MORE PLACES NEEDED FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED

* * * *

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR SELWYN ALLEYNE, HAS EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE SUBSTANTIAL SHORTFALL IN RESIDENTIAL PLACES FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED ADULTS WHO CANNOT BE CARED FOR AT HOME, OR WHO HAVE NO FAMILIES OR RELATIVES.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING TODAY (SATURDAY) OF THE HONG KONG RED CROSS SHUN LEE HOSTEL FOR PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED YOUNG PERSONS AT SHUN LEE ESTATE IN KWUN TONG, MR ALLEYNE SAID THE 1981 REVIEW OF THE REHABILITATION PROGRAMME PLAN HAD ESTIMATED A CURRENT REQUIREMENT OF 1 138 PLACES.

+BUT AT PRESENT THERE ARE ONLY 222 RESIDENTIAL PLACES,+ MR ALLEYNE SAID. +OVER THE NEXT FOUR YEARS PROVISION WILL INCREASE BY ABOUT 400 ADDITIONAL PLACES BUT THIS IS STILL FAR SHORT OF THE ESTIMATED DEMAND WHICH WILL THEN HAVE GROWN TO ABOUT 1 200.+

HE SAID PREMISES HAD BEEN RESERVED IN NEW PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES UNDER PLANNING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF HOME RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES SIDE BY SIDE WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF SHELTERED WORK.

RESIDENTIAL CARE FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED YOUNG PERSONS, ON THE OTHER HAND, IS MAINLY PROVIDED THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF BOARDING FACILITIES IN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS.

MR ALLEYNE NOTED THAT THE RED CROSS OPERATED FOUR SPECIAL SCHOOLS WITH RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES.

ON THE COMPLETION OF THE EXPANSION OF ITS BOARDING FACILITIES IN THE PRINCESS ALEXANDRA SCHOOL, THE CURRENT SHORTFALL WILL BE REDUCED FROM 61 TO 19 IN 1982.

+IN THE FOLLOWING YEAR, THERE WILL BE MORE THAN SUFFICIENT PLACES TO MEET THE ESTIMATED DEMAND,+ MR ALLEYNE SAID.

THE DIRECTOR PRAISED THE RED CROSS FOR BEING THE FIRST ORGANISATION HERE TO START PROVIDING RESIDENTIAL CARE FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED SCHOOL CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE.

+THIS SERVICE STARTED 13 YEARS AGO IN TSZ WAN SHAN ESTATE, AND TODAY WE MARK THE EXPANSION AND REPROVISIONING OF THIS SERVICE TO THIS NEW HOSTEL,+ HE SAID.

KAM TIN RIVER TO GET MASSIVE CLEAN-UP

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT IS TO SPEND \$4 MILLION TO BRING NEW LIFE TO THE MOST POLLUTED SECTIONS OF THE KAM TIN RIVER AND ITS CATCHMENT AREAS IN YUEN LONG, KAM TIN AND PAT HEUNG.

IT IS AIMED AT IMPROVING THE ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE OF THE RIVER COURSE AND THE ADJACENT AREAS WHERE LIVESTOCK FARMING ACTIVITIES ARE CONCENTRATED, SAID THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (NORTH REGION) OF NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES, MR BOWEN LEUNG, TODAY.

SPEAKING IN HIS CAPACITY AS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE WORKING PARTY ON MEASURES AGAINST AGRICULTURAL POLLUTION IN THE YUEN LONG RIVER CATCHMENT, KAM TIN AND PAT HEUNG AREA, MR LEUNG SAID THE GROUP WAS SET UP IN SEPTEMBER AS PART OF THE EFFORTS UNDER THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN.

MEMBERS OF THE WORKING PARTY INCLUDE THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, THE HIGHWAYS DIVISION AND THE PORT WORKS DIVISION OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND THE YUEN LONG DISTRICT OFFICE.

A NUMBER OF MEASURES TO TACKLE AGRICULTURAL POLLUTION AND IMPROVE SANITATION OF THE AREA NEAR PAT HEUNG AND KAM TIN HAVE BEEN PLANNED AND AGREED, MR LEUNG SAID.

DREDGING OPERATION AT FIVE HEAVILY POLLUTED SITES ALONG KAM TIN RIVER INCLUDING PAT HEUNG OFF FAN KAM ROAD, KAM TIN BRIDGE NEAR KAM TIN VEGETABLE MARKET, SHEK KONG CAMP OPPOSITE TO THE EASTERN GATE, KO PO BRIDGE ON KAM TIN ROAD AND HUNG MO BRIDGE WAS LAUNCHED IN SEPTEMBER.

THE HIGHWAYS (NEW TERRITORIES) DIVISION HAD COMMISSIONED CONTRACTORS TO DREDGE THE RIVER COURSE AS WIDE AND AS DEEP AS POSSIBLE. A TOTAL OF 6 500 CUBIC METRES OF POLLUTANTS WAS CLEARED AWAY DURING THE EXERCISE WHICH COMPLETED LAST WEEK.

IN ADDITION, THE HIGHWAYS (NEW TERRITORIES) DIVISION HAS ALSO INCREASED THE FREQUENCY OF DESILTING THE YUEN LONG NULLAH TO TWICE A YEAR AT THE SECTIONS WITHIN THE TOWN, AND OTHER SECTIONS WILL BE CLEARED ONCE A YEAR AS AN ON-GOING EXERCISE.

THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT IS NOW CARRYING OUT A TWO-MONTH-LONG CLEARANCE AT VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE RIVER TOTALLING 13 KILOMETRES. THIS CLEAN-UP DRIVE WILL BE COMPLETED TOWARDS THE END OF DECEMBER.

ANOTHER PHASE OF OPERATION AT OTHER SECTIONS OF THE KAM TIN RIVER WILL BE MOUNTED BETWEEN FEBRUARY AND MAY NEXT YEAR AS PART OF THE RURAL AREA CLEAN-UP DURING THE COURSE OF THE ON-GOING CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN.

MEANWHILE, THE NTSD WILL CONDUCT A SURVEY OF THE ADEQUACY OF REFUSE COLLECTION SERVICES IN THE AREA WITH AN AIM TO SEE WHETHER MORE FACILITIES WILL BE NEEDED.

AS FOR THE IRRIGATION WEIRS WHICH HAVE ACCUMULATED A LARGE AMOUNT OF BOTH AGRICULTURAL AND DOMESTIC WASTE AS A RESULT OF INDISCRIMINATE DUMPING BY FARMERS AND VILLAGERS, THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT WILL ALSO CARRY OUT AN OPERATION TO TIDY-UP MOST OF THEM AT PAT HEUNG AND KAM TIN AREAS.

THE AFD WILL LOOK INTO THE FEASIBILITY OF INSTALLING SCOURING VALVES AT SOME WEIRS AS AN ON-GOING CLEARING.

THREE WEIR CLEANSING TEAMS ARE ALSO BEING FORMED AND WILL START WORK ON TUESDAY (NOVEMBER 24) TO TAKE CARE OF FUTURE MAINTENANCE OF THE CLEANLINESS OF THE WEIRS.

ON THE OTHER HAND, GRANTS AND LOANS WILL BE GIVEN TO 176 FARM OPERATIONS IN PAT HEUNG FOR THE COST OF BUILDING MATERIALS TO ERECT WASTE TREATMENT FACILITIES AS A PRELUDE TO THE INTRODUCTION OF A LIMITED FARM WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES BY THE AFD.

THE FARMS ARE EXPECTED TO COMPLETE THE WASTE TREATMENT FACILITIES BY THE END OF DECEMBER. SITES FOR FIVE FARM WASTE COLLECTION POINTS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AND THE AFD IS PLANNING TO LAUNCH THE COLLECTION SERVICE ON A DOOR-TO-DOOR BASIS BEGINNING NEXT JANUARY.

IN CONNECTION WITH THIS, A COMPOSTING PLANT WILL BE SET UP AT KAI KEUNG LENG TO RECYCLE WASTE COLLECTED FROM THE FARMS WHILE PLANS TO CONSTRUCT A BIOGAS PLANT AT PAT HEUNG TO TREAT PART OF THE WASTE ARE BEING FORMULATED.

+BUT THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE WORK DEPENDS LARGELY ON THE FULL CO-OPERATION BY FARMERS AND VILLAGERS AS WELL AS ALL MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC,+ SAID MR LEUNG.

+DUMPING FARM WASTE AND REFUSE INDISCRIMINATELY INTO THE RIVER COURSE WOULD ONLY RESULT IN OBNOXIOUS SMELLS, FLIES, POOR SANITATION AND HEALTH HAZARDS,+ HE WENT ON.

WHILE STRESSING THAT THE GOVERNMENT WOULD CONTINUE TO MAKE AN EFFORT TO MAINTAIN THE CLEANLINESS CONDITION OF THE STREAM COURSE, MR LEUNG SAID LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTION WOULD ALSO BE STEPPED UP AGAINST ALL PEOPLE FOUND DUMPING REFUSE AND AGRICULTURAL WASTE INTO THE RIVER COURSE. OFFENDERS WOULD FACE A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$5 000 AND A JAIL SENTENCE OF SIX MONTHS, MR LEUNG WARNED.

A NUMBER OF SERVICES RUN BY THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT AT THEIR PRESENT HEADQUARTERS IN GUARDIAN HOUSE, WAN CHAI, WILL MOVE TO KOWLOON ON MONDAY.

THE ROAD TRANSPORT SECTION (KOWLOON) AND THE ROAD TRANSPORT SECTION (NEW TERRITORIES) WILL OPERATE FROM THE NEW KOWLOON REGIONAL OFFICE AT ROOM 2409, PARK-IN COMMERCIAL CENTRE, 24TH FLOOR, 56 DUNDAS STREET.

THE MOVE WILL ALSO INCLUDE THE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SECTION (NEW TERRITORIES) WHICH IS PRESENTLY LOCATED AT PUI CHING ROAD IN KOWLOON.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SATURDAY) THAT BUSINESS OF THE KOWLOON TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT REGISTRY, METER REVENUE COLLECTION SECTION AND CAR PARK SECTION WILL BE CONDUCTED FROM THE DUNDAS STREET OFFICE FROM MONDAY ONWARDS.

THE SLIP ROAD LEADING FROM CHATHAM ROAD NORTH TO HONG CHONG ROAD WILL BE TEMPORARILY CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FROM NOVEMBER 23 TO 25 FOR TWO PERIODS TO ALLOW FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE WORK.
