PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAMME - CORNERSTONE OF PROSPERITY

* * * * *

THE VARIOUS PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN BY THE WORKS DEPARTMENTS IN THE PAST AND AT PRESENT HAVE ENHANCED HONG KONG'S PROSPERITY AND HAVE MET RESIDENTS' NEEDS.

THE INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENTS HAVE ALSO HIGHLIGHTED AND CONSOLIDATED HONG KONG'S POSITION AS THE COMMERCIAL AND FINANCIAL CENTRE IN THE ASIA-PACIFIC REGION, GIVING IMPETUS TO THE REGION'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

THE REMARKS WERE MADE BY THE DIRECTOR OF TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT, MR CHOW CHE-KING, WHEN HE OPENED THE ROVING EXHIBITION ON HONG KONG'S PUBLIC WORKS AT THE CENTRAL MTR STATION THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

"THESE PROJECTS INCLUDED CIVIL ENGINEERING, TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, FLOOD MITIGATION AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL, WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM, ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES, RECREATION AND CULTURE, EDUCATION AND MEDICAL SERVICES AS WELL AS NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT," HE SAID.

MR CHOW NOTED THAT THE WORKS DEPARTMENTS HAD BEEN FUNCTIONING WELL IN HELPING THE TERRITORY TRANSFORM FROM A SMALL FISHING VILLAGE 150 YEARS AGO TO A HIGHLY MODERN CITY.

THIS IS PARTICULARLY SO DURING THE PAST 30 AND 40 YEARS BECAUSE HONG KONG HAS COMPLETED, WITHIN SHORT PERIODS, NUMEROUS LARGE-SCALE WORKS PROJECTS.

"THESE PROJECTS HAVE ENABLED HONG KONG TO RANK AT THE FOREFRONT IN THE WORLD IN TERMS OF QUANTITY, SCALE, QUALITY AND SPEED," MR CHOW STRESSED.

POINTING OUT THAT AS HONG KONG'S NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT HAD JUST PAST ITS 20TH ANNIVERSARY, MR CHOW SAID THE ROVING EXHIBITION HAD SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE.

"THIS IS BECAUSE VISITORS WOULD BE ABLE TO SEE THE CHANGING FACES OF THE TERRITORY THROUGH THE PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAMME AT THE EXHIBITION. ONE OF THE MODELS ON DISPLAY SHOWS THE NEW LOOK OF CENTRAL AND WAN CHAI," HE EXPLAINED.

MEANWHILE, MR CHOW ASSURED THE PUBLIC THAT STAFF OF THE WORKS DEPARTMENTS WOULD NOT BE COMPLACENT WITH THEIR PAST ACHIEVEMENTS.

"THEY WOULD CONTINUE DOING THEIR BEST IN THEIR PARTICIPATION IN PUBLIC WORKS IN ORDER TO LAY A GOOD FOUNDATION FOR A BETTER HONG KONG," HE STRESSED.

THE ROVING EXHIBITION WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE WORKS BRANCH AND THE WORKS GROUP OF DEPARTMENTS TO MARK THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE TERRITORY'S PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAMME.

IT WILL CONTINUE FROM 10 AM TO 8 PM THROUGHOUT THE HOLIDAYS UNTIL TUESDAY (JUNE 14) BEFORE MOVING TO A NEW VENUE IN HUNG HOM, KOWLOON, NEXT MONTH.

VISITORS WILL BE ABLE TO SEE HOW HONG KONG HAS TRANSFORMED FROM A SMALL VILLAGE 150 YEARS AGO INTO AN INTERNATIONAL TRADE AND FINANCIAL CENTRE.

THEY WILL ALSO LEARN THROUGH SHORT FILMS ON A FULL-SIZE VIDEO WALL, ON HOW PUBLIC MONEY IS SPENT ON BUILDING NEW TOWNS, HOSPITALS, SCHOOLS, PARKS, ROADS AND OTHER INFRASTRUCTURAL PROJECTS.

THE EXHIBITION ALSO FEATURES CHARTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS ILLUSTRATING THE MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE WORKS BRANCH, THE NEW AIRPORT PROJECTS CO-ORDINATION OFFICE, AND SEVEN WORKS DEPARTMENTS - ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, CIVIL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT, DRAINAGE SERVICES DEPARTMENT, ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT, TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE CEREMONY WERE WAN CHAI DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MRS PEGGY LAM; CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR AMBROSE LAU; ACTING WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICER, MISS VIVIAN KO; AND CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR HERMAN CHO.

NEW LEAFLET FOR DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS

* * * * *

DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS CAN NOW OBTAIN A NEWLY PUBLISHED LEAFLET DESCRIBING THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S SELECTIVE PLACEMENT DIVISION (SPD) FROM VARIOUS SOURCES SO THAT THEY CAN MAKE GOOD USE OF THE SERVICES.

A TOTAL OF 10,000 COPIES OF THE LEAFLET HAVE BEEN PRINTED. TO FACILITATE THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED JOB-SEEKERS TO UNDERSTAND DETAILS OF THE LEAFLET, THE SPD HAS ALSO PRODUCED 2,000 BRAILLE COPIES WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE HONG KONG SOCIETY FOR THE BLIND.

THE LEAFLETS ARE NOW AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION AT THE THREE SPD BRANCHES OFFICES, THE NINE OFFICES OF THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT, VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL'S SKILLS CENTRES FOR THE DISABLED IN KWUN TONG, TUEN MUN AND ABERDEEN, SEVEN TECHNICAL INSTITUTES AND TWO TECHNICAL COLLEGES OF THE COUNCIL, CARITAS LOK MO VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE, PINEHILL TRAINING CENTRE OF THE HONG KONG ASSOCIATION FOR THE MENTALLY HANDICAPPED, AND VARIOUS NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANISATIONS IN THE VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION FIELD.

ESTABLISHED IN JULY 1980, THE SPD HAS BEEN PROVIDING FREE EMPLOYMENT SERVICES TO THE DISABLED AND EMPLOYERS.

"IN THE PAST FIVE YEARS, WE HAVE MADE MORE THAN 1,000 PLACEMENTS EACH YEAR FOR THE DISABLED," SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER (SELECTIVE PLACEMENT) MRS JENNIE CHOR SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

IN 1993, THE CONCERTED EFFORT OF THE DIVISION'S STAFF CONTRIBUTED TO THE 1,340 PLACEMENTS FOR THE DISABLED, INCLUDING THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED, HEARING IMPAIRED, PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED, MENTALLY RETARDED AND EX-MENTALLY ILL JOB-SEEKERS.

MRS CHOR SAID THERE WERE MORE THAN 900 JOB VACANCIES FROM EMPLOYERS INTERESTED IN EMPLOYING DISABLED EMPLOYEES IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF THIS YEAR.

"THESE VACANCIES INCLUDE JOBS IN THE PROFESSIONAL, TECHNICAL, CLERICAL, SALES, SERVICE AND PRODUCTION SECTORS.

"AMONG THEM, OVER 60 PER CENT OFFERED WAGES OF BETWEEN \$4,500 AND \$5,500 OR ABOVE," SHE SAID.

DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS ARE WELCOME TO REGISTER AT THE BRANCH OFFICES OF THE SPD IN HARBOUR BUILDING IN CENTRAL AND NGAU TAU KOK AND TSUEN WAN GOVERNMENT OFFICES. DETAILS OF THE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE ARE CLEARLY PRINTED ON THE NEW LEAFLET.

MRS CHOR NOTED THAT THE LEAFLET ALSO LISTED THE VARIOUS SERVICES PROVIDED BY HER DIVISION TO DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS.

"FOR EXAMPLE, WE PROVIDE UP-TO-DATE INFORMATION ON THE EMPLOYMENT MARKET AND SKILL TESTS FOR THE DISABLED JOB-SEEKERS SO THAT THEY CAN UNDERSTAND THEIR ABILITIES AND FIND SUITABLE JOBS ACCORDING TO MARKET DEMAND.

"PLACEMENT OFFICERS IN THE DIVISION WILL ALSO MAKE USE OF COMPUTER FACILITIES TO SELECT SUITABLE JOBS FOR THE DISABLED AND WILL ACCOMPANY THEM FOR JOB INTERVIEWS WITH THE EMPLOYERS," SHE SAID.

THEY WILL ALSO ASSIST THEM TO APPLY FOR TECHNICAL AIDS AND REHABUS SERVICE.

MRS CHOR ADDED THAT FOLLOW-UP SERVICE WOULD ALSO BE PROVIDED BY THE SPD IN THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF EMPLOYMENT IN A BID TO ASSIST BOTH PARTIES IN MAINTAINING A HARMONIOUS WORKING RELATIONSHIP.

THE TUEN MUN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR PETER LEUNG, TODAY (SATURDAY) APPOINTED 21 VOTER REGISTRATION AMBASSADORS TO HELP BOOST THE ELECTORAL ROLL.

THEY INCLUDE SIX POPULAR ARTISTES IN A TVB FAMILY DRAMA, TAXI AND MINIBUS DRIVERS, AGENCY WORKERS AND CIVIL SERVANTS.

REGISTER AS VOTERS NOW

ASSISTANT KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICER MR EDWARD CHU TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED ON RESIDENTS IN THE AREA TO TAKE THE INITIATIVE TO ENROL AS ELECTORS BEFORE THE REGISTRATION PERIOD CLOSES ON JULY 1.

SPEAKING AT A VARIETY SHOW TO PROMOTE ELECTORAL REGISTRATION IN THE DISTRICT, MR CHU SAID DURING THE LONG WEEKEND, MORE THAN 100 TEMPORARY COMMUNITY ORGANISERS TOGETHER WITH STAFF OF THE DISTRICT OFFICE WOULD CONTINUE TO HELP PEOPLE REGISTER AT MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY STATIONS AND SHOPPING CENTRES.

"ONLY AFTER BECOMING A VOTER CAN YOU ELECT YOUR PREFERRED CANDIDATES IN THE FORTHCOMING POLLS AND HAVE YOUR VOICE HEARD ON LOCAL AFFAIRS. IT ONLY TAKES A FEW MINUTES TO EXERCISE SUCH CIVIC RIGHTS," HE SAID.

A CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION SPOKESMAN HAS AGAIN REMINDED THOSE WHO ARE AGED 18 AND ABOVE AND HAVE BEEN LIVING IN HONG KONG FOR SEVEN YEARS TO REGISTER AS VOTERS.

TAVA SCHEME AIDS TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS

* * * * *

TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDANTS WHO NEED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ARE ADVISED TO COME FORWARD TO THE TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS ASSISTANCE (TAVA) SECTION OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT (SWD).

MAKING THE APPEAL, AN SWD SPOKESMAN SAID STAFF FROM THE TAVA SECTION WOULD, IN MAJOR TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS, TAKE THE INITIATIVE TO CONTACT VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDANTS DIRECTLY TO HELP THEM APPLY AT AN EARLY DATE.

QUOTING A RECENT EXAMPLE, THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE SWD HAD TAKEN SWIFT ACTION TO ASSIST A MAN WHOSE THREE FAMILY MEMBERS WERE KILLED IN A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT AT TAI PO ROAD NEAR THE SHA TIN RACECOURSE ON APRIL 12 THIS YEAR.

AS A RESULT OF THIS, A SUM OF \$38,523 WAS AWARDED TO THE VICTIM WITHIN ONE WEEK.

THE TAVA SCHEME, OPERATING SINCE 1979, IS ONE OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY SCHEMES ADMINISTERED BY THE SWD.

IN THE 1992/93 FINANCIAL YEAR, THE SWD HAD SPENT SOME \$79.2 MILLION FROM THE TAVA FUND, REPRESENTING A 33 PER CENT INCREASE COMPARED WITH THE PRECEDING YEAR.

DURING THE SAME PERIOD, 5,517 APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE WERE RECEIVED, REPRESENTING A DROP OF 1.6 PER CENT WHEN COMPARED WITH 5,604 APPLICATIONS IN 1991/92.

"THE TAVA SCHEME AIMS TO PROVIDE QUICK FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDANTS, REGARDLESS OF THE MEANS OF THE FAMILY OR THE ELEMENT OF FAULT IN CAUSING THE ACCIDENT.

"TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ASSISTANCE, AN APPLICATION MUST BE MADE WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF THE ACCIDENT WHICH MUST HAVE BEEN REPORTED TO THE POLICE.

"IN THE CASE OF INJURY NOT CAUSING DEATH, AN APPLICANT MUST OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE FROM A REGISTERED DOCTOR GRANTING AT LEAST THREE DAYS OF SICK LEAVE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE ADDED THAT BENEFICIARIES UNDER THE SCHEME STILL RETAINED THE RIGHT TO MAKE CLAIMS FOR LEGAL DAMAGES OR COMPENSATION FROM OTHER SOURCES IN THE USUAL WAY.

HOWEVER, THOSE WHO RECEIVE COMPENSATION IN RESPECT OF THE SAME TRAFFIC ACCIDENT ARE REQUIRED TO REPAY THE AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE THEY HAVE RECEIVED FROM THE SCHEME.

"BUT IN ANY CASE THE AMOUNT TO BE REPAID SHALL NOT EXCEED THE AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION AWARDED," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

APPLICATIONS UNDER THE TAVA SCHEME CAN BE MADE EITHER IN PERSON OR BY POST.

APPLICATION FORMS MAY BE OBTAINED AT THE ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION UNITS OF REGIONAL POLICE HEADQUARTERS, DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION AND SWD'S TAVA SECTION AT ROOM 942, WU CHUNG HOUSE, 213 QUEEN'S ROAD EAST, WAN CHAI.

TEACHER RECRUITMENT DRIVE IN PROGRESS
* * * * *

PEOPLE WHO WISH TO JOIN THE TEACHING PROFESSION ON A FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME BASIS ARE INVITED TO REGISTER WITH THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S TEACHER RECRUITMENT INFORMATION OFFICE (T.R.I.O.).

THEIR PARTICULARS WILL BE ENTERED INTO A COMPUTER DATA BANK WHICH WILL THEN FORM A SOURCE OF POTENTIAL TEACHING FORCE TO SCHOOLS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID: "THE INFORMATION OFFICE AIMS TO ASSIST PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS WITH REGULAR OR TEMPORARY VACANCIES FOR OVER THREE MONTHS IN EMPLOYING SUITABLE TEACHERS TO FILL TEACHING VACANCIES ARISING FROM CREATION OF NEW POSTS OR NATURAL WASTAGE.

"SCHOOLS INTENDING TO RECRUIT TEACHERS FOR CERTAIN SUBJECTS CAN ALSO OBTAIN POTENTIAL TEACHERS' INFORMATION THROUGH THE T.R.I.O. DATA BANK BY FILLING IN A FORM, ONE FOR EACH POST, AND RETURNING IT TO T.R.I.O. BY FAX OR BY POST.

"WHEN T.R.I.O. RECEIVES THE REQUEST FROM THE SCHOOLS, IT WILL PROVIDE A COMPUTER PRINTOUT OF A LIST OF TEACHERS WITH SUITABLE QUALIFICATIONS AND SUBJECT RELEVANCE TO SCHOOLS FOR SELECTION," THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED.

"SCHOOLS WILL THEN ARRANGE INTERVIEWS WITH SUITABLE CANDIDATES ON THE LIST. WHETHER THE APPLICANTS WILL BE OFFERED APPOINTMENTS WILL BE SOLELY AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SCHOOL."

THE SPOKESMAN REMINDED SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS TO CANCEL THEIR REGISTRATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE SO THAT THE LIST OF CANDIDATES WERE ALWAYS KEPT UP-TO-DATE.

T.R.I.O. WAS SET UP TO LAUNCH A TEACHER RECRUITMENT CAMPAIGN TO HELP FULFIL THE OBJECTIVE OF IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION IN PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS AS ANNOUNCED BY THE GOVERNOR IN HIS TWO POLICY SPEECHES.

ABOUT 620 TEACHING POSTS WILL BE INTRODUCED IN THE 1994/95 SCHOOL YEAR. SUCH AN INCREASE DOES NOT INCLUDE REPLACEMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES RESULTING FROM TEACHER WASTAGE.

SINCE THE RE-ACTIVATION OF T.R.I.O. IN MARCH, OVER 2,400 PERSONS HAVE REGISTERED WITH THE OFFICE.

AMONG THESE APPLICANTS, 1,550 ARE DEGREE HOLDERS, 362 ARE GRADUATES FROM THE FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME IN-SERVICE TEACHER TRAINING COURSES OF THE COLLEGES OF EDUCATION AND 196 HAVE OBTAINED DIPLOMAS FROM THE APPROVED POST-SECONDARY COLLEGES.

SUMMER HEALTH TIPS

* * * * *

GOOD PERSONAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE AND SAFE FOOD ARE THE STRONGEST SHIELD TO GUARD AGAINST GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES, THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF HEALTH (HYGIENE), DR MAHOMMED ALI, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

DR ALI WAS APPEALING TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO TAKE SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST THE DISEASES WITH THE APPROACH OF THE SUMMER.

HE POINTED OUT THAT FOOD-BORNE DISEASES SUCH AS CHOLERA, VIRAL HEPATITIS A, DYSENTERY, TYPHOID AND FOOD POISONING LIKE THE RECENT OCCURRENCE OF BIOTOXIN CASES, WERE COMMON IN THE SUMMER AS A RESULT OF EATING UNCLEAR OR DETERIORATED FOOD, OR DRINKING CONTAMINATED WATER.

"MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE STRONGLY ADVISED NOT TO PATRONISE ILLEGAL HAWKERS AND UNLICENSED FOOD PREMISES AS THEIR FOOD MAY BE UNCLEAR AND MAY POSE A SERIOUS RISK TO HEALTH," HE SAID.

DR ALI SAID: "DO NOT BUY CUT FRUIT AS OPEN CUT FRUIT CAN EASILY GET CONTAMINATED.

"WHEN CONSUMING SEAFOOD, IN PARTICULAR THE BIVALVE SHELLFISH, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC SHOULD AVOID EATING THEIR INTERNAL ORGANS AND SHOULD NOT EAT TOO MUCH AT A TIME.

"WHEN THE TOXIC RED TIDE OCCURS, THEY SHOULD AVOID EATING BIVALVE SHELLFISH," DR ALI SAID.

HE ALSO ADVISED PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO TROPICAL COUNTRIES TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS IN CHOOSING THEIR FOODS AND DRINKS.

DR ALI CITED 10 POINTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO OBSERVE TO GUARD AGAINST GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES:

- * MAINTAIN A CLEAN KITCHEN;
- * CLEAN THE CHOPPING BOARD AND KNIFE BEFORE USE, ESPECIALLY AFTER CUTTING RAW MEAT AND POULTRY;
- * USE CLEAN COOKING UTENSILS;

/* WASH HANDS

- * WASH HANDS AFTER VISITING THE TOILET AND BEFORE PREPARING AND EATING FOOD;
- * STORE IN THE REFRIGERATOR PERISHABLE FOOD NOT MEANT FOR IMMEDIATE CONSUMPTION;
- * WASH VEGETABLES THOROUGHLY BEFORE COOKING;
- * COOK FOOD, ESPECIALLY MEAT AND SHELLFISH, THOROUGHLY BEFORE CONSUMPTION;
- * EAT HOT FOOD WHILE IT IS STILL HOT AND COLD FOOD WHILE IT IS COLD. DO NOT LEAVE IT EXPOSED FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME;
- * FOOD TO BE KEPT OVERNIGHT SHOULD BE PUT IN A REFRIGERATOR AND REHEATED THOROUGHLY BEFORE EATING; AND
- * ALL GARBAGE AND WASTE PENDING DISPOSAL SHOULD BE STORED IN A COVERED CONTAINER.

DR ALI STRESSED THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE URBAN SERVICES AND REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENTS WOULD CONTINUE TO TAKE POSITIVE MEASURES TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF GASTRO-INTESTINAL DISEASES THROUGH FOOD HYGIENE EDUCATION GIVEN TO LICENSEES AND EMPLOYEES IN THE FOOD TRADE.

PUBLICITY WOULD ALSO BE STEPPED UP TO DISSEMINATE HEALTH MESSAGES TO THE PUBLIC ON FOOD, PERSONAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE, HE ADDED.
