CLOSURE OF PRECIOUS BLOOD GOLDEN JUBILEE SECONDARY SCHOOL
* * * * *

THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR. COLVYN HAYE, HAS DECIDED TO CLOSE THE PRECIOUS BLOOD GOLDEN JUBILEE SECONDARY SCHOOL UNTIL AUGUST 31, 1978. FORMAL NOTICE TO THIS EFFECT WAS SERVED ON THE SUPERVISOR, THE REV. SISTER LOPRAINE TURCOTTE, AT 4 P.M. TODAY.

+IT IS WITH REGRET THAT, AFTER THE MOST CAREFUL CONSIDERATION, I HAVE REACHED THIS DECISION,+ MR. HAYE SAID. +BUT I AM ENTIRELY SATISFIED THAT MY DECISION IS IN THE INTEREST OF THE PROPER CONDUCT OF EDUCATION GENERALLY IN HONG KONG, AND IN THE LONG-TERM INTEREST OF THE PUPILS OF THE SCHOOL - BOTH THOSE WHOSE MISGUIDED BEHAVIOUR UNDER IRRESPONSIBLE ADULT INFLUENCES HAS CONTRIBUTED TO MY DECISION, AND THOSE WHO HAVE ONLY WANTED TO PURSUE THEIR SCHOOL LIFE IN A NORMAL WAY AND WHO THEREFORE HAVE SADLY BEEN THE VICTIMS OF THE GROSS MISCONDUCT OF OTHERS,+ HE ADDED.

MR. HAYE SAID THAT HE AND HIS SENIOR STAFF HAD MADE A CLOSE STUDY OF RECENT DEVELOPMENTS AT THE SCHOOL AND IN PARTICULAR THE EVENTS OF THE LAST FEW DAYS WHICH HAD CALLED FOR INSPECTORS' VISITS. THIS STUDY, HOURLY REPORTS FROM THE SCHOOL AND FIRST HAND OBSERVATION BY SENIOR INSPECTORS HAD CONVINCED HIM THAT THE MASSIVE DISRUPTION OF STUDIES AT PRECIOUS BLOOD GOLDEN JUBILEE SECONDARY SCHOOL WOULD CONTINUE. THE ADAMANT REFUSAL OF A NUMBER OF MILITANT TEACHERS, WHO HAD BEEN LEADING THE DEMONSTRATIONS OF HUNDREDS OF MISGUIDED STUDENTS, TO ACCEPT THE AUTHORITY OF THE SCHOOL MADE IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR THE SCHOOL TO CONTINUE AS IT SHOULD FOR THE LITTLE THAT WAS LEFT OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR. THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS HAD PROVED THIS BY ABSENTING THEMSELVES FROM THE SCHOOL DURING THE WEEK TO PARADE AND DEMONSTRATE, AND, ON THEIR RETURN TO THE SCHOOL ON FRIDAY (MAY 12) BY FURTHER DEMONSTRATIONS ON THE SCHOOL PREMISES.

+THERE IS NO EVIDENCE WHATSOEVER THAT THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS IN DEFIANCE OF SCHOOL AUTHORITY NEAR TO ABANDON THEIR CAMPAIGN OF INTIMIDATION AT THE SCHOOL,+ MR. HAYE SAID. +THIS HAS BEEN NOTED BY CLOSE OBSERVERS, CONFIRMED BY PRESS REPORTS OF TEACHERS' STATEMENTS AND BY THEIR MOST RECENT ACTIONS.+

MR. HAYE EMPHASISED THAT THE FACTS WERE CLEAR. STUDENTS HAD BEEN ENCOURAGED BY A GROUP OF TEACHERS TO DEFY SCHOOL AUTHORITY. PHYSICAL INTIMIDATION AND ABUSE OF THE PRINCIPAL AND HER DEPUTY HAD LED TO THE SUSPENSION AND WARNING OF RING LEADERS. TEACHERS HAD THEN LED STUDENTS IN MARCHES AND DEMONSTRATIONS DEMANDING THE WITHDRAWAL OF SUSPENSIONS AND WARNINGS AND THE DISMISSAL OF THE PRINCIPAL. TEACHERS AND STUDENTS DECLARED THAT THEY WOULD RETURN TO SCHOOL, BUT HAD MADE IT CLEAR THAT THEY HAD NOT DROPPED THEIR DEMANDS BY IMMEDIATE CONFRONTATION OF THE SCHOOL AUTHORITIES.

MOREOVER, MR. HAYE ADDED, SENIOR INSPECTORS OF SCHOOLS WHO HAD BEEN AT PRECIOUS BLOOD HAD CONFIRMED THAT MOST OF THE GIRLS OF MIDDLE 2 TO 4 CLASSES, WHO HAD RETURNED TO THE SCHOOL EARLIER IN THE WEEK AT THE INSISTENCE OF THEIR PARENTS, HAD REFUSED INSTRUCTION. THEY WERE DEFIANT, HOSTILE AND ABUSIVE, DESPITE THE INSTRUCTIONS OF TEACHERS WHO HAD STUCK TO THEIR POSTS. THESE POOR TEACHERS, MR. HAYE SAID, WERE AT THE END OF THEIR TETHER, AND PHYSICALLY AND EMOTIONALLY EXHAUSTED BY THE STRAIN OF DISTURBANCES AT THE SCHOOL. MOST OF THEM DOUBTED THEIR ABILITY TO FACE THE TROUBLE THEY WERE CERTAIN WOULD COME WITH THE RETURN OF TEACHERS AND STUDENTS WHO HAD SO OPENLY DEMONSTRATED THEIR CONTEMPT OF SCHOOL AUTHORITY.

+THINGS HAVE BEEN BAD AT THE SCHOOL,+ MR. HAYE SAID. +THEY HAVE GOT WORSE, AND THEY WILL NOT GET BETTER. THE ARENA OF CONFLICT HAS BEEN THE SCHOOL. IT MOVED TO CARITAS HOUSE LAST WEEK, AND NOW IT HAS RETURNED TO THE SCHOOL. I CANNOT LET THIS SORRY AND DANGEROUS STATE OF AFFAIRS CONTINUE.+

TEACHERS AND STUDENTS HAD RAISED A NUMBER OF PRETEXTS FOR THEIR REJECTION OF SCHOOL AUTHORITY, MR. HAYE COMMENTED. LAST YEAR IT HAD BEEN THE MISMANAGEMENT OF SCHOOL FUNDS, DESPITE THE PROMPT ACTION TAKEN BY THE SCHOOL MANAGERS TO REPORT TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, THE THOROUGH INVESTIGATION WHICH HAD COMMENCED BEFORE TEACHERS LODGED OFFICIAL COMPLAINTS, THE SUBSEQUENT PUNISHMENT OF A PREVIOUS PRINCIPAL AND REGULARISATION OF THE SCHOOL BOOKS. THEN IT HAD BEEN TEACHING CONTRACTS WHICH HAD LED TO SIT-INS, DESPITE THE FACT THAT TEACHERS HAD ACCEPTED THOSE CONTRACTS. MORE RECENTLY IT HAD BEEN ALLEGATIONS OF THE SEARCHING OF SCHOOL BAGS, ALLEGATIONS OF UNFAIR LETTERS OF WARNING AND SUSPENSION, AND, FINALLY, ALLEGATIONS OF ASSAULT. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE LATTER, WHICH WAS IN THE HANDS OF THE POLICE, MR. HAYE SAID, CAREFUL STUDY OF THE FACTS CONFIRMED THAT THE CLAIMS WERE PRETEXTS FOR ANARCHY. UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES, HE FELT THERE WAS NO SENSIBLE ALTERNATIVE TO CLOSURE OF THE SCHOOL.

THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION SAID THAT THROUGHOUT THE ESCALATION OF TROUBLE BY TEACHERS AND STUDENTS, HE HAD BEEN IN CLOSE TOUCH WITH THE SCHOOL SUPERVISOR AND MANAGERS. AT EMERGENCY MEETINGS ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY (MAY 12 - 13) THERE HAD BEEN UNANIMOUS SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSAL AND FINAL DECISION TO CLOSE THE SCHOOL.

THE ROMAN CATHOLIC BISHOP OF HONG KONG HAD BEEN KEPT INFORMED OF DEVELOPMENTS AND CONSULTED BEFORE THE DECISION, WHICH HE NOW ENDORSED.

+WHEN THE SCHOOL REOPENS ON SEPTEMBER 1, 1978, IT WILL BE TO A FRESH START UNDER A NEW SPONSOR AND WITH A NEW NAME,+ MR. HAYE CONCLUDED.

NEW KCR GENERAL MANAGER APPOINTED

* * * * *

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS HAS APPROVED THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. D.M. HOWES, A SENIOR MANAGER FROM BRITISH RAIL, AS GENERAL MANAGER OF THE KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY TO SUCCEED MR. REGINALD GREGORY, WHO LEFT HONG KONG IN FEBRUARY.

MR. HOWES HAS HAD A TOTAL OF 42 YEARS' EXPERIENCE WITH RAILWAYS IN BRITAIN AND OTHER COUNTRIES, MANY AT THE HIGHEST LEVELS. HIS APPOINTMENT WILL BE FOR TWO AND A HALF YEARS INITIALLY.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID MR. HOWES HAD BEEN APPOINTED BECAUSE OF HIS LONG EXPERIENCE WITH RAILWAYS AND PARTICULARLY ELECTRIFIED RAILWAY SYSTEMS.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD DECIDED TO ELECTRIFY THE WHOLE OF THE KCR MAIN LINE FROM HUNG HOM TO LO WU AT A COST OF ABOUT \$400 MILLION AND THAT A STUDY WAS NOW BEING UNDERTAKEN BY CONSULTANTS AS TO HOW BEST THIS PROJECT SHOULD BE CARRIED OUT.

+ELECTRIFICATION OF THE KCR, TOGETHER WITH DOUBLE TRACKING AND OTHER MEASURES TO MODERNISE THE RAILWAY, ARE ESSENTIAL IF IT IS TO COPE WITH AN EXPECTED SEVEN-FOLD GROWTH IN PASSENGER TRAFFIC BY 1990, AS WELL AS LARGE INCREASES IN THE VOLUME OF FREIGHT,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+AND AN ELECTRIFIED RAILWAY SYSTEM WILL ALSO SHORTEN JOURNEY TIMES AND BE MUCH MORE COMFORTABLE FOR THE TRAVELLING PUBLIC,+ HE ADDED.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO POINTED OUT THAT THERE WAS NO ONE IN HONG KONG WITH THE NECESSARY EXPERIENCE TO GUIDE THE RAILWAY THROUGH THE PERIOD WHEN THE HIGHLY COMPLEX ELECTRIFICATION PROGRAMME, WHICH WOULD REQUIRE TECHNIQUES NEW TO HONG KONG, WAS BEING UNDERTAKEN.

ONE OF MR. HOWES'S MAJOR TASKS WOULD BE TO SELECT AND TRAIN A LOCAL MEMBER OF THE KCR STAFF TO SUCCEED HIM AS GENERAL MANAGER TO RUN WHAT WOULD BY THEN BE A MUCH BUSIER AND OPERATIONALLY FAR MORE SOPHISTICATED RAILWAY.

THE GOVERNMENT HAS ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT, BECAUSE OF THE INCREASE IN WORKLOAD AND RESPONSIBILITIES TO WHICH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ELECTRIFICATION AND MODERNISATION PROGRAMME WILL GIVE RISE, A NEW POST OF DEPUTY GENERAL MANAGER OF THE KCR HAS BEEN CREATED.

THIS POST WILL BE FILLED BY THE PROMOTION OF MR. WONG U-LAI, WHO IS AT PRESENT ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER, AND WHO HAS BEEN ACTING AS GENERAL MANAGER SINCE THE DEPARTURE OF MR. GREGORY.

MR. HOWES IS MARRIED AND HAS TWO MARRIED CHILDREN. HE WAS THE CHIEF OPERATING MANAGER OF THE LONDON/MIDLAND REGION OF BRITISH RAIL FROM 1971 TO 1974 AND THE GENERAL MANAGER FROM 1974 TO 1977. MR. HOWES HAS UNTIL RECENTLY BEEN DEPUTY MANAGING DIRECTOR OF A MAJOR FIRM OF TRANSPORT CONSULTANTS.

MR. WONG'S SERVICE WITH THE KCR DATES BACK TO 1953 WHEN HE WAS APPOINTED ASSISTANT MECHANICAL ENGINEER. HE HAS BEEN ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER SINCE 1973.

COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE

* * * *

ABOUT 5,200 PATIENTS HAVE RECEIVED HEALTH CARE AT HOME BY COMMUNITY NURSES DURING THE PAST 12 MONTHS UNDER A GOVERNMENT SUBVENTION SCHEME TO ASSIST SIX ORGANISATIONS RUNNING THE COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE.

IT WAS THE FIRST YEAR THAT GOVERNMENT SUBVENTIONS WERE GIVEN TO THE ORGANISATIONS CONCERNED. THE SUBVENTIONS WOULD CONTINUE FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS SO THAT AN ASSESSMENT COULD BE MADE BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE SERVICE.

THE GOVERNMENT DECISION TO SUBVENT THE SIX ORGANISATIONS FOR A TRIAL PERIOD OF THREE YEARS FOLLOWED A RECOMMENDATION BY THE MEDICAL DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE IN THE MEDICAL WHITE PAPER TO GIVE FURTHER CONSIDERATION TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF COMMUNITY NURSING.

AT PRESENT, SIX ORGANISATIONS ARE EMPLOYING 33 FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME NURSES TO DO COMMUNITY NURSING. BETWEEN THEM, THEY HAVE MADE MORE THAN 40,000 VISITS, OR AN AVERAGE OF 7.7 HOME VISITS TO EACH PATIENT, DURING THE FIRST YEAR OF SUBVENTION.

THE SIX ORGANISATIONS ARE UNITED CHRISTIAN HOSPITAL, CARITAS MEDICAL CENTRE, OUR LADY OF MARYKNOLL HOSPITAL, YANG SOCIAL SERVICE CENTRE, NETHERSOLE HOSPITAL AND RENNIE'S MILL CHRISTIAN MEDICAL CENTRE.

BASICALLY, COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE ENABLES EXTENSION OF HEALTH CARE TO PATIENTS AFTER THEY HAVE BEEN DISCHARGED FROM HOSPITALS. IT IS NOT A PRIVATE NURSING SERVICE, AND THE TIME SPENT AT EACH HOME VISIT WILL BE LIMITED TO THAT REQUIRED FOR GIVING NECESSARY NURSING CARE AND INSTRUCTIONS.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THE COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE IS TO ENABLE CONTINUITY OF CARE AND ENSURE THAT TREATMENT FOR A PATIENT IS MAINTAINED FOLLOWING HIS DISCHARGE FROM HOSPITAL AFTER THE ACUTE STAGE OF ILLNESS HAS PASSED.

IT ENCOURAGES PERSONS WITH THE HELP OF THEIR FAMILIES TO PARTICIPATE IN THEIR OWN TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION AS WELL AS TO PREVENT RELAPSE BY SUPPORTIVE CARE AND HEALTH TEACHING.

DURING THE COURSE OF THEIR DUTIES, COMMUNITY NURSES ALSO EDUCATE FAMILIES TO CONTRIBUTE TO CARING FOR THEIR OWN HEALTH AND WELL-BEING.

A WIDE-RANGE OF SKILLED NURSING CARE IS GIVEN BY THE COMMUNITY NURSE PROVIDED THE NECESSARY EQUIPMENT AND NURSING FACILITIES ARE AVAILABLE AND CAN BE UTILISED AT THE PATIENTS' HOME.

THE TYPE OF NURSING CARE WOULD INCLUDE OBSERVATION OF BLOOD PRESSURE AND PULSE, ENEMAS, INJECTIONS, IRRIGATIONS, SURGICAL DRESSINGS, REMOVAL OF STITCHES, REHABILITATION EXERCISES, CATHETERISATION AND VARIOUS DIAGNOSTIC TESTS.

THE PATIENT AND HIS FAMILY ARE INSTRUCTED, SUPERVISED AND SUPPORTED IN CARRYING OUT SIMPLE TREATMENT INDEPENDENTLY BETWEEN AND DURING VISITS OF A COMMUNITY NURSE. KNOWLEDGE ON GENERAL HYGIENE AND HOME MANAGEMENT ARE ALSO DELIVERED DURING HOME VISITS.

IF THE PATIENT'S CONDITIONS SO REQUIRED, HE MAY BE REFERRED TO OTHER SPECIALIST CARE SUCH AS PHYSIOTHERAPISTS, OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS, PSYCHOLOGISTS AND SOCIAL WORKERS.

ONLY PATIENTS RECOMMENDED BY A PHYSICIAN WHO CAN COMPLY WITH CERTAIN INTAKE CRITERIA ARE ELIGIBLE FOR RECEIVING COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE. BROADLY SPEAKING, THESE ARE PATIENTS WHO DO NOT REQUIRE HOSPITAL CARE AND HAVE DIFFICULTY IN ATTENDING CLINIC FOR FOLLOW-UP CHECKS, BUT REQUIRED SKILLED NURSING CARE. ALSO THEIR HOME CONDITIONS MUST BE SUITABLE FOR CARE AT HOME.

TO BE ELIGIBLE, PATIENTS MUST ALSO MEET THE CRITERIA THAT THEY WOULD BENEFIT FROM SKILLED NURSING CARE IN ORDER TO ATTAIN OPTIMUM REHABILITATION OR MAINTAIN THEIR PRESENT CAPABILITIES. PATIENTS REQUIRING CONSTANT NURSING SUPERVISION WOULD NOT BE SUITABLE FOR COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE.

PATIENTS RECEIVING COMMUNITY NURSING SERVICE ARE CHARGED AT A STANDARD FEE OF \$5 PER VISIT. SPECIALISED EQUIPMENT AND DRUGS ARE CHARGED AT COST PRICE. HOWEVER, IN CASE OF FINANCIAL NEED, THESE FEES MAY BE REDUCED OR WAIVED.

PROVIDED THAT THE INTAKE CRITERIA ARE MET, THE SERVICE IS AVAILABLE TO ANY PATIENT REGARDLESS OF NATIONALITY, AGE, DISABILITIES, RELIGION AND FINANCIAL STATUS.

A NEW SERIES OF +HOW TO APPLY+ LEAFLETS IS BEING PRODUCED TO ADVISE PEOPLE OF GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTATION PROCEDURES.

THE FIRST EIGHT LEAFLETS, ALL IN CHINESE, ARE +HOW TO APPLY FOR A FLAT IN THE PUBLIC ESTATES+, +HOW TO APPLY FOR A CERTIFICATE OF IDENTITY AND A RE-ENTRY PERMIT+, +HOW TO REGISTER AND LICENSE A VEHICLE+, +HOW TO APPLY FOR A DRIVING LICENCE+, +HOW TO APPLY FOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION+, +HOW TO FILL IN A PROFITS TAX RETURN+, +HOW TO APPLY FOR A JOB WITH THE GOVERNMENT+ AND, +HOW TO APPLY TO JOIN THE FIRE SERVICES+.

THEY CAN BE OBTAINED FREE OF CHARGE FROM THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE, CITY DISTRICT OFFICES, DISTRICT OFFICES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES AND ALSO FROM THE RELEVANT GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID: +WE HOPE PEOPLE WILL MAKE A POINT OF OBTAINING THESE LEAFLETS IF THEY ARE NOT SURE OF THE PROCEDURES INVOLVED AS IT COULD SAVE THEM A LOT OF TIME AND INCONVENIENCE.

+IT ALSO HELPS DEPARTMENTS DEAL WITH APPLICATIONS MORE EFFICIENTLY IF A PERSON KNOWS WHAT PARTICULARS HE IS REQUIRED TO PRODUCE.+

LEAFLETS ON OTHER SUBJECTS ARE NOW BEING PREPARED BY THE GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID EVENTUALLY ABOUT 40 DIFFERENT LEAFLETS WILL BE AVAILABLE, MOSTLY IN CHINESE, ALTHOUGH A FEW WILL BE PRODUCED IN ENGLISH AS WELL IF THE SUBJECT MATTER IS RELEVANT.

+FOR INSTANCE, ENGLISH VERSIONS WILL BE AVAILABLE SHORTLY ON HOW TO APPLY FOR A DRIVING LICENCE, HOW TO REGISTER AND LICENSE A VEHICLE, AND ALSO HOW TO APPLY FOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION, A BIRTH CERTIFICATE AND A MARRIAGE LICENCE,+ HE ADDED.
