LAND AUCTIONS YIELD \$2 260.1 MILLION
* * * * *

THE TOTAL REALISED PREMIUM FROM SALES OF GOVERNMENT LAND BY PUBLIC AUCTION IN THE 1985-86 FINANCIAL YEAR AMOUNTED TO \$2 260.1 MILLION, ACCORDING TO THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT PUBLISHED TODAY.

DURING THE YEAR, 19 LOTS OF GOVERNMENT LAND WERE PUT UP FOR SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION AND ALL BUT ONE LOT WERE SOLD.

NOTABLE SALES INCLUDED A 6 449-SQUARE-METRE CANTON ROAD SITE FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL (EXCLUDING GODOWN) PURPOSES AT A PREMIUM OF \$636 MILLION, SOLD IN OCTOBER 1985, AND A 10 690-SQUARE-METRE QUEENSWAY SITE FOR NON-INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES AT A PREMIUM OF \$703 MILLION, SOLD IN APRIL 1985.

THE ANNUAL DEPARTMENTAL REPORT FOR 1985-86 GIVES A SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT'S FOUR DIVISIONS -- LAND OFFICE, COMMERCIAL DIVISION, INSURANCE DIVISION AND OFFICIAL RECEIVER'S OFFICE.

LAND OFFICE STATISTICS SHOW THAT THE NUMBER OF INSTRUMENTS OF ALL CATEGORIES REGISTERED WAS 271 324, WHICH WAS 85 054 MORE THAN THE TOTAL OF 186 270 IN 1984-85.

A TOTAL OF 105 GOVERNMENT LAND GRANTS WERE COMPLETED, AND 192 LOTS OR SECTIONS WERE SURRENDERED TO THE GOVERNMENT.

THE NUMBER OF LANDOWNERS (EXCLUDING MORTGAGEES) ROSE BY 35 353 OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR TO A TOTAL OF 509 013.

THE COMMERCIAL DIVISION COMPRISES THE COMPANIES, TRADE MARKS, PATENTS, MONEY LENDERS AND INCORPORATED TRUSTEES REGISTRIES.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF TRADE MARKS WAS 6 779, A NEW RECORD AND 210 MORE THAN THE PREVIOUS RECORD OF 6 569 IN 1984-85. ONE THOUSAND PATENTS WERE ALSO REGISTERED DURING THE YEAR.

THERE WAS AN INCREASE IN THE LEVEL OF ACTIVITY IN THE COMPANIES REGISTRY.

DURING THE YEAR, 17 990 NEW COMPANIES WERE INCORPORATED, 3 910 MORE THAN THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S TOTAL, WHILE 1 757 COMPANIES WERE DISSOLVED, LEAVING 150 551 COMPANIES ON THE REGISTER AT THE END OF THE YEAR.

THE NUMBER OF COMPANIES INCORPORATED OUTSIDE HONG KONG WHICH HAVE ESTABLISHED A PLACE OF BUSINESS HERE ROSE BY 105 TO 2 122.

DURING THE YEAR, 413 APPLICATIONS FOR A MONEY LENDER'S LICENCE WERE RECEIVED AND THERE WERE 425 MONEY LENDERS LICENSED AT THE END OF THE YEAR.

THE INSURANCE DIVISION AUTHORISED 10 NEW INSURERS UNDER THE INSURANCE COMPANIES ORDINANCE, COMPARED WITH 13 THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

NINE INSURERS CEASED TO BE AUTHORISED, COMPARED WITH SEVEN IN 1984-85.

HENCE, AT THE END OF THE YEAR THERE WAS A NET INCREASE OF ONE INSURER, BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF AUTHORISED INSURERS TO 287.

CONCERNING BANKRUPTCIES AND LIQUIDATIONS, 336 RECEIVING ORDERS, FOUR ADMINISTRATION ORDERS AND 300 WINDING-UP ORDERS WERE MADE DURING THE YEAR COMPARED WITH 273 RECEIVING ORDERS, TWO ADMINISTRATION ORDERS AND 330 WINDING-UP ORDERS IN 1984-85.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF NEW CASES WAS 35 MORE THAN THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S FIGURES AND REPRESENTED THE LARGEST NUMBER OF CASES EVER RECEIVED IN ONE YEAR.

WEINBERGER ON BRIEF STOP-OVER

AMERICAN SECRETARY OF DEFENCE, MR CASPAR WEINBERGER, WILL ARRIVE IN HONG KONG FOR A BRIEF STOP-OVER ON MONDAY (OCTOBER 6) AND DEPART THE FOLLOWING DAY.

HE IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE ON A SPECIAL FLIGHT AT 1.20 PM ON MONDAY, AND WILL LEAVE AT 3.30 PM ON TUESDAY.

CIVIC EDUCATION PREPARES FOR FUTURE

THE GOVERNMENT IS PROMOTING CIVIC EDUCATION TO HELP PEOPLE PREPARE FOR THE FUTURE, THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ALEX FONG, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR FONG SAID KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT HAD TAKEN THE LEAD BY SETTING UP A CIVIC EDUCATION ORGANISING COMMITTEE AND LAUNCHING CIVIC EDUCATION ACTIVITIES FROM APRIL THIS YEAR.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE 10TH INAUGURATION CEREMONY OF THE OFFICE BEARERS OF THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT SCOUT COUNCIL AND THE 25TH DISTRICT RALLY.

THE CIVIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGN IS INTENDED TO PROMOTE +CONCERN FOR THE COMMUNITY, PARTICIPATION BY THE PUBLIC, COURTESY AND CIVIC MINDEDNESS, AND NEIGHBOURLINESS AND PEACE+.

MR FONG NOTED THAT THE CAMPAIGN IN KOWLOON CITY BEGAN WITH A VARIETY SHOW ON CIVIC EDUCATION, FOLLOWED BY AN EXHIBITION ON KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, CIVIC RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES, AND A COURTESY CAMPAIGN.

OTHER ACTIVITIES PLANNED INCLUDED +CIVIC AMBASSADOR+ AND +STUDENT AMBASSADOR+ SCHEMES.

+IT IS HOPED THAT THESE SCHEMES WILL ENHANCE THE CIVIC-MINDEDNESS OF RESIDENTS AND THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION,+ HE SAID.

MR FONG SAID THAT OVER 40 PER CENT OF HONG KONG'S POPULATION, OR ABOUT TWO MILLION PEOPLE, WERE AGED BETWEEN 15 AND 40.

+THE YOUTH OF TODAY ARE SOCIETY'S LEADERS TOMORROW. EDUCATING YOUTH IS A LONG AND ONEROUS TASK WHICH REQUIRES THE CO-OPERATION AND ACTIVE PROMOTION OF BOTH THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PEOPLE,+ HE SAID.

+THE FUTURE OF HONG KONG LIES VERY MUCH IN THE HANDS OF THE PEOPLE, PARTICULARLY THE EFFORTS OF YOUTH IN CREATING AND DEVELOPING SOCIETY.+

MR FONG PAID TRIBUTE TO OFFICERS OF THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT SCOUT COUNCIL FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO COMMUNITY SERVICE OVER THE PAST 25 YEARS.

YOUTH CENTRES PLAY KEY ROLE

THE GOVERNMENT IS COMMITTED TO STEADY EXPANSION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH CENTRES AND IS SPENDING \$92 MILLION YEARLY TO ASSIST VOLUNTARY AGENCIES IN OPERATING THEM, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MRS ANSON CHAN, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CHINESE YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION (YMCA) LAI YIU CENTRE IN KWAI CHUNG, SHE NOTED THAT THERE WERE NOW 143 CHILDREN CENTRES AND 154 YOUTH CENTRES.

THEY OFFERED VARIOUS KINDS OF OUTDOOR AND INDOOR ACTIVITIES THAT WOULD HELD DEVELOP THE CHARACTER, LEADERSHIP POTENTIAL AND SOCIALISATION SKILLS OF YOUNG PEOPLE.

MRS CHAN STRESSED THAT THE SUCCESS OF THE CENTRES DEPENDED ON SUPPORT AND PARTICIPATION OF THE COMMUNITY AND MEMBERS THEMSELVES IN ADDITION TO THE INVOLVEMENT OF PROFESSIONAL SOCIAL WORKERS.

+IF RESIDENTS CAN CO-OPERATE AND CONTRIBUTE IDEAS, THE ACTIVITIES ORGANISED BY THESE CENTRES WILL BETTER MEET THE REAL NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY AND THUS ACHIEVE BETTER RESULTS,+ SHE SAID.

+ULTIMATELY, THE SUCCESS OF THESE CENTRES DEPENDS ON THE EXTENT OF ACTIVE INVOLVEMENT OF THEIR MEMBERS AND ON WHETHER MEMBERS ARE WILLING TO ACCEPT THE ASSISTANCE OF THE STAFF AND THE FRIENDS THEY MAKE THERE.+

MRS CHAN CONGRATULATED THE YMCA ON ITS 85TH ANNIVERSARY AS WELL AS ON THE OPENING OF THE LAI YIU CENTRE.

ABOUT 100 PARENTS ATTENDED A SEMINAR ON HOME CARE OF MENTALLY HANDICAPPED CHILDREN AT THE HENRY G. LEONG YAU MA TEI COMMUNITY CENTRE THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

THE PARENTS, MOSTLY NON-WORKING PEOPLE WITH CHILDREN WAITING FOR PLACEMENT IN WORK ACTIVITY CENTRES, WERE BRIEFED ON BASIC CONCEPTS AND SKILLS IN LOOKING AFTER MENTALLY HANDICAPPED CHILDREN AT HOME.

TALKS WERE GIVEN BY AN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT, MISS JUNE YEOW, AND A CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, MR PATRICK YAU. A QUESTION-AND-ANSWER SESSION FOLLOWED.

THE SEMINAR WAS ORGANISED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT'S DEPARTMENTAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC EDUCATION IN REHABILITATION.

SEVENTEEN CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS WERE AMONG STUDENTS WHO RECEIVED CERTIFICATES TODAY (SATURDAY) FOR COMPLETING A ONE-YEAR PART-TIME COURSE ON +PSYCHOLOGICAL APPROACHES TO CORRECTIONAL TREATMENT+.

JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE EXTRA-MURAL DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG, THE COURSE PROVIDES OFFICERS AND PROSPECTIVE OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT'S PSYCHOLOGICAL UNIT WITH THE NECESSARY KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS FOR COUNSELLING OFFENDERS.

STUDENTS OF THE COURSE LEARNED, AMONG OTHER THINGS, CRIMINAL BEHAVIOUR, INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP COUNSELLING TECHNIQUES, PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICES OF GROUP WORK AND HOW TO DEAL WITH DIFFERENT TYPES OF OFFENDERS.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN RUNNING SIMILAR COURSES OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS. THIS IS THE FIRST TIME THE DEPARTMENT HAS JOINTLY ORGANISED SUCH A COURSE WITH THE UNIVERSITY.

THE 17 OFFICERS AND TWO OTHER STUDENTS RECEIVED CERTIFICATES FROM ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTIONAL SERVICES (PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES AND PROGRAMME DEVELOPMENT), DR ROBERT ANDRY, AT A PRESENTATION AT THE UNIVERSITY'S EXTRA-MURAL TOWN OFFICE AT SHUN TAK CENTRE.
