILISATION OF RESOURCES AND A SPLENDID RESPONSE FROM THE TOTAL WORKFORCE,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT EXPLAINED.

A PRODUCTION CONTROL UNIT WAS SET UP IN LATE 1974 TO TAKE CARE OF THE PLANNING AND SPECIFYING OF ALL INCOMING WORK, OPTIMUM UTILISATION OF RESOURCES, CO-ORDINATION AND DIRECTION OF THE THREE MAIN PRODUCTION DIVISIONS, COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS OF PRODUCTION DATA, AND QUALITY CONTROL.

BUT APART FROM THE NATURAL WASTAGE OF STAFF TURNOVER AND THE LOSS OF A NUMBER OF ITS TOP NOTCH OFFICERS TO OTHER GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, THE SEVERE SHORTAGE OF SPACE IS THE MOST INHIBITING PROBLEM THAT THE DEPARTMENT FACED.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT SATURATION POINT WAS REACHED MANY YEARS AGO AND IT WAS NECESSARY TO SEEK EXTERNAL STORAGE FACILITIES.

THE CONTINUING RISE IN PRODUCTIVITY REQUIRING A GREATER THROUGHPUT OF PAPER, CALLED FOR A LARGER MARSHALLING AREA FOR BULK PAPER STORAGE, A LARGER CUTTING-TO-SIZE WORKING AREA, A LARGER SPACE FOR WORK IN PROGRESS AND A GREATER HOLDING AREA FOR PACKED WORK AWAITING DELIVERY.

AS TO THE IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE IN THE PRODUCTION LINES, A FIRM OF CONSULTANTS, SPECIALISTS IN THE FIELD OF COMPUTER-AIDED PHOTO-COMPOSITION, HAD ADVISED THAT THE TIME WAS WELL RIPE FOR A VENTURE INTO PHOTO-COMPOSITION FROM HOT-METAL TYPE-CASTING SYSTEM, AND THAT THERE WERE CONSIDERABLE ADVANTAGES TO BE GAINED FROM SUCH A STEP, THE SPOKESMAN INDICATED.

A NUMBER OF SUCH SYSTEMS ARE BEING INVESTIGATED AND NEGOTIATIONS ARE PROGRESSING.

A COST SYSTEM, AIMED AT A SENSIBLE APPORTIONMENT AND RECOVERY OF ALL COSTS, BILLING SYSTEMS, EXPENDITURE CONTROL SYSTEMS AND MANAGEMENT INFORMATION FOR COST AND PRODUCTION CONTROL, HAS ALSO BEEN DEVISED BY A TREASURY ACCOUNTANT FOR THE DEPARTMENT IN MARCH 1976. TENDERS ARE BEING CALLED FOR THE SOFTWARE PROGRAMMES AND THE DATA PREPARATION UNITS.

JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE BILL

* * *

A BILL TO ESTABLISH THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE, FORMERLY REFERRED TO AS THE SHA TIN SPORTS CENTRE, IS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY.

THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE BILL PROVIDES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A BOARD TO BE KNOWN AS THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE BOARD WHICH WILL BE A BODY CORPORATE TO PLAN, CONSTRUCT AND MANAGE THE CENTRE.

THIS BOARD WILL CONSIST OF UP TO NINE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, OF WHOM UP TO FOUR WILL BE APPOINTED IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB, SINCE THE CENTRE IS A JOINT VENTURE BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND THE JOCKEY CLUB.

ITS OFFICIAL NAME, THE JUBILEE SPORTS CENTRE, WAS APPROVED RECENTLY BY THE PROVISIONAL BOARD AND THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

THE PROVISIONAL BOARD OF FIVE WAS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR IN APRIL TO SEE THE LEGISLATION THROUGH ITS FORMATIVE STAGES AND TO GET THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CENTRE UNDER WAY.

THIS PROVISIONAL BOARD CONSISTS OF SIR ALBERT RODRIGUES AS CHAIRMAN, A KEEN SPORTSMAN AND PROMINENT HONG KONG CITIZEN= MR. P.G. WILLIAMS AND MR. LAMSON KWOK, STEWARDS OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB= SIR DONALD LUDDINGTON, A LONG-TIME CIVIL SERVANT OF HONG KONG, AND MR. EDWIN WONG, AN ARCHITECT WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT SPECIALISING IN RECREATIONAL DESIGN.

ALL THE MEMBERS OF THE PROVISIONAL BOARD HAVE BEEN AND STILL ARE KEENLY INTERESTED IN A WIDE VARIETY OF SPORTS. THEY WILL BE APPOINTED TO THE FULL BOARD ONCE THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION IS ENACTED.

THE PROVISIONAL BOARD HAD ALREADY EMPLOYED CONSULTANTS TO RECRUIT THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE AND THE POST HAD BEEN ADVERTISED BOTH LOCALLY AND IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

IT HAS SO FAR MET ON THREE OCCASIONS AND WILL BE MEETING FURTHER TO CONSIDER THE SCOPE AND FUNCTION OF THE CENTRE IN THE HONG KONG SPORTING SCENE.

EXHIBITION OF ENGINEERING AND FURNITURE DESIGNS

EXAMPLES OF ENGINEERING DESIGN, ELECTRIC/ELECTRONICS AND FURNITURE DESIGN ARE ON DISPLAY AT THE ARSENAL STREET POLICE PRIMARY SCHOOL.

THE PROJECTS HAVE BEEN MADE AS PART OF THE REQUIREMENTS FOR FORM 5 PUPILS WHO TAKE WOODWORK AND METALWORK IN THE HONG KONG CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION EXAMINATION.

THE PROJECT APPROACH HAS INVOLVED PUPILS IN INITIATING THEIR OWN IDEAS, PROBLEM SOLVING AND CREATIVE WAYS OF WORKING WITH WOOD AND METAL. IT HAS RESULTED IN A MORE ENLIGHTENED PROGRAMME OF LEARNING IN FIFTH YEAR PRACTICAL STUDY.

THE DESPATCH OF SAMPLES BY SPEEDPOST TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, SUSPENDED EARLIER THIS MONTH, WILL BE RESUMED FROM MONDAY (JUNE 20).

A POST OFFICE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT THE SERVICE WAS SUSPENDED BECAUSE ITEMS OF MERCHANDISE, WHICH WERE DUTIABLE AND THUS SUBJECT TO DELAY BY CUSTOMS, WERE BEING SENT BY SPEEDPOST AS 'SAMPLES'.

HE SAID THE UNITED STATES AUTHORITIES HAD NOW MADE CLEAR THAT BONA FIDE SAMPLES MUST BE :

- * NOT VALUED AT MORE THAN US\$1; OR MARKED, TORN, PERFORATED OR OTHERWISE TREATED SO THAT THEY ARE UNSUITABLE FOR SALE OR FOR USE OTHERWISE THAN AS SAMPLES, AND
- * INTENDED FOR USE IN THE UNITED STATES FOR SOLICITING ORDERS.

+SENDERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SIGN A DECLARATION FORM TO THIS EFFECT BEFORE SAMPLES ARE ACCEPTED FOR TRANSMISSION.

+IT IS REGRETTED THAT ITEMS OF MERCHANDISE WHICH DO NOT MEET THESE CONDITIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. THEY MAY, OF COURSE, BE SENT BY ORDINARY AIR-MAIL SERVICES,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.
