LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL APPOINTMENT

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN ANNOUNCED TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT THE GOVERNOR HAD RE-APPOINTED THE FOLLOWING PERSONS AS MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL FOR THE 1991-95 TERM:

IN ADDITION, AS HAS BEEN PREVIOUSLY ANNOUNCED, MR JOHN SWAINE CBE QC JP HAS BEEN APPOINTED AS A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL AND WILL FILL THE POST OF DEPUTY PRESIDENT.

THE APPOINTMENTS WILL RUN FROM THE DAY APPOINTED FOR THE FIRST SITTING OF THE NEW SESSION (OCTOBER 9, 1991) UNTIL THE NEXT DISSOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL.

THE GOVERNOR SAID THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL WERE CHOSEN FROM A WIDE RANGE OF DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS.

ALL HAD A GOOD RECORD OF PREVIOUS PUBLIC SERVICE. THEY ARE PEOPLE WHO HAVE MADE THEIR MARK IN THEIR FIELDS AND HAVE DEMONSTRATED INDEPENDENCE OF MIND.

HE WAS SURE THAT THEY WOULD ALL MAKE A VALUABLE CONTRIBUTION TO THE WORK OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OVER THE NEXT FOUR YEARS.

HE ALSO PAID A WARM TRIBUTE TO THE CONTRIBUTION THAT THOSE RETIRING AS APPOINTED MEMBERS HAD MADE TO THE GOOD GOVERNMENT OF HONG KONG DURING THEIR MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL.

HE NOTED WITH PLEASURE THAT SOME OF THEM HAD BEEN ELECTED TO THE COUNCIL FOR THE NEW SESSION, AND WAS SURE THAT THE OTHERS WOULD CONTINUE TO SERVE HONG KONG IN OTHER WAYS IN THE YEARS TO COME.

BRIEF DETAILS OF EACH OF THE NEW APPOINTEES ARE AS FOLLOWS:-

PROFESSOR EDWARD CHEN KWAN-YIU

AGED 46. DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRE OF ASIAN STUDIES AT HONG KONG UNIVERSITY. VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE CONSUMER COUNCIL AND A MEMBER OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

MR MOSES CHENG MO-CHI

AGED 41. A SOLICITOR. HE HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH A NUMBER OF VOLUNTARY AGENCIES, INCLUDING THE JUVENILE CARE CENTRE, THE FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS AND ST JAMES SETTLEMENT, AND HAS BEEN PROMINENT IN CHURCH AND COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES IN CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT.

MR VINCENT CHENG HOI-CHUEN

AGED 43. SENIOR MANAGER (GROUP RESEARCH) WITH THE HONGKONG AND SHANGHAI BANKING CORPORATION. PREVIOUSLY A FULL-TIME MEMBER OF THE CENTRAL POLICY UNIT.

MR MARVIN CHEUNG KIN-TUNG

AGED 44. AN ACCOUNTANT. AN APPOINTED URBAN COUNCILLOR SINCE 1985 AND A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS, THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON COMPANY LAW REFORM AND THE INSURANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

MR TIMOTHY HA WING-HO

AGED 54. PRINCIPAL OF ST PAUL'S COLLEGE. CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND A MEMBER OF THE EDUCATION COMMISSION, MEDICAL DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE.

DR LAM KUI-CHUN

AGED 49. A PHYSICIAN IN PRIVATE PRACTICE. A MEMBER OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, DEPUTY CHIEF ADJUDICATOR OF THE IMMIGRATION TRIBUNAL AND A FORMER DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER.

MR ERIC LI KA-CHEUNG

AGED 38. AN ACCOUNTANT. CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION ON YOUTH AND A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE SUBVENTIONS AND LOTTERIES FUND ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND THE OPERATIONS REVIEW COMMITTEE OF THE ICAC. CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG PHAB ASSOCIATION AND AN APPOINTED DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER.

AGED 50. PROFESSOR IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY AT HONG KONG UNIVERSITY. CHAIRMAN OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL WORK TRAINING AND MANPOWER PLANNING, AND A MEMBER OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, THE HOSPITAL AUTHORITY AND THE MENTAL HEALTH REVIEW TRIBUNAL.

MR STEVEN POON KWOK-LIM

AGED 48. DIRECTOR AND GENERAL MANAGER OF THE CHINA LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY. A MEMBER OF THE COUNCILS OF THE HONG KONG STOCK EXCHANGE AND THE HONG KONG UNIVERSITY FOR SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, AND A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION.

MR HENRY TANG YING-YEN

AGED 39. MANAGING DIRECTOR OF PENINSULA KNITTERS LIMITED. A MEMBER OF THE TEXTILES ADVISORY BOARD, THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD, THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE, THE INLAND REVENUE BOARD OF REVIEW AND THE HONG KONG COUNCIL FOR ACADEMIC ACCREDITATION.

GOVERNOR VISITS MARINE POLICE

THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, VISITED THE MARINE POLICE LAST (FRIDAY) NIGHT IN ORDER TO SEE FOR HIMSELF THE WORK OF THE ANTI-SMUGGLING TASK FORCE AND TO CONGRATULATE THEM ON THE SUCCESS OF THEIR OPERATION.

HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE ACTING COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR JOHN THORPE, AND THE MARINE REGIONAL POLICE COMMANDER, MR BARRIE DEEGAN.

SIR DAVID WAS BRIEFED ON THE WORK OF THE TASK FORCE AT THEIR BASE AT MEI SHA, SHA TIN.

HE THEN MET WITH POLICE, CUSTOMS AND EXCISE AND ROYAL NAVY PERSONNEL IN THE UNIT AND INSPECTED SOME OF THE SPEEDBOATS CONFISCATED FROM SMUGGLERS.

SIR DAVID ALSO WENT ON BOARD A NUMBER OF POLICE LAUNCHES AND MET THE CREWS, INCLUDING SOME OFFICERS WHO HAD BEEN INJURED DURING ANTI-SMUGGLING OPERATIONS.

MANY COMMUNITY FACILITIES HAVE BEEN BUILT IN TSEUNG KWAN O NEW TOWN TO COPE WITH THE GROWING POPULATION, THE SAI KUNG DISTRICT OFFICER, MR PARRISH NG, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE TSEUNG KWAN O CARNIVAL IN PO LAM ESTATE, MR NG SAID THESE INCLUDED TWO INDOOR RECREATIONAL CENTRES, A GOVERNMENT CLINIC, AND MANY OTHER SOCIAL SERVICE FACILITIES.
