HK CELEBRATES THE CENTENARY OF FIRST STREET LIGHT

* * * * *

IT IS GOOD THAT THE HONG KONG ELECTRIC COMPANY IS LOOKING AHEAD, WITH AN INVESTMENT OF SOME \$15 BILLION OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, TO MAKE SURE THAT THE LIGHTS CONTINUE TO SHINE BRIGHTLY IN HONG KONG, THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE LIGHTING-UP CEREMONY OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT SHOW TO CELEBRATE THE CENTENARY OF HONG KONG ELECTRIC COMPANY'S FIRST STREET LIGHT, THE GOVERNOR SAID HONG KONG HAD COME A LONG WAY IN THOSE HUNDRED YEARS.

"ELECTRICITY HAS HELPED US DO IT. BECAUSE OF ELECTRICITY HONG KONG HUMS WITH ACTIVITY BY DAY AND GLOWS BY NIGHTS," THE GOVERNOR SAID.

SIR DAVID SAID HE KNEW OF NO MORE STRIKING VIEW IN THE WORLD THAN TO LOOK DOWN AT NIGHT FROM THE PEAK ONTO THE MYRIAD LIGHTS BELOW. "AUSTIN COATES CALLED HIS HISTORY OF THE HONG KONG ELECTRIC COMPANY 'A MOUNTAIN OF LIGHT'. IT IS INDEED.

"TONIGHT THE MOUNTAIN OF LIGHT IS GOING TO BE BRIGHTER STILL," THE GOVERNOR SAID.

HE NOTED THAT FOR FOUR WEEKS CENTRAL DISTRICT AT NIGHT WOULD BE A CHILD'S WONDERLAND; A PHOTOGRAPHER'S DREAM; AND A TOURIST'S DELIGHT.

"ABOVE ALL IT WILL BE A CELEBRATION OF THE VITALITY AND SUCCESS OF THIS REMARKABLE AND EBULLIENT COMMUNITY," THE GOVERNOR SAID.

FSD OFFICERS INSPECT PRIVATE CLUBS

* * * * *

OFFICERS FROM THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAVE VISITED 52 PRIVATE CLUBS, MAINLY MAHJONG PARLOURS AND KARAOKE LOUNGES, SINCE SEPTEMBER 21 TO SEE IF THESE PREMISES ARE POSING ANY FIRE HAZARD.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE FIRE SERVICES SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) THAT OF THE PRIVATE CLUBS VISITED, 14 WERE ON HONG KONG ISLAND, 32 IN KOWLOON AND SIX IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

"AS A RESULT OF THESE INSPECTIONS, A NUMBER OF THE OPERATORS WILL BE ISSUED WITH ADVICE LETTERS ASKING THEM TO IMPROVE THE FIRE SAFETY STANDARD IN THEIR PREMISES IN 120 DAYS.

"IF THE OPERATOR DOES NOT FOLLOW THE ADVICE, HE WILL BE ISSUED WITH A FIRE HAZARD ABATEMENT NOTICE REQUIRING HIM TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENT.

"THE OPERATOR WILL BE SUBSEQUENTLY PROSECUTED IF HE FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE NOTICE.

"ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF THE OFFENCE IS LIABLE TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$25,000. IN ADDITION, HE WILL FACE A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$5,000 PER DAY FOR CONTINUANCE OF THE OFFENCE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE SAID OFFICERS FROM LOCAL FIRE STATIONS HAVE ALSO TAKEN PART IN ON-STREET SURVEYS TO TRY TO IDENTIFY PRIVATE CLUBS SUSPECTED OF POSING FIRE HAZARD. SO FAR, A TOTAL OF 345 ADDRESSES HAVE BEEN RECORDED.

"THESE ADDRESSES HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO THE FIRE PROTECTION BUREAU FOR FURTHER ACTION," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID OPERATORS WISHING TO SEEK ADVICE ON FIRE PROTECTION MAY CALL THE REGIONAL FIRE PROTECTION OFFICES ON 549 8104 (HONG KONG), 733 7543 (KOWLOON), OR 604 7223 (NEW TERRITORIES).

PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION OF A PIER ON TSING YI

THE GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO PERMIT THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PIER AT THE WEST COAST OF TSING YI ISLAND.

THE WORKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT WITHIN AN AREA OF ABOUT 5,650 SQUARE METRES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED OFF THE COAST.

THE EXTENT OF THE AREA AFFECTED WAS DESCRIBED IN A NOTICE PUBLISHED IN THE LATEST ISSUE OF THE GAZETTE.

ANY PERSON WHO CONSIDERS THAT HE HAS AN INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT IN OR OVER THE FORESHORE AND SEABED INVOLVED MAY SUBMIT A WRITTEN OBJECTION TO THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS AND LANDS ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 27 THIS YEAR.

THE NOTICE OF SUCH OBJECTION SHALL DESCRIBE THE INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT OF THE OBJECTOR AND THE MANNER IN WHICH HE ALLEGES HE WILL BE AFFECTED.

STUDENTS TO EXPLORE WORLD OF WORK

MORE THAN 700 STUDENTS WILL BE ABLE TO SEE FOR THEMSELVES THE REAL WORKING ENVIRONMENT FROM TUESDAY (OCTOBER 2) UNDER AN ONGOING WORK ORIENTATION PROGRAMME ORGANISED BY THE CAREERS ADVISORY SERVICE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

THE YEAR-LONG ACTIVITY IS AIMED AT HELPING FORM 3 TO 7 STUDENTS TO GAIN A REALISTIC UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD OF WORK SO THAT THEY CAN MAKE BETTER PLANS FOR THEIR FUTURE.

"THE FIRST BATCH OF PARTICIPATING STUDENTS IN THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR COME FROM SCHOOLS IN KWUN TONG, YAU MA TEI, TSIM SHA TSUI, CENTRAL, WESTERN AND NORTH DISTRICTS," THE SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER (CAREERS ADVISORY SERVICE), MR LEUNG LIT-CHEONG, SAID.

"THEY WILL VISIT 23 DIFFERENT ESTABLISHMENTS BETWEEN OCTOBER AND DECEMBER TO OBTAIN FIRST-HAND INFORMATION ON VARIOUS INDUSTRIES AND PROFESSIONS," HE ADDED.

THE ESTABLISHMENTS WILL INCLUDE HOTELS, MASS MEDIA ORGANISATIONS, DEPARTMENT STORES, TRAINING INSTITUTES, PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES, FACTORIES, MUSEUMS, BANKS AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

STUDENTS WILL BE TAKEN ON A GUIDED TOUR OF THE FACILITIES AND WILL BE TOLD BY COMPANY STAFF WHAT IT IS LIKE WORKING IN A PARTICULAR INDUSTRY.

"SUCH VISITS WERE MOST WELCOME BY BOTH STUDENTS AND CAREERS TEACHERS, WITH 1,300 STUDENTS FROM 45 SCHOOLS PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAMME IN THE LAST SCHOOL YEAR," MR LEUNG NOTED.

APART FROM THIS CAREERS EDUCATION PROJECT, HE SAID THE SERVICE ALSO OPERATED FOUR CAREERS INFORMATION CENTRES TO PROVIDE A WIDE RANGE OF SERVICES TO YOUNG PEOPLE SEEKING CAREER GUIDANCE.

"THE CENTRES ARE ALL EQUIPPED WITH A REFERENCE LIBRARY CONSISTING OF AN AUDIO-VISUAL UNIT WITH SOUND-ON-SLIDES, VIDEO AND AUDIO TAPE RECORDINGS, AND PUBLICATIONS ON EMPLOYMENT, TRAINING AND FURTHER EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES," HE SAID.

NOMINATION FOR THE 1990/91 CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT GOOD STUDENT AWARD SCHEME WILL OPEN TOMORROW (MONDAY).

NOMINATION FORMS ARE NOW AVAILABLE FROM THE DISTRICT OFFICE'S THREE PUBLIC ENQUIRY CENTRES AT HARBOUR BUILDING, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES (WEST WING) AND IN KENNEDY TOWN.

MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL FIRE SAFETY ADVICE

THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT TODAY (SUNDAY) ADVISED THE PUBLIC TO TAKE EXTRA CARE IN HANDLING FIRES WHEN THEY VISIT THE COUNTRYSIDE DURING THE COMING MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL HOLIDAY PERIOD.

"VISITORS SHOULD REFRAIN FROM RELEASING ANY HUNG MING LANTERN AND BE EXTREMELY CAREFUL WITH BARBECUE FIRES AND HAND-HELD CANDLE-LIT LANTERNS," THE DEPARTMENT'S SENIOR COUNTRY PARKS OFFICER, MR C.C. LAY, SAID.

ACCORDING TO MR LAY, THE ANNUAL MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL IS ONE OF THE HIGH FIRE RISK PERIODS. A TOTAL OF FIVE HILL FIRES BROKE OUT DURING THE LAST FESTIVAL.

MR LAY ADDED THAT IT IS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE FORESTS AND COUNTRYSIDE ORDINANCE AND THE COUNTRY PARKS ORDINANCE TO LIGHT FIRE ILLEGALLY OR TO RELEASE A HUNG MING LANTERN IN A COUNTRY PARK OR ANYWHERE IN THE COUNTRYSIDE.

"ILLEGAL LIGHTING OF FIRES INSIDE COUNTRY PARKS MAY LEAD TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$5,000 AND ONE YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT WHILE A SIMILAR OFFENCE COMMITTED IN THE COUNTRYSIDE CARRIES A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$2,000 AND ONE YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT," HE SAID.

HE ADDED THAT THERE WERE SIX PROSECUTIONS AGAINST THE ILLEGAL USE OF FIRE IN COUNTRY PARKS LAST YEAR AND OFFENDERS WERE FINED BETWEEN \$500 AND \$700.
