HK FESTIVAL IN VANCOUVER KICKS OFF

\* \* \* \* \*

THE SPECTACULAR SOUNDS, SIGHTS AND EXCITEMENT OF FESTIVAL HONG KONG '92 IN CANADA HAVE NOW REACHED VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA - ONE OF THE FIVE CANADIAN CITIES HOSTING FESTIVALS TO ENHANCE LINKS BETWEEN HONG KONG AND CANADA.

AT AN OPENING CELEBRATION OF THE FESTIVAL AT THE PLAZA OF NATIONS IN VANCOUVER ON SATURDAY, HUNDREDS OF CANADIANS TOOK PART IN THE FESTIVITY AND EXPERIENCED FOR THEMSELVES HONG KONG'S CULTURE AND LIFESTYLE.

THE CELEBRATION FEATURED TRADE DISPLAYS, DIM SUM TASTING, FILMS ON HONG KONG, AND PERFORMANCES OF CHINESE MARTIAL ARTS, DANCES, MUSIC AND CHOIR.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF BRITISH COLUMBIA DAVID SEE-CHAI LAM AND HONG KONG'S SECRETARY FOR RECREATION AND CULTURE JAMES SO OFFICIATED AT A RIBBON-CUTTING CEREMONY TO KICK OFF THE FESTIVAL, TOGETHER WITH A NUMBER OF CANADIAN AND HONG KONG GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS INCLUDING DIRECTOR OF HONG KONG ECONOMIC AND TRADE OFFICE IN CANADA STEPHEN LAM.

THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SAID THAT THE BRIDGE ACROSS THE PACIFIC THAT CANADA AND HONG KONG ARE NOW BUILDING HAVE MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR MORE PEOPLE TO FULFILL A LOT OF DREAMS.

"TODAY, VANCOUVER IS DEFINITELY ASIA'S GATEWAY TO CANADA AND NORTH AMERICA, AND HONG KONG IS DEFINITELY CANADA'S BRIDGEHEAD TO ASIA," HE SAID.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY, MR SO REAFFIRMED THAT THE AIM OF THE FESTIVAL IS TO LINK THE TWO COUNTRIES EVEN CLOSER TOGETHER, SO THAT THEY CAN JOINTLY HELP EACH OTHER TO PROMOTE THE STABILITY AND PROSPERITY OF THE ASIA PACIFIC REGION.

MR SO NOTED THAT VANCOUVER AND HONG KONG HAVE ALREADY HAD VERY CLOSE LINKS. ONE EXAMPLE IS THAT THE UNIVERSITY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA AND SIMON FRASER UNIVERSITY WOULD PROBABLY HAVE THE LARGEST ALUMNI OF HONG KONG STUDENTS IN CANADA.

MORE THAN 40 EVENTS WILL BE HELD IN THE FOLLOWING TWO WEEKS, INCLUDING A DISPLAY OF HONG KONG'S NEW AIRPORT, BUSINESS SEMINAR, CHINESE COINS AND CURRENCY EXHIBITION, AS WELL AS SPORTS AND CULTURAL DEMONSTRATIONS.

MOTORISTS AND PEDESTRIANS IN THE BUSY DOWNTOWN DISTRICT ARE IMPRESSED BY THE 400 COLOURFUL BRIDGE ACROSS THE PACIFIC BANNERS FEATURING A DRAGON AND A MAPLE LEAF THAT HAVE BEEN HUNG ALL OVER THE MAIN STREETS AND BRIDGES.

A DELEGATION OF TRADE OFFICIALS LED BY MR CHRISTOPHER JACKSON, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF TRADE, HAS LEFT HONG KONG TODAY (SUNDAY) FOR A ONE-WEEK FAMILIARISATION VISIT TO FUJIAN PROVINCE.

"THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE VISIT IS TO KEEP OURSELVES ABREAST OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN THE FAST-GROWING SOUTHERN PROVINCE IN CHINA," MR JACKSON SAID.

THE EIGHT-MEMBER DELEGATION WILL VISIT XIAMEN AND FUZHOU WHERE THEY WILL BE RECEIVED BY THE MAYOR OF XIAMEN, MEET PROVINCIAL AND MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS AND VISIT FACTORIES.

MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG DELEGATION INCLUDE MISS JOANNA CHOI, PRINCIPAL TRADE OFFICER; MISS WENDY CHEUNG, ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY; MR THOMAS OR, TRADE OFFICER; MR GORDON CHEUNG, MISS CHUNG SHUK-YI AND MISS PATRICIA WOO, ASSISTANT TRADE OFFICERS, AND MRS SARAH LEE, INTERPRETER.

#### STUDY REPORT ON PORT-RELATED ENTERPRISES ON SALE

THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT HAS PUBLISHED A REPORT THAT PROVIDES INFORMATION ON THE INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES WITH CLOSE LINKS TO THE PORT.

THE PUBLICATION, ENTITLED "THE FINAL REPORT OF THE STUDY ON PORT-RELATED INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES" (SPICE), CLEARLY DEMONSTRATES THE IMPORTANT ROLE OF THE PORT AND PORT-RELATED ACTIVITIES IN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE TERRITORY AND PROVIDES A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF EXISTING ACTIVITIES AND THEIR LINKAGES.

/IN ADDITION .....

IN ADDITION, IT PROVIDES AN ESTIMATE OF THE CONTRIBUTION OF PORT-RELATED ACTIVITIES TO THE HONG KONG ECONOMY AND INDICATES POSSIBLE FUTURE REQUIREMENTS FOR SPICE ACTIVITIES TOGETHER WITH AN INDICATION OF A LAND USE STRATEGY TO MEET THESE REQUIREMENTS.

THE REPORT ALSO SUGGESTS WAYS IN WHICH THIS STRATEGY MAY NEED TO BE REFINED IN CONJUNCTION WITH BOTH A TERRITORIAL LAND USE STRATEGY AND MORE DETAILED LOCAL STUDIES.

INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE REPORT IS DERIVED FROM A RECENT STUDY CARRIED OUT BY THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT.

THE STUDY WAS DESIGNED TO GATHER INFORMATION ON PORT-RELATED ACTIVITIES AND TO ESTIMATE LAND REQUIREMENTS TO MEET THE FUTURE EXPANSION OF THE PORT IN TERMS OF ITS RELATED ACTIVITIES.
