SURVEY INDICATES MODERATE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENTS  
\* \* \* \* \*

RESULTS OF A QUARTERLY BUSINESS SURVEY HELD LAST MONTH INDICATE THAT MODERATE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENTS TOOK PLACE IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 1980 AND A FAIR LEVEL OF CONFIDENCE FOR THE THIRD QUARTER IS MAINTAINED FOR THE ECONOMY AS A WHOLE. GROWTH AND OPTIMISM, HOWEVER, COME MAINLY FROM THE SERVICES SECTORS.

A REPORT ON THE SURVEY, COMPILED BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT, IS NOW ON SALE AT THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE AT \$3 A COPY.

ABOUT 900 FIRMS FROM VARIOUS INDUSTRIES, FORMING A CROSS-SECTION OF THE ECONOMIC COMMUNITY, WERE ASKED ABOUT THEIR BUSINESS EXPERIENCE IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF THIS YEAR, AND THEIR BUSINESS EXPECTATIONS FOR THE THIRD QUARTER.

IN THE MANUFACTURING DIVISION, PERFORMANCE IN THE SECOND QUARTER FELL SHORT OF PREVIOUS EXPECTATIONS GENERALLY, AND BUSINESS CONFIDENCE FOR THE THIRD QUARTER IS AT A LOW LEVEL.

THE 'TEXTILES' SECTOR REPORTED DETERIORATION IN BUSINESS IN THE SECOND QUARTER AND PREDICTS THIS TO CONTINUE INTO THE NEXT QUARTER. THE 'ELECTRONICS' SECTOR EXPERIENCED BUSINESS DECLINE IN THE SECOND QUARTER AND IS PESSIMISTIC ABOUT ITS IMMEDIATE PROSPECTS. BUSINESS CONFIDENCE OF THIS SECTOR IS PARTICULARLY WEAK COMPARED WITH THAT HELD AT THE SAME TIME LAST YEAR.

THE 'WEARING APPAREL', 'FABRICATED METAL PRODUCTS' AND 'MISCELLANEOUS MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES' SECTORS HAD PREVIOUSLY ANTICIPATED SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE QUARTER JUST PAST BUT THIS DID NOT MATERIALIZE. THESE SECTORS NOW PREDICT SOME DETERIORATION IN THE THIRD QUARTER.

THE 'PRINTING', 'PLASTICS' AND 'WATCHES AND CLOCKS' SECTORS DID QUITE WELL IN THE SECOND QUARTER. THE 'PRINTING' AND 'WATCHES AND CLOCKS' SECTORS ANTICIPATE FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS IN THE THIRD QUARTER BUT THE 'PLASTICS' SECTOR PREDICTS A SLOW DOWN.

THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY EXPECTS ITS STEADY BUSINESS IN THE SECOND QUARTER TO CARRY FORWARD INTO THE FOLLOWING QUARTER.

BOTH THE 'WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE' AND 'RESTAURANTS' SECTORS HAD A LOW SECOND QUARTER. THE 'WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE' LOOK FORWARD TO IMPROVEMENTS IN THE THIRD QUARTER. WITHIN THE 'RESTAURANTS' SECTOR, OPINIONS ABOUT PROSPECTS IN THIS QUARTER ARE VARIED, WITH AN OVERALL BALANCE ON THE 'DOWN' SIDE. THIS REPRESENTS A SUBSTANTIAL DROP IN BUSINESS CONFIDENCE COMPARED WITH A YEAR AGO. THE 'HOTELS' SECTOR EXPECTS A SLOW DOWN IN THE THIRD QUARTER. ITS PERFORMANCE IN THE PREVIOUS QUARTER WAS NOT AS GOOD AS HAD BEEN EXPECTED EARLIER.

OTHER SERVICES SECTORS ALL DID WELL IN THE SECOND QUARTER, IN LINE WITH PREVIOUS EXPECTATIONS. ABOUT THE THIRD QUARTER, THE 'BANKS' AND 'MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS SERVICES' SECTORS DISPLAY MUCH CONFIDENCE WHILE THE 'TRANSPORTATION' SECTOR EXPECTS LITTLE CHANGE FROM THE PRECEDING QUARTER.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT POINTED OUT THAT THE DATA, OBTAINED WITH A MINIMUM TIME LAG IN THE SURVEY, WERE BASICALLY INTENDED TO FACILITATE A QUICK ASSESSMENT OF THE CURRENT ECONOMIC SITUATION IN HONG KONG.

APART FROM A LIMITED NUMBER OF QUESTIONS REQUIRING ANSWERS IN QUANTITATIVE TERMS, FIRMS WERE ASKED TO COMPARE THE QUARTER JUST PAST WITH THE PREVIOUS QUARTER AND SIMILARLY FOR THE FORTHCOMING ONE, AND ONLY HAD TO INDICATE WHETHER, IN THEIR OPINION, A CERTAIN VARIABLE WAS 'UP', 'SAME' OR 'DOWN'.

HE CAUTIONED THAT IN A SURVEY OF THIS NATURE, CONSIDERABLE RESERVATIONS MUST BE MADE IN THE INTERPRETATION OF RESULTS, AS IT WAS DIFFICULT TO ESTABLISH THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE RESPONDENTS' PERCEPTION OF THE PAST AND THE FUTURE ACCORDS WITH THE UNDERLYING TRENDS, AND THE SURVEY RESULTS ARE PROBABLY AFFECTED CONSIDERABLY BY SEASONALITY.

COPIES OF THE REPORT, CONTAINING STATISTICAL TABLES AND AN ANALYSIS OF VARIOUS ECONOMIC VARIABLES, HAVE BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO FIRMS TAKING PART IN THE SURVEY AND OTHER BUSINESS ORGANISATIONS.

WORK STARTS ON NEW SUPREME COURT BUILDING  
\* \* \* \*

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START NEXT MONTH ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW SUPREME COURT BUILDING ON A SITE OFF QUEENSWAY THAT HAS BEEN MADE AVAILABLE BY THE RELEASE OF VICTORIA BARRACKS TO THE GOVERNMENT.

TENDERS WILL BE INVITED TOMORROW (FRIDAY) FOR THE FIRST STAGE OF THE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME WHICH INCLUDES SITE FORMATION AND CAISSON WORKS. WORK ON THIS STAGE IS EXPECTED TO TAKE NINE MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

THE 17-STOREY BUILDING WILL COMPRISE A SIX-FLOOR PODIUM AND AN 11-STOREY TOWER BLOCK. PHASE I IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN 1983 AND PHASE II ABOUT ONE YEAR LATER.

THE TOWER BLOCK WILL HOUSE 30 COURTS AND ANCILLARY ACCOMMODATION. THE PODIUM, WHICH WILL EVENTUALLY LINK UP WITH A PROPOSED GOVERNMENT OFFICE BLOCK ON AN ADJOINING SITE, WILL PROVIDE PARKING, REGISTRAR'S CHAMBERS, THE SUPREME COURT LIBRARY, THE SUPREME COURT REGISTRY, DIVORCE AND PROBATE REGISTRIES, GENERAL AND PERSONNEL REGISTRIES, ACCOMMODATION FOR THE BAR ASSOCIATION, AND THE LAW SOCIETY AND A HOLDING UNIT FOR THE PRISONS DEPARTMENT.

VEHICULAR ACCESS TO THE BUILDING WILL BE VIA A NEW ACCESS ROAD TO THE SOUTH WHEREAS PEDESTRIAN ACCESS WILL BE FROM QUEENSWAY TO THE NORTH, OPPOSITE ADMIRALTY MTR STATION.

THE OLD SUPREME COURT BUILDING, OFF STATUE SQUARE, IS CURRENTLY THE SUBJECT OF A STRUCTURAL INVESTIGATION FOLLOWING WHICH A DECISION WILL BE MADE ON ITS FUTURE.

DRAGON BOATS LAUNCHED ON THE THAMES  
\* \* \* \*

THE COLOUR AND FLAVOUR OF ONE OF HONG KONG'S MOST POPULAR FESTIVALS WAS SEEN IN BRITAIN FOR THE FIRST TIME YESTERDAY (WEDNESDAY) WHEN THREE DRAGON BOATS WERE +BROUGHT TO LIFE+ AT A TRADITIONAL EYE-DOTTING CEREMONY ON THE THAMES IN LONDON.

MR BRIAN SHAW, CHAIRMAN OF FURNESS WITHY, MR LAU YEE, AN ELDER OF THE CHINESE COMMUNITY IN BRITAIN, AND MR DAVID FORD, HONG KONG COMMISSIONER IN LONDON, DOTTED THE EYES ON THE DRAGON'S HEAD PROWS AT ST KATHERINE'S PIER.

BEFORE THE CEREMONY, A TAOIST PRIEST, MR LAW YIN, DRESSED IN TRADITIONAL FLOWING ROBES, OFFERED PRAYERS AT AN ALTAR FOR THE GOOD FORTUNE OF THE PEOPLE OF BRITAIN.

THE ALTAR ITSELF BORE OFFERINGS OF A ROAST PIG, STEAMED CHICKEN AND FRUIT AS IS THE CUSTOM ON SUCH OCCASIONS.

WHEN DOTTING THE EYES OF THE DRAGONS, MR SHAW, MR LAU AND MR FORD UTTERED THE ANCIENT PRAYER FOR FAIR WIND AND RAIN.

IMMEDIATELY AFTERWARDS, A TEAM MADE UP MAINLY OF HONG KONG STUDENTS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM CREWED ONE OF THE BOATS ON THE RIVER. TO THE RHYTHMIC BEAT OF GONGS AND DRUMS THEY PADDLED THE CRAFT UPRIVER AGAINST A STRONG CURRENT TOWARDS TOWER BRIDGE.

RIVERSIDERS AND TOURISTS CRUISING THE THAMES ON PLEASURE CRAFT WERE TAKEN BY SURPRISE WHEN THEY SAW THE DRAGON BOAT BY THE BRIDGE -- ONE OF LONDON'S MOST FAMOUS LANDMARKS.

THE CREW PADDLED THE BOAT UP AND DOWN RIVER FOR ABOUT 30 MINUTES AND THEN RETURNED TO THE PIER TO COMPLETE YET ANOTHER TRADITIONAL CUSTOM OF THE OCCASION -- THEY SHARED OUT THE ROAST PIG THAT WAS ON THE ALTAR AS AN OFFERING FOR GOOD FORTUNE.

WITH THE EYE-DOTTING CEREMONY COMPLETED, THE 18 TEAMS WHO HAVE ENTERED TO COMPETE IN RACES DURING THE +HONG KONG IN LONDON+ FESTIVAL AT BATTERSEA PARK ON THE WEEKEND OF SEPTEMBER 20 - 21 WILL BEGIN PRACTICE SESSIONS ON THE THAMES SOON.

THE TEAMS WILL COMPRISE MEMBERS OF THE LOCAL CHINESE COMMUNITY, LONDON SPORTING CLUBS AND BUSINESS HOUSES WITH HONG KONG CONNECTIONS. THEY WILL BE COMPETING FOR TROPHIES DONATED BY THE C.Y. TUNG GROUP.

THE DRAGON BOATS THEMSELVES WERE DONATED BY THE TUNG GROUP AND SHIPPED FROM HONG KONG BY ORIENT OVERSEAS CONTAINER LINE (OOCL).

JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT EXPLAINED

\* \* \* \* \*

THE JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT IS SIMPLY A SYSTEM OF SELECTION AND ALLOCATION OF SUBSIDISED FORM IV PLACES AND IT WOULD NOT INVOLVE THE PRESSURE OF A FULL-SCALE PUBLIC EXAMINATION, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT EXPLAINED TODAY TO CLARIFY PUBLIC MISCONCEPTION.

FOR THOSE NOT ALLOCATED SUBSIDISED FORM IV PLACES, THERE IS ALWAYS THE POSSIBILITY OF BEING ABLE TO CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION IN A PRIVATE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL. THIS WILL, OF COURSE, INVOLVE PARENTS IN HAVING TO PAY THE FULL FEES. THERE ARE AT PRESENT OVER 200 SUCH SCHOOLS IN HONG KONG.

TO ALLAY FEARS, THE SPOKESMAN FURTHER EXPLAINED THAT THE SYSTEM OF SELECTION AND ALLOCATION IS BASED ON PUPILS' ACHIEVEMENT IN THEIR SCHOOL'S MID-YEAR AND FINAL EXAMINATIONS IN FORM III.

AS DIFFERENT SCHOOLS MIGHT HAVE DIFFERENT METHODS OF ASSESSMENT AND STANDARDS OF MARKING, IT WAS CONSIDERED NECESSARY TO HAVE A MEANS OF COMPARING THE GENERAL STANDARD OF PUPILS AMONG VARIOUS PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS.

TO ACHIEVE THIS, A SCALING TEST WILL BE HELD IN THE BASIC SUBJECTS OF CHINESE, ENGLISH AND MATHEMATICS TO ADJUST INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS OF DIFFERENT SCHOOLS TO MAKE THEM COMPARABLE.

+A PUPIL'S PERSONAL PERFORMANCE IN THE SCALING TEST WILL NOT BE COUNTED IN THE SELECTION AND ALLOCATION PROCESS,+ THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT.

IN THE 1978 WHITE PAPER ON SENIOR SECONDARY AND TERTIARY EDUCATION, THE GOVERNMENT STATED THAT THERE WILL BE PROVISION FOR ABOUT 60 PER CENT OF THE 15-16 AGE GROUP IN FORM IV OF AIDED SECTOR, PLUS OTHER AVENUES FOR THE REMAINING PUPILS WHO WISH TO PURSUE SOME OTHER FORMS OF POST-FORM-THREE EDUCATION.

THESE INCLUDE THE TECHNICAL INSTITUTE COURSES, APPRENTICESHIP SCHEMES AND EVENING SENIOR SECONDARY CLASSES. THE TOTAL PROVISION IN FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME EDUCATION SHOULD BE ENOUGH FOR 75 PER CENT OF THE AGE GROUP IN 1981, PROGRESSING TO 98 PER CENT BY 1985.

IN ADDITION, THERE ARE FORM IV/V PLACES IN PRIVATE SCHOOLS WHICH PUPILS MAY ATTEND BY PAYING FEES.

+TAKING ALL THESE OPPORTUNITIES INTO CONSIDERATION, PARENTS AND STUDENTS SHOULD NOT BE OVER CONCERNED OR ANXIOUS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

IN ONE OF THE CAMP ROOMS WHERE SOME GIRL GUIDES WERE LEARNING SKILLS IN HANDICRAFT AND ARTWORK, A CAMPER PRESENTED A MAIL BAG SHE MADE HERSELF TO LADY MACLEHOSE AS A SOUVENIR.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE CHIEF COMMISSIONER OF THE HONG KONG GIRL GUIDES ASSOCIATION, MRS SALLY LEUNG AND OTHER OFFICIALS OF THE ASSOCIATION, LADY MACLEHOSE TOURED THE CAMP SITE TO SEE OTHER GIRL GUIDES ENGAGED IN DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES.

### GROUP PROMOTING WORKERS' RECREATION IN TUEN MUN HOLDING FIRST FUNCTION

A GROUP FORMED IN TUEN MUN IN JUNE TO PROMOTE RECREATION AND SPORT AMONG YOUNG LOCAL WORKERS HAS ARRANGED ITS FIRST FUNCTION.

THE GROUP HAS ORGANISED A LAUNCH PICNIC THIS SUNDAY (AUGUST 24) FOR 250 WORKERS TO LONG KE WAN, SAI KUNG.

THE WORKERS, FROM 20 FACTORIES, WILL BE TAKEN BY COACH FROM TUEN MUN TO BLAKE PIER, CENTRAL, WHERE THEY WILL BOARD THE LAUNCH FOR A WHOLE DAY TRIP.

THE GROUP, WHICH INCLUDES GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF CARITAS AND LOCAL FACTORIES, IS SUPPORTED BY TUEN MUN DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD WHICH HAS VOTED \$10 000 TOWARDS THE COST OF THE PICNIC.

A BOARD SPOKESMAN SAID MORE THAN 1 000 APPLICATIONS HAD BEEN RECEIVED FOR THE FUNCTION AND A MEETING HAD HAD TO BE HELD WITH FACTORY REPRESENTATIVES TO ENSURE THAT PLACES WERE EVENLY ALLOCATED.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE LARGE NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS RECEIVED INDICATED THE NEED FOR RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES IN THE NEW TOWN. IT WAS HOPED THAT DURING THE LAUNCH TRIP VIEWS WOULD BE OBTAINED FROM WORKERS ABOUT WHAT SPORTING AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE PROVIDED FOR THEM. THESE WOULD BE USED AS GUIDELINES FOR THE GROUP IN PLANNING FUTURE ACTIVITIES.

THERE ARE ABOUT 110 FACTORIES IN TUEN MUN, EMPLOYING MORE THAN 7 000 WORKERS. THE GROUP LIAISES REGULARLY WITH FACTORY MANagements.

#### FIELD STUDIES COURSE FOR GEOGRAPHY TEACHERS

THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL RUN AN ORIENTATION COURSE ON FIELD STUDIES FOR GEOGRAPHY TEACHERS.

THE ONE-DAY COURSE WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 27 (SATURDAY) FROM 10 AM TO 4 PM AT THE FIELD STUDIES CENTRE WITHIN THE SAI KUNG OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRE.

IT WILL INCLUDE LECTURES AND FIELD STUDIES IN THE SAI KUNG AREA. TWO OF THE LECTURES WILL BE DELIVERED IN ENGLISH AND THE OTHERS IN CANTONESE.

THE AIM IS TO FAMILIARISE GEOGRAPHY TEACHERS WITH THE FIELD STUDIES CENTRE AND TO PROVIDE BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE SAI KUNG AREA IN WHICH FIELD COURSES WILL BE ORGANISED FOR THEIR MIDDLE/FORM 6 AND UPPER 6 STUDENTS IN 1980/81.

A FREE COACH SERVICE WILL BE PROVIDED FROM KOWLOON TO THE CENTRE AND TO THE GEOGRAPHICAL SITES.

ENROLMENT IS LIMITED TO 80 AND PRIORITY WILL BE GIVEN TO TEACHERS FROM SCHOOLS WHICH HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED FOR 1980/81 STUDENT FIELD COURSES.
