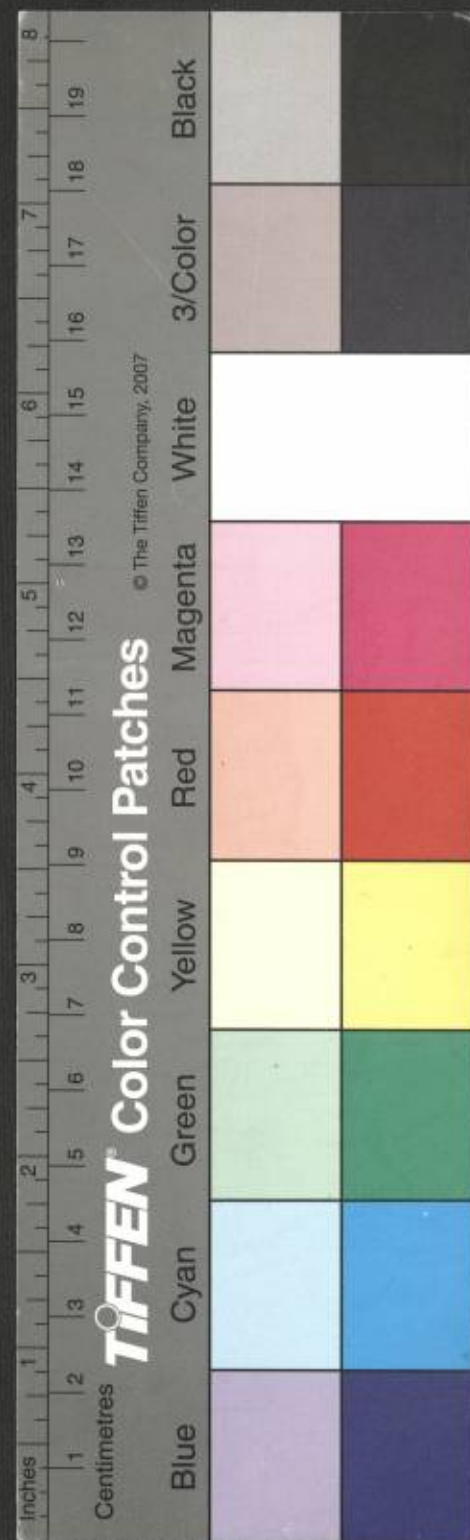

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Registration of Persons Ordinance, 1934 (Ordinance No. 3 of 1934), it is provided that the said Ordinance shall come into force on such date as may be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor :

NOW I, the said Sir WILLIAM PEEL, do hereby proclaim that the said Ordinance shall come into force and operation on the First day of June, 1934.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

Whereas by the second section of the Commissioners Powers Ordinance, 1886, it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power to nominate and appoint Commissioners under the Public Seal for the purpose of instituting, making, and conducting any enquiry that may be deemed advisable and for reporting thereon:

And Whereas the Governor in Council has deemed it advisable that a Commission be appointed to enquire into the causes and effects of the present trade depression in Hong Kong and make recommendations for the amelioration of the existing position and for the improvement of the trade of the Colony:

And I do also appoint the said Mr. Michael James Breen, to be Chairman of the said Commissioners :


And I do also appoint Mr. Brian Charles Keith Hawkins, to be Secretary to the said Commissioners :

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

Whereas by the third section of the Merchant Shipping Amendment Ordinance, 1934, (Ordinance No. 6 of 1934) it is provided that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation unless and until the Governor notifies by Proclamation that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the same and that thereafter it shall come into operation upon such day as the Governor shall notify by the same or any other Proclamation :

Now I, the said Sir WILLIAM PEEL, do hereby notify and proclaim that it is His Majesty's pleasure not to disallow the said Ordinance and that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on the 18th day of August, 1934.
